MATCH NOTES

FOR STARTERS

- Friday will be the second meeting between Virginia and Virginia Tech this season, only the third time the two schools have played twice in the same season (1961, 2014 & 2020).
- The winner of Friday's match will secure the ACC North Region second seed in the upcoming ACC Tournament. A draw and a Notre Dame loss will secure the second seed for the Hokies.
- Friday will mark the final home event at Klöckner Stadium in 2020. Despite clinching a berth into the ACC Tournament, all upcoming matches will be played at neutral sites.
- Virginia is seeking its 200th ACC regular season victory, no other program in the ACC has 200 regular season victories.

ROUND TWO

- The then-No. 5 Cavaliers and Hokies played to a 1-1 draw in Blacksburg back on Oct. 14, a match that was originally supposed to begin the 2020 season for both teams on Oct. 3.
- Virginia responded just one minute and 26 seconds after Virginia Tech scored the game's opening goal in the 76th minute.
- Joan Gibert Fuertes scored his first collegiate goal off a free kick to knot the game at one at the 77 minute mark.
- The Cavaliers were unsuccessful on PK attempt by Irakoze Donasiyano in the 61st minute.
- Virginia Tech out-shot Virginia 23-10 in the contest but the Cavaliers held over 60 percent of the game's possession. Only five of the Hokies 23 attempts landed on target compared to four by the Cavaliers.

POSTSEASON IMPLICATIONS

- Virginia has clinched a berth in the upcoming eight team ACC Tournament (Nov. 15-22).
- A win over Virginia Tech secures the No. 2 seed in the North Region.
- Seeds 2, 3 and 4 are all in play for the Cavaliers entering the weekend. The final bracket along with times and locations of the tournament matches is set to be announced after play has concluded on Friday night.

THE RIVALRY

- The last two matches at Klöckner Stadium have resulted in draws (2018 and 2016). The Cavaliers last victory against the Hokies on their home pitch came on Nov. 5, 2014 in the rivalry's only ACC Tournament affair.
- Since 2004, the two schools have met every season with the exception of 2015.
- Virginia owns a 41-4-6 advantage in the all-time series that dates back to 1960.
- George Gelnovatch is 14-2-6 against the Hokies in his tenure as head coach.
- Virginia is 8-1-3 against Virginia Tech at Klöckner Stadium, its only setback coming on Oct. 29, 2005, a 2-1 golden goal victory for the Hokies.

BREAKING DOWN HOOS SCORING

- All seven goals by Virginia this season have been scored by different goal scorers and no one on the team has scored multiple goals this season.
- Three of the seven UVA goals have come off set pieces, two off penalty kicks.
- Penalty kick goals against Louisville (10/9) and Syracuse (10/30) proved to be game-winners.
- Andreas Ueland, who's PK against Syracuse last Friday, was the third Cavalier to attempt a PK this season (most since 2013).
- Five of Virginia's seven goals have come in the 60th minute or later and only one in the first half.

90-WIN CLUB

- Virginia head coach George Gelnovatch became the fastest coach in ACC history to record 90 league wins with a 1-0 victory over Syracuse last Friday.
- He is one of three coaches in ACC history to reach the 90-win plateau - John Rennie (Duke) and I.M. Ibrahim.
- In the process, Gelnovatch registered career win No. 340 and moved him into a tie for 10th in career victories among active NCAA D-I coaches.

NO PLACE LIKE HOME

- Both Cavalier victories this Fall have come at Klöckner Stadium.
- Every year of its existence, Virginia has posted a .500 or above winning percentage at Klöckner Stadium and are 17-2 in the last 19 games in Charlottesville.
- Virginia's season-opening, 2-1 double overtime win over Louisville on Oct. 9 was also the 300th for the program at Klöckner Stadium.
- Virginia has won 81 percent (301-60-27) of its matches at Klöckner Stadium since its opening in 1992.
- Virginia went 15-1 at Klöckner Stadium in 2019, the most home wins of any team in the country and tied for the most in school history (1995).
- Klöckner Stadium has hosted an NCAA Tournament match in all 28 years of its existence.

• The Cavaliers are 40-12-2 (.759) at Klöckner in the NCAA postseason.

TRENDING

- Redshirt freshman Alex Rando made his second-consecutive start last Friday and made four saves in the Cavaliers' first clean sheet of the season. It marked the first UVA shutout since the Third Round of the 2019 NCAA Tournament.
- Senior Irakoze Donasiyano has started in 46-straight games for the Cavaliers, the longest active streak on the team. He has played every minute of every match this season along with teammates Oliver Gerbig, Bret Halsey and Andreas Ueland.
- Virginia has out-possessed its opponent in all five matches this season.
- Of the 10 teams ranked in TopDrawerSoccer.com's weekly Power Rankings, Virginia is ranked eighth, sliding up one spot from last week. UVA has been as high as No. 1 (Sept. 21) this fall.

FIRST TIMERS

- Redshirt freshman Alex Rando made his collegiate debut at goalkeeper against Notre Dame, making four saves including a few highlight worthy stops in the back third of the match. Rando is only the third goalkeeper since Aug. 24, 2018 to start for the Cavaliers.
- Including Rando, 10 players have made their debuts in Virginia uniforms this season - Leo Afonso, Nick Berghold, Isaiah Byrd, Rafael Caipo, Kaya Ignacio, Oliver Gerbig (transfer), Joan Gilbert-Fuertes, Reed Kessler and Kevin Ogudugu (Transfer).
- Of the six Virginia goals in 2020, three were the first of the collegiate careers of Ignacio, Fuertes and Berghold.

EXTRA TIME

- For the first time in school history, Virginia opened the season with four-straight overtime matches.
- The Cavaliers last played four-straight overtime games in 2012 and eventually set a school record by playing five-straight OT matches (Oct. 19 – Nov. 9).
- Of the 17 overtime matches played in college soccer this fall, Virginia (4) and Virginia Tech (3) have been part of seven of them.
- Virginia went 3-1-1 in overtime last season is 8-6-15 in extra time since 2016.

GAME OF FIRSTS

- Both goals in UVA's 3-2 overtime loss to Pitt were the first of the collegiate careers of Kaya Ignacio (66') and Nick Berghold (90').
- The tally for the true freshman Ignacio was part of a three-point night that vaulted him into a tie for the team lead for points (3) in just one game.
- Berghold sat the 2019 season due to injury and checked in at the start of the second half to make his collegiate debut. The redshirt freshman leveled the match at two in the 90th minute and logged 47 minutes on the night.
- Philip Horton, also tied for the team lead with three points, registered his first career assist with the crossing pass that found Ignacio on the far post.
- The loss against Pitt for Virginia snapped an eight-game win streak at Klöckner Stadium and an eight-match unbeaten streak against ACC opponents that included the 2019 postseason.
- Pitt scored two first half goals, the first two goals scored on Virginia in the first half of action.

LAST LINE OF DEFENSE

- Preseason All-American Colin Shutler leads the ACC and ranks third nationally with 4.67 saves per game.
- In the season opener against Louisville on Oct. 14, Shutler matched a career high with eight saves and was named the co-ACC Player of the Week and listed on TopDrawerSoccer.com's National Team of the Week on Oct. 12.
- Shutler owns the lowest career goals against average (.661) and the highest save percentage (.805) among active NCAA goalkeepers.
- One more shutout and Shutler will move into third place all-time on Virginia's career shutout list. He is eight saves shy of cracking UVA's top-10 saves list.

HISTORIC OPENING NIGHT

- Virginia won its seventh-straight season opener with a 2-1, double-overtime victory over Louisville.
- The 300th all-time victory at Klöckner Stadium was clinched by a Philip Horton PK in the 109th minute.
- Louisville tied the match in the 90th minute and out-shot the Cavaliers 18-9.
- The last time Virginia opened its season in October was 1974 (Oct. 1) and the latest a Virginia soccer season has started was in 1946 on Oct. 19, a 3-0 loss in the first of 86 meetings against North Carolina.

QUALITY OVER QUANTITY

- Despite being out-shot 56-32 in its first three matches Virginia has won the possession battle in each game this season. Against Virginia Tech, Virginia held a season-high 57 percent of the game's possession despite facing 23 Hokie shot attempts.
- Dating back to last season, Virginia has been out-shot nine times and lost only two of those matches including the 2019 National Championship game against Georgetown. After two overtimes, the match ended in a 3-3 draw but the Hoyas prevailed in a penalty kick shootout. By rule, the winner of the shootout in a National Championship game is credited with a win.

He returns to UVA as a graduate student in 2020 and entered the year with the lowest career goals against average (0.53) among active NCAA goalkeepers.

HEAD COACH GEORGE GELNOVATCH



George Gelnovatch enters his 25th season as the head coach of the Virginia men's soccer program. The longest tenured head coach in program history, Gelnovatch has led the Cavaliers to a pair of national championships in 2009 and 2014 as well as six NCAA College Cup appearances and 24-consecutive berths in the NCAA tournament.

Gelnovatch became the program's all-time leader in wins on August 25, 2017 with a 3-2 double-overtime victory over Villanova, surpassing his UVA mentor Bruce Arena for the program record in wins with 296. He reached the 300-win plateau on Sept. 15, 2017 with a 2-1 triumph at Virginia Tech, becoming just the fourth coach in Atlantic Coast Conference history to win 300 career matches.

A former Cavalier soccer All-American and assistant coach, Gelnovatch has guided Virginia to five ACC tournament titles, three regular-season ACC championships and a record of 340-133-59 (.694) during his tenure as UVA head coach. Over the course of his 30 years as an assistant and head coach at Virginia, he has been a part of all seven of the Cavaliers' national championships.

Gelnovatch is the first coach in NCAA Division I men's soccer history to lead 20-straight teams to the NCAA tournament. He is one of just eight coaches in the Division I men's soccer annals to take 20 teams to the tournament and one of only four active coaches to do so.

Going into 2020, Gelnovatch ranked as the seventh-winningest active head coach in Division I college soccer, with a .697 career winning percentage. He stood 13th in career wins among current head coaches. Among Division I coaches all-time, he ranked 34th in career wins and 37th in career winning percentage. These figures are even more striking when considering Gelnovatch's teams play one of the nation's toughest schedules on a yearly basis.

Virginia has won at least 15 games in a season 10 times under Gelnovatch, including 2019 when it won 21 games the second most in the history of the program en route to an ACC Coastal Division Championship, an ACC Tournament crown and a Runner-Up finish in the NCAA College Cup.

Gelnovatch has developed a number of Major League Soccer players during his UVA tenure, with 30 players going in MLS drafts and 12 in the MLS Supplemental Draft, while eight signed Project-40/Generations Adidas contracts and Jordan Allen (2014), Derrick Etienne (2015), Scott Thomsen (2015) and Aboubacar Keita (2018) each signed MLS Homegrown contracts. Jason Moore (1999) and Alecko Eskandarian (2003) were selected No. 1 in the MLS Draft, as 13 Cavaliers have been picked in the first round of the various MLS drafts.

Gelnovatch was named the 10th coach of the Virginia program on Jan. 3, 1996, after Bruce Arena announced he would end his 18-year career at the helm of UVA soccer to become head coach and assistant general manager of Major League Soccer's D.C. United.

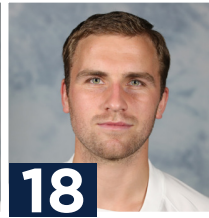

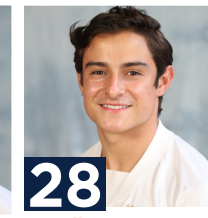
