LEADING OFF

- The 132nd season of baseball at Virginia will commence with Friday night's series opener against Oklahoma. Virginia has amassed 2,359 wins with an overall winning percentage of .569.
- Virginia is 37-12-1 in opening weekends during Brian O'Connor's 16 years as head coach.
- Virginia has picked up opening day wins in all but five seasons (11-5) under O'Connor's direction and is seeking its first opening day win since 2017 (10-2 win over Liberty in Charleston, S.C.)
- The Cavaliers have opened up away from Charlottesville every year since 2010 and will play in a minor league facility for the second-straight season (2019-Salt River Fields - Scottsdale)
- Virginia has won 11-straight against non-ACC foes dating back to last season.
- The Cavaliers will be the home team in all three games this weekend.
- Virginia is looking to snap a six-game neutral site losing streak that dates back to the 2018 ACC Tournament.
- This weekend will be the only time the Cavaliers will be away from Charlottesville until March 13 when they travel to Pitt. On Tuesday Virginia will commence a season-long, 15-game home stand.

AGAINST OKLAHOMA

- This weekend will mark the first regular season games between Virginia & Oklahoma since 1999. The Sooners and Cavaliers have previously met in the 2010 Charlottesville Super Regional and the 2012 Charlottesville Regional.
- The Sooners own a 3-2 edge in the all-time series and are 3-1 against UVA in the NCAA Tournament.
- Virginia will play a Big 12 opponent on opening weekend for the second year in a row. The Cavaliers dropped a 9-4 decision to TCU last season in Scottsdale.
- Brian O'Connor is 3-5 against current teams from the Big 12 Conference.

IN THE POLLS

- The Cavaliers come into 2020 unranked in the USA Today Coaches Poll for the second-straight season after nine-straight seasons in the top-25 on opening weekend.
- Virginia is ranked No. 25 according to Perfect Game and receiving votes in the NCBWA and Collegiate Baseball Newspaper polls.
- Oklahoma tops out at No. 16 in the Perfect Game Top-25 poll and is receiving votes in the preseason USA Today Coaches Poll.
- Virginia was picked to finish fifth in the ACC Coastal, its place of finish at the end of the 2019 regular season. The Sooners were slotted at No. 4 of nine teams in the Big 12 preseason poll.

- Four 50-win seasons (51 in 2010, 56 in 2011, 50 in 2013, 53 in 2014)
- Guided UVA to school-record win total each year from 2009-11 (49 in 2009, 51 in 2010, 56 in 2011)
- 84 players picked in Major League Baseball Draft over the last 16 years and 20 have had 20 reach the big leagues
- UVA has had 27 All-America and 72 all-conference selections in his tenure

FROM WAHOO TO BLUE WAHOOS

- Blue Wahoo Stadium home to the Pensacola Blue Wahoos, Double-A affiliate of the Minnesota Twins. Prior to the 2019 season, the ballpark housed the Double-A affiliate of the Cincinnati Reds.
- Nick Howard, UVA Baseball Hall of Fame Class of 2020, played for the Blue Wahoos in 2018 where he appeared in 12 games and went 2-0 with a 3.00 ERA. Howard was selected in the first round of the MLB Draft by the Reds in the 2014 MLB Draft.

SEASONED PITCHING STAFF

- A stark contrast from a year ago, Virginia returns over 380 innings from its pitching staff last season, including Griff McGarry, Chesdin Harrington and Mike Vasil who all spent time on the weekend rotation.
- The 2019 Cavaliers returned just 177 innings, the fewest in O'Connor's tenure at Virginia and only the second time the Cavaliers had less than 200 innings returning since 2004.
- At the back end of the bullpen, Virginia will turn to Andrew Abbott who has been one of the ACC's most reliable arms the past two seasons. He spent the summer of the 2019 on the U.S. Collegiate National team, co-leading the high-profile staff in appearances (7) while sporting a 2-1 record with a 2.25 ERA and 12 strikeouts in 12 innings pitched.

AT THE PLATE

- Historically, Virginia has been one of the top hitting teams in the Atlantic Coast Conference. Since 2009, the Cavaliers are sport a .302 batting average, highest in the league during that span.
- In the past two seasons, Virginia has the fewest strikeouts of any team in the ACC. In 2019, UVA hitters fanned 371 times and in 2018, 319 times, both league-lows.
- Senior Logan Michaels was statistically the ACC's toughest batter to strikeout (11.3 AB/K) in 2019.

DYNAMIC DUO

- Nic Kent and Zack Gelof combined to steal 33 bases as freshmen. Only twice in UVA history has a pair of first years swiped 10+ bags in a single season. Only one other time in UVA history has a two or more freshmen stolen 10 bases in a single season.
- Kent was the first UVA freshman to earn First Team All-ACC honors since Danny Hultzen and first position player since 1973.

- Gelof reached successfully in first 28-straight games, second most as a freshman since 2000, his 17-game hit streak the longest by a UVA freshman since 2000.

- Kent ended the 2019 season on a 13-game hit streak and reached base safely 16-straight.
- Gelof has reached base safely in 12-straight games coming into the 2020 season.

- Head Coach Brian O'Connor is one of five coaches ever to qualify for the NCAA Tournament in each of the first 14 seasons at the helm.

HOOS AT THE HIGHEST LEVEL

- A total of five former Cavaliers made their Major League debuts in 2019 - Adam Haseley (Phillies), Danny Hultzen (Cubs), Branden Kline (Orioles), Josh Sborz (Los Angeles Dodgers) and Matt Thaiss (Los Angeles Angels). The five new big leaguers were tied for the most of any college baseball program.
- A total of 13 former Cavaliers were listed on MLB rosters during the 2019 season, establishing a new program record.

MLB DRAFT SUCCESS

- Virginia is one of four schools nationally (Arkansas, Florida & Rice) to have a pick in the first five rounds in each of the last 10 MLB Drafts.
- UVA was the only program in the country to have a first round pick every year from 2014-18. The Cavaliers have boasted a first round pick in eight of Brian O'Connor's 16 seasons.
- 20 Cavaliers have been selected in the top three rounds under in the past 16 years
- 84 players have been drafted in the Brian O'Connor era (since 2004) and a total of 132 since the start of the program.
- Virginia has had 14 First Round draft picks, 12 have played for head coach Brian O'Connor.
- Adam Haseley (7th overall) and Pavin Smith (8th overall) are one of two sets of position players teammates to be selected in the top-10 since 1988 (OSU - Monty Fariss & Robin Ventura)

HOOS IN THE WORLD SERIES

- Former Cavaliers Ryan Zimmerman "Mr. National" and Sean Doolittle were key components to the Washington Nationals 2019 World Series Championship. Zimmerman blasted a three-run homer against the Dodgers in game four of the NLCS and is now regarded as one of the greatest moments in franchise history. Doolittle appeared in nine postseason games and didn't allow a run in three World Series appearances. He earned the save in game one of the World

Series, a 5-4 win in Houston.

·Virginia is the only program in the country to be represented in the last four World Series.

·Chris Taylor became the first Cavalier to play in back-to-back World Series as a member of the Dodgers in 2017 and 2018. He was named co-MVP of the 2017 NLCS after batting .316 with two home runs, five runs scored and three RBIs. Virginia has been represented in the last three World Series (Brandon Guyer - CLE -2016).
