### ON THE HILL

- First year Matthew Wyatt will make his second start of the season on Tuesday. The right-hander gave Virginia three scoreless innings to begin the game against Richmond on last Tuesday. He did not walk a batter, allowed two hits and struck out one in a 16-7 win.
- The Cavalier pitching staff its closing in on 200 strikeouts and comes into the midweek series with 184, the 11th most in the NCAA. Virginia pitchers have struck out 10 or more batters in all but four games this season.
- Graduate student Stephen Schoch is 5-for-5 in save opportunities this season, the second most in the ACC. He has appeared in a team-high 10 games this season.

### PLAYER NOTES

- Logan Michaels and Marc Lebreux come into the midweek series with nine-game hit streaks. Lebreux and Nic Kent has reached base in 13-straight games.
- Freshman Max Cotier put together a pair of three-hit efforts last week including a 3-for-5, four-RBI day on Sunday. Cotier also tallied his fourth triple of the season in the win and is now tied for the NCAA lead in triples this season with four.
- Zack Gelof provided the fireworks in the final game of the series against NC State, homering twice. It marked the first time since Brendan Rivoli cracked a pair against James Madison last season that a Cavalier accomplished the feat. Gelof moved into a tie with Chris Newell for the team lead with five.

### PENSACOLA IN REVIEW

- Virginia began the season with a 6-0 shutout of Oklahoma who was ranked as high as No. 16 in this week's Baseball America Top 25.
- The opening day shutout was the first by the Cavaliers since 2009 (12-0 vs. Bucknell). Four Cavalier pitchers - Griff McGarry, Kyle Whitten, Andrew Abbott and Stephen Schoch limited the Sooners too just two hits.
- With inclement weather in the forecast, the two teams were forced to play a doubleheader on Saturday in which the Sooners were victorious, 7-2 and 5-1 to take the three-game series.
- Oklahoma pitchers limited the Cavaliers to six hits over the 18 innings of the Saturday double dip.
- The series took place at the Pensacola Blue Wahoos, the Double-A affiliate of the Minnesota Twins.

### NEW HOOS

- Over the weekend, eight new Cavaliers saw their first action as a member of the program. A total of four position players and three pitchers made their collegiate debuts.
- Second baseman Max Cotier started all three games and his first hit of his college career came in his first at bat last Friday night, an RBI single that scored Nic Kent.
- Junior transfer Marc Lebreux also started all three games (1 LF, 2 RF) and came up with a big two-RBI hit late in the season-opening win over Oklahoma.
- Three freshman hurlers - Jacob Baldino, Nate Savino and Matt Wyatt - all saw action on opening weekend. Baldino pitched the final two innings of game one of Saturday's doubleheader, did not allow a run and struck out a pair of batters.

### FRESHMAN DUO

- Baseball America picked LHP Nate Savino as the publication's ACC Freshman of the Year. Savino and OF Chris Newell were the top two freshmen in the ACC.
- LHP Nate Savino came in at No. 3 on D1Baseball.com's Preseason Top 150 freshman while fellow first year Chris Newell came in at No. 11

### SEASONED PITCHING STAFF

- A stark contrast from a year ago, Virginia returns over 380 innings from its pitching staff last season, including Griff McGarry, Chesdin Harrington and Mike Vasil who all spent time on the weekend rotation.
- The 2019 Cavaliers returned just 177 innings, the fewest in O'Connor's tenure at Virginia and only the second time the Cavaliers had less than 200 innings returning since 2004.
- At the back end of the bullpen, Virginia will turn to Andrew Abbott who has been one of the ACC's most reliable arms the past two seasons. He spent the summer of the 2019 on the U.S. Collegiate National team, co-leading the high-profile staff in appearances (7) while sporting a 2-1 record with a 2.25 ERA and 12 strikeouts in 12 innings pitched.

### AT THE PLATE

- Historically, Virginia has been one of the top hitting teams in the Atlantic Coast Conference. Since 2009, the Cavaliers are sport a .302 batting average, highest in the league during that span.
- In the past two seasons, Virginia has the fewest strikeouts of any team in the ACC. In 2019, UVA hitters fanned 371 times and in 2018, 319 times, both league-lows.
- Senior Logan Michaels was statistically the ACC's toughest batter to strikeout (11.3 AB/K) in 2019.

### DYNAMIC DUO

- Nic Kent and Zack Gelof combined to steal 33 bases as freshmen. Only twice in UVA history has a pair of first years swiped 10+ bags in a single season. Only one other time in UVA history has a two or more freshmen stolen 10 bases in a single season.
- Kent was the first UVA freshman to earn First Team All-ACC honors since Danny Hultzen and first position player since 1973.
- Gelof reached successfully in first 28-straight games, second most as a freshman since 2000, his 17-game hit streak the longest by a UVA freshman since 2000.
- Kent ended the 2019 season on a 13-game hit streak and reached base safely 16-straight.
- Gelof has reached base safely in 12-straight games coming into the 2020 season.

**HOOS AT THE HIGHEST LEVEL**

· A total of five former Cavaliers made their Major League debuts in 2019 - Adam Haseley (Phillies), Danny Hultzen (Cubs), Branden Kline (Orioles), Josh Sborz (Los Angeles Dodgers) and Matt Thaiss (Los Angeles Angels). The five new big leaguers were tied for the most of any college baseball program.

· A total of 13 former Cavaliers were listed on MLB rosters during the 2019 season, establishing a new program record.

**MLB DRAFT SUCCESS**

· Virginia is one of four schools nationally (Arkansas, Florida & Rice) to have a pick in the first five rounds in each of the last 10 MLB Drafts.

· UVA was the only program in the country to have a first round pick every year from 2014-18. The Cavaliers have boasted a first round pick in eight of Brian O'Connor's 16 seasons.

· 20 Cavaliers have been selected in the top three rounds under in the past 16 years

· 84 players have been drafted in the Brian O'Connor era (since 2004) and a total of 132 since the start of the program.

Virginia has had 14 First Round draft picks, 12 have played for head coach Brian O'Connor.

· Adam Haseley (7th overall) and Pavin Smith (8th overall) are one of two sets of position players teammates to be selected in the top-10 since 1988 (OSU - Monty Fariss & Robin Ventura)

**HOOS IN THE WORLD SERIES**

· Former Cavaliers Ryan Zimmerman "Mr. National" and Sean Doolittle were key components to the Washington Nationals 2019 World Series Championship. Zimmerman blasted a three-run homer against the Dodgers in game four of the NLCS and is now regarded as one of the greatest moments in franchise history. Doolittle appeared in nine postseason games and didn't allow a run in three World Series appearances. He earned the save in game one of the World Series, a 5-4 win in Houston.

· Virginia is the only program in the country to be represented in the last four World Series.

· Chris Taylor became the first Cavalier to play in back-to-back World Series as a member of the Dodgers in 2017 and 2018. He was named co-MVP of the 2017 NLCS after batting .316 with two home runs, five runs scored and three RBIs. Virginia has been represented in the last three World Series (Brandon Guyer - CLE -2016).
