### OPENING KICK

#### CAVALIERS WELCOME ABILENE CHRISTIAN TO TOWN

- Virginia and Abilene Christian meet on Saturday, concluding the Cavaliers' three-game homestand.
- Abilene Christian is an FCS program that plays in the Southland Conference.

#### BE OUR PLUS-ONE?

- Abilene Christian and Virginia are meeting for the first time in football as the Wildcats are serving as the Cavaliers' plus-one in the 11-game ACC scheduling model for 2020, which features 10 conference games and one non-conference game.
- Since the 1978 NCAA Division I-A/I-AA split, ACU is the first new non-FBS opponent for Virginia since UVA hosted JMU in 1979 (W, 69-9), which was the Dukes' last season at NCAA DII before moving up to I-AA (now FCS).
- ACU is the first out of state FCS program to play Virginia since the 1978 NCAA Division I-A/I-AA split.

#### FIVE TOP STORYLINES

- OLB **Noah Taylor** returned an interception 85 yards for a touchdown last time out against Louisville. The return is the longest in program history by a linebacker and tied for third-longest by a Cavalier all-time. It is also tied for the longest INT return by a linebacker this season in all of FBS. He was named ACC Linebacker of the Week for his efforts.
- OLB **Charles Snowden** has recorded a combined 21 tackles, 9.0 tackles for loss and 6.0 sacks over his last three games (at then-No. 11 Miami, vs. then-No. 15 North Carolina & vs. Louisville). He had 5.0 sacks all of 2019. His 6.0 sacks on the year rank tied for No. 1 among the nation's linebackers.
- QB **Brennan Armstrong** is tied for the FBS lead with three game totals of 200+ passing yards, 40+ rushing yards, 1+ passing touchdowns and 1+ rushing touchdowns. He shares the spot with Sam Ehlinger (Texas), Asher O'Hara (MTSU) and Malik Willis (Liberty).
- WR **Billy Kemp IV** is No. 1 in the ACC and No. 19 in the nation with 6.9 receptions per game.
- ILB **Nick Jackson** is No. 2 in the ACC (No. 20 nationally) with 10.6 tackles per game. He has 37 tackles over his last three games (Miami, UNC, Louisville).



OLB Noah Taylor's 85-yard interception return for a touchdown against Louisville is the longest by a linebacker in UVA history and tied for the third-longest return overall. It is the longest INT return in the ACC this season and tied for third-longest in all of FBS.

### #TheStandard: BY THE NUMBERS

- 8** Billy Kemp IV is No. 8 in the nation with 48 receptions. He shares the spot with Clemson's Amari Rodgers.
- 9** Virginia is tied for No. 9 in the nation with 24 sacks. The Cavaliers have recorded 14 combined sacks over the last three games.
- 23** Terrell Jana has a reception in 23-straight games, dating back to Nov. 17, 2018 at Georgia Tech.

## VIRGINIA ATHLETICS NEW BRAND IDENTITY

- The University of Virginia athletics department introduced this year its new brand identity. The refreshed designs provide updates on a brand rich in history and tradition. The work was developed by Nike's Global Identity Group (GIG) and includes updates to the iconic V-Sabre mark, two new secondary marks, a revised color scheme and the introduction of new typography, numerals and patterns.
- Nike's GIG team works with a select number of its sideline partners each year to update the athletics department's brand identity based on the goals provided by the institution. The launch of the new Virginia Athletics brand identity is the culmination of an 18-month collaborative process with Nike that began with discovery sessions with UVA coaches, student-athletes and administrators.

## UNIQUELY UVA

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

## UNIVERSITY NICKNAMES

Virginia's athletics teams have been accompanied by a somewhat confusing array of nicknames. The most prominent and widely accepted of these monikers are "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos."

Although the terms "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are used almost interchangeably to refer to University teams and players, "Cavaliers" is more often used by the media, while "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are frequently used by Virginia students and fans.

Legend has it that Washington & Lee baseball fans dubbed the Virginia players "Wahoos" during the fiercely contested rivalry that existed between the two in-state schools in the 1890s. By 1940, "Wahoos" was in general use around Grounds to denote University students or events relating to them. The abbreviated "Hoos" sprang up later in student newspapers and has gained growing popularity in recent years.

## THE CAVALIER MASCOT

The costumed Cavalier with a large character head debuted during Virginia's 1984 football season and has remained the official mascot of the University.

The first documented Cavalier on horseback was Francis Bell, a Virginia student from Dublin, Va., in 1947. Bell rode onto the field dressed as Cavaliers for Virginia's home football game with Harvard on the afternoon of October 11.

The Cavalier on horseback returned as the University's mascot in 1963. The UVA Polo Club provided both the horse and rider. However, the mounted Cavalier and his horse parted company in 1974 with the inception of AstroTurf at Scott Stadium.

The mounted Cavalier made its return in the Florida Citrus Bowl at the end of the 1989 football season. Due to its instant popularity, the Cavalier on horseback returned the following season on a regular basis and continues to lead the Virginia football team onto the field at the beginning of all home games.

## UNIVERSITY COLORS

Orange and blue were adopted as the University of Virginia's official athletic colors at a mass student meeting in 1888. UVA athletic teams had previously worn silver gray and cardinal red, but those colors did not stand out on muddy football fields, prompting a student movement to change them.

One of the students attending the mass meeting was Allen Potts, a star athlete who played on Virginia's first football team in 1888. Potts showed up at the meeting wearing a navy blue-and-orange scarf that he had acquired during a summer boating expedition at Oxford University. Orange and blue were chosen as the official athletic colors after one of Potts' fellow students pulled the scarf off Potts' neck and, waving it to the crowd, yelled, "How will this do?" UVA later served as the inspiration for schools like Auburn and Florida when they selected school colors.

## WAH-HOO-WAH

The origin of "Wah-hoo-wah" is uncertain. The cheer was used to root on Virginia teams as early as 1890 and may have been borrowed from Dartmouth College, whose athletics teams were once known as the Indians.

Legend attributes the yell to Natalie Floyd Otey, who sang the ballad "Where'er You Are, There Shall My Love Be" at Charlottesville's Levy Opera House in 1893. The predominantly student audience noticed that Otey warbled the first three words of the song between each of the stanzas and decided to join in the refrain. By evening's end, goes the legend, the crowd had corrupted "Where'er You Are" into "Wah-hoo-wah."

The Levy Opera House stands at the corner of High Street and Park Street and has since been renovated into an office building.

**VIRGINIA - ABILENE CHRISTIAN CONNECTIONS**

- Abilene Christian's DT Jack Schultz played two seasons at College of the Canyons, a junior college in Santa Clarita, Calif. UVA offensive line coach Garrett Tujague served as the head coach at College of the Canyons from 2007-12 before leaving to join Bronco Mendenhall's staff at BYU in 2013. Prior to being COC's head coach, he spent 1998-06 as the offensive line coach for the Cougars.
- UVA's special teams coordinator/tight ends coach Ricky Brumfield was the special teams coordinator and safeties coach at Nicholls State when ACU's offensive line coach Mario Jeberaeel was a graduate assistant at Nicholls State in 2011. UVA's director of player personnel Justin Anderson was also an assistant coach on that Nicholls State staff from 2010-15.

**VIRGINIA AND TEAMS FROM THE FCS**

- Abilene Christian is the first FCS program not from the Commonwealth of Virginia to play the Cavaliers since the 1978 NCAA Division I-A/I-AA split. With a bevy of current FCS programs (6) in the Commonwealth, UVA has steadily played JMU, Richmond, VMI and William & Mary dating back to 1978.
- There are 15 current FCS programs from outside the Commonwealth of Virginia that UVA has an all-time series. The majority of the meetings coming during the early to mid-20th century. UVA has an all-time series with the following current FCS programs not located in Virginia. The last year the series was played in the parenthesis: Bucknell (1906), The Citadel (1951), Colgate (1970), Columbia (1938), Dartmouth (1934), Davidson (1968), Furman (1923), Georgetown (1913), Harvard (1947), Idaho (2011\*), Lafayette (1942), Lehigh (1976), Penn (1950), Princeton (1948) and Yale (1944). \*- UVA played a 2011 Idaho team that was an FBS member at the time

**VIRGINIA FACING TEAMS FROM THE LONE STAR STATE**

- Virginia is facing a school from the state of Texas for the eighth time. UVA has played three games against Texas, three games against TCU and one against Texas Tech.
- Abilene Christian is just the fourth-different opponent from Texas the Cavaliers have played.
- Abilene Christian is playing its first-ever game in the Commonwealth of Virginia.
- UVA has only played three games in the Lone Star State, playing twice at Texas and once at TCU. UVA has faced TCU and Texas Tech in bowl games. UVA's most recent game in Texas was at TCU in 2012.

**CAVALIERS FROM THE STATE OF TEXAS**

- Virginia has five players on its team that call the state of Texas home.
- WR Nathaniel Beal III (Houston), OG Joe Bissinger (Houston), Matt Gahm (Dallas), WR Ra'Shaun Henry (Killeen) and QB Lindell Stone (Dallas) all hail from Texas.

**HOME SWEET HOME**

- Virginia returns home to Scott Stadium for the last of three-straight home games.
- UVA is winners of 15 of its last 17 games at Scott Stadium, dating back to the start of the 2018 season.
- UVA snapped a four-game losing streak last time out against then-No. 15 North Carolina. Prior to the win UVA had only led for a combined 30:47 this season, all of which came in the season-opening win over Duke at Scott Stadium. During UVA's current two-game winning streak at home, UVA has led for a combined 94:21 of 120:00 of playing time, which was 38:32 vs. UNC and 55:49 vs. Louisville.

**ARMSTRONG LIVING THE THORTERBACK LIFE AT UVA**

- QB Brennan Armstrong has three games this season with at least 200+ passing yards, 40+ rushing yards, 1+ passing touchdowns and 1+ rushing touchdowns. UVA is 3-0 this season when Armstrong meets those marks. His three games rank tied for No. 1 in the nation this season. He shares the spot with Sam Ehlinger (Texas), Asher O'Hara (MTSU) and Malik Willis (Liberty).
- Since 2000, a UVA quarterback has met those marks just 14 times with Bryce Perkins (2018-19) leading the way with five such games. In fact, Perkins did not accomplish it until his eighth career start with the Cavaliers (vs. UNC, 2018). In comparison, Armstrong did so in three of his first five full games as the starting quarterback.
- Under Bronco Mendenhall, UVA is 7-1 when its quarterback reaches those "Thorterback" marks.
- Prior to Mendenhall's tenure, current UVA wide receiver coach Marques Hagans accomplished the feat twice in his career, while other UVA QBs since 2000 to reach those marks were Jameel Sewell (twice), Matt Johns (once) and David Watford (once).

**ARMSTRONG ON THIRD AND FOURTH DOWN**

- QB Brennan Armstrong is 18-of-30 passing (60 percent) on third down conversions with 12 first downs and one touchdown.
- Armstrong has been known to get the fourth down rush as well, averaging 12.0 yards per rush on fourth down attempts, nabbing five first downs on six tries.
- Armstrong has thrown six of his 11 touchdowns this season on first down.

**ON A MISSION, SNOWDEN ERUPTS**

- Virginia OLB Charles Snowden has been a defensive spark for the Cavaliers the last couple weeks, notching 18 combined tackles, 8.5 tackles for loss and 5.0 sacks.
- He is the only player in the nation with 30+ tackles (43), 6.5+ tackles for loss (10.0), 4+ sacks (6.0) and 3+ passes defended (3).
- His 4.0 sacks against then-No. 15 UNC, three of which came on three-consecutive plays, is a single-season best in all of FBS this year.
- Since 2000, Snowden is one of 11 ACC players to record 4.0+ sacks in a game and the first since Greg Rousseau of Miami did so against FSU in 2019.
- Snowden is the first Cavalier to record 4.0 sacks since Jamie Sharper in 1996 (vs. UNC).

**SNOWDEN CONTINUES AN ACC LINEBACKER TRADITION**

- Virginia OLB Charles Snowden leads the nation's linebackers with 6.0 sacks. He is in a four-way tie with Arkansas State's Justin Rice, Georgia State's Jordan Strachan and FAU's Leighton McCarthy.
- While also leading the ACC linebackers in sacks, Snowden is on track to become the fourth Cavalier in a row to accomplish this feat. Former OLB Chris Peace did so in 2017 (7.5) and 2018 (7.5), while ILB Jordan Mack (7.5) was the one in 2019. Also, all four at one time have had Kelly Poppinga as their position coach at UVA. Mack was an OLB in 2016 as a freshman, before moving inside in 2017.

**SNOWDEN CLIMBS UVA CAREER SACKS LIST**

- Snowden has 15.0 career sacks, which ties him for No. 15 all-time at UVA, sharing the spot with DT Tom Kilgannon (1981-84) and DE Jon Harris (1993-96).

**ONE TAYLOR OF A KIND**

- OLB Noah Taylor returned an interception 85 yards for a touchdown on Nov. 14 against Louisville. It was the longest INT return by a linebacker in program history and is tied for the third-longest return in the UVA record book, sharing the spot with teammate Nick Grant's 85-yard INT return against William & Mary last year.
- The return is also tied for the longest this season by a linebacker in all of FBS, sharing the spot with Kentucky's Jamin Davis. It is the longest return in the ACC this season and tied for the third longest overall in FBS.
- Taylor is the only player in the nation since the 2019 season started with at least 9.0 sacks and at least three interceptions.
- Taylor is used in a myriad of ways, coming off the edge, as well as dropping into coverage. Of his 38 tackles, 27 have come on rushing plays.
- Taylor is building on his breakthrough 2019 season when he finished 2019 with 57 tackles, 13.5 TFL, 7.0 sacks, 2 INT, 4 PBU, 1 FF and 1 punt block. His 7.0 sacks ranked No. 2 among ACC linebackers in 2019, second to former UVA teammate Jordan Mack (Carolina Panthers). Taylor was also just one of three FBS players with 2+ INTs and 7+ sacks in 2019 and the only one returning to college football in 2020.

**THE C-VILLE TRIO**

- Virginia has three receivers, Billy Kemp IV (48), Terrell Jana (31) and Tony Poljan (25), with at least 25 receptions. It is one of 12 programs in the nation with three players at that plateau in catches, joining, Arkansas State, Boston College, BYU, Clemson, Miami, Middle Tennessee State, Mississippi State, Oklahoma, SMU, West Virginia and Western Kentucky.

**ARMSTRONG VS. ASSOCIATED PRESS TOP 25 TEAMS**

- QB Brennan Armstrong has played well against AP Top 25 teams in 2020.
- In games against No. 1 Clemson, No. 11 Miami and No. 15 North Carolina, Armstrong has thrown for 659 yards, eight touchdowns (3 INTs) and rushed for 246 more yards and another score. That comes out to 905 yards of total offense (301.7 ypg) and nine touchdowns responsible for.

The last Cavalier to reach 1,000-career rushing yards was former QB Bryce Perkins last season when he became the 44th player in program history to reach the milestone. He is only the third UVA quarterback to reach the milestone and the first since Shawn Moore in 1990.

**LAVEL DAVIS JR. STRETCHES THE FIELD**

- WR Lavel Davis Jr. is averaging 21.8 yards per reception so far this season. Since he missed the Miami and UNC games, he has not played enough games to be ranked nationally, however he would rank No. 1 in the ACC and No. 11 nationally. To rank nationally, a player needs to appear in 75 percent of his teams game, which by playing against Abilene Christian on Saturday he will hit that mark.
- Despite missing two games, Davis still ranks No. 7 in the nation among freshmen with 284 receiving yards.
- Eight of Davis Jr.'s 13 receptions this season have gone for 20+ yards and three have gone for 30+ yards. All 13 of his receptions have gone for a first down or a touchdown.
- Dating back to 2000, Davis Jr.'s 21.8 yards per reception mark through UVA's first seven games is the highest in program history of players with at least 10 receptions.
- Davis Jr.'s 21.8 yards per reception is ranked No. 4 in the nation among players with at least 13 receptions. Below is where Davis Jr. stacks up:

**FRESHMAN SCORING RATE FOR DAVIS IS HIGH**

- WR Lavel Davis Jr. is tied for No. 2 in the nation among freshmen for receiving touchdowns with four. He trails Oklahoma's Marvin Mims (7) and shares the second spot with Tahj Washington (Memphis).

**KEMP IS A WORKHORSE FOR THE UVA OFFENSE**

- WR Billy Kemp IV has become a workhorse for the Virginia offense. He currently ranks No. 1 in the ACC and No. 21 in the nation with 6.9 receptions per game. He tallied a career-high 10 catches at No. 1 Clemson and again against NC State. His 96 receiving yards against the Tigers was also a career high.
- Kemp ranks No. 12 in the ACC and No. 95 nationally with 64.0 receiving yards per game.
- Over his last 12 games, dating back to Nov. 9, 2019 vs. Georgia Tech, Kemp has caught 68 passes (5.7 rpg) for 641 yards (53.4 ypg) and two touchdowns (vs. VT & NC State).

**JACKSON IS TRENDING TOWARD THE VICINITY OF FORMER UVA ALL-AMERICANS**

- ILB Nick Jackson is No. 2 the ACC in tackles per game with 10.6 per game. He also ranks No. 20 in the nation.
- Since 2000, Jackson is only the third different Cavalier to record at least 70 tackles through the first seven games of the season. The other two were All-Americans FS Quin Blanding and ILB Micah Kiser.
- Kiser, a current starter for the Los Angeles Rams, is only the second player in ACC history to lead the league in tackles three seasons in a row (2015-17), joining Luke Kuechly (2009-11).
- Blanding is the only player in ACC history to finish No. 2 in tackles four years in a row. No one had done it three times until Blanding did it. Blanding is UVA's all-time leading tackler (495).

**LONG UVA SCORING DRIVES**

- Five games into the season, UVA already has scoring drives of 97 yards (vs. NC State), 94 yards (vs. Duke) and 94 yards (at Miami). All three drives resulted in touchdowns and are longer than any drive the Cavaliers had in 2017, 2018 and 2019.
- The last time UVA had multiple drives of 90+ yards was in 2016 when UVA set a program record with a 99-yard drive vs. Central Michigan and also had a 90-yard drive against UConn.
- UVA has 10 drives of 75 yards or more and all 10 have resulted in touchdowns.

**VIRGINIA ON 4TH DOWN**

- Virginia has secured first downs 14 times on 4th down, which is tied for No. 6 in FBS. They share the spot with Florida State and Liberty. Western Kentucky is No. 1 in the nation with 17 made 4th down attempts.
- Of UVA's 14 first downs on 4th down, 11 came on rushes and three on passes.

**THOMPSON GETTING IT DONE ON THIRD AND FOURTH DOWN**

- QB Keytaon Thompson has been 100 percent successful obtaining a first down when rushing on third or fourth down. He is 4-for-4 on third down and 2-for-2 on fourth down.

**POLJAN BRINGING THE TIGHT END BACK TO UVA**

- TE Tony Poljan, a grad transfer from Central Michigan, has 25 receptions for 223 yards and four touchdowns this season.
- Since 2001, UVA tight ends have accumulated 806 receptions, 8,380 receiving yards and 74 touchdowns, by far the best in the ACC over that span.
- From that list of tight ends, 10 have enjoyed careers in the NFL with seven lasting 3+ years.

**POLJAN ONE OF THE NATION'S MORE PRODUCTIVE TIGHT ENDS**

- TE Tony Poljan is tied for No. 7 in the nation among tight ends with 25 receptions.

**FIELD POSITION HAD BEEN HURTING THE CAVALIERS - TRENDING TOWARD THE POSITIVE**

- Virginia is losing the field position battle by an average of 2.1 yards for the season. UVA's average starting field position is its own 28.5, while its opponents on average start at the 30.6-yard line.
- UVA also has only started nine drives on its opponents side of the field, while four of those times came in the opener against Duke. Against Duke UVA turned the short field into two touchdowns, threw one interception and the last one took a kneel to end the game.
- In comparison, UVA's opponents have started 16 drives on the Cavaliers' side of the field. The UVA defense has battled well under the circumstances, yielding five touchdowns and four field goals. The defense has also forced two punts, one interception and one missed field goal. Two other times the game ended with a QB kneel.
- Compared to last season, UVA had +6.6 average in field position for the season as its average starting field position was the 33.9 yard-line, while opponents were starting on average at their own 27.3 yard line.
- The field position deficit has shrunk during the current two-game winning streak. Heading into the UNC game, UVA was losing the field position battle by 5.8 yards and was starting on average at its own 26.6, while opponents were starting on average at the 32.4.

**DELANEY CLIMBING VARIOUS UVA CAREER SCORING LISTS**

- At Miami PK Brian Delaney is the 11th Cavalier with 200+ career points and needs three points to pass Tiki Barber and Frank Quayle for No. 8 on UVA's all-time career scoring ledger.
- Delaney is also No. 5 all-time at UVA in career points kicking with 208. Delaney set the UVA single-season record for points kicking with 110 in 2019. His 50 PATs in 2019 are also a UVA single-season record.
- Delaney is No. 5 all-time at UVA with 39 career field goals. No. 4 is Ian Frye (2012-15) with 45 made field goals.

**NATION'S MOST SEASONED OFFENSIVE LINE**

- Virginia returns all its starting offensive linemen from 2019 and the unit boasts 150 career starts at the position, which is No. 1 in all of FBS.
- Looking at UVA's top leaders in career starts, the top three returning players with most career offensive starts are all offensive linemen (Dillon Reinkensmeyer, 44; Ryan Nelson, 34; Chris Glaser, 29).
- UVA has not started the same five offensive linemen for every game in a season since 2011. That could change in 2020.
- Currently, UVA is No. 3 in the ACC with fewest sacks allowed (1.86).

**THE MENDENHALL ERA: HOLDING OPPONENTS TO CERTAIN THRESHOLDS**

- Virginia, under Bronco Mendenhall, has held opponents under 400 yards of total offense 36 times since the start of the 2016 season (55 games). UVA is 21-15 under Mendenhall in those games.
- Since the start of the 2018 season, UVA has held 23 opponents (30 games) under 400 yards of total offense. UVA is 16-7 under Mendenhall in those games.
- The 2019 team faced injuries in the secondary like no other position group during Mendenhall's tenure and still managed to do this 10 times. ## UNIQUELY VIRGINIA FOOTBALL

## GUIDING PRINCIPLES

- The Virginia football program under Bronco Mendenhall has 14 guiding principles. They can be found on the walls of the McCue Center and outlining the fences of the practice facility. They are a constant reminder to the foundation of the program. Each one is a vehicle for the Virginia football program to develop people.
- **Bronco Mendenhall** *Said It:* "I would love to win a national championship. I'd love to develop a great program here. But what I would really love is for every kid in my program to have an amazing life."
- Family. First, Last, Always
- Earned Not Given
- Will Before Skill
- And ...
- 400 Percent
- The Power of Choice
- Two Ways
- Protect our Cart
- Less Drama, More Work
- Hard Things Together
- Everybody is Somebody
- It Pays to be a Winner
- Champions Do Extra
- Make it a Masterpiece

## TASK UNIT LEADERS

- The Cavaliers have 10 task-unit leaders and each has an assistant. Working together, they determine the order in which players select their jersey numbers, choose the movie that's shown the night before a game (not taking place this season), pick the color combination of the uniform UVA will wear in a given game, recognize teammates for their effort in practice, and decide which players make up the four special-teams units: kickoff, kickoff return, punt and punt return.
- **Bronco Mendenhall** *Said It:* "It's their program. The idea simply is, I like the idea of delegating and providing leadership opportunities as much as possible. I try to get as much off it [head coach's plate] as possible, so the only thing that I have remaining to do is competitive work. Then that allows me to help our team at the highest level with the time that I have."
- OLB **Charles Snowden** *Said It:* "I know he's [Mendenhall] big on leadership development, so I think he just gives us opportunities to lead within football. We definitely see our peers in a different light than the coaches do. The coaches kind of see football only. We know who's coming back and getting in extra work, we know how guys carry themselves, we know how invested they are."

## THE 4TH SIDE

- Offense and defense are two sides. Special teams is the third side. **The 4th Side**, in Bronco Mendenhall's teaching, is the sidelines. Mendenhall has made it a point of emphasis with his team since arriving in Charlottesville that **The 4th Side** is as important as the other three. And just as he expects his teams to perform on offense, defense and special teams, Mendenhall wants his players on the sidelines to thrive. By extension, the UVA fan base is also part of the **The 4th Side**.
- **Bronco Mendenhall** *Said It:* "It starts on our sideline and possibly the name of all of our fans as the entire stadium becomes The 4th Side."
- WR **Terrell Jana** *Said It:* "It is the 4th Side for a reason because of the four aspects of the team. Coach shows film in the meeting room of players on the 4th Side. The team sees that and takes pride in that."



## EARN YOUR JERSEY NUMBER

- Head coach Bronco Mendenhall introduced what he sees as the bedrock of his "earned not given" mantra when he arrived in Charlottesville in 2016. There are no double numbers and once a number is earned, that student-athlete has it for the season. The majority of numbers are picked over the course of the selection ceremonies during the final three weekends of fall camp. Once the season ends, all players return to the status of no number for winter conditioning, spring ball and summer workouts.
- To be considered for number selection, players have to meet certain physical benchmarks – weight room numbers, conditioning times, etc. – but it's also about dedication to the program, overall effort in practice and having the right disposition in the locker room.
- Bronco Mendenhall doesn't choose the order. The task unit leaders do.
- **Bronco Mendenhall** *Said It:* "The task unit leaders, they're the ones who are with their teammates every day in the locker room. They're with them in class. They're with them in their apartments. They see a lot more than I see. Our players have embraced it, and it matters to them to be endorsed by their peers to be on our team."
- Alum **Jordan Mack** *Said It:* "Part of our program is earned not given. They know what to expect coming in, and they know nothing is going to be given. To earn a number, gear, anything with a Virginia sabre on it, you're going to have to earn it through your hard work."

## STATE CHANGERS

- White ► Grey ► Orange ► Navy ► Black
- Workout gear color is immediate feedback where our student-athletes stand in their training in order to drive positive change.
- Everything in performance is tracked from the moment they step on Grounds to show their gains. All new players begin their UVA careers wearing white.
- Black workout gear is the pinnacle in the UVA strength & conditioning. Two current Cavaliers have reached that pinnacle: DE Richard Burney and CB Nick Grant.

## THURSDAY'S HEROES

- The Thursday's Heroes program is coordinated by the University of Virginia football team. Originally at BYU, Thursday's Heroes transitioned to UVA when Bronco Mendenhall became Head Coach in 2016. Since then, the program has continued to grow, warming the hearts of players, coaches, fans, and of course, the Heroes. Each Thursday during the Fall and Spring season (this is not happening this year), an individual who is undergoing a difficult circumstance (medical, physical, cognitive, etc.) and their family is invited to tour the football facilities, watch practice, meet the coaches/team, and receive special gifts unique to each Hero. Different players take turns showering the Hero with gifts, including UVA gear, an official game jersey, Beats by Dre, a bicycle, school supplies, Halloween costumes, and special video messages from favorite celebrities (Peyton Manning, Kenny Chesney, Damian Lillard, Chris Long and Hugh Jackman to name a few have taken part). The goal of the program is simple: to put a smile on the Hero's face and to welcome them to the Virginia Football family.
- TB **Wayne Taulapapa** *Said It:* "Everybody is Somebody ... Every day we look up to them and the fight they are in. We want them to know they are with us and we are with them."

UNIQUELY VIRGINIA FOOTBALL

MAD HATTERS (PUT ON THE HATS)

- The “Mad Hatters” is the name of the Virginia Football Scout Team. It drew inspiration from the character frozen in time in “Alice in Wonderland,” but the name has as much to do with the evolution of pennies scout team players once draped over their shoulder pads to brightly colored pieces of fabric, which stretch over their helmets. Hence, “Put on the hats.”
- Each Thursday after practice the “Mad Hatter of the Week” is announced by a task unit leader.
- **Bronco Mendenhall** *Said It:* “The way I frame it to our team is without going through that process, I think there is a fundamental step missed in their development. Most recruits and most young people want to come in and play their first year. Most of us, right, it’s kind of about us. When you’re in that role, it’s really about serving and helping your team.”

UVA GROUNDSKEEPERS

- Virginia’s football program wants to be a catalyst for change in the community, helping to turn the pain of the Charlottesville riots of Aug. 12, 2017 into a celebration of life, love and unity. During the summer of 2020, a player-led initiative was born in the form of the Groundskeepers in order to “Take Back our Grounds” from the white nationalists that descended upon Charlottesville in 2017.
- To be part of the Groundskeepers, participants take part in their own march, which starts downtown at Heather Heyer Way — the street named in honor of the woman who lost her life during the Aug. 12 demonstrations — before heading to the Enslaved Workers Memorial and the Rotunda.
- **Bronco Mendenhall** *Said It:* “We chose to take this march in direct opposition and the exact opposite direction of the events that happened in the death of Heather Heyer. We’re standing against hate, inequality, anything that doesn’t reflect well on the state of mankind, especially at the University of Virginia.
- **OLB Charles Snowden** *Said It:* We are committed to making a change in our community. We are committed to fighting for what’s right. We are committed to a better future. We are the Groundskeepers. Just thinking about what transpired those two days and what those two days signify and stand for — There were protests led in the name of hatred, racism, oppression and that’s harmful. That’s hurtful to a lot of people and that’s not what the city of Charlottesville stands for. That’s not what the University of Virginia stands for. The Groundskeepers here at UVA, we just want to show that’s not who we are and not what we stand for. So we’re just trying to take back the power of those days and show that we stand for love, unity, respect, uplifting one another, and just doing what’s right.”
- One of UVA’s four flags they run onto the field with each game is a flag that represents the Groundskeeper, which serves as constant reminder to the community of the importance of being unified in love rather than hate.

THE SHIELD

- The shield is an important part of the Virginia football program. On the shield, which was modeled after shields used in the movie 300, has three numbers: +1, 24, +5. They represent a formula that Bronco Mendenhall and his staff developed after years of data study and analytics that will lead to probable wins. Each game UVA’s goal is to be at least +1 in turnover margin, score at least 24 points while holding opponents under 24 points and being at least +5 in field position. Accomplishing each of those goals in a game creates a winning scenario.
- Virginia’s shield (pictured) is always represented in the UVA locker room.
- The shield also has the UVA guiding principles painted around the shield.

ARMSTRONG IS NAMED QB1

- QB Brennan Armstrong was named the starting quarterback by Bronco Mendenhall on Aug. 27. He is the third opening-day starting quarterback under Bronco Mendenhall, joining Kurt Benkert (2016-17) and Bryce Perkins (2018-19).
- Armstrong is one of UVA's four team captains as voted upon by his peers. He is the only non-senior, joining DE Richard Burney, WR Terrell Jana and OLB Charles Snowden.
- Armstrong is the first left-handed starting QB at UVA since Jameel Sewell (2006, 2007, 2009).
- Armstrong enrolled at UVA in January 2018 and backed up Perkins the last two seasons, saving his redshirt season in 2018 under the NCAA participation rules.
- Armstrong is the 13th different UVA starting quarterback to start an opener in the last 16 seasons. The list includes: Bryce Perkins (2018-19), Kurt Benkert (2016-17), Matt Johns (2015), Greyson Lambert (2014), David Watford (2013), Michael Rocco (2011-12), Marc Verica (2010), Vic Hall (2009), Peter Lalich (2008), Jameel Sewell (2007), Christian Olsen (2006) and Marques Hagans (2005).

ARMSTRONG CONTINUES TO MATURE AS THE STARTING QB

- QB Brennan Armstrong threw for 200+ yards in each of his first two career starts, including 269 against Duke and 270 at No. 1 Clemson. He is only the second Cavalier to throw for 200+ passing yards in each of his first two career starts. Armstrong joins Matt Blundin, who did so in his first four career starts that spanned 1989, 1990 and 1991.
- With UVA trailing by three points (20-17) entering the fourth quarter in the season-opening win over Duke, Armstrong was 8-of-9 passing for 144 yards and two touchdowns. His lone incompletion was ruled a catch on the field by Davis Jr., but overturned on replay.
- Armstrong passed for 270 yards and three touchdowns at No. 1 Clemson, while also rushing for 89 more yards. Dating back to 2000, he is the only QB to pass for 225+ yards, pass for 3+ touchdowns and rush for 70+ yards in a game against the Tigers.
- With Armstrong under center, the UVA offense accumulated 417 yards of total offense at No. 1 Clemson. The Cavaliers became the first ACC team to earn 400+ yards of total offense against the Tigers since 2017 when NC State (Nov. 4) did so. Since the start of the 2019 season only LSU, Notre Dame, Ohio State, Virginia (twice) and Syracuse have averaged 5.0+ yards per play against the Clemson defense.

UVA QUARTERBACKS IN THEIR FIRST-CAREER START

- QB Brennan Armstrong made his first collegiate start against Duke at Scott Stadium.
- Armstrong threw for 269 yards and two touchdowns against Duke, which is the second-most by a Cavalier starting quarterback making his first career start.
- Since 1955, 22 Virginia quarterbacks have passed for at least 150 yards in their first-career start. Here is a breakdown of the most passing yards by a Virginia QB in their first-ever start:

SCOTT STADIUM, HOME OF THE CAVALIERS

The Carl Smith Center, home of David A. Harrison III Field at Scott Stadium, with its unique architectural design, scenic setting on the University's Grounds and exceptional sight lines, is one of the nation's finest college football settings.

Opened in 1931, Scott Stadium might be one of the oldest campus college football stadiums in the nation, but you could never tell from its appearance. Numerous upgrades and expansions make it a modern home for the Cavaliers and their fans.

Scott Stadium was the gift of Frederic William Scott and Elisabeth Strother Scott, and was dedicated to the memory of his parents, Frederic Robert Scott and Frances Branch Scott.

Virginia played its dedication game at Scott Stadium on Oct. 15, 1931 against the Virginia Military Institute before a then-capacity crowd of 22,000. Prior to that season, the Cavaliers staged their home games at the University's Lambeth Field.

Virginia has played 481 games in the historic venue. UVA's all-time record at Scott Stadium stands at 275-194-12.

# Bronco Mendenhall

## Head Coach • Fifth Season

Since arriving at Virginia for the 2016 season, head coach Bronco Mendenhall's impact on the Cavalier program has been immense. From a two-win season, to the ACC's Coastal Division Championship and a New Year's Six bowl invitation, Virginia football's ascent has both remarkable and historic.

Mendenhall came to Charlottesville after a highly successful 11-year career at BYU with a vision and a plan of execution for the daunting renovation project he faced. He has masterfully crafted principles and culture, and instilled pride and purpose, leading to a standard of unbroken growth in just four seasons.

Having a plan and being able to execute a strategic approach to achieving results have been mission critical to Mendenhall's formula for success.

"Teams and organizations are perfectly designed to get the results that they get,"

Mendenhall is fond of saying regarding both successes and failures. His pursuit of

"unbroken growth" centers around learning, applying and improving on tools, frameworks, networks, innovation and processes that deliver those results. His ultimate goal is more expansive than building a great football organization. He strives to build great people.

On-field success is just part of the story Mendenhall has scripted at Virginia. He is a powerful believer in balance, which he frequently sums up with one simple word ... AND. It has become the calling card for the UVA football program.

"I think decisions are made based on principle, and I think principles are governed by beliefs," Mendenhall said. "AND is one of our guiding principles, and that is based on my belief that football is a vehicle to develop people."

At his introductory press conference, Mendenhall stressed that he wanted students AND athletes and believed that combination was achievable, especially at an institution such as Virginia that ranks among the top three public universities in the nation. Since that time, he has not compromised his approach to achieving those means. More importantly, his teams have bought in on the concepts with great enthusiasm and demonstrated they can do so while also being successful on the field.

"I would love to win a national championship," Mendenhall said. "I'd love to develop a great program here. But what I would really love is for every kid in my program to have an amazing life."

In the world of big-time football, Mendenhall's philosophy is unconventional, but that doesn't faze him.

"I'm looking for the complete development of everyone in our program – and winning," he said. "One is not at the expense of the other. I think they go hand-in-hand, and winning, without the other, would be hollow to me."

Under Mendenhall, the UVA program has progressed from two to six to eight to nine wins. Achievements and recognitions on the field, in the classroom and around the community have exponentially increased as well.

In 2019, UVA placed 10 players on the ACC All-Academic team, the most in the program's history. Linebacker

Jordan Mack was named the ACC's Jim Tatum Award winner as the league's top football scholar-athlete and was a finalist for the William B. Campbell Trophy, known in the sport as the "academic Heisman." Linebacker Micah Kiser, now a member of the Los Angeles Rams, won the award in 2017.

Giving back has become a cornerstone of Virginia football. Players frequently visit the University's Children's Medical Center and speak at local elementary schools. The team's Thursday's Heroes program has been recognized for its efforts to honor individuals across the state of Virginia who are dealing with personal adversity. In 2020, the ACC honored the Thursday's Heroes program with its "Game Changers" award, which recognizes and highlights specific conference teams' involvement with their local communities.

"I'm in pursuit, and we're in pursuit as a football program, of both of those things, and without compromising our expectations for one or the other," Mendenhall said. "I want good young people. I'm talking about morals, values, character, behavior and contribution to the world. And I want a great team. I know it sounds idealistic, but I would not coach football if I did not think it could be done, and I would not coach at Virginia if I did not think there was support for doing it that way."

Mendenhall's pursuit of individual growth is only magnified by the success his teams have also achieved on the field. His name appears often when the accolades of college football's leading active coaches are charted.

"To me, football is just a magical and powerful platform to have motivated learners, and I get to teach life lessons through the sport of football," Mendenhall said. "The trophies, the wins, they're necessary for job security and the world makes a big deal of that. But it is hollow without the substance. Relationships are everything. Other than that, it would just be a game, and that does not sound quite meaningful enough to me."

### Game Notes

- Virginia opened its 131st season against the Blue Devils.
- UVA is 84-38-9 in season openers.
- The Cavaliers are 77-21-7 all-time in season openers at home.
- Virginia opened a season against Duke for the 20th time. The Cavaliers are 10-10 all-time against the Blue Devils in season openers.
- UVA is 39-33 all-time against Duke. UVA has won six-straight against the Blue Devils.
- UVA is 22-11 all-time against Duke at Scott Stadium.
- Bronco Mendenhall is 12-4 all-time in season openers, including 4-1 at UVA.
- UVA tied a single-game record with five interceptions. The last time UVA notched five interceptions was against Duke's Daniel Jones in 2016. UVA has now accomplished this feat 10 times.
- Virginia has forced 25 turnovers against Duke over the last six games, including 12 over the 2019 and 2020 meetings.
- OL Dillon Reinkensmeyer started at left guard, making him the only player in all of FBS since 2010 to start at least one career game at all five offensive line positions. He owns 21 career starts at center, 12 at right tackle, two at right guard, two at right tackle and now one at left guard.
- QB Brennan Armstrong made his first career start and became only the second left-handed quarterback to start a game for Virginia.
- Armstrong's four-yard rushing touchdown in the second quarter was the first of his career.
- Armstrong finished with 269 passing yards, becoming the 21st Cavalier quarterback to throw for 150+ yards in his first career UVA start. His 269 yards rank No. 2 for most passing yards in a first career UVA start.
- With four receptions, WR Terrell Jana extends his consecutive streak of games with a catch to 17.
- WR Lavel Davis Jr.'s 18-yard reception in the second quarter was the first of his career.
- Davis Jr. finished with four receptions for 101 yards in his debut, highlighted by his first two career touchdown receptions, both coming in the fourth quarter. His first went for 18 yards and his second went for 26 yards.
- S D'Angelo Amos notched his first Virginia interception in the second quarter. It was the third of his career. He notched two at JMU.
- ILB Zane Zandier notched a career-high 15 tackles. His previous high was 10 against Ohio in 2018.

The 23-yard pass went for a touchdown to WR Terrell Jana. It was Jana's first touchdown of 2020 and fifth of his career.
- DE Richard Burney had a career-high 2.0 tackles for loss, including picking up his second sack of the season.
- QB Keytaon Thompson caught a touchdown pass on a three-yard pass from Brennan Armstrong. It was the first receiving touchdown on Thompson's college career. He now has caught a touchdown, rushed for a touchdown and thrown for a touchdown in his college career. He had previously rushed and thrown for multiple touchdowns at Mississippi State.
- WR Billy Kemp IV finished with 10 receptions for 96 yards, both career highs.
- In two career games against Clemson, Kemp IV has 19 career receptions for 162 yards against the Tigers.

### Game Notes

- UVA's nine-game home winning streak was snapped. It was tied for the tenth-longest in the nation among active streaks and was tied for the third-longest of the UVA modern era. UVA has only lost two of its last 15 games at Scott Stadium (2018 vs. Pitt; 2020 vs. NC State).
- For the 36th time under Bronco Mendenhall, UVA held an opponent (363) under 400 yards of total offense. UVA is 21-15 in those games, including 16-7 since the start of 2018.
- UVA attempted 64 passes, which ranks No. 2 all-time in program history for a game.
- UVA's 24-0 deficit to start the game was the most it has trailed during the home winning streak.

- P Nash Griffin connected on a 26-yard pass play to Nick Jackson on a fake punt attempt in the third quarter. The 26-yard pass play is the third-longest completed pass by a Cavalier on special teams in program history. The reception by Jackson was the first in his career.
- WR Lavel Davis Jr. finished with three receptions for 51 yards. One of his three receptions went for 20+ yards. For the season, five of his nine receptions have gone for 20+ yards.
- CB De'Vante Cross snatched his fourth career interception in the third quarter. It was the first interception yielded this season by NC State quarterback Devin Leary.
- WR Billy Kemp IV tied his career high with 10 receptions. He also had 10 last week at No. 1 Clemson.

**Game Notes**

- The game was the 125th meeting of the South's Oldest Rivalry, tying for the second-most played series in FBS history.
- UVA's win over No. 15 North Carolina is its highest over an AP Top-25 team since beating No. 12 Georgia Tech in 2011.
- UVA has won four-straight against UNC, matching Virginia Tech and Clemson in current win streaks vs. the Tar Heels in ACC play.
- The 85 points is the most combined points in a UVA ACC win, passing the 84 scored in a 44-0 win over UNC in 1973.
- UVA scored 40+ points against an *Associated Press* Top-25 team for the first time since scoring 48 points against then-No. 15 West Virginia in the 2002 Continental Tire Bowl.
- For the second week in a row UVA scored a touchdown on its opening drive of the game.
- Virginia scored touchdowns on its first possession of the game and the first of the second half for the first time this season. It happened twice in 2019 (vs. Liberty & William & Mary). Last time UVA did it against an ACC team was in 2018 vs. North Carolina at Scott Stadium.
- UVA's 9:02 scoring drive in the fourth quarter was the fourth-longest scoring drive in program history.
- UVA held North Carolina to 93 yards rushing, improving to 14-1 when holding opponents to less than 100 yards rushing under Bronco Mendenhall.
- It was the 200th game of Bronco Mendenhall's career. He became the fifth active ACC coach with 200 games coached, joining Mack Brown, Dave Clawson, David Cutcliffe and Brian Kelly.
- QB Brennan Armstrong connected with RB Shane Simpson for a 71-yard scoring strike, which were career longs for both Cavaliers. The 71-yard receiving touchdown was the longest by a Cavalier since Joe Reed went 75 yards at Virginia Tech in 2018 and it was the longest by a Cavalier running back since Taquan Mizzell scored on an 80-yard reception against William & Mary in 2015.
- Armstrong tied his career high with three passing touchdowns, tying his output at No. 1 Clemson. Add his rushing touchdown and he had a career-high four touchdowns responsible for.
- OLB Charles Snowden notched a career-high 4.0 sacks. He is the first Cavalier to record 4.0 sacks in a game since Jamie Sharper in 1996 vs North Carolina.

### Game Notes

- The win over the Cardinals served as the 275th all-time victory at Scott Stadium.
- The 31 points equaled the most points UVA has scored against Louisville in the all-time series, matching its 2015 total (L, at UL, 31-38).
- UVA's pick-6 in the first quarter was the first defensive points of season for the Cavaliers.
- SS Coen King made his first collegiate start.
- OLB Noah Taylor notched his third career interception (1st of the season) in the first quarter. He returned it for 85 yards and a touchdown. It is the longest INT return in the ACC this season and tied for third longest in FBS this year.
- Taylor's 85-yard interception return for a touchdown is tied for the third-longest interception return in UVA history, sharing the spot with Nick Grant's 85-yard INT return last year against William & Mary.
- The 85-yard interception return by Taylor is the longest INT return in program history by a linebacker. It is tied for the longest in FBS this season by a linebacker, sharing the spot with Kentucky's Jamin Davis who accomplished the feat against Tennessee.
- Taylor becomes the first UVA linebacker to return a interception for a touchdown since Zane Zandier went 22 yards against Old Dominion in 2019.
- QB Brennan Armstrong passed for one touchdown and rushed for two touchdowns. It is the third time this season he has passed and rushed for at least one touchdown each in a game.
- Armstrong finished with 203 passing yards, surpassing 200+ yards for the fourth time this season.
- With three receptions, WR Terrell Jana extends his active streak with a catch to 23 games.
- Jana now has 19 games since the start of 2019 with 3+ receptions, which is No. 2 in the nation over that span.
- With seven points, PK Brian Delaney passed Frank Quayle (210) and Tiki Barber (210) on the UVA career scoring list. Delaney is now No. 8 with 215 career points.
- CB Nick Grant forced and recovered his first career fumble on the same play in the fourth quarter.
- WR Demick Starling notched his first career reception for six yards in the fourth quarter.
- With one reception, TE Tony Poljan extends his active streak with a catch to 20 games.
- SS Coen King finished with a career-high six tackles.
- FS Antonio Clary tied his career high with seven tackles. He also had seven at Miami.
