## LEADING OFF

- Notre Dame will be the 13th ACC school Virginia has squared off against this season. The Cavaliers did not play either of their Group D opponents in the regular season. The only school UVA hasn't played in 2022 is NC State.
- With a loss on Wednesday against Florida State, Virginia will not have a chance to advance to the weekend semifinals.
- The Cavaliers come into tournament action winners of 11 of the last 16 regular season games.
- Virginia finished the regular season ranked 9th in the NCAA in team batting average (.313) and 22nd in team ERA (4.05). UVA and consensus No. 1 Tennessee are the only two programs in the country to be ranked in the top-22 in both categories.
- The Cavaliers also boast the ninth-best scoring offense in the country (9.0 runs/gm) and strike out 10.8 batters per game, the sixth most of any NCAA pitching staff.
- Virginia enters the ACC Tournament as the No. 15 team in the country according to D1Baseball.com. The Cavaliers highest ranking comes from USA Today/Coaches poll at No. 13. UVA enters play on Friday with an RPI of 20, one of seven ACC teams with a top-20 RPI ranking.

## ACC TOURNAMENT NOTES

- Virginia earned the fifth seed, its highest seed since 2017 ACC Tournament when it was the fourth seed.
- The last time Virginia was the fifth seed in the ACC Tournament was 1996, the program's second ever tournament title.
- UVA has been the fifth seed six previous times (1974, 1975, 1980, 1986, 1987, 1996) and owns a 7-9 record in those six tournaments.
- The Cavaliers have won the ACC Tournament three times, 1996, 2009 and most recently 2011.
- Virginia has been part of every ACC Tournament since its inception in 1973 and will make its 48th overall appearance. Only Virginia and Clemson have participated in every ACC Tournament.
- The Cavaliers own a 54-79 overall record in the ACC postseason.
- Under head coach Brian O'Connor, the Cavaliers have a record of 29-25 overall mark in the ACC Tournament.

## AGAINST NOTRE DAME

- Friday will mark the second-straight season and the third time ever Notre Dame and Virginia will meet in the ACC Tournament. The Cavaliers have won two of three in ACC postseason action.
- In last year's tournament, Virginia erupted for 14 runs, tied for the most it has ever scored in ACC tournament play. The win propelled UVA into its first ACC Tournament semifinal since 2011.
- Virginia owns an 11-8 all-time mark against the Fighting Irish in series that dates back to 1991.
- Since entering the league in 2015, the Cavaliers are 8-6 against Notre Dame.
- Notre Dame won its first ever series against Virginia, taking all three in Charlottesville by a combined score of 30-12. It sent Virginia to 2-7 in league play over the first three ACC series of the season. The Cavaliers went on to win 14 of the last 20 ACC games last season to qualify for the NCAA Tournament and eventually reach the program's fifth College World Series.
- O'Connor spent 14 years as an assistant under Paul Mainieri at Notre Dame and was on staff for the Fighting Irish's last College World Series appearance in 2002.

- Led UVA to 2010 and 2011 ACC Coastal Division titles
- Second fastest in ACC history to reach 600 wins (825 games); only FSU's Mike Martin did so faster (802)
- One of eight coaches in history of ACC with 300 conference wins
- Led teams to ACC Championship games in 2005, 2008, 2009 and 2011 (won '09 and '11 titles)
- Four 50-win seasons (51 in 2010, 56 in 2011, 50 in 2013, 53 in 2014)
- Guided UVA to school-record win total each year from 2009-11 (49 in 2009, 51 in 2010, 56 in 2011)
- 84 players picked in Major League Baseball Draft over the last 16 years and 20 have had 20 reach the big leagues

### NOTING WEDNESDAY

- Virginia was upset by ninth-seeded Florida State in its pool play opener on Wednesday, 13-3. The Seminoles blew the game open in the third inning with a six-run rally, tied for the largest single inning output by an opponent this season.
- It marked the first time Virginia was run-ruled in the ACC Tournament for the first time since 2006 (11-0 - 7 inn.), also against Florida State.
- Virginia racked up 10 hits in the contest and lost for only the fourth time when accumulating double-digit hits. The Cavaliers are 25-4 this season when collecting 10 or more hits.
- The Cavaliers did not walk in the contest and left seven runners on base, including four in scoring position. It was only the second time this season UVA did not draw a walk.
- UVA's three runs in the contest came on consecutive two-out hits by Kyle Teel (3B), Casey Saucke (2B) and Ethan Anderson (1B) in the fourth inning.

### ON THE MOUND

- Lefthander Nate Savino is scheduled to make his 14th start of the season on Friday.
- Savino recorded his first win since March 25 in his final regular season start at Louisville. He scattered five hits over five innings of work and was charged with one earned run.
- The Cavaliers have allowed 7.92 hits per game the third fewest of any staff in the ACC. UVA ranks 19th in the country in hits allowed per game.
- Virginia ranks seventh in the country with 574 strikeouts this season. The 574 punchouts are the fourth most in program history. Including this season, UVA has struck out 500+ batters 11 times including a school-record 687 batters last season.
- Virginia has seven shutouts this season, one behind national leader Vanderbilt. Virginia is one of seven teams in the country with seven or more shutouts (Vanderbilt, Tennessee, Stanford, Central Michigan, Omaha).

### CAVALIERS AT THE PLATE

- Virginia is the No. 9 scoring offense in the country, averaging 9.0 runs per game. The Cavaliers have totaled 484 runs in 54 games, the 11th most nationally. The 484 runs are the fourth most in a single season in program history.
- The Cavaliers have scored 10 or more runs in a game 24 times this season.
- Virginia has scored five or more runs in a single inning 28 times this season. The seven runs in the fourth inning of game one against Clemson marked the 10th time UVA has scored seven or more in a single frame.

### CAVALIER NOTABLES

- In four games against the Irish last season, Jake Gelof went 5-for-11 (.455) with a home run and three RBI. The home run came in the ACC Tournament, his first of his career. He has hit 22 homers since, second most among active Cavaliers.
- Freshman Griff O'Ferrall extended his reached base streak to 18 games with a 2-for-4 effort in the ACC Tournament Pool Play opener. He is statistically the fifth-toughest batter in the ACC to strike out and leads the team in stolen bases with 17.
- Kyle Teel is expected to make his 107-consecutive start on Friday. He has caught all 54 games for UVA this season and split time as an outfielder, catcher and DH as a true freshman. Against FSU on Wednesday he drove in UVA's first run with his third triple of the season, tied for the team lead.
- Alex Tappen had 42 RBI in ACC play, the most of any hitter in the league. Tappen has been UVA's hottest hitter of the last 10 games, batting .415 (17-for-41) with three home runs and 15 RBI.
- Devin Ortiz homered in back-to-back games to close out the regular season. He is one homer shy of matching his career high set last season and is tied with Casey Saucke for the fourth-most on the team.

### DYNAMIC DUO

- Third baseman Jake Gelof and Alex Tappen are the most prolific run-producing duo in school history, combining for 144 RBI this season. The make up two-thirds of UVA's single-season 70-RBI club.
- Gelof and Tappen were both First Team All-ACC selections, the first set of Cavalier position players to land on the first team since Pavin Smith and Adam Haseley who went on to become the seventh and eighth overall picks, respectively, in the 2017 MLB Draft

### RECORD CHASING

- Jake Gelof surpassed Jon Benick (2001) for sole possession of second place on UVA's single season home runs list with his 19th in the middle game against Louisville on May 20. He trails Brian Buchanan (22 in 1994) for the most in program history.
- Gelof is also having a historic season driving in runs. He became the second player in UVA history to eclipse the 70-RBI mark with a two-run homer in the series finale against Clemson. He only trails Pavin Smith by three who drove in 77 in 2017 for the school record.
- With 15 RBI in the last 11 games, Tappen has shot up the single-season RBI list and became the third Cavalier to eclipse 70-RBI in a single season. He drove in four runs in three games in the final series of the season against Louisville.

**HONORING RYAN ZIMMERMAN**

- Zimmerman was the first player to have his number retired in the 134-year history of the program. No. 11 was retired as part of Ryan Zimmerman Day on April 30 at Disharoon Park.
- The No. 24 is UVA's only other retired number, worn by former head coach and UVA administrator Jim West.
- Zimmerman earned All-America honors from Baseball America (Second Team) and the NCBWA (Third Team) in 2005.
- Over his three-year career, Zimmerman batted .355 with seven home runs, 47 doubles and 140 RBI. His accumulated 250 career hits in 174 games, the fifth-most in program history before departing UVA for professional baseball.
- He left UVA as the single season record holder in hits (92 in 2005) and at bats (249 in 2004), both have since been surpassed.
- It took a little over two months since his last college baseball game for Zimmerman to make his MLB debut. In 2005, he was the fourth overall pick in the draft, the highest by any Cavalier at the time.
- Zimmerman was part of the inaugural class inducted into the UVA Baseball Hall of Fame in 2018.

**MR. WALK-OFF**

- Devin Ortiz hit a walk-off grand slam in the tenth inning on April 23 to help Virginia clinch its first series victory over North Carolina since 2016. The walk-off home run was his second of his career. He broke a 3-3 tie in the 10th of the 2021 NCAA Columbia Regional Championship game against ODU to send UVA to the Super Regionals.
- The walk-off grand slam was the only one hit by a Cavalier in the last 22 years.
- Since 2000, there have been eight Virginia walk-off homers. Ortiz is the only Cavalier to hit two walk-off home runs in that span.

**HOME COOKING**

- Virginia won 32 of its last 37 games at home, including a school-record streak of 19-straight that ended on April 1 against Georgia Tech.
- UVA is 29-5 at Disharoon Park in 2021.
- The Cavaliers have won 77 percent (537-165) of its games over the course of 21 seasons at The Dish.
- UVA is outscoring its opponents 363-146 at home this season.
- The sixth-inning home run by Jake Gelof in the series finale against Georgia Tech on April 3 was the 39th hit by the Cavaliers at Disharoon Park this season, a facility record. The previous mark of 38 was set in 2017 over the course of 38 games.
- The Disharoon Park single-game attendance record fell on April 3 against Georgia Tech and again on April 30 for a sellout crowd for Ryan Zimmerman day. A total of 5,919 fans poured into the stadium, the third crowd of 5,000+ his season.

**GOLDEN HOUR**

- Jake Gelof is the 10th semifinalist for the Golden Spikes Award in program history, tied for the third-most of any college baseball program.

## YEAR OF THE GRAND SLAM

- Virginia has hit five grand slams this season, the most of any Cavalier team since 2000.
- In the series opener against Boston College, Teel and Newell cleared the bases with a home run marking only the third time since 2000 and the last time since Kenny Towns hit two grand slams himself in 2013 against ECU that the Cavaliers have hit two grand slams in the same game.
- Teel, whose most notable grand slam came in game three of last year's Super Regional, hit four grand slams in his first 74 collegiate games the most of any Cavalier since 2000.
- With the bases loaded this season, Teel is 5-for-8 (.625) with three home runs, a triple and 18 RBI
- Newell has a grand slam in each of his three seasons as a Cavalier.

## GELOF'S MONSTER WEEK

- Jake Gelof was named the ACC Player of the Week on Monday (Feb. 28), NCBWA co-Hitter of the Week and was one of Collegiate Baseball Newspaper's National Players of the Week. He's the first Cavalier position player to take home the ACC weekly honor since 2017 (Pavin Smith & Jake McCarthy).
- In four games from Feb. 23-27, Gelof batted .900 (9-for-10) with four home runs and 15 RBI. He reached base 13 times and slugged 2.500 for the week.
- In the series opener against Cornell he blasted a pair of three-run homers and drove in eight runs, the most in a game since a UVA hitter since 2013.
- He capped off his week by becoming the first Cavalier to hit for the cycle in 21 years, accomplishing the feat in just four at bats and five innings played.

## HISTORIC NUMBERS VS CORNELL

- Virginia plated 60 runs in three games against Cornell, a new school record for runs in a three-game series. The 60 runs were tied for the most in any three-game span in the history of the program. The only other three-game stretch of 60 runs came in 1891.
- Virginia scored 24 runs in the opening game against Cornell, the most in a game since scoring 24 against U-Mass Lowell in 2020.
- The Cavaliers posted 41 runs in the first two games of the series, the second-most in back-to-back games during O'Connor's tenure at Virginia (44 in 2008 - Coppin St./Sienna).
- Led by Nate Savino's 11, Virginia fanned 23 batters in the opening game against Cornell, the second-largest strikeout total in school history. It marked the fourth time in the last two seasons UVA pitchers have combined to strike out 20 or more in a game.
- Only 11 times in NCAA history has a team struck out 23 or more batters in a nine-inning game. Virginia has produced two of the 11 games, both occurring in the last two seasons.
- Virginia drew 17 walks in the opening game against Cornell, the most in any game since 2000. Kyle Teel was issued five free passes, tying the program's single-game mark held by Phil Gosselin.

## PRESEASON POLLING

- For the second-straight season, Virginia came into the year ranked No. 5 by Baseball America. The Cavaliers were also inside the top 25 of Collegiate Baseball Newspaper (No. 24), USA Today Coaches (No. 21) and the NCBWA (No. 17) national polls.
- After appearing in the program's fifth College World Series last season, Virginia finished the 2021 season ranked in the top-10 of every major poll and finished as high as No. 6 according to Baseball America, Collegiate Baseball Newspaper, NCBWA and Perfect Game.
- In the annual preseason poll of the Atlantic Coast Conference baseball coaches, Virginia was picked to finish second in the Coastal Division. The Cavaliers received three votes to be the league's overall champion, second only to predicted winner, Florida State.
- Virginia was picked to finish second in the Coastal Division for the second-straight season and has been either first or second in the annual ACC preseason coaches poll in six of the last seven seasons.

## NEW CAVALIER BACKSTOP

- Sophomore Kyle Teel will assume the starting catching role in 2020 after 15 of his 53 starts as a true freshman came behind the dish. He played 19 in right field and served as the designated hitter for 19 more.
- Teel was included on the Golden Spikes Award Preseason Watch List, an award in which UVA has boasted that UVA nine semifinalists, the fourth-most in college baseball.
- As a true freshman, Teel led the Cavaliers with a .335 batting average which was the 10th-highest in the ACC. It was the first time a UVA freshman led the team in hitting since 2008.
- Teel was a third-team All-ACC selection and earned freshman All-America honors from D1Baseball.com (first team), Baseball America (first team), Collegiate Baseball Newspaper and Perfect Game (second team).
- Teel collected a preseason All-America nod from D1Baseball and preseason All-ACC honors from Perfect Game.

## PRESEASON NOTARIETY

- The Cavaliers had seven players included on D1Baseball's Position Power Rankings - 2B Max Cotier (40), OF Chris Newell (56), 1B Devin Ortiz (29), Catcher Kyle Teel (3), SP Matt Wyatt (52), SP Nate Savino (82) and Brandon Neeck (105)
- On Baseball America's top-150 baseball players list, Kyle Teel came in at 44, Savino at 74 and Newell at 76.

## LOOKING BACK TO 2021

- UVA went 4-12 in its first 16 ACC games and finished and won 14 of its last 20 ACC games to earn the 8th seed in the ACC Tournament.
- To close out the regular season, Virginia won 10 of its last 14 games.
- Won six-straight elimination games between the NCAA Regional and Super Regional to advance to the program's fifth College World Series.
- All five College World Series appearances for Virginia have come under head coach Brian O'Connor's watch. The five trips to Omaha since 2009 are tied for the second-most of any college baseball program.
- Virginia ranked 14th in the nation with a 3.62 ERA and second in the ACC, the first time in the top-20 since 2014.
