MATCH NOTES

FOR STARTERS

- Wednesday will be a rematch of the 2019 ACC Championship game in which Clemson and Virginia were ranked No. 1 and No. 2 in the country, respectively. The Cavaliers won their 11th tournament crown after a 3-1 comeback win in Cary, N.C.
- Clemson comes into Wednesday as the No. 2 ranked team in the country and is the third seed out of the South Region. The Tigers upset Virginia Tech on Sunday, 4-1 in Durham, N.C.
- Coming in as the No. 2 team in the country according to the United Soccer Coaches Poll, Clemson is the third top-5 opponent Virginia will face this season. The Cavaliers are 1-1 against top-5 opponents this year and went 4-1 against top-5 opponents last season.
- The winner of Wednesday's match will play the winner of Pittsburgh and Notre Dame on Sunday (Nov. 22) in Cary, N.C. Pitt and Notre Dame will play at 8 p.m. in Raleigh, N.C. on Wednesday night also on ACC Network.

POSTSEASON PLAYER

- It took just one minute and 18 seconds for Cabrel Happi Kamseu to make an impact in the quarterfinal victory over Wake Forest. Shortly after checking in, Happi Kamseu scored his first goal of the season and what would eventually be the game-winner on Sunday in the 31st minute.
- He went on to score his second goal of the match in the 52nd minute intercepting a pass deep in the Demon Deacon zone before chipping it over the goalkeeper's head. He vaulted himself into the team lead in goals (2) and points (4)
- Happi Kamseu became the Cavaliers' first multiple goal scorer since Daryl Dike's brace against the same Wake Forest program in the semifinals of the 2019 College Cup.
- The appearance was Happi Kamseu's second of the season, his only other action coming in a start at Virginia Tech on Oct. 14. He logged 50 minutes of action.
- The two goals were his second and third ACC Tournament goals of his career. He scored the game-winner in the 2019 ACC Championship match against Clemson and earned a spot on the ACC All-Tournament Team
- Happi Kamseu now has nine career goals, second most on the team to Nathaniel Crofts' 11.

QUARTERFINAL RECAP

- Virginia logged its first road win and second clean sheet of the season with a 2-0 upset win over Wake Forest on Sunday night.
- Coming into the match, Wake Forest's 18 goals were the most by any ACC team this Fall.
- Virginia out-shot the Demon Deacons, 11-10 and held 55 percent of the game's possession. Of the 11 shot attempts by the Cavaliers landed seven on target compared to just two by Wake Forest.
- The Cavaliers improved to 16-0-5 against Wake Forest all-time in the ACC Tournament.

ROSTER REINFORCEMENTS

- Virginia welcomed captain Nathaniel Crofts and All-American goalkeeper Colin Shutler back to the lineup on Sunday. Crofts logged 73 minutes in his first action since the opening match of the season against Louisville. Shutler missed three games and made his first start since Oct. 18.
- Sophomore Jeremy Verley, who appeared three games off the bench as a freshman and saw his first action of 2020 in the season finale against Virginia Tech made his first start of his career in the ACC Quarterfinal. He played all but nine minutes in Sunday's victory.
- In the regular season finale against Virginia Tech, Virginia's starting XI included just four starters (Andreas Ueland, Bret Halsey, Axel Gunnarsson, Irakoze Donasiyano) from the National Championship game last year.

VIRGINIA IN THE ACC TOURNAMENT

- The Cavaliers own the most wins (46), goals (118), semifinals appearances (28), finals appearances (20) and tournament titles (11) in 33 years of the ACC Tournament.
- Including last year's ACC title run, Virginia has been in the ACC Championship game, two of the last three seasons.
- Under George Gelnovatch, Virginia has won five ACC Tournament Championships (1997, 2003, 2004, 2009, 2019) in his 25-year tenure.
- Virginia is 46-19-12 in ACC Tournament games.
- The Cavaliers will not play an ACC Tournament home game for the first time since 2015.

TRENDING

- For their efforts in the quarterfinal round, Happi Kamseu and Andreas Ueland were named to the TopDrawerSoccer.com Team of the Week. Ueland was listed for the third time in his young career while Happi Kamseu got the nod for the first time.
- Virginia improved to 2-1 when scoring two or more goals this season and in the program's history, have never lost when scoring two or more goals in an ACC Tournament match (34 occasions).
- Nathaniel Crofts has scored five goals in postseason play over the course of his career, two in the ACC Tournament and three in the NCAA Tournament. His five game-winning goals in 2019 were the second most in the ACC.
- Colin Shutler registered his 24th career shutout, tying him with Diego Restrepo for the third most in UVA history. His 24 shut-outs are the second most among active NCAA goalkeepers (Enrique Facusse, Kentucky - 29).
- Senior Irakoze Donasiyano has started in 48-straight games for the Cavaliers, the longest active streak on the team. Dating back to last season, Donasiyano has played in 978 consecutive minutes of action.
- Andreas Ueland has played every minute of his college career (2,903) and has started 31 matches in a row for the Cavaliers. Last year he became one of nine UVA freshmen to start every game on one of UVA's 13 College Cup teams and is one of two first years to have played every minute of every match on a UVA College Cup squad.

NOTES CONTINUED

- Along with Ueland and Donasiyano, Bret Halsey and Oliver Gerbig have not come off the field in seven matches this season.
- Virginia has out-possessed its opponent in six of its seven matches this season.

BREAKING DOWN HOOS SCORING

- With nine goals on the season, the Cavaliers have put forth eight different goal scorers. Happi Kamseu is the only multiple goal scorer on the team and he scored them both in the same game.
- Three of the nine UVA goals have come off set pieces, two off penalty kicks.
- Penalty kick goals against Louisville (10/9) and Syracuse (10/30) proved to be game-winners.
- Andreas Ueland, who's PK against Syracuse served as a game-winner, was the third Cavalier to attempt a PK this season (most since 2013).
- The three Cavalier penalty kick attempts are the most of an NCAA team this fall.
- Five of Virginia's nine goals have come in the 60th minute or later and only one in the first half.

REGULAR SEASON REVIEW

- For the first time in program history, Virginia started its season with four-straight overtime matches, with the first three occurring in a nine-day span.
- The Cavaliers recorded victories over Louisville and Syracuse while picking up a point on the road at Virginia Tech.
- Virginia was shutout for the first time since 2018 in its season finale against Virginia Tech, relegating the Cavaliers to the fourth seed in the ACC North Region.
- Two of the three Cavalier losses have come in extra time. The Cavaliers erased a 2-0 deficit against Pitt before losing on a first OT golden goal and blew a 1-0 lead before succumbing to Notre Dame on an own goal in the 103rd minute.
- The 1-0 loss in the regular season finale against in-state foe Virginia Tech snapped a 16-game unbeaten streak against the Hokies.
- George Gelnovatch became the fastest coach to 90 ACC wins and only the third coach ever to reach the 90-win plateau with a 2-1 overtime win over Syracuse on Oct. 30.
- The Cavaliers season opener of the 2020 season also served as the program's 300th win at Klöckner Stadium, a 2-1 double overtime win over Louisville on Oct. 9.

FIRST TIMERS

- Redshirt freshman Alex Rando made his collegiate debut at goalkeeper against Notre Dame, making four saves including a few highlight worthy stops in the back third of the match. Rando is only the third goalkeeper since Aug. 24, 2018 to start for the Cavaliers.
- Including Rando, 11 players have made their debuts in Virginia uniforms this season - Leo Afonso, Nick Berghold, Isaiah Byrd, Rafael Caipo, Kaya Ignacio, Oliver Gerbig (transfer), Joan Gibert-Fuertes, Reed Kessler, Eben Noverr and Kevin Ogudugu (Transfer).
- Of the nine Virginia goals in 2020, three were the first of the collegiate careers of Ignacio, Fuertes and Berghold.

EXTRA TIME

- For the first time in school history, Virginia opened the season with four-straight overtime matches.
- The Cavaliers last played four-straight overtime games in 2012 and eventually set a school record by playing five-straight OT matches (Oct. 19 - Nov. 9).
- Of the 17 overtime matches played in college soccer this fall, Virginia (4) and Virginia Tech (3) have been part of seven of them.
- Virginia went 3-1-1 in overtime last season is 8-6-15 in extra time since 2016.

QUALITY OVER QUANTITY

- Dating back to last season, Virginia has been out-shot 11 times and lost only three of those matches including the 2019 National Championship game against Georgetown. After two overtimes, the match ended in a 3-3 draw but the Hoyas prevailed in a penalty kick shootout. By rule, the winner of the shootout in a National Championship game is credited with a win.

LAST LINE OF DEFENSE

- Preseason All-American Colin Shutler leads the ACC and ranks second nationally with 4.00 saves per game.
- In the season opener against Louisville on Oct. 14, Shutler matched a career high with eight saves and was named the co-ACC Player of the Week and listed on TopDrawerSoccer.com's National Team of the Week on Oct. 12.
- Shutler owns the lowest career goals against average (.646) and the highest save percentage (.808) among active NCAA goalkeepers.
- One more shutout and Shutler will move into third place all-time on Virginia's career shutout list. He is six saves shy of cracking UVA's top-10 saves list.

HEAD COACH GEORGE GELNOVATCH



George Gelnovatch enters his 25th season as the head coach of the Virginia men's soccer program. The longest tenured head coach in program history, Gelnovatch has led the Cavaliers to a pair of national championships in 2009 and 2014 as well as six NCAA College Cup appearances and 24-consecutive berths in the NCAA tournament.

Gelnovatch became the program's all-time leader in wins on August 25, 2017 with a 3-2 double-overtime victory over Villanova, surpassing his UVA mentor Bruce Arena for the program record in wins with 296. He reached the 300-win plateau on Sept. 15, 2017 with a 2-1 triumph at Virginia Tech, becoming just the fourth coach in Atlantic Coast Conference history to win 300 career matches.

A former Cavalier soccer All-American and assistant coach, Gelnovatch has guided Virginia to five ACC tournament titles, three regular-season ACC championships and a record of 341-134-59 (.694) during his tenure as UVA head coach. Over the course of his 30 years as an assistant and head coach at Virginia, he has been a part of all seven of the Cavaliers' national championships.

Gelnovatch is the first coach in NCAA Division I men's soccer history to lead 20-straight teams to the NCAA tournament. He is one of just eight coaches in the Division I men's soccer annals to take 20 teams to the tournament and one of only four active coaches to do so.

Going into 2020, Gelnovatch ranked as the seventh-winningest active head coach in Division I college soccer, with a .697 career winning percentage. He stood 13th in career wins among current head coaches. Among Division I coaches all-time, he ranked 34th in career wins and 37th in career winning percentage. These figures are even more striking when considering Gelnovatch's teams play one of the nation's toughest schedules on a yearly basis.

Virginia has won at least 15 games in a season 10 times under Gelnovatch, including 2019 when it won 21 games the second most in the history of the program en route to an ACC Coastal Division Championship, an ACC Tournament crown and a Runner-Up finish in the NCAA College Cup.

Gelnovatch has developed a number of Major League Soccer players during his UVA tenure, with 30 players going in MLS drafts and 12 in the MLS Supplemental Draft, while eight signed Project-40/Generations Adidas contracts and Jordan Allen (2014), Derrick Etienne (2015), Scott Thomsen (2015) and Aboubacar Keita (2018) each signed MLS Homegrown contracts. Jason Moore (1999) and Alecko Eskandarian (2003) were selected No. 1 in the MLS Draft, as 13 Cavaliers have been picked in the first round of the various MLS drafts.

Gelnovatch was named the 10th coach of the Virginia program on Jan. 3, 1996, after Bruce Arena announced he would end his 18-year career at the helm of UVA soccer to become head coach and assistant general manager of Major League Soccer's D.C. United.

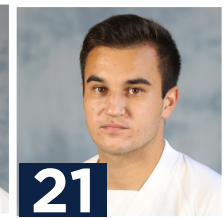

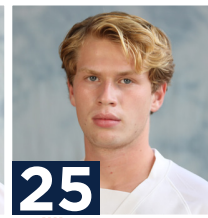

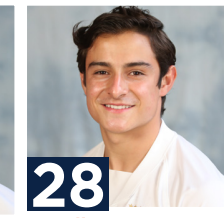
