OPENING KICK

VIRGINIA WELCOMES BC TO SCOTT STADIUM

- Virginia returns home on Saturday when the Cavaliers welcome the Boston College Eagles to Scott Stadium.
- Virginia is playing its first home game in the month of December since 2001 when the Cavaliers hosted Penn State (W, 20-14).
- Saturday is only the third time UVA has played a home game at Scott Stadium in the month of December. It also defeated UNC (44-13) during the 1950 season at Scott Stadium.
- Saturday is just the 10th all-time regular season UVA football game in the month of December. The first was against Johns Hopkins to close out the 1888 season, UVA's first football season. UVA hosted that game in Charlottesville, serving as the only other December football game UVA has played in Charlottesville. It was also UVA's first-ever loss in the sport of football.



WR Lavel Davis Jr. is No. 4 in the nation with 26.7 yards per reception and is No. 7 in the nation among freshmen with 374 receiving yards.

VIRGINIA VS. BOSTON COLLEGE

- This is just the seventh meeting between Boston College and Virginia and the fifth in ACC play.
- The Eagles own a 6-0 edge in the series, including a 4-0 mark since joining the ACC.
- The 1994 meeting was in the Carquest Bowl (Miami Gardens, Fla.).
- BC won the first ACC contest between the teams, 28-17, in 2005 in Chestnut Hill.
- The 2020 season created a unique opportunity to face Boston College again. UVA is not slated to play Boston College again until the 2024 season, which will take place in Chestnut Hill.
- This is just Boston College's third trip to Charlottesville.
- Not counting Notre Dame (2020 member), Syracuse (one) is the only ACC team UVA has played fewer conference games against than Boston College (four). UVA also has played seven ACC games against Louisville, who joined the league after Syracuse.

FIVE TOP STORYLINES

- Boston College is the only fulltime ACC team Virginia has never beaten, losing all six previous meetings, including four in league play.
- QB **Brennan Armstrong** is tied for the FBS lead with six game totals of 180+ passing yards and 40+ rushing yards. He shares the top spot with Ian Book (Notre Dame) and Malik Willis (Liberty). The two games Armstrong didn't reach those marks was the one game he left in the second quarter with an injury and the full subsequent game he didn't appear in because of that injury.
- WR **Lavel Davis Jr.** ranks No. 7 in the nation among freshmen with 374 receiving yards and is tied for No. 2 in the nation among freshmen for receiving touchdowns with five. **Davis Jr.** ranks No. 3 in the nation (No. 1 in the ACC) with 26.7 yards per reception.
- WR **Billy Kemp IV** is No. 1 in the ACC and No. 20 in the nation with 6.5 receptions per game.
- ILB **Nick Jackson** is No. 2 in the ACC (No. 23 nationally) with 10.6 tackles per game. He has 48 tackles over his last three games (Miami, UNC, Louisville, ACU).

#TheStandard: BY THE NUMBERS

- A win over the Eagles on Saturday would be the program's first-ever against Boston College.
- Virginia closed out November with a 2-0 record. The Cavaliers are 6-0 in the month of November over the last two seasons.
- Tony Poljan is No. 7 in the nation among tight ends with 30 receptions. His five touchdowns are tied for No. 6 among those that play the position.

VIRGINIA ATHLETICS NEW BRAND IDENTITY

• The University of Virginia athletics department introduced this year its new brand identity. The refreshed designs provide updates on a brand rich in history and tradition. The work was developed by Nike's Global Identity Group (GIG) and includes updates to the iconic V-Sabre mark, two new secondary marks, a revised color scheme and the introduction of new typography, numerals and patterns.

• Nike's GIG team works with a select number of its side-line partners each year to update the athletics department's brand identity based on the goals provided by the institution. The launch of the new Virginia Athletics brand identity is the culmination of an 18-month collaborative process with Nike that began with discovery sessions with UVA coaches, student-athletes and administrators.

UNIQUELY UVA

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

UNIVERSITY NICKNAMES

Virginia's athletics teams have been accompanied by a somewhat confusing array of nicknames. The most prominent and widely accepted of these monikers are "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos."

Although the terms "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are used almost interchangeably to refer to University teams and players, "Cavaliers" is more often used by the media, while "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are frequently used by Virginia students and fans.

Legend has it that Washington & Lee baseball fans dubbed the Virginia players "Wahoos" during the fiercely contested rivalry that existed between the two in-state schools in the 1890s. By 1940, "Wahoos" was in general use around Grounds to denote University students or events relating to them. The abbreviated "Hoos" sprang up later in student newspapers and has gained growing popularity in recent years.

THE CAVALIER MASCOT

The costumed Cavalier with a large character head debuted during Virginia's 1984 football season and has remained the official mascot of the University.

The first documented Cavalier on horseback was Francis Bell, a Virginia student from Dublin, Va., in 1947. Bell rode onto the field dressed as Cavaliers for Virginia's home football game with Harvard on the afternoon of October 11.

The Cavalier on horseback returned as the University's mascot in 1963. The UVA Polo Club provided both the horse and rider. However, the mounted Cavalier and his horse parted company in 1974 with the inception of AstroTurf at Scott Stadium.

The mounted Cavalier made its return in the Florida Citrus Bowl at the end of the 1989 football season. Due to its instant popularity, the Cavalier on horseback returned the following season on a regular basis and continues to lead the Virginia football team onto the field at the beginning of all home games.

UNIVERSITY COLORS

Orange and blue were adopted as the University of Virginia's official athletic colors at a mass student meeting in 1888. UVA athletic teams had previously worn silver gray and cardinal red, but those colors did not stand out on muddy football fields, prompting a student movement to change them.

One of the students attending the mass meeting was Allen Potts, a star athlete who played on Virginia's first football team in 1888. Potts showed up at the meeting wearing a navy blue-and-orange scarf that he had acquired during a summer boating expedition at Oxford University. Orange and blue were chosen as the official athletic colors after one of Potts' fellow students pulled the scarf off Potts' neck and, waving it to the crowd, yelled, "How will this do?" UVA later served as the inspiration for schools like Auburn and Florida when they selected school colors.

WAH-HOO-WAH

The origin of "Wah-hoo-wah" is uncertain. The cheer was used to root on Virginia teams as early as 1890 and may have been borrowed from Dartmouth College, whose athletics teams were once known as the Indians.

Legend attributes the yell to Natalie Floyd Otey, who sang the ballad "Where'er You Are, There Shall My Love Be" at Charlottesville's Levy Opera House in 1893. The predominantly student audience noticed that Otey warbled the first three words of the song between each of the stanzas and decided to join in the refrain. By evening's end, goes the legend, the crowd had corrupted "Where'er You Are" into "Wah-hoo-wah."

The Levy Opera House stands at the corner of High Street and Park Street and has since been renovated into an office building.

BC IS NO STRANGER TO MENDENHALL

- UVA head coach Bronco Mendenhall is familiar with Boston College, facing the Eagles twice as the head coach at BYU.
- Mendenhall's first game as a head coach in 2005 came against then-No. 22 Boston College, a 20-3 setback in Provo. Mendenhall's BYU team lost only two games a year later in 2006, the first in double overtime to then-No. 25 Boston College in Chestnut Hill. The BC head coach for those two meetings was former UVA assistant coach and offensive coordinator Tom O'Brien.
- With UVA sitting at 5-1 in 2017, Boston College came to town and beat Mendenhall and the Cavaliers, hauling a four-game UVA winning streak.

VIRGINIA - BOSTON COLLEGE CONNECTIONS

- UVA grad assistant and former long snapper Joe Spaziani is the son of former Boston College head coach Frank Spaziani, who lifted the Eagles over the Cavaliers in the 2009 and 2010 meetings. Frank Spaziani also had his UVA ties, serving nine years as an assistant to George Welsh (1982-90), including being the defensive coordinator from 1985-90. Frank is now the defensive coordinator at New Mexico State.
- UVA's Tavares Kelly attended St. Thomas Aquinas High School (Fort Lauderdale, Fla.), as did BC's Matthew Taylor. The NFL announced that St. Thomas Aquinas High School had the most alums on NFL rosters entering the 2020 season with 14. St. Thomas Aquinas has earned this honor for the seventh season in a row and eighth in the past nine.

CURRENT CAVALIERS IN THE 2017 GAME

- Fourteen current Cavaliers played in the 2017 game against Boston College, the last time these teams both met.
- CB De'Vante Cross played both offense and defense as a redshirt freshman against BC in 2017, rushing once for 13 yards and making one tackle in the game.
- QB Lindell Stone made his collegiate debut and passed for 26 yards in the 2017 meeting.
- PK A.J. Mejia made one field goal in the 2017 game, coming on a 38-yard attempt.
- PK Brian Delaney kicked off three times in the 2017 game.
- FS Joey Blount made 10 tackles as a true freshman in the 2017 meeting against Boston College, while SS Brenton Nelson made 11 stops and 0.5 TFLs as a redshirt freshman.
- OLB Charles Snowden made two tackles in the game, while CB Darrius Bratton, ILB Zane Zandier and DE Mandy Alonso all made one stop each in the game.
- Other current Cavaliers that played in the game, but didn't record any stats were: DE Richard Burney; CB Nick Grant; P Nash Griffin and WR Terrell Jana.

Last Meeting

Anthony Brown threw three touchdown passes and Boston College's defense stifled Virginia, 41-10, the last time these teams met.

The Eagles won their second straight road game, and did it behind Brown, who completed 19 of 24 passes for 275 yards, and a defense that limited Virginia to 247. The Eagles, by contrast, had 275 through the air and 237 on the ground.

Virginia came up well short in its bid for a fifth straight victory and bowl eligibility for the first time since 2011.

The Eagles used big plays to blow the game open quickly.

Thadd Smith took a jet sweep 76 yards down the sideline to make it 10-0 with 4:16 left in the first quarter. After Virginia went three-and-out, Brown hit Kobay White with a screen pass and White took it 76 yards down the middle of the field to make it 17-0 with 1:57 left.

After another Virginia punt, the Eagles ran a flea flicker, and Brown hit Michael Walker for 46 yards, setting up Brown's 10-yard touchdown throw to tight end Tom Sweeney with no defenders anywhere near him five plays later. He later found Sweeney again, this time from 3 yards out, to give BC a 34-7 lead.

While Brown was having his way with the Cavaliers defense, the Eagles were giving Kurt Benkert fits. They sacked him three times and had him on the run all day.

HOME SWEET HOME

- Virginia returns home to Scott Stadium for its last home game on the 2020 slate.
- UVA is winners of 16 of its last 18 games at Scott Stadium, dating back to the start of the 2018 season.
- UVA snapped a four-game losing streak against then-No. 15 North Carolina on Oct. 31. Prior to the win UVA had only led for a combined 30:47 this season, all of which came in the season-opening win over Duke at Scott Stadium. During UVA's current three-game winning streak at home, UVA has led for a combined 144:01 of 180:00 of playing time, which was 38:32 vs. UNC, 55:49 vs. Louisville and 49:40 against Abilene Christian.

ARMSTRONG LIVING THE THORTERBACK LIFE AT UVA

- QB Brennan Armstrong has three games this season with at least 200+ passing yards, 40+ rushing yards, 1+ passing touchdowns and 1+ rushing touchdowns. UVA is 3-0 this season when Armstrong meets those marks. His three games rank tied for No. 3 in the nation this season. He had shared the top spot with Sam Ehlinger (Texas), Asher O'Hara (MTSU) Desmond Ridder (Cincinnati) and Malik Willis (Liberty) prior to UVA's scheduled game with FSU. After the UVA-FSU postponement, Ehlinger and Willis recorded their fourth game over the weekend to take the lead from Armstrong.
- Since 2000, a UVA quarterback has met those marks just 14 times with Bryce Perkins (2018-19) leading the way with five such games. In fact, Perkins did not accomplish it until his eighth career start with the Cavaliers (vs. UNC, 2018). In comparison, Armstrong did so in three of his first five full games as the starting quarterback.
- Under Bronco Mendenhall, UVA is 7-1 when its quarterback reaches those "Thorterback" marks.
- Prior to Mendenhall's tenure, current UVA wide receiver coach Marques Hagans accomplished the feat twice in his career, while other UVA QBs since 2000 to reach those marks were Jameel Sewell (twice), Matt Johns (once) and David Watford (once).
- Against Abilene Christian on Nov. 21 Armstrong set a career high with four passing touchdowns. Coming into the game he had only one pass of 50 yards or more. Three of his four passing touchdowns came on passes of 90, 56 and 52 yards, making him the first Cavalier in program history to throw at least three passes of 50+ yards in a single game.

ARMSTRONG ON THIRD AND FOURTH DOWN

- QB Brennan Armstrong is 20-of-32 passing (62 percent) on third down and long conversions with 14 first downs and one touchdown.
- Armstrong has been known to get the fourth down rush as well, averaging 12.0 yards per rush on fourth down attempts, nabbing five first downs on six tries.
- Armstrong has thrown nine of his 15 touchdowns this season on first down.

LAVEL DAVIS JR. STRETCHES THE FIELD

- WR Lavel Davis Jr. is averaging 26.7 yards per reception so far this season, which ranks No. 1 in the ACC and No. 3 in the nation.
- Nine of Davis Jr.'s 14 receptions this season have gone for 20+ yards and four have gone for 30+ yards. All 14 of his receptions have gone for a first down or a touchdown.
- Dating back to 2000, Davis Jr.'s 21.8 yards per reception mark through UVA's first eight games is the highest in program history of players with at least 10 receptions.
- Despite missing two games, Davis still ranks No. 7 in the nation among freshmen with 374 receiving yards. Of the six players ahead of him on the freshman receiving list, he is one of two who was in high school last spring. Pitt's Jordan Addison and Oklahoma's Marvin Mims are both true freshmen, but enrolled in college last January. Wake Forest's Donavon Greene and Memphis' Tahj Washington both played in four games in 2019 and retained redshirt seasons.

FRESHMAN SCORING RATE FOR DAVIS IS HIGH

- WR Lavel Davis Jr. is tied for No. 2 in the nation among freshmen for receiving touchdowns with five. He trails Oklahoma's Marvin Mims (7) and shares the second spot with Tahj Washington (Memphis).
- Davis Jr. had a huge debut for the Cavaliers when led UVA with 101 receiving yards and two touchdowns on four receptions in his collegiate debut against Duke. The 101 receiving yards by the Dorchester, S.C., native is the first time a Cavalier has recorded 100+ receiving yards in his collegiate debut.
- He scored touchdowns on scoring strikes of 18 and 26 yards in the fourth quarter. His first, an 18-yard pass from Brennan Armstrong, gave UVA the lead (24-20) for good with 12:43 left to play against Duke. He was named ACC receiver and rookie of the week for his efforts.
- He later was named ACC Rookie of the Week after the Louisville game when he notched 4 catches for 74 yards and a score.
- His 90-yard touchdown against Abilene Christian was the second-longest by a true freshman in program history, second only to Tyrone Davis' 91-yard score in 1991 against NC State. The 90-yard touchdown by Davis Jr. is the longest reception in the ACC this season.

AND THE CLOCK HITS ... ZEROS

- Against Abilene Christian, UVA scored a 90-yard touchdown (pass) as time expired in the first quarter, a run-yard rushing touchdown as time expired in the second quarter and an 84-yard interception return for a touchdown as time expired in the fourth quarter.
- OLB D'Sean Perry, who made his collegiate debut in the game, ended the contest with the 84-yard "pick-6". It was the second "pick-6" by a UVA linebacker in as many weeks. Perry's was one yard short of matching Noah Taylor's program record longest INT return by a linebacker (85), which happened on Nov. 14 against Louisville.

POLJAN BRINGING THE TIGHT END BACK TO UVA

- TE Tony Poljan, a grad transfer from Central Michigan, has 30 receptions for 300 yards and five touchdowns this season.
- Since 2001, UVA tight ends have accumulated 811 receptions, 8,457 receiving yards and 75 touchdowns, by far the best in the ACC over that span.
- From that list of tight ends, 10 have enjoyed careers in the NFL with seven lasting 3+ years.

POLJAN ONE OF THE NATION'S MORE PRODUCTIVE TIGHT ENDS

- TE Tony Poljan is tied for No. 7 in the nation among tight ends with 30 receptions.
- The ACC boasts two of the nation's Top 7 tight ends in regards to receptions. Poljan entered the FSU week No. 4, but ended up with an off week after the postponement of the game.

ONE TAYLOR OF A KIND

- OLB Noah Taylor returned an interception 85 yards for a touchdown on Nov. 14 against Louisville. It was the longest INT return by a linebacker in program history and is tied for the third-longest return in the UVA record book, sharing the spot with teammate Nick Grant's 85-yard INT return against William & Mary last year.
- The return is also tied for the second longest this season by a linebacker in all of FBS, sharing the spot with Kentucky's Jamin Davis. It is the longest return in the ACC this season and tied for the fourth longest overall in FBS.
- Taylor is the only player in the nation since the 2019 season started with at least 9.0 sacks and at least three interceptions.
- Taylor is used in a myriad of ways, coming off the edge, as well as dropping into coverage. Of his 40 tackles, 28 have come on rushing plays.
- Taylor is building on his breakthrough 2019 season when he finished 2019 with 57 tackles, 13.5 TFL, 7.0 sacks, 2 INT, 4 PBU, 1 FF and 1 punt block. His 7.0 sacks ranked No. 2 among ACC linebackers in 2019, second to former UVA teammate Jordan Mack (Carolina Panthers). Taylor was also just one of three FBS players with 2+ INTs and 7+ sacks in 2019 and the only one returning to college football in 2020.

THE C-VILLE TRIO

- Virginia has three receivers, Billy Kemp IV (52), Terrell Jana (32) and Tony Poljan (30), with at least 30 receptions. It is one of five programs in the nation with three players at that plateau in catches, joining Arkansas State, Auburn, Clemson, Middle Tennessee State, Mississippi State and SMU. Mississippi State has six and the SMU Mustangs have four.

KEMP IS A WORKHORSE FOR THE UVA OFFENSE

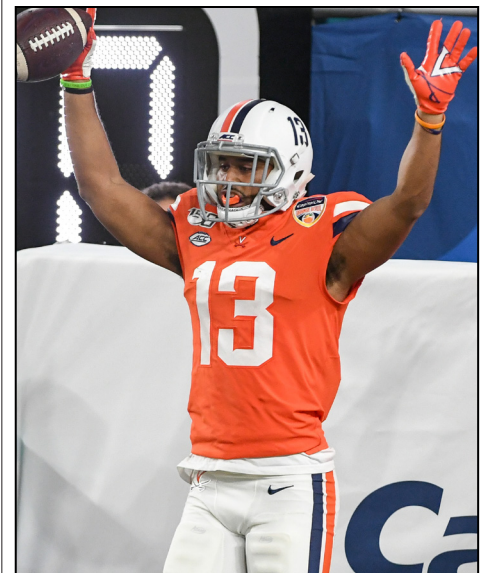
- WR Billy Kemp IV has become a workhorse for the Virginia offense. He currently ranks No. 1 in the ACC and No. 20 in the nation with 6.5 receptions per game. He tallied a career-high 10 catches at No. 1 Clemson and again against NC State. His 96 receiving yards against the Tigers was also a career high.
- Kemp ranks No. 12 in the ACC and No. 91 nationally with 64.6 receiving yards per game.
- Over his last 13 games, dating back to Nov. 9, 2019 vs. Georgia Tech, Kemp has caught 72 passes (5.5 rpg) for 710 yards (54.6 ypg) and two touchdowns (vs. VT & NC State).

UVA AND THE SACK

- Virginia is for No. 11 in the nation with 28 sacks. The Cavaliers have recorded 18 combined sacks over the last four games.

The last Cavalier to reach 1,000-career rushing yards was former QB Bryce Perkins last season when he became the 44th player in program history to reach the milestone. He is only the third UVA quarterback to reach the milestone and the first since Shawn Moore in 1990.

JACKSON IS TRENDING TOWARD THE VICINITY OF FORMER UVA ALL-AMERICANS

- ILB Nick Jackson is No. 2 the ACC in tackles per game with 10.6 per game. He also ranks No. 23 in the nation.
- Since 2000, Jackson is only the third different Cavalier to record at least 80 tackles through the first eight games of the season. The other two were All-Americans FS Quin Blanding and ILB Micah Kiser.
- Kiser, a current starter for the Los Angeles Rams, is only the second player in ACC history to lead the league in tackles three seasons in a row (2015-17), joining Luke Kuechly (2009-11).
- Blanding is the only player in ACC history to finish No. 2 in tackles four years in a row. No one had done it three times until Blanding did it. Blanding is UVA's all-time leading tackler (495).

LONG UVA SCORING DRIVES

- UVA has four drives of 90+ yards already this season. They have scoring drives of 97 yards (vs. NC State), 94 yards (vs. Duke), 94 yards (at Miami) and 90 yards (Abilene Christian). All four drives resulted in touchdowns and the 97-yard and 94-yard drives are longer than any drive the Cavaliers had in 2017, 2018 and 2019.
- The last time UVA had multiple drives of 90+ yards was in 2016 when UVA set a program record with a 99-yard drive vs. Central Michigan and also had a 90-yard drive against UConn.
- UVA has 13 drives of 75 yards or more and all 13 have resulted in touchdowns.

VIRGINIA ON 4TH DOWN

- Virginia has secured first downs 15 times on 4th down, which is tied for No. 6 in FBS. They share the spot with Arkansas State, South Alabama, South Carolina and Liberty. Army is No. 1 in the nation with 20 made 4th down attempts.
- Of UVA's 15 first downs on 4th down, 12 came on rushes and three on passes.

THOMPSON GETTING IT DONE ON THIRD AND FOURTH DOWN

- QB Keytaon Thompson has been successful obtaining a first down when rushing on third or fourth down. He is 5-for-8 on third down and 2-for-2 on fourth down.

JANA BRINGS CONSISTENCY TO RECEIVING CORPS

- WR Terrell Jana has 19 games with at least three receptions since the start of the 2019 season. That ranks tied for No. 5 in all of FBS.

FIELD POSITION HAD BEEN HURTING THE CAVALIERS - TRENDING TOWARD THE POSITIVE

- Virginia is losing the field position battle by an average of 1.9 yards for the season. UVA's average starting field position is its own 28.4, while its opponents on average start at the 30.3-yard line.
- UVA also has only started nine drives on its opponents side of the field, while four of those times came in the opener against Duke. Against Duke UVA turned the short field into two touchdowns, threw one interception and the last one took a kneel to end the game.
- In comparison, UVA's opponents have started 16 drives on the Cavaliers' side of the field. The UVA defense has battled well under the circumstances, yielding five touchdowns and four field goals. The defense has also forced two punts, one interception and one missed field goal. Two other times the game ended with a QB kneel.
- Compared to last season, UVA had +6.6 average in field position for the season as its average starting field position was the 33.9 yard-line, while opponents were starting on average at their own 27.3 yard line.
- The field position deficit has shrunk during the current three-game winning streak. Heading into the UNC game, UVA was losing the field position battle by 5.8 yards and was starting on average at its own 26.6, while opponents were starting on average at the 32.4.

NATION'S MOST SEASONED OFFENSIVE LINE

- Virginia returns all its starting offensive linemen from 2019 and the unit boasts 155 career starts at the position, which is No. 2 in all of FBS. It had been No. 1 all season until Appalachian State played last week and UVA's game at FSU was postponed.
- Looking at UVA's top leaders in career starts, the top three returning players with most career offensive starts are all offensive linemen (Dillon Reinkensmeyer, 44; Ryan Nelson, 35; Chris Glaser, 30).
- UVA has not started the same five offensive linemen for every game in a season since 2011. UVA was on course to do that in 2020 before Reinkensmeyer went down against Louisville with a season-ending injury.
- Currently, UVA is No. 1 in the ACC with fewest sacks allowed (1.75).
- Below is a list of the schools currently with the most career starts on the offensive line:

THE MENDENHALL ERA: HOLDING OPPONENTS TO CERTAIN THRESHOLDS

- Virginia, under Bronco Mendenhall, has held opponents under 400 yards of total offense 36 times since the start of the 2016 season (55 games). UVA is 22-15 under Mendenhall in those games.
- Since the start of the 2018 season, UVA has held 24 opponents (35 games) under 400 yards of total offense. UVA is 17-7 under Mendenhall in those games.
- The 2019 team faced injuries in the secondary like no other position group during Mendenhall's tenure and still managed to do this 10 times. By the end of the season, or immediately after its conclusion, 11 members of the secondary in 2019 were out due to injury, or required a post-season surgery (played with ailment).
- Below are some year-by-year progressions during the Mendenhall era:

THE PORTAL IS PRODUCING FOR THE CAVALIERS

- Virginia welcomed seven graduate transfers this season and they all had an impact on UVA's 44-41 win over then-No. 15 UNC.
- TB Shane Simpson (Towson) led UVA with 141 all-purpose yards on 70 rushing and 71 receiving (1 TD). TE Tony Poljan (Central Michigan) added two catches for 33 yards and a score, while WR Ra'Shaun Henry (St. Francis (Pa.)) added an 18-yard receiving touchdown. QB/WR Keytaon (Mississippi State) did a little of everything, rushing 10 times for 43 yards and a score, played special teams and secured the game on a fourth-down rush via a fake punt play in the closing minutes. Bottled up to the right, he reversed and found five yards and a first down to the left, securing the victory.
- On defense, S D'Angelo Amos (JMU) was third on the team with eight tackles and posted 1.0 tackles for loss. DE Adeeb Atariwa (JMU) made his second start of the season and posted three tackles.
- LS Danny Caracciolo (Bryant/JMU) snapped on all PATs as well as Brian Delaney's deciding 35-yard field goal in the fourth quarter.

"BREAKING THE ROCK"

"Breaking the Rock," has also become a tradition in UVA football, started in 2018 by Shawn Griswold, the team's director of football development and performance. It represents how you move a mountain, one rock at a time. The hardest worker during summer workouts is awarded the honor of swinging the sledgehammer and breaking the designated rock to close the summer phase. After a Cavalier win, the "unofficial player of the game" breaks the rock for that week. Below is the collection of Cavaliers to Break the Rock since the tradition began. Griswold started the tradition while at Tulsa and also included it at Pitt and Arizona State.

DELANEY CLIMBING VARIOUS UVA CAREER SCORING LISTS

- At Miami PK Brian Delaney became the 11th Cavalier with 200+ career points and needs four points to pass Robert Randolph for No. 6 on UVA's all-time career scoring ledger.
- Delaney is also No. 4 all-time at UVA in career points kicking with 208. Delaney set the UVA single-season record for points kicking with 110 in 2019. His 50 PATs in 2019 are also a UVA single-season record.
- Delaney is No. 5 all-time at UVA with 39 career field goals. No. 4 is Ian Frye (2012-15) with 45 made field goals.

DELANEY BREAKS UVA'S CONSECUTIVE FIELD GOALS MADE RECORD

- Senior Brian Delaney made 17-straight field goals, breaking the UVA record owned by Jake McInerney. In 1989, McInerney made 14 in a row. Delaney's streak came to an end at Wake Forest on Oct. 17 after he missed his third attempt of the game.
- Delaney's streak had started on Oct. 11, 2019 at Miami when he made three field goals in a row after his first attempt of the game was blocked.
- The ACC record is 34, set by Wake Forest's Nick Sciba last season, breaking the previous record of 27 held by NC State's Marc Primanti.

STONE MAKES FIRST CAREER START

- QB Lindell Stone made his first career start against Wake Forest. With 193 passing yards, he became the 22nd Cavalier in program history to throw for 150+ yards in his first career start.
- Stone's 193 passing yards ranks No. 10 all-time among UVA quarterbacks making their first career starts.

STONE'S CAREER DAY AGAINST NC STATE

- Fourth-year QB Lindell Stone had a career day against NC State when he was called into the game in the second quarter after starting QB Brennan Armstrong left with an injury.
- It was just the fifth appearance of Stone's career and first that didn't come in the fourth quarter. Entering the game his only pass of 2020 had gone for -7 yards and his career QB efficiency rating was 5.03.
- Stone tossed his first career passing touchdown in the closing seconds of the second quarter when he found Billy Kemp IV for the two-yard score. On the scoring drive Stone was 6-of-9 for 75 yards and the touchdown pass.
- Stone finished with career highs in completions (30), attempts (53), yards (240) and touchdowns (3).
- Stone marked the 17th time since 2000 a Cavalier quarterback has completed 30+ passes in a game. Six of those occurrences have happened since 2017.

JANA JOINS THE 100/1,000 CLUB AT VIRGINIA

- WR Terrell Jana notched nine receptions against NC State on Oct. 10 to become the 23rd Cavalier in program history to reach 100 career receptions and 1,000 receiving yards. Jana became the 43rd player in program history to reach 1,000 career receiving yards in the 2019 Orange Bowl against Florida.
- Eight of the 23 Cavaliers to join the 100/1,000 club had current UVA wide receiver coach Marques Hagans as a coach.

THE HAGANS FACTOR

- With WR Terrell Jana moving into No. 21 all-time at UVA in receiving yards, he becomes the ninth Cavalier in the Top 25 to be coached by current UVA receivers coach and alum Marques Hagans.
- Hagans has coached: No. 2 Olamide Zaccheaus, No. 5 Kris Burd, No. 8 Hasise Dubois, No. 11 Darius Jennings, No. 12 Tim Smith, No. 17 Joe Reed, No. 18 Doni Dowling, No. 20 Canaan Severin and No. 25 Jana. Hagans worked with Burd while as an offensive GA in 2011.
- In all, 11 of the 42 Cavaliers that have reached the 1,000-yard receiving plateau in their career have been coached by Hagans.

MITCHELL HONORS HAGANS WITH JERSEY PICK

- WR Hayden Mitchell, who wore No. 83 the last two years, picked No. 18 when it was his time to choose this season. He did so to honor his position coach, Marques Hagans, who wore the number as a QB/WR at UVA (2002-05).
- Mitchell is a former walk-on. The Richmond, Va., native was awarded a scholarship this past August after practice.

UNIQUELY VIRGINIA FOOTBALL

GUIDING PRINCIPLES

- The Virginia football program under Bronco Mendenhall has 14 guiding principles. They can be found on the walls of the McCue Center and outlining the fences of the practice facility. They are a constant reminder to the foundation of the program. Each one is a vehicle for the Virginia football program to develop people.
- **Bronco Mendenhall** *Said It:* "I would love to win a national championship. I'd love to develop a great program here. But what I would really love is for every kid in my program to have an amazing life."
- Family. First, Last, Always
- Earned Not Given
- Will Before Skill
- And ...
- 400 Percent
- The Power of Choice
- Two Ways
- Protect our Cart
- Less Drama, More Work
- Hard Things Together
- Everybody is Somebody
- It Pays to be a Winner
- Champions Do Extra
- Make it a Masterpiece

TASK UNIT LEADERS

- The Cavaliers have 10 task-unit leaders and each has an assistant. Working together, they determine the order in which players select their jersey numbers, choose the movie that's shown the night before a game (not taking place this season), pick the color combination of the uniform UVA will wear in a given game, recognize teammates for their effort in practice, and decide which players make up the four special-teams units: kickoff, kickoff return, punt and punt return.
- **Bronco Mendenhall** *Said It:* "It's their program. The idea simply is, I like the idea of delegating and providing leadership opportunities as much as possible. I try to get as much off it [head coach's plate] as possible, so the only thing that I have remaining to do is competitive work. Then that allows me to help our team at the highest level with the time that I have."
- OLB **Charles Snowden** *Said It:* "I know he's [Mendenhall] big on leadership development, so I think he just gives us opportunities to lead within football. We definitely see our peers in a different light than the coaches do. The coaches kind of see football only. We know who's coming back and getting in extra work, we know how guys carry themselves, we know how invested they are."

THE 4TH SIDE

- Offense and defense are two sides. Special teams is the third side. **The 4th Side**, in Bronco Mendenhall's teaching, is the sidelines. Mendenhall has made it a point of emphasis with his team since arriving in Charlottesville that **The 4th Side** is as important as the other three. And just as he expects his teams to perform on offense, defense and special teams, Mendenhall wants his players on the sidelines to thrive. By extension, the UVA fan base is also part of the **The 4th Side**.
- **Bronco Mendenhall** *Said It:* "It starts on our sideline and possibly the name of all of our fans as the entire stadium becomes The 4th Side."
- WR **Terrell Jana** *Said It:* "It is the 4th Side for a reason because of the four aspects of the team. Coach shows film in the meeting room of players on the 4th Side. The team sees that and takes pride in that."



EARN YOUR JERSEY NUMBER

- Head coach Bronco Mendenhall introduced what he sees as the bedrock of his "earned not given" mantra when he arrived in Charlottesville in 2016. There are no double numbers and once a number is earned, that student-athlete has it for the season. The majority of numbers are picked over the course of the selection ceremonies during the final three weekends of fall camp. Once the season ends, all players return to the status of no number for winter conditioning, spring ball and summer workouts.
- To be considered for number selection, players have to meet certain physical benchmarks – weight room numbers, conditioning times, etc. – but it's also about dedication to the program, overall effort in practice and having the right disposition in the locker room.
- Bronco Mendenhall doesn't choose the order. The task unit leaders do.
- **Bronco Mendenhall** *Said It:* "The task unit leaders, they're the ones who are with their teammates every day in the locker room. They're with them in class. They're with them in their apartments. They see a lot more than I see. Our players have embraced it, and it matters to them to be endorsed by their peers to be on our team."
- Alum **Jordan Mack** *Said It:* "Part of our program is earned not given. They know what to expect coming in, and they know nothing is going to be given. To earn a number, gear, anything with a Virginia sabre on it, you're going to have to earn it through your hard work."

STATE CHANGERS

- White ► Grey ► Orange ► Navy ► Black
- Workout gear color is immediate feedback where our student-athletes stand in their training in order to drive positive change.
- Everything in performance is tracked from the moment they step on Grounds to show their gains. All new players begin their UVA careers wearing white.
- Black workout gear is the pinnacle in the UVA strength & conditioning. Two current Cavaliers have reached that pinnacle: DE Richard Burney and CB Nick Grant.

THURSDAY'S HEROES

- The Thursday's Heroes program is coordinated by the University of Virginia football team. Originally at BYU, Thursday's Heroes transitioned to UVA when Bronco Mendenhall became Head Coach in 2016. Since then, the program has continued to grow, warming the hearts of players, coaches, fans, and of course, the Heroes. Each Thursday during the Fall and Spring season (this is not happening this year), an individual who is undergoing a difficult circumstance (medical, physical, cognitive, etc.) and their family is invited to tour the football facilities, watch practice, meet the coaches/team, and receive special gifts unique to each Hero. Different players take turns showering the Hero with gifts, including UVA gear, an official game jersey, Beats by Dre, a bicycle, school supplies, Halloween costumes, and special video messages from favorite celebrities (Peyton Manning, Kenny Chesney, Damian Lillard, Chris Long and Hugh Jackman to name a few have taken part). The goal of the program is simple: to put a smile on the Hero's face and to welcome them to the Virginia Football family.
- TB **Wayne Taulapapa** *Said It:* "Everybody is Somebody ... Every day we look up to them and the fight they are in. We want them to know they are with us and we are with them."

UNIQUELY VIRGINIA FOOTBALL

MAD HATTERS (PUT ON THE HATS)

- The “Mad Hatters” is the name of the Virginia Football Scout Team. It drew inspiration from the character frozen in time in “Alice in Wonderland,” but the name has as much to do with the evolution of pennies scout team players once draped over their shoulder pads to brightly colored pieces of fabric, which stretch over their helmets. Hence, “Put on the hats.”
- Each Thursday after practice the “Mad Hatter of the Week” is announced by a task unit leader.
- **Bronco Mendenhall** *Said It:* “The way I frame it to our team is without going through that process, I think there is a fundamental step missed in their development. Most recruits and most young people want to come in and play their first year. Most of us, right, it’s kind of about us. When you’re in that role, it’s really about serving and helping your team.”

UVA GROUNDSKEEPERS

- Virginia’s football program wants to be a catalyst for change in the community, helping to turn the pain of the Charlottesville riots of Aug. 12, 2017 into a celebration of life, love and unity. During the summer of 2020, a player-led initiative was born in the form of the Groundskeepers in order to “Take Back our Grounds” from the white nationalists that descended upon Charlottesville in 2017.
- To be part of the Groundskeepers, participants take part in their own march, which starts downtown at Heather Heyer Way — the street named in honor of the woman who lost her life during the Aug. 12 demonstrations — before heading to the Enslaved Workers Memorial and the Rotunda.
- **Bronco Mendenhall** *Said It:* “We chose to take this march in direct opposition and the exact opposite direction of the events that happened in the death of Heather Heyer. We’re standing against hate, inequality, anything that doesn’t reflect well on the state of mankind, especially at the University of Virginia.
- **OLB Charles Snowden** *Said It:* We are committed to making a change in our community. We are committed to fighting for what’s right. We are committed to a better future. We are the Groundskeepers. Just thinking about what transpired those two days and what those two days signify and stand for — There were protests led in the name of hatred, racism, oppression and that’s harmful. That’s hurtful to a lot of people and that’s not what the city of Charlottesville stands for. That’s not what the University of Virginia stands for. The Groundskeepers here at UVA, we just want to show that’s not who we are and not what we stand for. So we’re just trying to take back the power of those days and show that we stand for love, unity, respect, uplifting one another, and just doing what’s right.”
- One of UVA’s four flags they run onto the field with each game is a flag that represents the Groundskeeper, which serves as constant reminder to the community of the importance of being unified in love rather than hate.

THE SHIELD

- The shield is an important part of the Virginia football program. On the shield, which was modeled after shields used in the movie 300, has three numbers: +1, 24, +5. They represent a formula that Bronco Mendenhall and his staff developed after years of data study and analytics that will lead to probable wins. Each game UVA’s goal is to be at least +1 in turnover margin, score at least 24 points while holding opponents under 24 points and being at least +5 in field position. Accomplishing each of those goals in a game creates a winning scenario.
- Virginia’s shield (pictured) is always represented in the UVA locker room.
- The shield also has the UVA guiding principles painted around the shield.

ARMSTRONG IS NAMED QB1

- QB Brennan Armstrong was named the starting quarterback by Bronco Mendenhall on Aug. 27. He is the third opening-day starting quarterback under Bronco Mendenhall, joining Kurt Benkert (2016-17) and Bryce Perkins (2018-19).
- Armstrong is one of UVA's four team captains as voted upon by his peers. He is the only non-senior, joining DE Richard Burney, WR Terrell Jana and OLB Charles Snowden.
- Armstrong is the first left-handed starting QB at UVA since Jameel Sewell (2006, 2007, 2009).
- Armstrong enrolled at UVA in January 2018 and backed up Perkins the last two seasons, saving his redshirt season in 2018 under the NCAA participation rules.
- Armstrong is the 13th different UVA starting quarterback to start an opener in the last 16 seasons. The list includes: Bryce Perkins (2018-19), Kurt Benkert (2016-17), Matt Johns (2015), Greyson Lambert (2014), David Watford (2013), Michael Rocco (2011-12), Marc Verica (2010), Vic Hall (2009), Peter Lalich (2008), Jameel Sewell (2007), Christian Olsen (2006) and Marques Hagans (2005).

ARMSTRONG CONTINUES TO MATURE AS THE STARTING QB

- QB Brennan Armstrong threw for 200+ yards in each of his first two career starts, including 269 against Duke and 270 at No. 1 Clemson. He is only the second Cavalier to throw for 200+ passing yards in each of his first two career starts. Armstrong joins Matt Blundin, who did so in his first four career starts that spanned 1989, 1990 and 1991.
- With UVA trailing by three points (20-17) entering the fourth quarter in the season-opening win over Duke, Armstrong was 8-of-9 passing for 144 yards and two touchdowns. His lone incompletion was ruled a catch on the field by Davis Jr., but overturned on replay.
- Armstrong passed for 270 yards and three touchdowns at No. 1 Clemson, while also rushing for 89 more yards. Dating back to 2000, he is the only QB to pass for 225+ yards, pass for 3+ touchdowns and rush for 70+ yards in a game against the Tigers.
- With Armstrong under center, the UVA offense accumulated 417 yards of total offense at No. 1 Clemson. The Cavaliers became the first ACC team to earn 400+ yards of total offense against the Tigers since 2017 when NC State (Nov. 4) did so. Since the start of the 2019 season only LSU, Notre Dame, Ohio State, Virginia (twice) and Syracuse have averaged 5.0+ yards per play against the Clemson defense.

ARMSTRONG VS. ASSOCIATED PRESS TOP 25 TEAMS

- QB Brennan Armstrong has played well against AP Top 25 teams in 2020.
- In games against No. 1 Clemson, No. 11 Miami and No. 15 North Carolina, Armstrong has thrown for 659 yards, eight touchdowns (3 INTs) and rushed for 246 more yards and another score. That comes out to 905 yards of total offense (301.7 ypg) and nine touchdowns responsible for.

UVA QUARTERBACKS IN THEIR FIRST-CAREER START

- QB Brennan Armstrong made his first collegiate start against Duke at Scott Stadium.
- Armstrong threw for 269 yards and two touchdowns against Duke, which is the second-most by a Cavalier starting quarterback making his first career start.
- Since 1955, 22 Virginia quarterbacks have passed for at least 150 yards in their first-career start. Here is a breakdown of the most passing yards by a Virginia QB in their first-ever start:

SCOTT STADIUM, HOME OF THE CAVALIERS

The Carl Smith Center, home of David A. Harrison III Field at Scott Stadium, with its unique architectural design, scenic setting on the University's Grounds and exceptional sight lines, is one of the nation's finest college football settings.

Opened in 1931, Scott Stadium might be one of the oldest campus college football stadiums in the nation, but you could never tell from its appearance. Numerous upgrades and expansions make it a modern home for the Cavaliers and their fans.

Scott Stadium was the gift of Frederic William Scott and Elisabeth Strother Scott, and was dedicated to the memory of his parents, Frederic Robert Scott and Frances Branch Scott.

Virginia played its dedication game at Scott Stadium on Oct. 15, 1931 against the Virginia Military Institute before a then-capacity crowd of 22,000. Prior to that season, the Cavaliers staged their home games at the University's Lambeth Field.

Virginia has played 482 games in the historic venue. UVA's all-time record at Scott Stadium stands at 276-194-12.

Bronco Mendenhall

Head Coach • Fifth Season

Since arriving at Virginia for the 2016 season, head coach Bronco Mendenhall's impact on the Cavalier program has been immense. From a two-win season, to the ACC's Coastal Division Championship and a New Year's Six bowl invitation, Virginia football's ascent has both remarkable and historic.

Mendenhall came to Charlottesville after a highly successful 11-year career at BYU with a vision and a plan of execution for the daunting renovation project he faced. He has masterfully crafted principles and culture, and instilled pride and purpose, leading to a standard of unbroken growth in just four seasons.

Having a plan and being able to execute a strategic approach to achieving results have been mission critical to Mendenhall's formula for success.

"Teams and organizations are perfectly designed to get the results that they get,"

Mendenhall is fond of saying regarding both successes and failures. His pursuit of

"unbroken growth" centers around learning, applying and improving on tools, frameworks, networks, innovation and processes that deliver those results. His ultimate goal is more expansive than building a great football organization. He strives to build great people.

On-field success is just part of the story Mendenhall has scripted at Virginia. He is a powerful believer in balance, which he frequently sums up with one simple word ... AND. It has become the calling card for the UVA football program.

"I think decisions are made based on principle, and I think principles are governed by beliefs," Mendenhall said. "AND is one of our guiding principles, and that is based on my belief that football is a vehicle to develop people."

At his introductory press conference, Mendenhall stressed that he wanted students AND athletes and believed that combination was achievable, especially at an institution such as Virginia that ranks among the top three public universities in the nation. Since that time, he has not compromised his approach to achieving those means. More importantly, his teams have bought in on the concepts with great enthusiasm and demonstrated they can do so while also being successful on the field.

"I would love to win a national championship," Mendenhall said. "I'd love to develop a great program here. But what I would really love is for every kid in my program to have an amazing life."

In the world of big-time football, Mendenhall's philosophy is unconventional, but that doesn't faze him.

"I'm looking for the complete development of everyone in our program – and winning," he said. "One is not at the expense of the other. I think they go hand-in-hand, and winning, without the other, would be hollow to me."

Under Mendenhall, the UVA program has progressed from two to six to eight to nine wins. Achievements and recognitions on the field, in the classroom and around the community have exponentially increased as well.

In 2019, UVA placed 10 players on the ACC All-Academic team, the most in the program's history. Linebacker Jordan Mack was named the ACC's Jim Tatum Award winner as the league's top football scholar-athlete and was a finalist for the William B. Campbell Trophy, known in the sport as the "academic Heisman." Linebacker Micah Kiser, now a member of the Los Angeles Rams, won the award in 2017.

Giving back has become a cornerstone of Virginia football. Players frequently visit the University's Children's Medical Center and speak at local elementary schools. The team's Thursday's Heroes program has been recognized for its efforts to honor individuals across the state of Virginia who are dealing with personal adversity. In 2020, the ACC honored the Thursday's Heroes program with its "Game Changers" award, which recognizes and highlights specific conference teams' involvement with their local communities.

"I'm in pursuit, and we're in pursuit as a football program, of both of those things, and without compromising our expectations for one or the other," Mendenhall said. "I want good young people. I'm talking about morals, values, character, behavior and contribution to the world. And I want a great team. I know it sounds idealistic, but I would not coach football if I did not think it could be done, and I would not coach at Virginia if I did not think there was support for doing it that way."

Mendenhall's pursuit of individual growth is only magnified by the success his teams have also achieved on the field. His name appears often when the accolades of college football's leading active coaches are charted.

"To me, football is just a magical and powerful platform to have motivated learners, and I get to teach life lessons through the sport of football," Mendenhall said. "The trophies, the wins, they're necessary for job security and the world makes a big deal of that. But it is hollow without the substance. Relationships are everything. Other than that, it would just be a game, and that does not sound quite meaningful enough to me."

- Virginia opened a season against Duke for the 20th time. The Cavaliers are 10-10 all-time against the Blue Devils in season openers.
- UVA is 39-33 all-time against Duke. UVA has won six-straight against the Blue Devils.
- UVA is 22-11 all-time against Duke at Scott Stadium.
- Bronco Mendenhall is 12-4 all-time in season openers, including 4-1 at UVA.
- UVA tied a single-game record with five interceptions. The last time UVA notched five interceptions was against Duke's Daniel Jones in 2016. UVA has now accomplished this feat 10 times.
- Virginia has forced 25 turnovers against Duke over the last six games, including 12 over the 2019 and 2020 meetings.
- OL Dillon Reinkensmeyer started at left guard, making him the only player in all of FBS since 2010 to start at least one career game at all five offensive line positions. He owns 21 career starts at center, 12 at right tackle, two at right guard, two at right tackle and now one at left guard.
- QB Brennan Armstrong made his first career start and became only the second left-handed quarterback to start a game for Virginia.
- Armstrong's four-yard rushing touchdown in the second quarter was the first of his career.
- Armstrong finished with 269 passing yards, becoming the 21st Cavalier quarterback to throw for 150+ yards in his first career UVA start. His 269 yards rank No. 2 for most passing yards in a first career UVA start.
- With four receptions, WR Terrell Jana extends his consecutive streak of games with a catch to 17.
- WR Lavel Davis Jr.'s 18-yard reception in the second quarter was the first of his career.
- Davis Jr. finished with four receptions for 101 yards in his debut, highlighted by his first two career touchdown receptions, both coming in the fourth quarter. His first went for 18 yards and his second went for 26 yards.
- S D'Angelo Amos notched his first Virginia interception in the second quarter. It was the third of his career. He notched two at JMU.
- ILB Zane Zandier notched a career-high 15 tackles. His previous high was 10 against Ohio in 2018.

Game Notes

- UVA's nine-game home winning streak was snapped. It was tied for the tenth-longest in the nation among active streaks and was tied for the third-longest of the UVA modern era. UVA has only lost two of its last 15 games at Scott Stadium (2018 vs. Pitt; 2020 vs. NC State).
- For the 36th time under Bronco Mendenhall, UVA held an opponent (363) under 400 yards of total offense. UVA is 21-15 in those games, including 16-7 since the start of 2018.

- UVA held North Carolina to 93 yards rushing, improving to 14-1 when holding opponents to less than 100 yards rushing under Bronco Mendenhall.
- It was the 200th game of Bronco Mendenhall's career. He became the fifth active ACC coach with 200 games coached, joining Mack Brown, Dave Clawson, David Cutcliffe and Brian Kelly.
- QB Brennan Armstrong connected with RB Shane Simpson for a 71-yard scoring strike, which were career longs for both Cavaliers. The 71-yard receiving touchdown was the longest by a Cavalier since Joe Reed went 75 yards at Virginia Tech in 2018 and it was the longest by a Cavalier running back since Taquan Mizzell scored on an 80-yard reception against William & Mary in 2015.
- Armstrong tied his career high with three passing touchdowns, tying his output at No. 1 Clemson. Add his rushing touchdown and he had a career-high four touchdowns responsible for.
- OLB Charles Snowden notched a career-high 4.0 sacks. He is the first Cavalier to record 4.0 sacks in a game since Jamie Sharper in 1996 vs North Carolina.

- Jana now has 19 games since the start of 2019 with 3+ receptions, which is No. 2 in the nation over that span.

Game Notes

- UVA held Abilene Christian to 62 yards rushing. It is the 16th time in the Bronco Mendenhall era the Cavaliers have held their opponent under 100 rushing yards. UVA's record is 15-1 in such games, including 3-0 in 2020.
- UVA scored on a one-play, 90-yard touchdown play on the final play of the first quarter. It is the second-longest one-play scoring drive in school history. A 93-yard one-play scoring drive against Wake Forest in 1982 is the longest.
- UVA scored on a 90-yard play to end the first quarter and a one-yard play to end the second quarter. It has had an 84-yard pick-6 to end the game.
- WR Lavel Davis Jr. caught a 90-yard touchdown pass from QB Brennan Armstrong. It was a career long for both players. It is also tied for the fifth-longest pass play in program history. It is the longest by a Cavalier since Emmanuel Byers found Deyon Williams for 90 yards against Miami in 2005. The pass play is tied for the fifth longest in the nation this season and is the longest in the ACC so far this season.
- Davis Jr.'s 90-yard touchdown is the second-longest by a true freshman in program history, second only to Tyrone Davis' 91-yard score in 1991 against NC State.
- QB Brennan Armstrong finished with a career-high 383 passing yards. It is the first career game with 300+ passing yards.
- Armstrong set a career high with four passing touchdowns. Coming into the game he had only one pass of 50 yards or more. Three of his four passing touchdowns came on passes of 90, 56 and 52 yards.
- Armstrong becomes the first Cavalier to throw at least three passes of 50+ yards in a single game.
- Armstrong is the first UVA quarterback since Bryce Perkins in the 2019 Orange Bowl to throw for at least four touchdowns in a game. It marked the 24th time a UVA quarterback threw for 4+ touchdowns in a game.
- OLB D'Sean Perry closed the game on an 84-yard interception return for a touchdown, which is the fifth-longest return in program history. Perry made his collegiate debut in the game.
