 This week Virginia is ranked No. 9 in both the USILA coaches and Inside Lacrosse media polls.

THE SERIES VS. ROBERT MORRIS

 Saturday is the fourth all-time meeting between UVA and Robert Morris with the Cavaliers holding a 3-0 edge.

· RMU first came to Klöckner Stadium in 2010 when the Cavaliers were ranked No. 1 in the nation and UVA cruised to an 18-9 victory.

• UVA led early in the 2017 meeting, 6-0, before RMU came roaring back. Virginia finished off the win by six goals, 13-7.

 UVA and RMU last met in the first round of the 2019 NCAA Tournament, the Cavaliers first win on their way to the program's sixth NCAA title.

• RMU head coach Andrew McMinn is in his 10th season at Robert Morris and has took the Colonials to back-to-back NCAA Tournaments in 2018 and 2019 as champions of the NEC. RMU is playing the 2021 season as an independent in men's lacrosse before joining the newly formed ASUN men's lacrosse league for 2022. The rest of RMU's sports joined the Horizon League last summer.

LASALLA GETTING THE WIN AT THE FACEOFF X

 Petey LaSalla won 21 faceoffs last time out, a career high. The 21 faceoff wins is tied for No. 8 on UVA's all-time single-game list. He is only the 13th Cavalier to win 20+ faceoffs in a single game.

COVERING THE CAVALIERS

UNIQUELY UVA

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

UNIVERSITY NICKNAMES

Virginia's athletics teams have been accompanied by a somewhat confusing array of nicknames. The most prominent and widely accepted of these monikers are "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos."

Although the terms "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are used almost interchangeably to refer to University teams and players, "Cavaliers" is more often used by the media, while "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are frequently used by Virginia students and fans.

Legend has it that Washington & Lee baseball fans dubbed the Virginia players "Wahoos" during the fiercely contested rivalry that existed between the two in-state schools in the 1890s. By 1940, "Wahoos"

was in general use around Grounds to denote University students or events relating to them. The abbreviated "Hoos" sprang up later in student newspapers and has gained growing popularity in recent vears.

THE CAVALIER MASCOT

The costumed Cavalier with a large character head debuted during Virginia's 1984 football season and has remained the official mascot of the University.

UNIVERSITY COLORS

Orange and blue were adopted as the University of Virginia's official athletic colors at a mass student meeting in 1888. UVA athletic teams had previously worn silver gray and cardinal red, but those colors did not stand out on muddy football fields, prompting a student movement to change them.

One of the students attending the mass meeting was Allen Potts, a star athlete who played on Virginia's first football team in 1888. Potts showed up at the meeting wearing a navy blue-and-orange scarf that he had acquired during a summer boating expedition at Oxford University. Orange and blue were chosen as the official athletic colors after one of Potts' fellow students pulled the scarf off Potts' neck and, waving it to the crowd, yelled, "How will this do?" UVA later served as the inspiration for schools like Auburn and Florida when they selected school colors.

WAH-HOO-WAH

The origin of "Wah-hoo-wah" is uncertain. The cheer was used to root on Virginia teams as early as 1890 and may have been borrowed from Dartmouth College, whose athletics teams were once known as

the Indians.

Legend attributes the yell to Natalie Floyd Otey, who sang the ballad "Where'er You Are, There Shall My Love Be" at Charlottesville's Levy Opera House in 1893. The predominantly student audience noticed that Otey warbled the first three words of the song between each of the stanzas and decided to join in the refrain. By evening's end, goes the legend, the crowd had corrupted "Where'er You Are" into "Wahhoo-wah."

The Levy Opera House stands at the corner of High Street and Park Street and has since been renovated into an office building.

THE SERIES VS. THE COLONIALS

• Virginia leads the all-time series with Robert Morris, 3-0, in a series that began in 2010. The first meeting was an 18-9 thrasing when UVA was the No. 1 team in the nation in 2010.

· Chris Bocklet had a day against the Colonials, scoring six goals and dishing out three assists for a careerhigh nine points. Bocklet's six goals that day against RMU equaled a career high that he accomplished three times during his illustrious UVA career.

• In the 2010 meeting, 13 Cavaliers scored points as UVA assisted 14 of 18 goals.

• UVA also received multi-goal games from Matt White (3), Rhamel Bratton (2), Matt Kugler (2) and Tim Fuchs (2).

 The 2017 meeting came in Lars Tiffany's first season as the head coach of UVA. The Cavaliers opened the game on a 6-0 run and held on for a 13-7 dogfight.

· GK Griffin Thompson made 18 saves against the Colonials, which at the time tied a UVA program record for single-game saves by a freshman goalkeeper. That record was broken in 2019 by Patrick Burkinshaw at Princeton (24).

· Michael Kraus led the way for UVA with four points on three goals and one assist. Joe French also had three scores in the contest as 11 different Cavaliers scored points.

 Robert Morris began its men's lacrosse program in 2005 and started playing in the CAA. Since 2011, RMU has been playing its conference games in the NEC before the school left last summer for the Horizon League. RMU men's lacrosse is plaving this season as an independent before joining the new ASUN men's lacrosse conference in 2022. Joining RMU in the ASUN men's lacrosse reboot league will be Air Force, Bellarmine, Cleveland State, Detroit Mercy, and Utah. The ASUN originally founded a lacrosse league in 2012 with founding members Furman, High Point, Jacksonville, Mercer, Richmond and VMI,

LAST MEETING: 2019 AT UVA (UVA 19, RMU 10) - NCAA FIRST ROUND

 The last time these teams met the No. 3 national seeded Virginia Cavaliers upended the Robert Morris Colonials in the first round of the 2019 NCAA Tournament, 19-10, at Klöckner Stadium.

 The victory snapped a four-game losing streak for the Cavaliers in the NCAA Tournament, their longest in program history.

 The Cavaliers received career nights from Mikey Herring and Ryan Conrad, two seniors playing their final career games at Klöckner Stadium. Herring scored a career-high six goals and Conrad scored a career-high five goals, as the duo was responsible for 11 of UVA's 19 goals. Matt Moore also added a career-high seven assists and a career-high nine points.

• The wet conditions delayed the scoring to start as the game was scoreless until the 7:18 mark in the first quarter when Michael Kraus fed Matt Moore for the game's first goal. Moore's score initiated a 3-0 UVA run to start the game. Kraus and Mikey Herring all scored during the spurt.

· Virginia's 3-0 run was part of a larger 7-2 Cavaliers streak, which was capped by Herring on a Moore assist with 12:26 left in the first half. By Half UVA owned a 9-5 advantage and used an 8-2 streak to start the second half to help put the game away.

The trio is part of 55 male student-athletes named to the watch list.

 \cdot Conners is on the watch list for the third time, while Moore is on the list for the second time in his career. It is the first time for Cormier.

MOORE NAMED ACC OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK (FEB. 23)

• A Matt Moore (Garnet Valley, Pa.) was named the ACC Offensive Player of the Week on Feb. 23. It was the first career weekly ACC accolade of Moore's career.

 \cdot Moore led UVA with five goals in the Cavaliers' 15-12 win at No. 11 Loyola.

 \cdot Moore scored three times in a key third quarter that spelled the difference in the game. Twice in the third quarter his goals broke a tie, including for the last time in the game with 2:58 remaining in the period to give UVA a 10-9 lead.

• His fifth goal iced the game in the fourth quarter.

GAVIN NAMED ACC DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK (FEB. 16)

• GK Bobby Gavin (San Diego, Calif.) was named the ACC Defensive Player of the Week on Feb. 16.

• Gavin made his first collegiate start against No. 12 Army after he was pressed into action for starter Alex Rode, the 2019 NCAA Tournament's Most Outstanding Player, who was not available.

• In just his second collegiate game, Gavin made 13 saves and helped UVA defeat the Black Knights, 14-9.

 After allowing four goals on the first four shots he saw on goal, Gavin saved 13 of the Black Knights next 18 shots on goal to aid the Cavalier defense.

• Gavin also saved seven of nine shots on goal by Army's All-American attackman Brendan Nichtern. He also picked up six ground balls and caused two turnovers in the winning cause.

UVA GETS A GOAL-SCORING MACHINE IN BERTRAND

 Charlie Bertrand scored 210 goals over 58 career games at Merrimack from 2017-20, which includes at least one in all 58 career games for MC. During that span he helped Merrimack win back-to-back NCAA DII titles in 2018 and 2019, while also being named the NCAA DII National Player of the Year in each of those seasons. Merrimack made the jump to DI in 2020 and Bertrand scored 18 goals and dished five assists for 23 points in just six games in 2020 before the season was canceled due to the pandemic.

 \cdot Bertrand left Merrimack with 274 career points on 210 goals and 64 assists.

 $\boldsymbol{\cdot}$ In his first game with the Cavaliers he tallied four goals and two assists against Towson.

 \cdot In his college career he has recorded at least two goals in 57 of his 65 career games (87.7), while in 44 of his 65 career games (67.7) he scored at least three goals.

CONNERS AND FOX REPEAT AS TEAM CAPTAINS IN 2021

• Virginia men's lacrosse head coach Lars Tiffany announced that long-stick midfielder Jared Conners and midfielder John Fox have been selected as captains for the 2021 season, as voted on by their peers.

 \cdot Conners and Fox repeat as captains. It makes just the fourth time that UVA has had at least two repeat captains. In 1971 and 1972 it was Jay Connor and Bob Proutt, while in 1985 and 1986 it was Roddy Marino and Jeff Nicklas. Most recently, it was Conor Gill and Mark Koontz in 2001 and 2002.

The No. 5 Virginia Cavaliers (1-0) used a sevengoal second quarter to distance themselves from the Towson Tigers (0-1), 20-11, at Klöckner Stadium.

Connor Shellenberger scored seven points on four goals and three assists in his collegiate debut. Payton Cormier added a career-high six goals and one assist, while graduate transfer Charlie Bertrand notched four goals and two assists in his UVA debut.

HOW IT HAPPENED

UVA scored 52 seconds into the game to take an early 1-0 lead on an unassisted Shellenberger score. Towson rebounded with a 4-1 spurt to take a 4-2 lead with 6:26 left in the first frame. Cormier broke through with his first goal at 3:50 in the first quarter to jumpstart a 7-0 Cavalier run, pushing the Cavaliers ahead for good. Cormer scored four times during the run and capped it on a Shellenberger helper with 9:37 left in the second quarter, giving UVA an 9-4 lead.
