#### AGAINST THE DEMON DEACONS

 Virginia and Wake Forest played twice last season, both meetings occurring in the postseason. The Cavaliers ousted the De-mon Deacons in the ACC Semifinals with a 1-0 victory at Klöckner Stadium and followed it up with a 2-1 win in the NCAA College Cup Semifinals in Cary, N.C

 The Demon Deacons 5-3-2 against the Cavaliers in the last 10 meetings.
 From 2010 to 2013 the two programs met each year in the ACC Quarterfinals, three matches went to extra time and the 2012 meeting ended with the Cavaliers advancing on penalty kicks.

 The two teams feature head coaches ranked in the top-12 in career winning percentage among active head coaches. Gelnovatch ranks eighth (.693) and Bobby Muuss is tied for 12th (.675)

#### HOW WE GOT HERE

· For the first time in program history, Virginia started its season with four-straight overtime matches, with the first three occur-

ring in a nine-day span. • The Cavaliers recorded victories over Louisville and Syracuse while picking up a point on the road at Virginia Tech. • Virginia was shutout for the first time since 2018 in its season finale against Virginia Tech, relegating the Cavaliers to the fourth seed in the ACC North Region.

• Two of the three Cavalier losses have come in extra time. The Cavaliers erased a 2-0 deficit against Pitt before losing on a first OT golden goal and blew a 1-0 lead before succumbing to Notre Dame on an own goal in the 103rd minute.

• The 1-0 loss in the regular season finale against in state foe Virginia Tech snapped a 16-game unbeaten streak against the Hokies

#### VIRGINIA IN THE ACC TOURNAMENT

The Cavaliers own the most wins (45), goals (116), semifinals appearances (27), finals appearances (20) and tournament titles (11) in 33 years of the ACC Tournament.

Including last year's ACC title run, Virginia has been in the ACC Championship game, two of the last three seasons.
 Under George Gelnovatch, Virginia has won five ACC Tournament Championships (1997, 2003, 2004, 2009, 2019) in his 25-

vear tenure.

• Virginia is 45-19-12 in ACC Tournament games.

The Cavaliers will not play an ACC Tournament home game for the first time since 2015.

#### SEASON MILESTONES

 George Gelnovatch became the fastest coach to 90 ACC wins and only the third coach ever to reach the 90-win plateau with a 2-1 overtime win over Syracuse on Oct. 30.

• The Cavaliers season opener of the 2020 season also served as the program's 300th win at Klöckner Stadium, a 2-1 double overtime win over Louisville on Oct. 9.

#### MISSING PIECES

The Cavaliers have gone without preseason All-American goalkeeper Colin Shutler and the team's leading returning scorer in Nathaniel Crofts for the majority of Fall. Shutler has missed the last three matches while Crofts hasn't played since opening night.

• In Virginia's loss to Virginia Tech, Virginia starting XI included just four starters (Andreas Ueland, Bret Halsey, Axel Gunnarsson, Irakoze Donasiyano) from the National Championship game last year.

The Cavaliers have used six different lineup combinations in six matches this year.

#### TRENDING

Senior Irakoze Donasiyano has started in 47-straight games for the Cavaliers, the longest active streak on the team. Dating back to last season, Donasiyano has played in 888 consecutive minutes of action.
 Andreas Ueland has played every minute of his college career (2,813) and has started 30 matches in a row for the Cavaliers.

· Along with Ueland and Donasiyano, Bret Halsey and Oliver Gerbig have not come off the field in six matches this season.

Virginia has out-possessed its opponent in five of its six matches this season.

· Of the 10 teams ranked in TopDrawerSoccer.com's weekly Power Rankings, Virginia is ranked 10th. UVA has been as high as No. 1 (Sept. 21) this Fall.

· Redshirt freshman Alex Rando has made the last three starts in goal for the Cavaliers. He was credited with his first career shutout against Syracuse on Oct. 30, the first UVA clean sheet since the first UVA Third Round of the 2019 NCAA Tournament.

· Five of Virginia's seven goals have come in the 60th minute or later and only one in the first half.

#### FIRST TIMERS

· Redshirt freshman Alex Rando made his collegiate debut at goalkeeper against Notre Dame, making four saves including a few highlight worthy stops in the back third of the match. Rando is only the third goalkeeper since Aug. 24, 2018 to start for the Cavaliers.

· Including Rando, 11 players have made their debuts in Virginia uniforms this season - Leo Afonso, Nick Berghold, Isaiah Byrd, Rafael Caipo, Kaya Ignacio, Oliver, Gerbig (transfer), Joan Gibert-Fuertes, Reed Kessler, Eben Noverr and Kevin Ogudugu (Transfer).

Of the six Virginia goals in 2020, three were the first of the collegiate careers of Ignacio, Fuertes and Berghold.

#### **EXTRA TIME**

· For the first time in school history, Virginia opened the season with four-straight overtime matches.

 The Cavaliers last played four-straight overtime games in 2012 and eventually set a school record by playing five-straight OT matches (Oct. 19 – Nov. 9).

• Of the 17 overtime matches played in college soccer this Fall, Virginia (4) and Virginia Tech (3) have been part of seven of them.

· Virginia went 3-1-1 in overtime last season is 8-6-15 in extra time since 2016.

#### QUALITY OVER QUANTITY

· Dating back to last season, Virginia has been out-shot 11 times and lost only three of those matches including the 2019 National Championship game against Georgetown. After two overtimes, the match ended in a 3-3 draw but the Hoyas prevailed in a penalty kick shootout. By rule, the winner of the shootout in a National Championship game is credited with a win.

· Both goals in UVA's 3-2 overtime loss to Pitt were the first of the collegiate careers of Kaya Ignacio (66') and Nick Berghold (90').

 The tally for the true freshman Ignacio was part of a threepoint night that vaulted him into a tie for the team lead for

points (3) in just one game.
Berghold sat the 2019 season due to injury and checked in at the start of the second half to make his collegiate debut. The redshirt freshman leveled the match at two in the 90th minute and logged 47 minutes on the night. • Philip Horton, also tied for the team lead with three points,

registered his first career assist with the crossing pass that found Ignacio on the far post.

 The loss against Pitt for Virginia snapped an eight-game win streak at Klöckner Stadium and an eight-match unbeaten streak against ACC opponents that included the 2019 postseason.

#### LAST LINE OF DEFENSE

· Preseason All-American Colin Shutler leads the ACC and ranks third nationally with 4.67 saves per game.

· In the season opener against Louisville on Oct. 14, Shutler matched a career high with eight saves and was named the co-ACC Player of the Week and listed on TopDrawerSoccer.com's National Team of the Week on Oct. 12.

· Shutler owns the lowest career goals against average (.661) and the highest save percentage (.805) among active NCAA goalkeepers.

· One more shutout and Shutler will move into third place alltime on Virginia's career shutout list. He is eight saves shy of cracking UVA's top-10 saves list.

# HEAD COACH GEORGE GELNOVATCH



George Gelnovatch enters his 25th season as the head coach , GELNOVATCH'S UVA COACHING YEARS of the Virginia men's soccer program. The longest tenured head coach in program history, Gelnovatch has led the Cavaliers to a pair of national championships in 2009 and 2014 as well as six NCAA College Cup appearances and 24-consecutive berths in the NCAA tournament.

Gelnovatch became the program's all-time leader in wins on August 25, 2017 with a 3-2 double-overtime victory over Villanova, surpassing his UVA mentor Bruce Arena for the program record in wins with 296. He reached the 300-win plateau on Sept. 15, 2017 with a 2-1 triumph at Virginia Tech, becoming just the fourth coach in Atlantic Coast Conference history to win 300 career matches.

A former Cavalier soccer All-American and assistant coach. Gelnovatch has guided Virginia to five ACC tournament titles,

three regular-season ACC championships and a record of 340-133-59 (.694) during his tenure as UVA head coach. Over the course of his 30 years as an assistant and head coach at Virginia, he has been a part of all seven of the Cavaliers' national championships.

Gelnovatch is the first coach in NCAA Division I men's soccer history to lead 20-straight teams to the NCAA tournament. He is one of just eight coaches in the Division I men's soccer annals to take 20 teams to the tournament and one of only four active coaches to do so.

Going into 2020, Gelnovatch ranked as the seventh-winningest active head coach in Division I college soccer, with a .697 career winning percentage. He stood 13th in career wins among current head coaches. Among Division I coaches all-time, he ranked 34th in career wins and 37th in career winning percentage. These figures are even more striking when considering Gelnovatch's teams play one of the nation's toughest schedules on a yearly basis.

Virginia has won at least 15 games in a season 10 times under Gelnovatch, including 2019 when it won 21 games the second most in the history of the program en route to an ACC Coastal Division Championship, an ACC Tournament crown and a Runner-Up finish in the NCAA College Cup.

Gelnovatch has developed a number of Major League Soccer players during his UVA tenure, with 30 players going in MLS drafts and 12 in the MLS Supplemental Draft, while eight signed Project-40/Generation Adidas contracts and Jordan Allen (2014), Derrick Etienne (2015), Scott Thomsen (2015) and Aboubacar Keita (2018) each signed MLS Homegrown contracts. Jason Moore (1999) and Alecko Eskandarian (2003) were selected No. 1 in the MLS Draft, as 13 Cavaliers have been picked in the first round of the various MLS drafts.

Gelnovatch was named the 10th coach of the Virginia program on Jan. 3, 1996, after Bruce Arena announced he would end his 18-year career at the helm of UVA soccer to become head coach and assistant general manager of Major League Soccer's D.C. United.


