2022 SCHEDULE

INSIDE TODAY'S MATCHUP

- · Virginia will square off against Illinois for the second-straight season and visit Champaign for the first time.
- · Last year in Charlottesville, UVA never trailed and scored the final 21 points in a 42-14 victory.
- · UVA has won five of its last seven matchups against Big Ten foes.
- ·The Cavaliers are looking to move to 2-0 for the second-straight season and the seventh time since 2000.
- · Virginia is seeking its first road win over a Big Ten opponent since 2011 (at Indiana). Against active members of the Big Ten, UVA is 8-11 all-time. Only one of the eight wins have come on the road - Indiana (2011).

TOP STORYLINES

- · Fralin Family Head Coach Tony Elliott was one of 12 FBS coaches to make their head coaching debut in the past two weeks. Elliott is among seven who won their first game as the head man.
- · Quarterback Brennan Armstrong led a balanced UVA attack with 246 yards passing and 105 yards rushing in a season-opening win over Richmond. He is one of three quarterbacks in the country to throw for 200 yards and rush for 100 in a game this

season.

- · Promising a commitment to the running game, Tony Elliott delivered in week one. UVA amassed 505 yards of total offense, 246 in the air and another 259 on the ground against Richmond. As a play caller at Clemson that started with 2014 season bowl win over Oklahoma, the Tiger offense had 39 games in which the offense accumulated 200 or more passing and rushing yards in a game and went a perfect 39-0 in those games.
- · Armstrong broke UVA's career total offense record (8,010) in week one against Richmond. He's in striking distance for the program's career passing yards record and career touchdown mark. He needs four touchdown passes and 433 yards passing to eclipse both records.
- ·The new look Cavaliers had eight players (five on offense and three on defense) make their first career starts in week one. A total of six Cavaliers made their collegiate debuts.



RB Perris Jones became the fourth UVA running back since 1986 to rush for 100+ yards in his first career start.

CAVALIER RUSHING ATTACK

- · Last Saturday against Richmond marked the first time two UVA rushers went for 100+ yards in the same game since Jordan Ellis (146) and Bryce Perkins (108) vs. Richmond in 2018.
- •The 42 attempts were the most since running the ball 42 times against Boston College on Dec. 5, 2020.
- ·The Cavaliers racked up 250 or more yards on the ground for only the fourth time since the 2015 season, a span of 87 games.

· Armstrong's 64-yard run was the longest of his career, the longest of any Cavalier since his 60-yard scamper against Boston College in 2020 and the sixth-longest ever by a UVA quarterback.

UVA UP FRONT

- •The Virginia offensive line debuted with five players who made their debut in a UVA uniform. Only John Paul Flores (LG) had previously started a game.
- · Freshman McKale Boley became only the second Cavalier true freshman ever to start on opening day at offensive tackle. He's only the sixth UVA freshman OT to start a game at offensive tackle.
- · Virginia allowed only two sacks and paved the way from 262 yards rushing. The Cavaliers hadn't recorded more rushing yards than passing yards in a game since 2020 against North Carolina (210 rush/208 pass).

TONY ELLIOTT AT A GLANCE

- Tony Elliott brings a wealth of championship football experience to Charlottesville. In his 16 years as a fulltime college coach, Elliott has been a part of 15 winning seasons including 10-win seasons at Clemson from 2011-2020.
- As the offensive Coordinator, Clemson went 89-10 and made four CFP National Championship game appear-
- Elliott is one of 14 African-American head coaches in college football and one of eight running power-5 programs. The Cavaliers have seven full-time African-American assistant coaches, the most of any coaching staff in the country.

HOOS BACK?

- Virginia returns a total of 30 letterman (12 on offense, 16 on defense and two specialists) from its roster a year
- Of those 30 letterman, 12 (five on offense and seven on defense) have starting experience.
- Virginia returns one letterwinner (Jonathan Leech) on its offensive line, tied with Colorado State with the fewest in college football.

·With the loss of 12 starters from last year (seven on offense & five on defense), the Cavaliers added 30 true freshmen to its roster. An additional 10 players joined the team via the transfer portal.

WIDE RECEIVER U

· Virginia and UTSA are the only two schools to return three wide receivers that accumulated 725 or more yards last season (Dontayvion Wicks - 1,203; Keytaon Thompson - 990 & Billy Kemp IV). The UVA trio accounted for 2,918 yards, almost 500 more yards than its Roadrunner counterparts.

· Wicks and Thompson are both on the Biletnikoff Award Watch List. Virginia is one of three schools (Penn State & Texas) with multiple student-athletes on the 43-player list.

· Virginia is the only school in the country to return two wide receivers with 990 or more yards receiving - Dontayvion Wicks (1,203) and Keytaon Thompson (990).

· According to Pro Football Focus, Thompson had the second-best elusive rating (a stat that measures the success and impact of a runner with the ball independently of the blocking) - 175.5 of any non-running back in the country with 20 or more rush attempts

· His 453 yards after the catch last season were the third most in the ACC.

THE 1,000 YARD RECEIVING CLUB

- · Dontayvion Wicks became the fifth Cavalier to eclipse 1,000 yards receiving in a season after his school-record, 1,203 yards in 2021.
- · Wicks matched Herman Moore as the fastest of the five to 1,000 yards. Wicks and Moore both reached the 1,000-yard mark in their 10th game of the season. Moore had 1,010 yards through 10 games back in 1990.
- ·Wicks needed only 57 receptions last season to amass the largest receiving yards total in school history. His 1,203 yards were ranked 17th in the country..
- · His 100.2 yards per game were the third most in the ACC and ranked 14th in the country. Only 15 wide receivers in the nation last year averaged over 100 yards receiving per game.

LOOKING AHEAD TO WEEK TWO

- · Armstrong has thrown a TD pass in the last 18 games he's played, the longest streak in UVA history.
- · Armstrong is one of three quarterbacks this season to pass for 200 yards and rush for 100 in the same game (Todd Centeio (JMU) - 287/110 & Jayden Daniels (LSU) 2019/114)
- ·The Cavalier signal caller broke UVA's career total offense record on a 64-yard touchdown run in the season opener against Richmond. He leaped frogged Shawn Moore (7,987) and Bryce Perkins (7,910) on UVA's all-time list.
- · Armstrong eclipsed the 1,000-yard rushing mark for his career in the season opener against Richmond. He's only the fourth Cavalier quarterback ever (Bryce Perkins, Bill Dudley, Shawn Moore) to go over 1,000
- · Record Watch: Armstrong needs 433 yards to break UVA's career passing record, four touchdowns to break UVA's career touchdown passes record. His 200-yard passing performance in week one was his 17th of his career, one shy of tying Matt Schaub's school record.
- · His 64-yard TD run was the 15th rushing touchdown of his career, tying him with fellow southpaw Jameel Sewell for the fifth most by a quarterback in program history.
- · Armstrong joins Jameis Winston (Florida State), Deshaun Watson (Clemson) and Sam Hartman (Wake Forest) as the only ACC quarterbacks to return the next season after passing for 4,000 yards in the year prior.

HIGHLIGHTS OF A HISTORIC 2021 SEASON

- · Armstrong is one of three players in NCAA Football history that have thrown for 4,400 yards or more playing just 11 games. Only Houston quarterbacks Andre Ware (4,699 in 1989) and David Klinger (5,140 in 1990) had more yards playing 11 games in a season.
- · Armstrong's 4,449 passing in 2021 were the most ever by an NCAA left-handed quarterback. He surpassed Scott Mitchell (Utah) who threw for 4,322 in 1988.
- · Armstrong came just 145 yards shy of breaking the ACC single-season record for passing yards and might have done it if the Fenway Bowl was not canceled.
- ·The 4,000-yard season was one of 10 ever by an ACC quarterback.
- · Armstrong broke UVA's single season passing record in just nine games and finished with 4,449 passing yards, the fourth most in a single season in ACC history.
- · In addition, Armstrong set Virginia's single-season records for total offense (4,700), passing touchdowns (31) and completions (326).
- · Armstrong threw for 300-or-more yards 10 times and 400 yards six times in 11 games played, both school records. Prior to 2021 a UVA quarterback hadn't thrown for 300 yards more than four times (Matt Schuab and Bryce Perkins) in the same season or thrown for 400 yards twice in the same season.
- ·Armstrong owned three of the top 14 passing performances by an FBS quarterback last season. His 554 at UNC were the fourth most by an FBS QB in 2021.

- · Illinois snapped a 26-year bowl victory drought with a 31-21 win over the Cavaliers in the 1990 Florida Citrus Bowl
- In all-time meetings with schools currently in the Big Ten, UVA is 42-59-2. The Cavaliers have played eight of the 14 current members of the league.
- Seventy-eight of those meetings came against Maryland (32-44-2), a former ACC rival.
- Saturday's game is only the 20th time UVA has faced an active member of the Big Ten. UVA is 8-11 in those games.
- Virginia's wins over the Big Ten include a 47-0 triumph over the University of Chicago in 1939 (Chicago left the conference a year later). It was UVA's first Big Ten win.
- Virginia is 1-0 vs. Chicago and Minnesota, 2-2 vs. Indiana, 2-1 vs. Penn State (Big Ten member only), 1-1 vs. Purdue, 0-3 vs. Michigan, 1-2 vs. Illinois, 0-1 vs. Ohio State and Wisconsin.
- UVA's four-game winning streak against the Big Ten, dating back to the 2005 Music City Bowl, was snapped when Indiana beat UVA, 34-17, at Scott Stadium in 2017. The streak started with a 34-31 Music City Bowl win over Minnesota and included wins over Indiana in 2009 and 2011, followed by a 2012 win over Penn State.

CAVALIER/ILLINI CONNECTIONS

·The Virginia men's tennis team won its fifth National Championship in program history in a trip to Champaign this past spring. Virginia also won its first National Championship at Illinois' Kahn Tennis Center back in 2013. It started a streak of four-straight national titles form 2013-17.

Former Big Ten Pitcher of the Year and Illinois standout Drew Dickinson has spent the last three seasons on staff as the pitching coach for the Cavalier baseball program. The Cavaliers have ranked in the top-20 in the country in ERA the past two seasons and Dickinson helped backup quarterback Jay Woolfolk earn Freshman All-America honors. Woolfolk co-led the Cavaliers in appearances and sported a 2.87 ERA.

·Three Illini coaches - Bart Miller (TEs), Terrance Jamison (DL) and Ben Miller all coached with current UVA defensive coordinator John Rudzinski at Air Force. Rudzinski, an Academy graduate, spent 14 season on the Falcons' staff.

Tony Elliott, a patient man, was looking for the right fit when it came time for him to leave the assistant coaching ranks and take on the responsibility of running a collegiate football program as the head coach. During his 11-year tenure at Clemson, his alma mater, several opportunities presented themselves, but it was not until Virginia came calling that he felt the setting was right for what he wants to accomplish.

On Dec. 10, 2021, Elliott was named the University of Virginia's Fralin Family Head Football Coach. At his introductory press conference, he explained his decision to become the Cavaliers' head coach and what he wants to accomplish in Charlottesville.

"I chose UVA because I wanted to lead a program that was partnered with a university that had world-class academics," he said "I wanted to be able to recruit the best and the brightest student-athletes.

"I wanted to compete in the best conference in college athletics. I wanted to be a part of an alignment with (athletic director) Ms. Carla (Williams) and President (Jim) Ryan that shared a vision that was similar to mine, which is centered around the holistic development of the student-athlete. And lastly, I wanted to be part of a university and athletic department that would not compromise its values to win.

"There is no better place for me than UVA. And there is no better time than now."

With that, Elliott went to work crafting what he had hoped to build for years - The Model Program.

"My vision for the UVA football program is to become the model in college football, the model program in college football," he said. "My goal is to contribute to changing the narrative in college football and demonstrate that you can win at the highest level and you can do so while achieving excellence in education, leadership and service."

Elliott's cornerstones of that culture are based on H.E.A.R.T.- humility, effort, accountability, respect and toughness.

"I think that building a championship culture starts with making sure that you have alignment and a vision," he said. "You clearly state the vision and you are particular in the people that you bring in and make sure that they align with the vision, and then you stay grounded to the principles that you set in place for the players and the staff, and you go to work every single day, and you keep an inside-out mentality. It's one day at a time, and eventually that will bring your championship culture to life."

Elliott's background and coaching pedigree is rich with championship experiences.

He spent 11 seasons as an assistant on Dabo Swinney's staff at Clemson. In January of 2021, he was named the program's assistant head coach and offensive coordinator. He previously served as the team's co-offensive coordinator (2014-20) and the team's running backs coach (2011-20).

At Clemson, Elliott was a part of a 10-season stretch in which the Tigers won 10 or more games. In that span, Clemson won six Atlantic Coast Conference Championships, made four appearances in the College Football Playoff National Championship game and captured national titles in 2016 and 2018.

Since Elliott's promotion to co-offensive coordinator prior to the 2014 Russell Athletic Bowl, the Tigers posted an 89-10 record and ranked in the top 12 nationally in total offense. Clemson either led or ranked No. 2 in the ACC in total offense in five of his seven seasons as an offensive coordinator. Elliott's 2018 and 2019 offenses were responsible for two of the 22 650-point seasons in major college football history.

Elliott was named the Frank Broyles Award recipient as the nation's top assistant coach in 2017. Before transitioning to the tight ends room this year, Elliott was in charge of Clemson's running backs for his first 10 seasons. In that time, he guided Clemson running back Travis Etienne to one of the most illustrious careers in ACC and college football history, helping him set the NCAA record for most games scoring a touchdown (46) and secure ACC records for career rushing yards (4,952), total touchdowns (78), rushing touchdowns (70) and points (468).

As the program's offensive coordinator, Elliott worked with two first-round draft picks at quarterback, including the 2021 first overall pick Trevor Lawrence. From 2015-2020, a Clemson offensive player took home both the ACC's Player of the Year and Offensive Player of the Year awards four times.

Prior to returning to his alma mater, Elliott spent three seasons at Furman (2008-10) and two at South Carolina State (2006-07) coaching wide receivers at both schools. Prior to his coaching career he worked for Michelin North America for two years.

In 2002, Elliott earned his undergraduate degree in industrial engineering from Clemson, where he was a first-team Academic All-ACC selection as well as a CoSIDA Academic District III member. He was also a recipient of an ACC Weaver-James-Corrigan Postgraduate Scholarship.

Under Tommy Bowden, he came to Clemson as a walk-on wide receiver in the fall of 1999 and finished his career with four letters and appeared in 44 games. Swinney was his position coach his senior year (2003) in which he was named a co-captain of a team that finished with a 9-4 record and a No. 22 final ranking by AP and USA Today.

Born in Watsonville, Calif., Elliott and his wife, Tamika, have two sons, A.J. and Ace.

UNIQUELY UVA

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

UNIVERSITY NICKNAMES

Virginia's athletics teams have been accompanied by a somewhat confusing array of nicknames. The most prominent and widely accepted of these monikers are "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos."

Although the terms "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are used almost interchangeably to refer to University teams and players, "Cavaliers" is more often used by the media, while "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are frequently used by Virginia students and fans.

Legend has it that Washington & Lee baseball fans dubbed the Virginia players "Wahoos" during the fiercely contested rivalry that existed between the two in-state schools in the 1890s. By 1940, "Wahoos" was in general use around Grounds to denote University students or events relating to them. The abbreviated "Hoos" sprang up later in student newspapers and has gained growing popularity in recent years.

THE CAVALIER MASCOT

The costumed Cavalier with a large character head debuted during Virginia's 1984 football season and has remained the official mascot of the University.

The first documented Cavalier on horseback was Francis Bell, a Virginia student from Dublin, Va., in 1947. Bell rode onto the field dressed as Cavaliers for Virginia's home football game with Harvard on the afternoon of October 11.

The Cavalier on horseback returned as the University's mascot in 1963. The UVA Polo Club provided both the horse and rider. However, the mounted Cavalier and his horse parted company in 1974 with the inception of AstroTurf at Scott Stadium.

The mounted Cavalier made its return in the Florida Citrus Bowl at the end of the 1989 football season. Due to its instant popularity, the Cavalier on horseback returned the following season on a regular basis and continues to lead the Virginia football team onto the field at the beginning of all home games.

Since 2000, Kim Kirschnick led the Cavaliers out of the tunnel on horseback and retired after the 2021 season finale against Virginia Tech. 2022 will mark Julie Caruccio first season as the mounted Cavalier. A former interim dean of students at UVA, Caruccio is the first female in school history to have the mounted Cavalier job on a fulltime basis. When the tradition rotated among members of the club polo team until Kirschnick took over in 2000, at least two women - Bess Worrall and Kerry McDaniel - were on horseback for a few games in the early '90s.

UNIVERSITY COLORS

Orange and blue were adopted as the University of Virginia's official athletic colors at a mass student meeting in 1888. UVA athletic teams had previously worn silver gray and cardinal red, but those colors did not stand out on muddy football fields, prompting a student movement to change them.

One of the students attending the mass meeting was Allen Potts, a star athlete who played on Virginia's first football team in 1888. Potts showed up at the meeting wearing a navy blue-and-orange scarf that he had acquired during a summer boating expedition at Oxford University. Orange and blue were chosen as the official athletic colors after one of Potts' fellow students pulled the scarf off Potts' neck and, waving it to the crowd, yelled, "How will this do?" UVA later served as the inspiration for schools like Auburn and Florida when they selected school colors.

WAH-HOO-WAH

The origin of "Wah-hoo-wah" is uncertain. The cheer was used to root on Virginia teams as early as 1890 and may have been borrowed from Dartmouth College, whose athletics teams were once known as the Indians.

Legend attributes the yell to Natalie Floyd Otey, who sang the ballad "Where'er You Are, There Shall My Love Be" at Charlottesville's Levy Opera House in 1893. The predominantly student audience noticed that Otey warbled the first three words of the song between each of the stanzas and decided to join in the refrain. By evening's end, goes the legend, the crowd had corrupted "Where'er You Are" into "Wah-hoo-wah."

The Levy Opera House stands at the corner of High Street and Park Street and has since been renovated into an office building.
