- · Friday night will be a rematch of last year's ACC Quarterfinal match that saw Virginia advance in a 2-1 victory en route to the program's 13th ACC Title.
- The Cavaliers have opened up the 2020 season with four-straight overtime matches for the first time in program history.
- The match is the sixth meeting between the two schools since Syracuse joined the ACC in 2013. Virginia owns a 3-1-1 edge in the all-time series.
- · The two programs were originally scheduled to play an exhibition on Sept. 19 in Charlottesville before the two programs mutually agreed to flip the locations of their two scheduled meetings in 2020. The exhibition eventually was canceled due to COVID related precautions by the Orange and the home regular season game remained for Virginia.
- · Virginia has dropped back-to-back games for the first time since 2015 and is looking to avoid its first three-game losing streak since 2003.
- · Prior to the match Virginia will honor four seniors Beau Bradley, Nathaniel Crofts, Irakoze Donasiyano and Spencer Patton.

FIRST TIMERS

- · Redshirt freshman Alex Rando made his collegiate debut at goalkeeper last week against Notre Dame, making four saves including a few highlight worthy stops in the back third of the match. Rando is only the third goalkeeper since Aug. 24, 2018 to start for the Cavaliers.
- · Including Rando, 10 players have made their debuts in Virginia uniforms this season Leo Afonso, Nick Berghold, Isaiah Byrd, Rafael Caipo, Kaya Ignacio, Oliver Gerbig (transfer), Joan Gibert-Fuertes, Reed Kessler and Kevin Ogudugu (Transfer).

 • Of the six Virginia goals in 2020, three were the first of the collegiate careers of Ignacio, Fuertes and Berghold.

ROAD TRIP RECAP

- The Cavaliers suffered their first regular season road loss since the 2018 NCAA Tournament last weekend at Notre Dame, 2-1 in double overtime. Coincidently the last regular season home loss for the Cavaliers also came in South Bend, a 1-0 extra time
- · Axel Gunnarsson gave Virginia its first, first-half lead of the season with a goal in the 22nd minute. The lead would last until the 54th minute on a goal by Notre Dame's Jack Lynn.
- · The Irish were the beneficiaries of an own goal in the 103rd minute, the second golden goal victory for Notre Dame against Virginia in the last three matchups.
- · Freshman Rafael Caipo was credited with his first collegiate point, assisting on Gunnarsson's go-ahead goal.

EXTRA TIME

- · The Cavaliers last played four-straight overtimes in 2012 and eventually set a school record by playing five-straight OT matches (Oct. 19 - Nov. 9).
- · Of the 15 overtime matches played in college soccer this fall, Virginia (4) and Syracuse (3) have been part of seven of them. Central Arkansas is the only other school to play extra time in three matches this season.
- · Virginia went 3-1-1 in overtime last season is 8-6-15 in extra time since 2016.

TRENDING

- · Virginia has six different goal scorers through four games this season
- The Cavaliers have allowed seven goals through the first four games, the most since 2013
- · Senior Irakoze Donasiyano is expected to start his 46th-straight game, the longest active streak on the team. He also is tied for the team lead in minutes played with 413
- · With the top-four teams from the North Region qualifying for the ACC Tournament, The Cavaliers are tied for third place with
- · Virginia has out-possessed its opponent in all four matches this season. Against Notre Dame, the Cavaliers held the ball for 56 percent of the time, just shy of a season-high 57 percent against Virginia Tech on Oct. 14
- · Of the 10 teams ranked in TopDrawerSoccer.com's weekly Power Rankings, Virginia is ranked ninth and has been as high as No. 1 (Sept. 21) this fall.

RUN FOR 90

- George Gelnovatch seeking 90th career ACC win and would be the fastest coach in ACC history to 90 ACC regular season wins.
- Only two other coaches in ACC history have reached the 90-win mark.

GAME OF FIRSTS

- · Both goals in UVA's 3-2 overtime loss to Pitt were the first of the collegiate careers of Kaya Ignacio (66') and Nick (90').
- · The tally for the true freshman Ignacio was part of a threepoint night that vaulted him into a tie for the team lead for points (3) in just one game.

 • Berghold sat the 2019 season due to injury and checked in
- at the start of the second half to make his collegiate debut. The redshirt freshman leveled the match at two in the 90th minute and logged 47 minutes on the night.
- · Philip Horton, also tied for the team lead with three points, registered his first career assist with the crossing pass that found Ignacio on the far post.
- The loss for Virginia snapped an eight-game win streak at Klöckner Stadium and an eight-match unbeaten streak against ACC opponents that included the 2019 postseason.
- · Pitt scored two first half goals, the first two goals scored on Virginia in the first half of action.

LAST LINE OF DEFENSE

- · Preseason All-American Colin Shutler leads the ACC and ranks third nationally with 4.67 saves per game.
- · In the season opener against Louisville on Oct. 14, Shutler matched a career high with eight saves and was named the co-ACC Player of the Week and listed on TopDrawerSoccer.com's National Team of the Week on Oct. 12.
- Shutler owns the lowest career goals against average (.661) and the highest save percentage (.805) among active NCAA goalkeepers.
- One more shutout and Shutler will move into third place alltime on Virginia's career shutout list. He is eight saves shy of cracking UVA's top-10 saves list.

300 AND BEYOND

- · Virginia's season-opening, 2-0 double overtime win over Louisville on Oct. 9 was also the 300th for the program at Klöckner Stadium.
- · Virginia has won 80 percent (300-60-27) of its matches at Klöckner Stadium since its opening in 1992.
- · Virginia went 15-1 at Klöckner Stadium in 2019, the most home wins of any team in the country and tied for the most in school history (1995).
- Klöckner Stadium has hosted an NCAA Tournament match in all 28 years of its existence.
- The Cavaliers are 40-12-2 (.759) at Klöckner in the NCAA postseason.

HISTORIC OPENING NIGHT

- · Virginia won its seventh-straight season opener with a 2-1, double-overtime victory over Louisville.
- The 300th all-time victory at Klöckner Stadium was clinched by a Philip Horton PK in the 109th minute.
- · Louisville tied the match in the 90th minute and out-shot the Cavaliers 18-9.
- · The last time Virginia opened its season in October was 1974 (Oct. 1) and the latest a Virginia soccer season has started was in 1946 on Oct. 19, a 3-0 loss in the first of 86 meetings against North Carolina.

QUALITY OVER QUANTITY

- · Despite being out-shot 56-32 in its first three matches Virginia has won the possession battle in each game this season.

 Against Virginia Tech, Virginia held a season-high 57 percent of the game's possession despite facing 23 Hokie shot attempts.
- · Dating back to last season, Virginia has been out-shot nine times and lost only two of those matches including the 2019 National Championship game against Georgetown. After two overtimes, the match ended in a 3-3 draw but the Hoyas prevailed in a penalty kick shootout. By rule, the winner of the shootout in a National Championship game is credited with a

- · The 10 returners accounted for 23 of the team's 46 goals last season.
- · Virginia lost four underclassman Joe Bell (Viking FK), Daryl Dike (Orlando City SC), Henry Kessler (New England Revolution) and Daniel Steedman (Atlanta United 2) to the professional
- · According to TopDrawerSoccer.com, the Cavaliers boasted the No. 8 recruiting class, comprised of eight true freshmen, three transfers and two graduate transfers.

PRESEASON HONORS

- · Serving as a co-captain alongside sophomore Andreas Ueland, Nathaniel Crofts returns for his senior season as the team's top returning scorer from a year ago (6g, 3a). He was part of the 11-man Preseason ACC Players to Watch List.
- · Ueland, a freshman All-American after playing every minute of every match as a true freshman was one of eight ACC underclassmen identified as a top underclassman prospect by TopDrawerSoccer.com
- · Goalkeeper Colin Shutler earned Preseason First Team All-America honors from College Soccer News after a consensus First Team All-America nod in 2019. He returns to UVA as a graduate student in 2020 and entered the year with the lowest career goals against average (0.53) among active NCAA goalkeepers.

HEAD COACH GEORGE GELNOVATCH



George Gelnovatch enters his 25th season as the head coach of the Virginia men's soccer program. The longest tenured head coach in program history, Gelnovatch has led the Cavaliers to a pair of national championships in 2009 and 2014 as well as six NCAA College Cup appearances and 24-consecutive berths in the NCAA tournament.

Gelnovatch became the program's all-time leader in wins on August 25, 2017 with a 3-2 double-overtime victory over Villanova, surpassing his UVA mentor Bruce Arena for the program record in wins with 296. He reached the 300-win plateau on Sept. 15, 2017 with a 2-1 triumph at Virginia Tech, becoming just the fourth coach in Atlantic Coast Conference history to win 300 career matches.

A former Cavalier soccer All-American and assistant coach. Gelnovatch has guided Virginia to five ACC tournament titles.

three regular-season ACC championships and a record of 339-133-59 (.694) during his tenure as UVA head coach. Over the course of his 30 years as an assistant and head coach at Virginia, he has been a part of all seven of the Cavaliers' national championships.

Gelnovatch is the first coach in NCAA Division I men's soccer history to lead 20-straight teams to the NCAA tournament. He is one of just eight coaches in the Division I men's soccer annals to take 20 teams to the tournament and one of only four active coaches to do so.

Going into 2020, Gelnovatch ranked as the seventh-winningest active head coach in Division I college soccer, with a .697 career winning percentage. He stood 13th in career wins among current head coaches. Among Division I coaches all-time, he ranked 34th in career wins and 37th in career winning percentage. These figures are even more striking when considering Gelnovatch's teams play one of the nation's toughest schedules on a yearly basis.

Virginia has won at least 15 games in a season 10 times under Gelnovatch, including 2019 when it won 21 games the second most in the history of the program en route to an ACC Coastal Division Championship, an ACC Tournament crown and a Runner-Up finish in the NCAA College Cup.

Gelnovatch has developed a number of Major League Soccer players during his UVA tenure, with 30 players going in MLS drafts and 12 in the MLS Supplemental Draft, while eight signed Project-40/Generation Adidas contracts and Jordan Allen (2014), Derrick Etienne (2015), Scott Thomsen (2015) and Aboubacar Keita (2018) each signed MLS Homegrown contracts. Jason Moore (1999) and Alecko Eskandarian (2003) were selected No. 1 in the MLS Draft, as 13 Cavaliers have been picked in the first round of the various MLS drafts.

Gelnovatch was named the 10th coach of the Virginia program on Jan. 3, 1996, after Bruce Arena announced he would end his 18-year career at the helm of UVA soccer to become head coach and assistant general manager of Major League Soccer's D.C. United.
