LEADING OFF

- Virginia improved to 4-1 in College World Series opening games with a 6-0 shutout over Tennessee on Sunday afternoon.
- The Cavaliers are 13-8 all-time if five total College World Series trips (2009, 2011, 2014, 2015, 2021).
- All five of the program's College World Series appearances have come under head coach Brian O'Connor. The Cavaliers won the 2015 National Championship, the ACC's first since 1955.
- O'Connor recorded his 750th career win on Sunday, the ninth most of any coach in ACC history. The victory was also his 55th NCAA Tournament win, the fourth most of any ACC coach.
- Virginia will be the home team on Tuesday. In the NCAA Tournament, Virginia has won all five games when it's been designated the home team.

AGAINST MISSISSIPPI STATE

- Tuesday will be the third meeting between the Bulldogs and Cavaliers. Including Tuesday, all three will have come in the NCAA Tournament
- Mississippi State swept Virginia in the 2013 Charlottesville Super Regional winning 11-6 in game one and advanced to the College World Series with a 6-5 victory in game two.
- The Cavaliers are 16-15 against SEC schools in the O'Connor era (2004-present).

ON THE MOUND

- Right-hander Griff McGarry is expected to make his 11th start of the season. In two NCAA starts he has logged 10.1 innings allowed three runs and struck out 18 batters.
- In game two of the super regionals against Dallas Baptist, he carried a no-hitter into the seventh inning and produced the first quality start of the NCAA postseason by allowing no runs over seven innings of work. He retired 11-straight batters from the third inning all the way until the first batter of the seventh.
- His start in the regional final against Old Dominion, McGarry struck out the first six batters he faced and totaled eight in 3.1 innings. He combined with Brandon Neeck for 24 strikeouts in the game, the third most ever in a nine-inning game in NCAA history.
- The Cavaliers have produced two shutouts in the NCAA postseason, both occurring in the last three games. Virginia has combined for six shutouts this season, tied for the most in the ACC. The shutout was the Cavaliers' fourth in College World Series play and first since game two of the 2015 College World Series finals.
- In 38.2 total innings in the NCAA tournament, the Cavaliers bullpen is sporting a 1.86 ERA, allowing just eight earned runs. The Cavalier bullpen has not allowed a run in the last 11.2 innings.
- Righthander Matt Wyatt, who earned his first save of his career on Sunday, has not allowed a run in his last 13.2 innings pitched.

PLAYER NOTES/TRENDS

- Seven of the nine Virginia batters were responsible for the 13 Cavalier hits against Tennessee. Virginia is 22-3 this season when collection 10 or more hits.
- The Cavaliers have scored four runs in the seventh inning in each of its last three games.

· Logan Michaels hit his first home run of the season on Sunday and second of his career. The solo shot came in his first college world series at bat and gave Virginia a 1-0 advantage in the third inning.

· Michaels' run-scoring single in the seventh was his 99th hit of his career. He has appeared in 113 games in a Cavalier uniform over the last three seasons. He's looking to become the fifth active Cavalier to compile 100 career hits.

· Zack Gelof has a team-best 14 hits in the NCAA postseason after a three-hit performance on Sunday against Tennessee. He has scored a run in each of the last six games.

· Freshman Kyle Teel extended his reached base streak to 24 games after going 1-for-4 with a walk in his College World Series debut.

· Alex Tappen has reached base safely in 18-straight games and has a hit in all but one of his last 17 games played.

UVA IN THE COLLEGE WORLD SERIES

· Virginia is 13-8 in four previous College World Series appearances.

· Virginia is the only three-seed remaining and the lowest seed to reach the College World Series in 2021. Five of the seven teams were a No. 1 seed in their respective regionals.

· The last team seeded third in its regional to win the National Championship was Virginia in 2015.

ROAD TO OMAHA - BIG TIME PERFORMANCES

· **June 5 vs. Jacksonville** - UVA postseason record, 21 hits - Zack Gelof/Kyle Teel had four hits each, tying UVA postseason record

· **June 6 at South Carolina** - Matt Wyatt - 5.0 IP, 0 R, 8 SO - Career-high in IP and strikeouts, first start since March 24 vs. Liberty (allowed 4 runs in 0.2 IP)

· **June 7 vs. Old Dominion** - Brandon Neeck 5.2 IP, 16 strikeouts (UVA postseason record). Had 19 career innings pitched and had never pitched more than 2.1 innings in a game prior to the outing. Neeck and Griff McGarry combined for 24 strikeouts, the third most in a nine-inning game in NCAA history.

· **June 8 vs. Old Dominion** - Devin Ortiz - 4.0 IP, 0 R, 6 SO (all career-highs). Ortiz made his first career start on the mound and only his third pitching appearance of the 2021 season. He stayed in the game as a designated hitter and hit a walk-off home run in the 10th, the first walk-off homer in UVA postseason history and the first of any kind by a UVA hitter since 2013.

· **June 13 vs. DBU** - Griff McGarry - 7.0 IP, 2 H, 0 R, 10 SO - McGarry carried a no-hitter into the 7th inning and came into the game 0-5 with a 7.53 ERA. The quality start was the first by a UVA pitcher in the 2021 postseason.

· **June 14 vs. DBU** - Kyle Teel's grand slam in the bottom of the seventh was the first in UVA postseason history and erased a 2-1 deficit. Matt Wyatt surpassed a career-high set earlier in the tournament with 5.2 innings of relief and matched a career-best with eight strikeouts.

TRENDS

· Virginia is 13-7 in one run games this year and is 2-2 in the NCAA Tournament in one-run affairs. The Columbia regional loss to South Carolina snapped an eight-game win streak in one-run games.

· The Cavaliers have 14 come-from-behind wins in 2021 and have trailed in three of its six NCAA Tournament wins, including the deciding game of the Super Regional last Monday.

· Virginia has homered in 13-straight games and has 21 total homers in that span. Virginia hit 20 home runs in its first 39 games of the year.

THE HEAD COACH

· Of the eight schools remaining in the NCAA Tournament, only Brian O'Connor and Vanderbilt's Tim Corbin have National Championships to their credit.

· O'Connor is 55-34 all-time in the NCAA Tournament. The 55 wins are the fourth most ever among ACC coaches.

· O'Connor is one of five coaches ever to reach the NCAA Tournament in each of his first 14 years at the helm.

· In the history of college baseball O'Connor is one of two coaches win a national championship (Virginia - 2015), play on a college world series team (Creighton - 1991) and be an assistant coach on a college world series team (Notre Dame - 2002)

CAVALIER FIREMEN

· Reliever Blake Bales was one of 10 finalists for the NCBWA Stopper of the Year Award. He's one of three Virginia players ever to be a finalist for the award and the first since Branden Kline in 2011. Both Kline and Kevin Arico, a 2009 finalist, are in UVA's Baseball Hall of Fame.

· Closer Stephen Schoch moved into a tie for ninth place all-time on Virginia's career saves list after closing out South Carolina in an elimination game. He tossed 2.1 shutout innings and struck out five for his eighth save of the year. It marked the fifth time that he registered a save pitching more than one inning.

REGIONAL RECAP

· Virginia eliminated Jacksonville, host South Carolina and top-seeded Old Dominion to win the Columbia regional.

· The Cavaliers did not get a quality start from any of its five starting pitchers on the weekend. Virginia's starting pitchers for the final three games of the regional combined for six starts in 2021 including the first career start for Devin Ortiz in the regional championship game on Tuesday. Those three pitchers - Griff McGarry, Matt Wyatt and Devin Ortiz - combined for 12.1 innings, three runs allowed and 22 strikeouts.

· Top-seeded Old Dominion came into the NCAA regional ranked No. 1 in the country in home runs and hit long balls in two games, both occurring in the sixth inning of Sunday's matchup. Virginia pitching fanned 39 ODU batters in 19 innings.

· The walk-off home run by Devin Ortiz in the regional final came after four shutout innings on the mound. It was the first walk-off home run in UVA postseason history and the first walk-off homer for Virginia since 2013.

· Virginia set a school record with 24 strikeouts against Old Dominion in the nightcap on Sunday to force a decisive seventh game. The 24-strikeout performance was only the third time in NCAA baseball history a team has struck out 24 or more in a nine-inning game. The last time a team struck out 24 or more batters was back in 1992 when Auburn struck out 25 against Arkansas. The only other occurrence was in 1971 when Miami (OH) totaled 26 against Wright State, an NCAA nine-inning record.

NOTING THE NCAA TOURNAMENT

· Virginia has won seven regional championships (2009, 2010, 2011, 2013, 2014, 2015, 2021) and reached the College World Series five times - 2009, 2011, 2014, 2015 & 2021.

· The Cavaliers captured the program's first National Championship in 2015 in a rematch of the 2014 College World Series final. Virginia became the first ACC school to claim a national title since 1955 (Wake Forest).

· Brian O'Connor is one of seven active coaches to win a National Championship.

· Competing in its 18th NCAA tournament, Virginia is 56-39 in NCAA play.

· UVA is 44-22 in the NCAA tournament since 2009, the seventh-most NCAA wins in that span.

· Under Brian O'Connor (since 2004), UVA is 50-33 in the NCAA tournament.

ACC TOURNAMENT NOTES

· As the No. 8 seed, Virginia won Pool A with a victory over Virginia Tech (3-2) on Tuesday and then ousted top-seeded Notre Dame (14-1) on Friday. Prior to the 2021 Tournament, both Pool A opponents were the only two teams UVA had not defeated ACC postseason action.

· A two-run homer by Kyle Teel against Virginia Tech in the

opening game proved to be the difference against Virginia Tech on Tuesday.

- Starting pitcher Zach Messinger recorded his third win of the year after pitching a career-high 5.1 innings. He allowed two earned runs and struck out six. Four relievers – Brandon Neeck, Blake Bales, Andrew Abbott and Kyle Whitten recorded the final 11 outs to seal the victory.

- On Friday, Virginia matched its most runs (14) and the largest margin of victory (13) ever in the ACC Tournament in a 14-1 over top-seeded Notre Dame.

- The Cavaliers hit a season-high four home runs, including three in a five-run second inning.

- Senior Andrew Abbott earned the win after pitching 6.1 scoreless frames and striking out nine. Virginia has scored 56 runs in his last four starts and the left-hander has not allowed a run in his last 30.1 innings pitched.

- Duke eliminated Virginia in the semifinal thanks to three home runs, two off the bat of Joey Loperfido.

REGULAR SEASON NOTABLES

- Virginia closed the regular season having won 10 of its final 14 games and six of the last seven ACC series.

- The Cavaliers began ACC play this season by dropping 11 of its first 15 league games. Virginia won 14 of its last 21 ACC games to finish with a conference record of 18-18.

- The 18 ACC wins are the most by Virginia since 2017.

- Head coach Brian O'Connor recorded his 300th ACC victory on April 23 with a 9-4 win over Duke. He became the eighth coach in league history to reach the 300-win plateau.

- Andrew Abbott, Jake Berry and Griff McGarry combined for the program's seventh no-hitter on May 14th against Wake Forest. It was the first no-hitter in ACC play since UVA's Nathan Kirby threw a no-no at Pitt in 2014.

- The Cavaliers have recorded 11 come-from-behind victories this season, nine occurring in the final 22 games.

- Prior to this season, Virginia had not produced a walk-off win since 2018. So far, UVA has produced four walk-offs in 2021, all of them occurring in the last 19 games.

- After throwing a no-hitter in the opener against Wake Forest, Virginia recorded back-to-back walk-off victories to sweep the series. In his final home game of his career, senior Christian Hlinka doubled home the game-winning run in the ninth.

- With the series win against Boston College, Virginia improved to 47-23 in the final two ACC series of the year since 2009.
