LEADING OFF

- Virginia Cavaliers return to ACC play on Friday after dropping the program's first home midweek game since 2022 to the Richmond Spiders by a score of 6-2 on Wednesday. On the season, the Cavaliers are 6-0 after a loss.
- Prior to the Richmond game, UVA took two of three from Cal during the squad's first-ever conference road trip to California. Over the final 10 innings of the weekend, the Cavaliers outscored the Bears 22-6.
- Entering the weekend, the Cavaliers have seven comeback wins on the season and are 7-5 in games when the opponents scores first. The Hoos are also outscoring opponents 30-10 in the second inning compared to being outscored 10-3 in the first inning this season.

AGAINST THE BLUE DEVILS

- In a series that dates back to 1926, the Cavaliers and the Blue Devils have played a total of 181 times. UVA leads the all-time series with a record of 110-70-1.
- The Cavaliers and Blue Devils have played a total of 16 games since the start of the 2021 season. Entering the weekend, each team has won eight games over that timespan.
- Virginia has 100 all-times win against five schools: North Carolina (120), Maryland (113), VMI (112), Virginia Tech (111) and Duke (110).
- The weekend series will be the first time that the two squads have faced off in Disharoon Park since the 2023 Charlottesville Super Regional. Duke took game one 5-4, before Virginia outscored the Blue Devils 26-6 over the final two games to advance to the College World Series.

RANKING THE HOOS

- Entering the weekend, UVA's arms ranked 33rd nationally and fifth in the ACC with an ERA of 3.77. The staff's strikeouts-per-nine of 10.3 ranks 30th in the country. Virginia has also turned 16 double plays this season, which ranks second in the ACC.
- Individually, freshman phenom Tomas Valincius ranks 85th nationally and 12th in the ACC with 31 strikeouts over his first five starts of the season. Valincius also ranks fourth among all freshmen across the country in strikeouts and second with a 7.75 K-to-BB ratio. In the batter's box, James Nunnallee is proving to be one of the hardest players to strikeout, with a K rate of 16.0 to rank 27th nationally and fifth in the ACC. Not too far behind him, Henry Godbout ranks 33rd nationally and sixth in the conference with a K-rate of 15.2.

- Guided UVA to 2009, 2011, 2014, 2015, 2021, 2023, 2024 College World Series including the 2014 and 2015 CWS Finals

- (Irvine Regional and Oxford Super Regional champions)
- Competed in 18 NCAA regionals and nine super regionals (hosted 10 NCAA regionals and six super regionals)
- Has won nine regionals, seven super regionals
- Led UVA to 2010, 2011 & 2023 ACC Coastal Division titles
- Second fastest in ACC history to reach 600 wins (825 games); only FSU's Mike Martin did so faster (802)
- One of eight coaches in history of ACC with 300 conference wins
- Led teams to ACC Championship games in 2005, 2008, 2009 and 2011 (won '09 and '11 titles)
- Five 50-win seasons (51 in 2010, 56 in 2011, 50 in 2013, 53 in 2014, 50 in 2023)
- Guided UVA to school-record win total each year from 2009-11 (49 in 2009, 51 in 2010, 56 in 2011)

ROSTER MAKEUP

- UVA added 20 newcomers (10 freshmen, 3 grad transfers, 4 four-year transfers, 3 junior college) to bolster its 2025 roster.
- The Cavalier offensive attack that broke single season records for team batting average (.333), runs per game (9.22), home runs (116), home runs per game (1.84), RBI (536) and total bases (1281) returns just over 50 percent of its at bats from a year ago. UVA returns 77 home runs from last year's historic power surge, the most in the ACC.
- Virginia returns 13 pitchers that saw action in 2024. The Cavaliers return a total of 356 innings pitched from 2024's College World Series squad, the most for a UVA pitching staff since 2020 and the second most in the ACC.

ON THE MOUND

- Jay Woolfolk will get the ball to open the series for UVA. Over this last four starts at Disharoon Park, Woolfolk only allowed seven earned runs in 25.2 innings pitched with 28 total strikeouts.
- During the first five starts of his collegiate career, Tomas Valincius has racked up 31 strikeouts. The 31 Ks rank Valincius 85th nationally and 12th in the ACC. Valincius also sits fourth among all freshmen across the country in strikeouts. To go along with his strikeouts, Valincius has only surrendered a quartet of walks, giving the lefty a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 7.75, which ranks him 29th nationally and fifth in the ACC.
- To close out the weekend, Preseason All-American Evan Blanco will get the start for the Hoos. In his four outings this season, Blanco is 1-0 with a 3.86 ERA in 9.1 innings pitched. He finished the 2024 season with an 8-3 record with 99 strikeouts in 99.1 innings pitched.

PRESEASON HONORS

- Headlined by consensus Preseason All-American Henry Godbout, a total of six Cavaliers landed on Preseason All-American teams.
- Henry Ford was named to three teams while Jacob Ference and Evan Blanco each landed on two. Chris Arroyo was named to D1Baseball's squad and Harrison Didawick found himself on NCBWA's team.
- Virginia is ranked top 5 in all five major College Baseball polls. The No. 2 ranking from D1Baseball is the program's highest preseason slot in the poll since 2015.
- In a poll of the Atlantic Coast Conference coaches, the Virginia baseball team was picked to win the league. UVA was picked to finish first in the conference in 2015, prior to the program's first National Championship.

HOME FIELD ADVANTAGE

- The home opening series against Dartmouth saw a combined attendance of 12,641, which was the largest crowd ever for a home-opening series.
- The ACC opening series against Boston College saw 16,301 fans packed Disharoon Park. The most for a regular season home series in program history including the earliest sell out in program history in the weekend finale.
- UVA ranked 14th in the NCAA in total attendance, second highest in the ACC during the 2024 season. The per game average of 4,197 ranked 18th in the country and third in the ACC.
- Disharoon Park was sold out a program single-season record, six times in 2024 including the final four games of the season.
- Virginia went 31-7 at Disharoon Park, the second-straight season UVA has 30 or more wins at home. It was the ninth time the Cavaliers have posted 30 or more home wins.
- Nine of the largest 25 Disharoon Park crowds were in 2024.

2024 SEASON IN REVIEW

- Reached the Men's College World Series for the seventh time in program history and the third time in the last four seasons. The seven trips to Omaha are the second-most of any college baseball program since 2009. Only Virginia, Tennessee and Stanford have appeared in three the last four MCWS.
- Virginia swept through the NCAA postseason, going 5-0 for only the second time in seven trips to the MCWS.
- UVA was the No. 12 overall seed in the NCAA Tournament and was the only team in the country to host NCAA Regionals and

Super Regionals in back-to-back seasons.

- Virginia reached the Super Regional round for the ninth time since 2009, only two schools have more appearances in the span (Florida-10, Florida State-10).
- The Cavaliers racked up their 14th 40-win season, 13 of which have come under the direction of Brian O'Connor.
- Virginia's 46 wins were tied for the fifth-most of any team in the country and marked the ninth time in program history UVA had 45 or more wins. All nine 45+ win seasons have come in O'Connor era (2004-present).
- The back-to-back 45-win seasons were the first since 2013 (50 wins) and 2014 (53 wins).
- Virginia lost back-to-back games once in the regular season. It's only the fifth time since 2004 UVA has lost consecutive games once in regular season play - 2024, 2017, 2013 (0 times), 2011 & 2010.
- Virginia registered 23 come-from-behind wins in 2024 including nine in ACC play and three more in the NCAA Tournament.
- UVA went 22-2 in non-conference action during the regular season, one of six teams nationally with two or fewer non-conference losses.
- Virginia captured the inaugural Jacksonville College Classic title at 121 Financial Field in Jacksonville, Fla. After outlasting Wichita State in 10 innings on Friday, the Cavaliers downed then-No. 18 Iowa (12-9) and handed Auburn its first loss of the season with a 6-4 win on Sunday.

O'CONNOR'S QUEST FOR 900

- Brian O'Connor reached his 850th Career win on March 5, a 6-3 victory over Penn State at Disharoon Park
- Now in his 22nd season, O'Connor is the eighth baseball coach in ACC history to accumulate 850 wins at an ACC institution. His .705 winning percentage is the highest of any active coach in DI baseball (min. 10 years).
- All his career wins have come at Virginia. He became the program's all-time wins leader on May 28, 2016 with his 595th win, a 7-2 victory over Louisville in the ACC Tournament.

LIFE ON THE ISLAND

•For the first time since the 2022 season, the Virginia Cavaliers started the season on the road. The 2025 opening weekend also marked the first time that the Hoos played in Puerto Rico.

•The season opening defeat against Michigan was highlighted by a two-run home run by Puerto Rico native Chris Arroyo in the seventh inning. Jay Woolfolk struck out five batters over 4.2 innings of two-run ball. Jacob Ference tied the school record for hit by pitches in a single game with three. Ference became the sixth Cavalier and first since Caleb Knight in 2018 to be plunked three times.

• In Virginia's first win of the season over Villanova, Bryson Moore did not surrender a hit over his first five innings of work and struck out a career-high, six batters in 5.2 innings of work but did not factor into the decision. Freshman James Nunnallee had a breakout performance by going 3-for-4 with an RBI and two runs scored in the 3-2 victory.

•Powered by freshman Tomas Valincius, UVA prevailed 7-0 over Rice in the weekend finale. In his collegiate debut, Valincius fanned 10 Owl batters over six innings of scoreless one-hit ball for the win. Valincius' 10 Ks were the most by a Virginia freshman since Alec Bettinger struck out 11 against Richmond in 2013. Along with Valincius, Five Cavalier pitchers combined for 15 strikeouts on Sunday, the most in a game since fanning 17 against Columbia on Feb. 24, 2023. Offensively, Henry Ford, Jacob Ference and Aidan Teel each had a pair of hits and scored once in the heart of the Cavalier lineup.

TEXAS ON THE MIND

•On the second weekend of the 2025 season, the Virginia Cavaliers travel to the Lone Star State to participate in the Round Rock Classic.

• In the weekend opener, UVA fell 7-2 to the Oregon State Beavers before bouncing back to take a 4-2 contest against the Minnesota Gophers. The weekend concluded with a 12-inning marathon with Oklahoma that the Sooners took 5-4.

• It marked the fourth time that the Cavaliers have been away from home on the second weekend since 2004 and the second consecutive season.

NOTING THE HOMESTAND

•During the eight-game homestand, the Virginia offense averaged just under 11 (10.6) runs per game on 13.1 hits per game while outscoring opponents 85-44.

• During the same span, the UVA tallied 7.5 strikeouts per nine innings with a total of 50.

•To secure the weekend sweep of Dartmouth, the freshman quartet of James Nunnallee, Chone James, Adien Harris and Jackson Sirois combined for seven hits, seven RBIs and four runs scored in the 13-3 victory.

• UVA's 10-run third inning against William & Mary was the most runs scored at home in an inning since Virginia plated 10 against Longwood in 2023.

• In the Saturday slugfest against Boston College, UVA's nine-run eighth inning is the most runs scored by the Cavaliers at home against an ACC opponent since scoring 10 on Georgia Tech in 2022.

•The 22 runs were the most runs for Virginia in an ACC game since 2010 - 27 vs. Maryland (4/23/10).

CALIFORNIA COMEBACKS

• In the first true road series of the 2025 season, Virginia took two of three from the Cal Golden Bears with both wins coming in comeback fashion.

•Virginia trailed 2-0 after two innings and was down 7-2 entering the ninth inning on Saturday, only to even the weekend series with UVA's sixth come-from-behind victory of the year. The five-run deficit was the largest the Cavaliers have overcome for a victory in 2025.

•The Saturday rally was sparked by the pinch-hit duo of Chone James and Walker Buchanan. The pairing combined for four hits, four RBI and three runs scored in the eighth-inning rally.

• In the weekend finale, the Cavaliers allowed the first run of the game in the bottom of the first before exploding for nine runs in the top of the second to take a commanding 9-1 lead en route to an 11-5 victory.

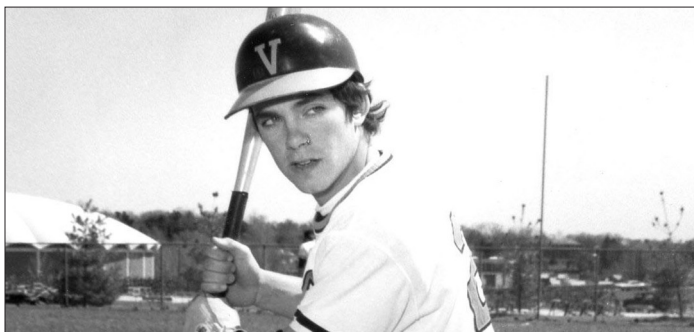
