LEADING OFF

- This marks the fourth-straight year Virginia opens up its home schedule against VMI.
- In the Brian O'Connor era (since 2004), Virginia is 12-3 in its home openers.
- Virginia went 14-4 at home against non-conference opponents in 2018 and is 32-5 against non-conference foes over the last two seasons.
- In an all-time series that dates back to 1889, Virginia is 105-32 against the Keydets. Under O'Connor, the Cavaliers hold a 11-5 edge
- Virginia was 10-4 against teams from the Commonwealth in 2018.

LAST SEASON VS. VMI

- The Keydets spoiled opening day last season in front of a home opener record, 3,709 fans by taking out the Cavaliers 9-4. The temperature at first pitch was 75 degrees, the warmest home opener in more than a decade for UVA.
- VMI scored the game's first seven runs including six in the first inning.
- Virginia avenged the loss a week later with a 10-9 victory at Disharoon Park. The Cavaliers jumped out to a 10-1 advantage before Bennett Sousa put a stop to the furious comeback, pitching the two-scoreless innings to record the six-out save.

MLB4 AT A GLANCE

- Virginia played three ranked foes (No. 2 Vanderbilt, No. 17 TCU & No. 24 Cal State Fullerton) in the inaugural MLB4 Collegiate Baseball Tournament in Scottsdale, Ariz. to open the 2019 season.
- It marked the first time in school history Virginia played three-ranked opponents to start a season and Vanderbilt was the highest ranked team to open the season since 2010 when it started up with a three-game series at No. 11 East Carolina.
- Against Vanderbilt, an eight-run third inning doomed Virginia in a 15-9 loss in a game that aired live on MLB Network. On Saturday against TCU, the Cavaliers fell behind 7-0 after the first inning and could not recover. In the tournament finale, Cal State Fullerton scored three runs in the top of the ninth to wipe away a 5-3 Virginia advantage.
- Virginia is winless through its first four games for the first time since 2003 when it dropped its first three games at Auburn.

OFF ON THE RIGHT FOOT

- Tanner Morris leads the team with six hits in his first 13 at bats (.462). His batting average is the 12th highest in the ACC through the first three games. Dating back to last season he has a four-game hit streak and has reached base safely in six-straight.
- Despite just one in his two starts at catcher, Cameron Comer has reached base seven times. He was issued a career-high three walks in games vs. Vanderbilt and Cal State Fullerton. His six total walks rank 13th in the NCAA and tied for third in the ACC.

MLB DRAFT SUCCESS

- Six Cavaliers were selected in the 2018 MLB Draft for the second-straight season.
- Two of this year's picks fell in the Top 40, including Daniel Lynch at No. 34 overall to the Royals.
- Virginia is the only program in country to have first round pick in each of last five seasons.
- Five of the six selections came in first 10 rounds, tied for the second most in the country.
- Virginia is one of four schools (Florida, Oregon, Stanford) with multiple selections in the top-40 in 2018
- 20 Cavaliers have been selected in the top three rounds under in the past 15 years
- and the only school in the country with multiple selections in the top-40 in back-to-back seasons.
- 81 players have been drafted in the Brian O'Connor era (since 2004) and a total of 136 since the start of the program.
- Including this year's class, Virginia has had 14 First Round draft picks, 12 have played for head coach Brian O'Connor.
- Adam Haseley (7th overall) and Pavin Smith (8th overall) are one of two sets of position players teammates to be selected in the top-10 since 1988 (OSU - Monty Fariss & Robin Ventura)

HOOS IN THE WORLD SERIES

- Chris Taylor became the first Cavalier to play in back-to-back World Series as a member of the Dodgers in 2017 and 2018.

He was named co-MVP of the 2017 NLCS after batting .316 with two home runs, five runs scored and three RBIs. Virginia has been represented in the last three World Series (Brandon Guyer - CLE -2016).

- Derek Fisher became the second Cavalier to win a World Series as a member of the Houston Astros. He scored the game-winning run in game five on a walk-off single by Alex Bregman.

PROGRAM SUPERLATIVES

- 81 Cavaliers have been selected in the MLB Draft in the last 15 years.
- Virginia is the only program in the country to boast a first round draft pick in each of the last five seasons
- UVA has won 42 NCAA tournament games since 2009 - tied for the fourth most in the nation in that span.
