## OPENING DRAW

### GAME OVERVIEW

- Virginia continues its three-game homestand with a non-conference tilt with Utah. Faceoff is set for 12 p.m.
- This week Virginia is ranked No. 4 in the USILA coaches poll and No. 3 in the Inside Lacrosse media poll.

### THE SERIES VS. THE UTES

- Utah and Virginia are meeting for the second time in series history. UVA won the first meeting, 17-6, in 2019 at Klöckner Stadium.
- The 2019 season was the inaugural men's lacrosse campaign for Utah.
- Utah head coach Brian Holman is no stranger to UVA as he was an assistant coach from 2009-16 at ACC rival North Carolina. He also was the defensive coordinator and goalkeeper coach at Johns Hopkins from 1987-90 and from 1999-2000.



Petey LaSalla is the only Cavalier to win 200+ faceoffs in multiple seasons and in only 12 games he is the quickest Cavalier to the mark in program history. He is on pace to be the only player in UVA history to win 200+ faceoffs in a season at a 60%+ clip.

### THE VIRGINIA-UTAH CONNECTION

- Utah assistant coach Adam Ghitelman is a 2011 graduate of Virginia. Ghitelman was the starting goalie on UVA's 2011 NCAA title team. He was a two-time All-American and left Charlottesville No. 1 all-time at UVA in career goalie wins (50) and No. 2 in all-time saves (586). Ghitelman's win record was previously owned by UVA assistant coach Kip Turner (40). Ghitelman was also MVP of the 2010 ACC Tournament.
- Utah director of operations Tim McDermott was a volunteer assistant at UVA (2013-14) and the older brother of former UVA FOGO Brian McDermott (2007-11).

COVERING THE CAVALIERS

**UNIQUELY UVA**

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

**Grounds:** The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

**First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year:** Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

**Commonwealth:** Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

**UNIVERSITY NICKNAMES**

Virginia's athletics teams have been accompanied by a somewhat confusing array of nicknames. The most prominent and widely accepted of these monikers are "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos."

Although the terms "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are used almost interchangeably to refer to University teams and players, "Cavaliers" is more often used by the media, while "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are frequently used by Virginia students and fans.

**Legend** has it that Washington & Lee baseball fans dubbed the Virginia players "Wahoos" during the fiercely contested rivalry that existed between the two in-state schools in the 1890s. By 1940, "Wahoos"

was in general use around Grounds to denote University students or events relating to them. The abbreviated "Hoos" sprang up later in student newspapers and has gained growing popularity in recent years.

**THE CAVALIER MASCOT**

The costumed Cavalier with a large character head debuted during Virginia's 1984 football season and has remained the official mascot of the University.

**UNIVERSITY COLORS**

Orange and blue were adopted as the University of Virginia's official athletic colors at a mass student meeting in 1888. UVA athletic teams had previously worn silver gray and cardinal red, but those colors did not stand out on muddy football fields, prompting a student movement to change them.

One of the students attending the mass meeting was Allen Potts, a star athlete who played on Virginia's first football team in 1888. Potts showed up at the meeting wearing a navy blue-and-orange scarf that he had acquired during a summer boating expedition at Oxford University. Orange and blue were chosen as the official athletic colors after one of Potts' fellow students pulled the scarf off Potts' neck and, waving it to the crowd, yelled, "How will this do?" UVA later served as the inspiration for schools like Auburn and Florida when they selected school colors.

**WAH-HOO-WAH**

The origin of "Wah-hoo-wah" is uncertain. The cheer was used to root on Virginia teams as early as 1890 and may have been borrowed from Dartmouth College, whose athletics teams were once known as the Indians.

Legend attributes the yell to Natalie Floyd Otey, who sang the ballad "Where'er You Are, There Shall My Love Be" at Charlottesville's Levy Opera House in 1893. The predominantly student audience noticed that Otey warbled the first three words of the song between each of the stanzas and decided to join in the refrain. By evening's end, goes the legend, the crowd had corrupted "Where'er You Are" into "Wah-hoo-wah."

The Levy Opera House stands at the corner of High Street and Park Street and has since been renovated into an office building.

**LAST MEETING: UVA 17, UTAH 6 - (2019 AT KLÖCKNER STADIUM)**

- The Virginia Cavaliers cruised to a 17-6 triumph over the visiting Utah Utes at Klöckner Stadium the last time these teams met.
- The victory was the seventh in a row for UVA, which gave the Cavaliers their first seven-game winning streak since starting the 2012 season 8-0. UVA eventually went on to win the 2019 NCAA title.
- On two days rest (after playing Richmond), Virginia got after Utah early, opening the game on a 6-0 run before the Utes managed to get their first shot off.
- Utah, in its first year as a program, didn't record its first shot until the 3:03 mark in the first quarter. During that span Matt Moore scored three goals and Michael Kraus scored two, while adding an assist. In the first quarter the Cavaliers picked up 19 ground balls and made 19 shots, while Utah managed just four shots and picked up 11 ground balls.
- Kraus started the game's scoring at 13:03 in the first quarter. A shot by Moore was blocked and Kraus picked up the ground ball in front of the cage and scored easily. The goal was the 100th career goal of his career. Kraus is the 16th different Cavalier to reach 100 career goals and in career game No. 42 he is the third fastest. Only Doug Knight (39 games) and Kevin Pehlke (40 games) reached the milestone quicker.
- The Cavaliers opened the game on a 9-0 run. Ryan Lamb capped the streak with an unassisted goal at 8:46 left in the second quarter. After Utah scored its first goal with 2:35 left before the intermission, UVA finished the quarter on a 4-1 streak, which included scoring two goals in the final eight seconds.
- After Jack Peele scored his first career goal unassisted with eight seconds left, Ryan Conrad picked up the ensuing faceoff's ground ball win. From the V-sabre at midfield Conrad shucked a shot and found nylon with 0.7 seconds left on the clock, sending UVA into the break with a 13-2 lead.
- UVA started the third quarter on a 4-0 run, which was capped by back-to-back goals by Mikey Herring at 3:53 in the third quarter. Halfway through the third quarter UVA head coach Lars Tiffany began to empty his bench as for the second game in a row 35 different Cavaliers saw action.

**AITKEN IS AMONG A SPECIAL GROUP OF MIDFIELDERS**

- Dox Aitken is No. 18 all-time in DI midfielder scoring with 169 career points. Full list on page No. 7.
- Aitken needs four assists to become the 17th midfielder in the history of the game at the DI level to record at least 100 career goals and 40 career assists.
- He is No. 4 all-time among ACC midfielders in career points.

**UVA ON THE GREEN GRASS OF KLÖCKNER**

- Virginia owns a 156-42 (.7879) all-time record at Klöckner Stadium, including a 5-2 mark in 2021 and are winners of 17 of last 21 played in the historic edifice. UVA also is 12-3 all-time at Klöckner Stadium in the NCAA Tournament.
- UVA is 29-10 all-time at Klöckner Stadium under head coach Lars Tiffany.
- Klöckner Stadium first hosted lacrosse in 1993.

**LASALLA AND CONNERS PICKING UP THE GB**

- UVA's Petey LaSalla is No. 1 in the nation with 99 ground balls. LSM Jared Conners is tied for No. 16 with 56 ground balls, which is No. 1 among LSMs. Duke's Tyler Carpenter (52) trails Conners by four GBs.
- GK Alex Rode leads the nation's goalies with 33 ground balls.

**LASALLA GETTING THE WIN AT THE FACEOFF X**

- Petey LaSalla won a career-high 26 faceoffs (38 attempts) at UNC on April 10. It marks the first time in program history a Cavalier has won 20+ faceoffs in a game at least three times in the same season.
- LaSalla previously won a career-high 23 faceoffs (28 attempts) against Robert Morris on March 20. It marked the first time in program history a Cavalier won 20+ faceoffs in back-to-back games. He previously won 21 faceoffs against then-No. 1 North Carolina on March 11.
- He joins former teammate, Justin Schwenk, as the only Cavaliers to win 20+ faceoffs in a game multiple times during a career.
- LaSalla faced Notre Dame's Kyle Gallagher on March 27, who was No. 1 in the nation with an 85.1 percent winning percentage entering the game. LaSalla won 11-of-21 against Gallagher and was 13-of-25 in the game, gaining a slight advantage.
- LaSalla faced Duke's Jake Naso on April 15 who entered the game No. 5 in the nation in faceoff winning percentage (67.3). Naso had a season low of 40 percent (8-of-20).
- LaSalla is No. 8 in the nation with a 66.0 percent winning mark (200-of-303). If you remove the 11-of-30 showing at Syracuse, LaSalla is winning at a 69.2 percent clip against all other opponents.
- LaSalla is No. 1 in the nation with 200 faceoff wins and No. 1 in faceoffs taken (303).

- Midfielder Petey LaSalla is currently No. 2 all-time at UVA for a single-season faceoff winning mark of .660.
- LaSalla is trending to become the first Cavalier in program history to win 200+ faceoffs in a season and win 60+ percent of his draws in the same season.

**JEFF CONNER HEATING UP**

- After appearing in only one of UVA's first three games, Jeff Conner has seen more time and is heating up.
- In action over the last seven games, Conner has nine goals and five assists on 20 shots. He has also picked up 12 ground balls over the last seven games.
- He notched a career-high four goal on April 10 at No. 3 UNC.

**CAVALIERS BETTER IN THE CLEARING GAME OF LATE**

- After a troublesome start in the clearing game, UVA has been much better of late, including 92.2 percent (71-of-77) over the last four games (at Notre Dame, vs. Richmond, at North Carolina, Duke).
- Over the last five games, which includes ACC games vs. UNC (x2), Duke and at Notre Dame, UVA is clearing at 88.2 percent (97-of-110).
- UVA started the season (first six games) clearing just 79.4 percent.

**KOLOGY PROVIDING DEFENSIVE COVERAGE**

- Preseason All-American D Kyle Kology is starting to heat up.
- He currently is No. 6 in the nation with 19 caused turnovers.
- He has 18 ground balls and 15 caused turnovers over the past eight games.
- Kology had five ground balls and five caused turnovers in the win over High Point while guarding All-American Asher Nolting. While Kology guarded Nolting, the HPU senior did not score a goal. Nolting scored his only goal on an EMO situation while Kology was in the penalty box.
- Nolting had 12 turnovers against UVA on March 3.
- Kology caused three turnovers against Robert Morris on March 20.

**CORMIER AND SHELLENBERGER MAKING MARKS EARLY**

- A/M Payton Cormier leads the team with 34 goals in through 12 games. He had 12 goals in UVA's six games in 2020. Cormier also has at least a hat-trick in 10 of his 18 career games. Cormier is No. 4 in the nation with 34 goals and No. 13 in the nation with 42 points.
- A/M Connor Shellenberger is off to a productive start in his career. He leads the team in points with 49. Shellenberger dished out at least two assists in nine of UVA's 12 games, including a career-high four against Air Force. He also has dished three assists against Towson, at No. 11 Loyola, against No. 19 High Point and against Robert Morris.
- Shellenberger is tied for No. 3 in the nation with 29 assists and is No. 6 in the nation with 49 points.

**SAUSTAD HAS BEEN STEADY**

- D Cade Saustad has been steady in 2021 after returning to the fold from an injury that kept him out in 2020.
- Saustad held Notre Dame's Pat Kavanagh to only two assists on March 27, one of which came on EMO.
- He held UNC's Chris Gray mostly in check on April 10, allowing two goals and an assist while guarding him straight up. For the season he has 20 GBs and seven CTs.

**DIFFERENT MILESTONES THAT COULD BE HIT SOON**

- There are various Cavaliers on the verge of career milestones.
- Charlie Bertrand, one of two active lacrosse player in the nation with at least 200 career goals (229), needs one point to reach 300 career points. He is currently No. 3 among active players with 299 career points, behind Duke's Michael Sowers (357) and Fairfield's Matt Chlastawa (305).
- Matt Moore needs two assists to become the fifth Cavalier in program history with 100 career goals and 100 career assists. He would join Kevin Pehlke, Danny Glading, Steele Stanwick and Michael Kraus.
- Moore needs two assists to become just the 10th Cavalier with 100 career assists.
- Dox Aitken and Jared Connors each have played in 71 career games. They need to play in one more games to pass Bray Malphrus (71) for the UVA career record for games played.
- As the schedule stands, the April 24 game against Syracuse will be the 200th all-time men's lacrosse game at Klöckner Stadium.

- In 2020 Virginia was No. 2 in the nation in riding, limiting its opponents to .737 clearing. Bucknell was No. 1 in the nation at .690.
- UVA was No. 2 in the nation in 2019 at .711, trailing only Cleveland State (.707).

The No. 5 Virginia Cavaliers (1-0) used a seven-goal second quarter to distance themselves from the Towson Tigers (0-1), 20-11, at Klöckner Stadium.

Connor Shellenberger scored seven points on four goals and three assists in his collegiate debut. Payton Cormier added a career-high six goals and one assist, while graduate transfer Charlie Bertrand notched four goals and two assists in his UVA debut.
