MATCH NOTES

LEADING OFF

- Virginia will play the final non-conference match of the spring before ending the regular season with three ACC games.
- Tuesday marks the first ever meeting between Central Arkansas and Virginia.
- The last Sun Belt Conference opponent for Virginia was Coastal Carolina on opening night in 2016.
- The Cavaliers boast a 5-2 record at Klöckner Stadium this season and have won all three matches this spring at home.
- Central Arkansas and George Mason are the only two non-conference opponents Virginia will play in 2020-21.

WEEKLY STANDOUTS

- Goalkeeper Alex Rando was named ACC co-Defensive Player of the Week on Monday after helping the Cavaliers to a clean sheet against Virginia Tech last Friday.
- The sophomore netminder made four saves against the Hokies and was credited with his fourth career shutout.
- Rando ranks second in the ACC in both goals against average (0.70) and save percentage (.815). His four clean sheets in 2020-21 are tied for the second most in the league.
- Rando is the third Cavalier to take home an ACC weekly defensive honor and the second this spring (Oliver Gerbig – March 8). Colin Shutler was recognized as the ACC Defensive player of the week on Oct. 12, 2020.

LAST TIME OUT

- Virginia was clinical in 2-0 victory over Virginia Tech on Friday and improved to 2-1 in ACC play this spring.
- The Cavaliers scored two second half goals the first came off the foot of Kaya Ignacio in the 47th minute and the second on a thunderous strike by Kevin Ogudugu in the 58th minute.
- It marked the third meeting between Virginia and Virginia Tech, the first time the two schools played three times in one season.
- Including draws in 2016 and 2018 along with a loss in the fall, the win was the first over Virginia Tech at Klöckner Stadium since 2014. Virginia owns a 42-5-6 advantage in the all-time series with its commonwealth foe.

NOTES AND TRENDS

- Virginia has won three-straight matches at Klöckner Stadium and have not been scored upon on their home pitch this spring.
- The Cavaliers moved up two spots in the College Soccer News National rankings to No. 22. The United Soccer Coaches poll is scheduled to come out Tuesday afternoon.
- Including Friday's win, the Cavaliers are 4-0-1 when tied at the half in 2020-21
- Redshirt freshman Nick Berghold was credited with the assist on the game-winning goal against Virginia Tech, the first assist of his career. He has five points (2g, 1a) in 10 games played in 2020-21.
- Virginia is two wins shy of No. 800 all-time. The Cavaliers entered 2020 with the fifth most wins of any Division I College soccer program and the most among any ACC School
- Oliver Gerbig and Irakoze Donasiyano are the only two Cavaliers to have played every minute of action this season. Donasiyano made his 53rd consecutive start in Friday's match against Virginia Tech.
- The goalkeeping combination of Colin Shutler and Alex Rando have combined for 44 saves in 2020-21, the most in the ACC.

NOTING THE BEARS

- The Bears began their spring season on Feb. 3 and has one match remaining on their schedule after their visit to Charlottesville.
- In six games this spring, Central Arkansas is 3-2-1 and in its last match lost at Lipscomb, 2-1 on March 16.
- Central Arkansas went 3-3 in Sun Belt play this past fall and played to a 1-1 draw in the conference semifinals before Georgia State advanced on PKs.
- Head coach Ross Duncan led Central Arkansas to its first ever NCAA Tournament in 2017 and returned again in 2018 after winning back-to-back Missouri Valley Conference Championships.

NOTES CONTINUED

MILESTONE VICTORY

- Virginia became the first program in ACC history to reach 200 regular season games with a 1-0 win over Notre Dame on March 7. Of the 200 wins, 91 have come in the 25-year tenure of George Gelnovatch.
- Gelnovatch became the fastest coach in ACC history to reach 90 wins (25 seasons) and is second to only Duke's John Rennie (95 wins in 29 seasons) for the most ACC regular season wins ever.

FALL NOTES

- The Cavaliers went 3-4-1 in fall competition and made it to the semifinals of the ACC Tournament before falling to eventual champion Clemson.
- Eight different players accounted for the 10 Virginia goals in the fall, all will return to the roster in the spring.
- As the No. 4th seed in the ACC North Region, Virginia upset top-seeded Wake Forest in Winston-Salem in the ACC Quarterfinals, 2-0. Cabrel Happi Kamseu scored two goals and the Cavaliers recorded their second shutout of the fall.
- Center back Andreas Ueland was one of two Cavaliers listed on the ACC All-Tournament team. Ueland also played every minute of action in the fall.

WHAT'S AT STAKE

- ACC teams will return to their respective Atlantic and Coastal divisions in the spring.
- The Atlantic Division champion will play the Coastal Division champion at the higher seed on April 13.
- The winner of the divisional champion match will play at Clemson (which won the ACC Championship in the fall) on April 17 to determine the ACC's automatic qualifier for the NCAA Tournament.
- If Clemson is the Atlantic Division champion, the April 13 match against the Coastal Division champion will be played to determine the league's automatic qualifier.

ROSTER MAKEUP

- The Cavaliers will be without goalkeeper Colin Shutler who was drafted 45th overall by Toronto FC in the 2021 MLS SuperDraft. Shutler had started 45 games in goal for the Cavaliers over the last four seasons and was listed on the Mac Hermann Award watch list earlier this spring.
- Virginia will also be missing Bret Halsey who was the seventh overall pick of Real Salt Lake in this year's SuperDraft. Halsey started 31 matches for the Cavaliers and was a two-time ACC All-Tournament selection.
- Returning to the spring roster will be Irakoze Donasiyano and Nathaniel Crofts who were both selected in the SuperDraft but will return to their respective MLS teams in May.
- Virginia added defender Will Citron in January who has 15 collegiate games under his belt after spending his freshman season at Cornell. Midyear transfer Scott Williams will add depth to the Cavalier goalkeeping corps

HAPPI POSTSEASON

- It took just one minute and 18 seconds for Cabrel Happi Kamseu to make an impact in the quarterfinal victory over Wake Forest. Shortly after checking in, Happi Kamseu scored his first goal of the season and what would eventually be the game-winner on Sunday in the 31st minute.
- He went on to score his second goal of the match in the 52nd minute intercepting a pass deep in the Demon Deacon zone before chipping it over the goalkeeper's head. He vaulted himself into the team lead in goals (2) and points (4)
- Happi Kamseu became the Cavaliers' first multiple goal scorer since Daryl Dike's brace against the same Wake Forest program in the semifinals of the 2019 College Cup.

- The appearance was Happi Kamseu's second of the season, his only other action coming in a start at Virginia Tech on Oct. 14. He logged 50 minutes of action.
- The two goals were his second and third ACC Tournament goals of his career. He scored the game-winner in the 2019 ACC Championship match against Clemson and earned a spot on the ACC All-Tournament Team
- Happi Kamseu now has nine career goals, second most on the team to Nathaniel Crofts' 11.

REGULAR SEASON REVIEW

- For the first time in program history, Virginia started its season with four-straight overtime matches, with the first three occurring in a nine-day span.
- The Cavaliers recorded victories over Louisville and Syracuse while picking up a point on the road at Virginia Tech.
- Virginia was shutout for the first time since 2018 in its season finale against Virginia Tech, relegating the Cavaliers to the fourth seed in the ACC North Region.
- Two of the three Cavalier losses have come in extra time. The Cavaliers erased a 2-0 deficit against Pitt before losing on a first OT golden goal and blew a 1-0 lead before succumbing to Notre Dame on an own goal in the 103rd minute.
- The 1-0 loss in the regular season finale against in-state foe Virginia Tech snapped a 16-game unbeaten streak against the Hokies.
- George Gelnovatch became the fastest coach to 90 ACC wins and only the third coach ever to reach the 90-win plateau with a 2-1 overtime win over Syracuse on Oct. 30.
- The Cavaliers season opener of the 2020 season also served as the program's 300th win at Klöckner Stadium, a 2-1 double overtime win over Louisville on Oct. 9.

FIRST TIMERS

- Redshirt freshman Alex Rando made his collegiate debut at goalkeeper against Notre Dame, making four saves including a few highlight worthy stops in the back third of the match. Rando is only the third goalkeeper since Aug. 24, 2018 to start for the Cavaliers.
- Including Rando, 13 players have made their debuts in Virginia uniforms this season - Leo Afonso, Nick Berghold, Isaiah Byrd, Rafael Caipo, Kaya Ignacio, Oliver Gerbig (transfer), Joan Gibert-Fuertes, Reed Kessler, Eben Noverr, Kevin Ogudugu (Transfer), Will Citron and Julian Aguilar.

LATE MATCH FIREWORKS

- A penalty kick drawn by freshman Leo Afonso and converted by Philip Horton against Louisville proved to be the latest goal by the Cavaliers since Jean-Christophe Koffi's game-winner against Pitt on Oct. 20, 2017.

- Serving as a co-captain alongside sophomore Andreas Ueland, Nathaniel Crofts returns for his senior season as the team's top returning scorer from a year ago (6g, 3a). He was part of the 11-man Preseason ACC Players to Watch List.
- Ueland, a freshman All-American after playing every minute of every match as a true freshman was one of eight ACC underclassmen identified as a top underclassman prospect by TopDrawerSoccer.com

HEAD COACH GEORGE GELNOVATCH



George Gelnovatch enters his 25th season as the head coach of the Virginia men's soccer program. The longest tenured head coach in program history, Gelnovatch has led the Cavaliers to a pair of national championships in 2009 and 2014 as well as six NCAA College Cup appearances and 24-consecutive berths in the NCAA tournament.

Gelnovatch became the program's all-time leader in wins on August 25, 2017 with a 3-2 double-overtime victory over Villanova, surpassing his UVA mentor Bruce Arena for the program record in wins with 296. He reached the 300-win plateau on Sept. 15, 2017 with a 2-1 triumph at Virginia Tech, becoming just the fourth coach in Atlantic Coast Conference history to win 300 career matches.

A former Cavalier soccer All-American and assistant coach, Gelnovatch has guided Virginia to five ACC tournament titles, three regular-season ACC championships and a record of 341-134-59 (.694) during his tenure as UVA head coach. Over the course of his 30 years as an assistant and head coach at Virginia, he has been a part of all seven of the Cavaliers' national championships.

Gelnovatch is the first coach in NCAA Division I men's soccer history to lead 20-straight teams to the NCAA tournament. He is one of just eight coaches in the Division I men's soccer annals to take 20 teams to the tournament and one of only four active coaches to do so.

Going into 2020, Gelnovatch ranked as the seventh-winningest active head coach in Division I college soccer, with a .697 career winning percentage. He stood 13th in career wins among current head coaches. Among Division I coaches all-time, he ranked 34th in career wins and 37th in career winning percentage. These figures are even more striking when considering Gelnovatch's teams play one of the nation's toughest schedules on a yearly basis.

Virginia has won at least 15 games in a season 10 times under Gelnovatch, including 2019 when it won 21 games the second most in the history of the program en route to an ACC Coastal Division Championship, an ACC Tournament crown and a Runner-Up finish in the NCAA College Cup.

Gelnovatch has developed a number of Major League Soccer players during his UVA tenure, with 30 players going in MLS drafts and 12 in the MLS Supplemental Draft, while eight signed Project-40/Generacion Adidas contracts and Jordan Allen (2014), Derrick Etienne (2015), Scott Thomsen (2015) and Aboubacar Keita (2018) each signed MLS Homegrown contracts. Jason Moore (1999) and Alecko Eskandarian (2003) were selected No. 1 in the MLS Draft, as 13 Cavaliers have been picked in the first round of the various MLS drafts.

Gelnovatch was named the 10th coach of the Virginia program on Jan. 3, 1996, after Bruce Arena announced he would end his 18-year career at the helm of UVA soccer to become head coach and assistant general manager of Major League Soccer's D.C. United.
