INSIDE TODAY'S MATCHUP

- Virginia will be home for four-straight weekends and not leave the Commonwealth for the remainder of the 2022 regular season.
- UVA last played four-straight home games in 2020 but has only played on four-consecutive Saturdays at Scott Stadium during the 1951 and 1970 seasons.
- The Cavaliers are 2-1 at home this season and own a 23-6 record at Scott Stadium since 2018. The 23 home wins are the third most in the ACC behind Clemson (30) and NC State (26) and the most of any ACC Coastal Division school in the last five years.
- After visiting Miami in each of the last three seasons, Virginia will host the Hurricanes for the first time since 2018. The Cavaliers upset a then-No. 16 Miami team with a 16-13 victory in that contest, the first win over a ranked opponent at home since 2014.
- Virginia has won four of the last five meetings against Miami at Scott Stadium.
- Miami and Virginia are two of the top teams in the country in getting after the quarterback. The Hurricanes are averaging 3.43 sacks per game, second most in the ACC and eighth most in the country. The Cavaliers rank third in the ACC and 11th most in the country with 3.29 sacks per game.



Chico Bennett Jr. was named the ACC Defensive Lineman of the Week for the second time this season after his seven-tackle, two-sack performance at Georgia Tech.

TOP STORYLINES

- Saturday's contest is crucial for both teams to keep their Coastal Division title hopes alive. UVA and Miami are two of the four Coastal teams with one win. The Cavaliers have first place North Carolina on deck next weekend.
- After becoming UVA's all-time leader in career touchdowns passes last week against Georgia Tech, Brennan Armstrong has his sights set on the ACC record books. The southpaw sits 376 yards away from 10,000 yards of total offense for his career. Only 14 players in league history have reached 10,000 yards in their careers.
- The Virginia defense is coming off one of the most dominant efforts in the last decade. The Cavaliers yielded only 202 yards of total offense against Georgia Tech, the fewest against an ACC/FBS opponent since 2013.
- In addition, the Cavaliers accumulated eight sacks, the second-most ever in a game in program history and the most since setting the school record with nine against Duke in 2006. UVA has recorded eight sacks in a game, four times, most recently in 1996 against Wake Forest.

CLIMBING THE CHARTS

· Wide receivers Keytaon Thompson and Billy Kemp IV are on pace to go down as statistically two of the top-10 receivers in UVA history.

· Thompson entered UVA's top-15 in career receiving yards last week against Georgia Tech with 89 yards on a team-best seven catches. He needs 78 yards to pass Heath Miller for the 10th-most receiving yards in school history.

· Kemp was held without a catch against the Yellow Jackets but sits just 13 yards shy of Miller.

· Thompson and Kemp are also among the program's top-10 in receptions. Thompson has 133 career catches at UVA, the ninth-most in program history. Kemp ranks fourth all-time with 181 receptions and looking to become only the third Cavalier with 200 career receptions (see chart on page 3).

THROUGH THE AIR & ON THE GROUND

· Brennan Armstrong has rushed for a touchdown in three-straight games for the second-straight time in his career. He has never run for a TD in four-consecutive games.

· Armstrong's 18 career rushing touchdowns are the fifth-most by a UVA quarterback and one shy of Bob Davis' 19 from 1962-64.

· Armstrong's 313 yards passing against Louisville were a season-high. It also marked the 12th time in his career he's eclipsed the 300-yard mark in a game, a program record. One more 300-yard effort and he will move into a tie for the sixth most in ACC history.

THOMPSON'S CONSISTENCY

· Wide receiver Keytaon Thompson has led the Cavaliers in receptions for the last six games. He has caught five or more passes in 11 of his last 13 games.

· Thompson's team-best, nine catches against Louisville marked the eighth time in his career and second time this season he's caught nine or more passes.

· Thompson has caught a pass in 21-straight games dating back to the 2020 season, the longest active streak on the team.

BIG PLAY POTENTIAL

· Lavel Davis Jr. ranks second in the ACC and 8th in the country with a 21.60 yards per catch average. Of his 35 career catches, 17 have gone for 20 or more yards.

· Wide receiver Dontayvion Wicks has two touchdowns this season both have gone for 40+ yards. Of his 12 career touchdown receptions, six have been 40+ yard scores.

· Since 2000, Wicks has the most plays of 20 or more yards than any UVA wide receiver with 34. His 2021 campaign included 27 plays of 20 or more yards, the most in a single season by any UVA wideout since 2000.

· Over the course of his six-year college career that started at Mississippi State as a quarterback in 2017, Thompson has accumulated over 1,000 yards rushing, 1,000 receiving and 750 yards passing. The only other known player in the last 25 years to accomplish the feat was Paul Dombrowski of New Mexico State from 2002-05.

BALANCING ACT

· In three of six games this season, UVA has rushed for more yards than its thrown for, including a 259-yard rushing effort in the season opener against Richmond.
 · Prior to this season, the Cavaliers hadn't recorded more rushing yards than passing yards in a game since 2020 against North Carolina (210 rush/208 pass).

· Promising a commitment to the running game, Tony Elliott has delivered. As a play caller at Clemson that started with 2014 season bowl win over Oklahoma, the Tiger offense had 39 games in which the offense accumulated 200 or more passing and rushing yards in a game and went a perfect 39-0 in those games. As a head coach, he is 2-0 when totaling more than 200 yards in both the running and passing game.

· In the 12 seasons before Elliott's arrival, UVA has rushed for 200+ and passed for 200+ in the same game 20 times and own a record of 14-6 in those contests.

RARE RUSHING FEATS

· In the season opener against Richmond, the Cavaliers ran for 259 yards on 42 attempts. Both were the most in a game since 2020 against Boston College and marked the fourth time since 2015 UVA has ran for 250+ on the ground, a span of 87 games.

· Against Richmond Perris Jones became the first UVA running back with a 100-yard rushing effort since Jordan Ellis in the 2018 Belk Bowl.

· Both Jones and Brennan Armstrong had 100-yard games on the ground, the first time two UVA rushers went for 100+ yards in the same game since Jordan Ellis (146) and Bryce Perkins (108) vs. Richmond in 2018.

· Against Illinois, UVA accumulated 42 rushing yards on 29 attempts. It's the fewest amount of yards on 27 or more attempts since 2019 against Notre Dame.

· Armstrong's 64-yard run against Richmond was the longest of his career, the longest of any Cavalier since his 60-yard scamper against Boston College in 2020 and the sixth-longest ever by a UVA quarterback.

UVA UP FRONT

· The Virginia offensive line debuted with five players who made their first start in a UVA uniform. Only John Paul Flores (LG) had previously started a collegiate game, in his time at Dartmouth.

· Virginia returned one letterwinner (Jonathan Leech) on its offensive line from last season, tied with Colorado State for the fewest in college football.

· Freshman McKale Boley became only the second Cavalier true freshman ever to start the opening game at offensive tackle. He's only the sixth UVA freshman OT to start a game at offensive tackle.

WIDE RECEIVER U

· Virginia and UTSA were the only two schools to return three wide receivers that accumulated 725 or more yards last season (Dontayvion Wicks - 1,203; Keytaon Thompson - 990 & Billy Kemp IV). The UVA trio accounted for 2,918 yards, almost 500 more yards than their Roadrunner counterparts.

· Wicks and Thompson are both on the Biletnikoff Award Watch List. Virginia is one of three schools (Penn State & Texas) with multiple student-athletes on the 43-player list.

· Virginia was the only school in the country to return two wide receivers with 990 or more yards receiving - Dontayvion Wicks (1,203) and Keytaon Thompson (990).

LOOKING AHEAD TO WEEK EIGHT

- Armstrong now owns school records for career and single-season passing yards, career and single season touchdown passes, career and single season total offense and the program's single-game passing yards mark.
- The lefthander is on pace to break UVA's career completions record, held by Matt Schaub (716).
- On the ground, Armstrong has rushed for 1,182 yards, the fourth Cavalier quarterback ever to rush for 1,000 career yards. He needs 87 yards to surpass Shawn Moore for third place all-time.
- Armstrong's school record streak of 18-straight games with a touchdown was snapped at Illinois.
- Armstrong is the school's record holder in 200-yard games (22), 300-yard games (12), 400 yard games (5) and the only player in school history to throw for 500 yards in a game.
- The Cavalier signal caller broke UVA's career total offense record on a 64-yard touchdown run in the season opener against Richmond. He leaped frogged Shawn Moore (7,987) and Bryce Perkins (7,910) on UVA's all-time list.
- Armstrong has 8,442 career passing yards the second most by a lefthanded quarterback in ACC history. He trails only Wake Forest's Tanner Price who threw 8,899 from 2010-13.
- Armstrong joins Jameis Winston (Florida State), Deshaun Watson (Clemson) and Sam Hartman (Wake Forest) as the only ACC quarterbacks to return the next season after passing for 4,000 yards in the year prior.

HIGHLIGHTS OF A HISTORIC 2021 SEASON

- Armstrong is one of three players in NCAA Football history that have thrown for 4,400 yards or more playing just 11 games. Only Houston quarterbacks Andre Ware (4,699 in 1989) and David Klinger (5,140 in 1990) had more yards playing 11 games in a season.
- Armstrong's 4,449 passing in 2021 were the most ever by an NCAA left-handed quarterback. He surpassed Scott Mitchell (Utah) who threw for 4,322 in 1988.
- Armstrong came just 145 yards shy of breaking the ACC single-season record for passing yards and might have done it if the Fenway Bowl was not canceled.
- The 4,000-yard season was one of 10 ever by an ACC quarterback.
- Armstrong broke UVA's single season passing record in just nine games and finished with 4,449 passing yards, the fourth most in a single season in ACC history.
- In addition, Armstrong set Virginia's single-season records for total offense (4,700), passing touchdowns (31) and completions (326).
- Armstrong threw for 300-or-more yards 10 times and 400 yards six times in 11 games played, both school records. Prior to 2021 a UVA quarterback hadn't thrown for 300 yards more than four times (Matt Schaub and Bryce Perkins) in the same season or thrown for 400 yards twice in the same season.
- Armstrong owned three of the top 14 passing performances by an FBS quarterback last season. His 554 at UNC were the fourth most by an FBS QB in 2021.

• Senior Chico Bennett Jr. was named the ACC Defensive Player of the Week for the second time on Monday (Oct. 24). Bennett, a Georgia Tech transfer, had a huge day in his homecoming on the Flats, recording a career-high seven tackles and putting forth his second, multi-sack effort of the season.
• Bennett sits atop the ACC leaders in sacks with six on the season and his 0.86 sacks per game are tied for the 18th best in the country.
• Bennett is the ninth Cavalier defensive lineman to win the award twice in the same season. The list includes: Mandy Alonso (2021), Matt Conrath (2011), Nate Collins (2009), Chris Long (2007), Patrick Kerney (1998), Mark Kirchbaum (1993), Chris Slade (1991) and Ron Mattes (3x in 1984).
• Through only seven games, Bennett's six sacks are the most by a Cavalier since Charles Snowden had six in his 2020 campaign.

HOMETOWN KID

• Playing in his hometown for the first time in his career last week against Georgia Tech, Nick Jackson led UVA with eight tackles, recorded a career high two sacks and recovered the first fumble of his career.
• Jackson is on pace for his third-consecutive 100-tackle season with 70 through seven games. He's recorded double-digit tackle efforts in four of the seven games this season, including a 10-tackle performance in just one half against Duke. The senior linebacker was forced to sit out the first half against the Blue Devils due to a targeting call against Syracuse in the week prior. The first-half suspension halted his streak of 27-straight starts at linebacker for the Hoos.
• Jackson has 18 double-digit tackle efforts over the course of his four years at UVA.

• Through seven games, Jackson ranks third in the ACC and 16th in the country in tackles per game with 10.0.
• Jackson was the ACC's top tackler in 2021, totaling 117 stops and was credited with 2.5 sacks in 12 games. He recorded six tackles for loss, broke up two passes and had six quarterback hurries.
• Jackson's 9.8 tackles per game also led the ACC and were the 14th most in the country.
• The Atlanta native went on to earn second team All-ACC honors for the second year in-a-row.
• Jackson has the chance to join Charles McDaniel (1982-84), Jon Copper (2006-08) and Micah Kiser (2015-17) as the only Cavaliers to lead the team in tackles for three consecutive seasons.

HISTORIC PERFORMANCE

• The Cavaliers accumulated eight sacks, the second-most ever in a game in program history and the most since setting the school record with nine against Duke in 2006. UVA has recorded eight sacks in a game, four times, most recently in 1996 against Wake Forest.
• The eight sacks are the most by an ACC team this season. Including UVA, only seven schools in the country have recorded eight or more sacks in a game this season.

LAST YEAR'S MEETING VS. MIAMI

·The Cavaliers escaped with a 30-28 victory after the Hurricanes missed a 28-yard field goal as time expired.

·Virginia snapped a five-game road losing streak in last year's meeting against the Hurricanes. The victory at Hard Rock Stadium was Virginia's first since 2011. The Cavaliers had dropped six-straight games in the facility, including the 2019 Orange Bowl (to Florida).

·Dontayvion Wicks, had only two receptions, but one turned out to be one of the most memorable of the college football season. In third quarter, on second-and-17 from the Miami 37, Armstrong threw a long pass to the end zone that was nearly intercepted. As the defensive back came down with the ball, however, it came loose and landed on Wicks' back. As Wicks rolled over, the ball popped up, and he grabbed it for an unforgettable touchdown.

·The game served as a homecoming for defensive end Mandy Alonso who had career-highs sacks (2) and tackles for losses (3). He made the tackle on the first quarter safety. He went on to earn ACC Defensive Lineman of the Week honors.

·Last year's meeting was the only game of the season in which Armstrong did not amass 300 yards passing. He completed 25 of 44 passes for 268 yards and one TD. He was intercepted once, a turnover that Miami quickly turned into a touchdown.

CAVALIER/HURRICANE CONNECTION

·Virginia has nine players from the Sunshine State including five from the Miami area - Dawson Alters, Will Bettridge, Sean Moore, D'Sean Perry and Blake Steen.

·Current Cavalier running back Cody Brown transferred from Miami to Virginia prior to the 2022 season. Brown appeared in 10 games as a true freshman for the Hurricanes and accumulated 139 yards on 34 carries. He scored three touchdowns last season, two came in a two-score, 77-yard effort against Central Connecticut.

· Tony Elliott brings a wealth of championship football experience to Charlottesville. In his 16 years as a full time college coach, Elliott has been a part of 15 winning seasons including 10-win seasons at Clemson from 2011-2020.

· As the offensive coordinator, Clemson went 89-10 and made four CFP National Championship game appearances.

· Elliott is one of 13 African-American head coaches in college football and one of eight running Power-5 programs. The Cavaliers have seven full-time African-American assistant coaches.

FALL CAMP WALK-ONS

· Head coach Tony Elliott put three Cavaliers on scholarship in dramatic fashion during fall camp.

· During a two-minute drill in the middle of practice, Elliott joined the special teams huddle and said “How bout if my man (Brendan) Farrell makes this kick (48 yards), he goes on scholarship?” Farrell drilled it and only the 11 guys in the huddle knew what had just happened.

· Quarterback Jared Rayman and wide receiver Josh Clifford were supposed to get up in front of the whole team on karaoke night. Having to submit a team name, the duo called themselves “Walk On, Walk Off.” Before they were set to sing, Elliott stole the microphone and said that they have a new name “The two newest guys on scholarship.” The team erupted in celebration.

Tony Elliott, a patient man, was looking for the right fit when it came time for him to leave the assistant coaching ranks and take on the responsibility of running a collegiate football program as the head coach. During his 11-year tenure at Clemson, his alma mater, several opportunities presented themselves, but it was not until Virginia came calling that he felt the setting was right for what he wants to accomplish.

On Dec. 10, 2021, Elliott was named the University of Virginia's Fralin Family Head Football Coach. At his introductory press conference, he explained his decision to become the Cavaliers' head coach and what he wants to accomplish in Charlottesville.

"I chose UVA because I wanted to lead a program that was partnered with a university that had world-class academics," he said "I wanted to be able to recruit the best and the brightest student-athletes.

"I wanted to compete in the best conference in college athletics. I wanted to be a part of an alignment with (athletic director) Ms. Carla (Williams) and President (Jim) Ryan that shared a vision that was similar to mine, which is centered around the holistic development of the student-athlete. And lastly, I wanted to be part of a university and athletic department that would not compromise its values to win.

"There is no better place for me than UVA. And there is no better time than now."

With that, Elliott went to work crafting what he had hoped to build for years - The Model Program.

"My vision for the UVA football program is to become the model in college football, the model program in college football," he said. "My goal is to contribute to changing the narrative in college football and demonstrate that you can win at the highest level and you can do so while achieving excellence in education, leadership and service."

Elliott's cornerstones of that culture are based on **H.E.A.R.T.- humility, effort, accountability, respect and toughness.**

"I think that building a championship culture starts with making sure that you have alignment and a vision," he said. "You clearly state the vision and you are particular in the people that you bring in and make sure that they align with the vision, and then you stay grounded to the principles that you set in place for the players and the staff, and you go to work every single day, and you keep an inside-out mentality. It's one day at a time, and eventually that will bring your championship culture to life."

Elliott's background and coaching pedigree is rich with championship experiences.

He spent 11 seasons as an assistant on Dabo Swinney's staff at Clemson. In January of 2021, he was named the program's assistant head coach and offensive coordinator. He previously served as the team's co-offensive coordinator (2014-20) and the team's running backs coach (2011-20).

At Clemson, Elliott was a part of a 10-season stretch in which the Tigers won 10 or more games. In that span, Clemson won six Atlantic Coast Conference Championships, made four appearances in the College Football Playoff National Championship game and captured national titles in 2016 and 2018.

Since Elliott's promotion to co-offensive coordinator prior to the 2014 Russell Athletic Bowl, the Tigers posted an 89-10 record and ranked in the top 12 nationally in total offense. Clemson either led or ranked No. 2 in the ACC in total offense in five of his seven seasons as an offensive coordinator. Elliott's 2018 and 2019 offenses were responsible for two of the 22 650-point seasons in major college football history.

Elliott was named the Frank Broyles Award recipient as the nation's top assistant coach in 2017. Before transitioning to the tight ends room this year, Elliott was in charge of Clemson's running backs for his first 10 seasons. In that time, he guided Clemson running back Travis Etienne to one of the most illustrious careers in ACC and college football history, helping him set the NCAA record for most games scoring a touchdown (46) and secure ACC records for career rushing yards (4,952), total touchdowns (78), rushing touchdowns (70) and points (468).

As the program's offensive coordinator, Elliott worked with two first-round draft picks at quarterback, including the 2021 first overall pick Trevor Lawrence. From 2015-2020, a Clemson offensive player took home both the ACC's Player of the Year and Offensive Player of the Year awards four times.

Prior to returning to his alma mater, Elliott spent three seasons at Furman (2008-10) and two at South Carolina State (2006-07) coaching wide receivers at both schools. Prior to his coaching career he worked for Michelin North America for two years.

In 2002, Elliott earned his undergraduate degree in industrial engineering from Clemson, where he was a first-team Academic All-ACC selection as well as a CoSIDA Academic District III member. He was also a recipient of an ACC Weaver-James-Corrigan Postgraduate Scholarship.

Under Tommy Bowden, he came to Clemson as a walk-on wide receiver in the fall of 1999 and finished his career with four letters and appeared in 44 games. Swinney was his position coach his senior year (2003) in which he was named a co-captain of a team that finished with a 9-4 record and a No. 22 final ranking by AP and USA Today.

UNIQUELY UVA

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

UNIVERSITY NICKNAMES

Virginia's athletics teams have been accompanied by a somewhat confusing array of nicknames. The most prominent and widely accepted of these monikers are "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos."

Although the terms "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are used almost interchangeably to refer to University teams and players, "Cavaliers" is more often used by the media, while "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are frequently used by Virginia students and fans.

Legend has it that Washington & Lee baseball fans dubbed the Virginia players "Wahoos" during the fiercely contested rivalry that existed between the two in-state schools in the 1890s. By 1940, "Wahoos" was in general use around Grounds to denote University students or events relating to them. The abbreviated "Hoos" sprang up later in student newspapers and has gained growing popularity in recent years.

THE CAVALIER MASCOT

The costumed Cavalier with a large character head debuted during Virginia's 1984 football season and has remained the official mascot of the University.

The first documented Cavalier on horseback was Francis Bell, a Virginia student from Dublin, Va., in 1947. Bell rode onto the field dressed as Cavaliers for Virginia's home football game with Harvard on the afternoon of October 11.

The Cavalier on horseback returned as the University's mascot in 1963. The UVA Polo Club provided both the horse and rider. However, the mounted Cavalier and his horse parted company in 1974 with the inception of AstroTurf at Scott Stadium.

The mounted Cavalier made its return in the Florida Citrus Bowl at the end of the 1989 football season. Due to its instant popularity, the Cavalier on horseback returned the following season on a regular basis and continues to lead the Virginia football team onto the field at the beginning of all home games.

Since 2000, Kim Kirschnick led the Cavaliers out of the tunnel on horseback and retired after the 2021 season finale against Virginia Tech. 2022 marks Julie Caruccio first season as the mounted Cavalier. A former interim dean of students at UVA, Caruccio is the first female in school history to have the mounted Cavalier job on a full-time basis. When the tradition rotated among members of the club polo team until Kirschnick took over in 2000, at least two women – Bess Worrall and Kerry McDaniel – were on horseback for a few games in the early '90s.

UNIVERSITY COLORS

Orange and blue were adopted as the University of Virginia's official athletic colors at a mass student meeting in 1888. UVA athletic teams had previously worn silver gray and cardinal red, but those colors did not stand out on muddy football fields, prompting a student movement to change them.

One of the students attending the mass meeting was Allen Potts, a star athlete who played on Virginia's first football team in 1888. Potts showed up at the meeting wearing a navy blue-and-orange scarf that he had acquired during a summer boating expedition at Oxford University. Orange and blue were chosen as the official athletic colors after one of Potts' fellow students pulled the scarf off Potts' neck and, waving it to the crowd, yelled, "How will this do?" UVA later served as the inspiration for schools like Auburn and Florida when they selected school colors.

WAH-HOO-WAH

The origin of "Wah-hoo-wah" is uncertain. The cheer was used to root on Virginia teams as early as 1890 and may have been borrowed from Dartmouth College, whose athletics teams were once known as the Indians.

Legend attributes the yell to Natalie Floyd Otey, who sang the ballad "Where'er You Are, There Shall My Love Be" at Charlottesville's Levy Opera House in 1893. The predominantly student audience noticed that Otey warbled the first three words of the song between each of the stanzas and decided to join in the refrain. By evening's end, goes the legend, the crowd had corrupted "Where'er You Are" into "Wah-hoo-wah."

The Levy Opera House stands at the corner of High Street and Park Street and has since been renovated into an office building.

GAME 1 • UVA 34, RICHMOND 17
Sept. 3 • Charlottesville, Va.

Game Notes

- UVA is 85-39-9 all-time in season openers and has won six-straight for the first time since winning six-consecutive openers from 1927-32.
- Tony Elliott made his head coaching debut and became the second UVA coach since 1965 win in his debut.
- Virginia had two 100-yard rushers – Brennan Armstrong (105 yards) and Perris Jones (104 yards) for the first time since Jordan Ellis (146) and Bryce Perkins (108) in 2018 against Richmond.
- UVA ran the ball 42 times and totaled 259 yards rushing, the most since accumulating 262 yards on 42 attempts against Boston College on Dec. 5, 2020.
- Virginia wore orange pants and orange jerseys for the first time since 2010 against North Carolina.
- Brennan Armstrong broke UVA's career total offense record with a 64-yard touchdown run. He surpassed Shawn Moore (7,987) and Bryce Perkins (7,910) on UVA's all-time list. It was the longest rush of his career and the 6th-longest ever by a UVA quarterback. His previous career long was 60 yards against Boston College in 2020.
- Armstrong rushed for 105 yards, his second 100-yard rushing effort of his career. He ran for 130 yards against Boston College on Dec. 5, 2020.
- Armstrong's 64-yard rushing touchdown was his 15th rushing score of his career, tying him with fellow southpaw Jameel Sewell for the fifth most ever by a UVA quarterback.
- McKale Boley and D'Brickashaw Ferguson are the only two true freshmen in UVA history to start at offensive tackle in the season opener. Only six true freshmen in program history have started a game at offensive tackle – Ferguson (2002 – all 14 games), Brad Butler (2002-1 game), Morgan Moses (2010 – 6 games), Eric Smith (2013 – 8 games), Chris Glaser (2017 – 2 games) and Boley (2022).
- Perris Jones is the first UVA running back with a rushing touchdown and a receiving touchdown in the same game since Wayne Taulapapa at Miami on Sept. 30, 2021. He totaled 104 yards on the ground, the first UVA running back to rush for 100 yards since Jordan Ellis against South Carolina in the 2018 Belk Bowl.

Game Notes

- Virginia drops to is 1-3 all-time against Illinois.
- UVA is 8-12 all-time in games against active members of the Big Ten and falls for only the third time in the last eight matchups against Big Ten foes.
- The Virginia defense forced four turnovers – three forced fumbles and an interception. Two of the turnovers came on the first two Illinois' drives.
- The three fumble recoveries were the most in a game since being credited with three against Duke on Oct. 19, 2019.
- The Cavaliers finished with 222 yards of total offense (42 rush, 180 pass) in the contest, their lowest output since compiling 191 against Virginia Tech in 2017. Including today, UVA has amassed 300 or more yards in all but eight games since the 2017 season, a span of 64 games.
- Cornerback Anthony Johnson picked off the game's first pass, his sixth career interception and fourth at UVA (three in 2021).
- Antonio Clary, Jonas Sanker and Kam Butler each were credited with forced fumbles. It marked the first time Clary and Sanker forced a fumble in their careers.
- Butler recorded his fourth career forced fumble on a strip sack in the second quarter. It was his 16th career sack. He had three forced fumbles last season playing for Miami (OH) and 15 career sacks with the Redhawks.
- Long led the team with 13 tackles (eight solo and five assisted), only his second multiple tackle game of his career. He had two in the season opener against William & Mary last season.
- Nick Jackson (6.5 career), Chico Bennett Jr. (1.5 career) and Kam Butler (16 career) each recorded their first sacks of the 2022 season.
- Long made their first collegiate start in the contest and Bennett made his first start at UVA (started 2 games while at Georgia Tech in 2020).
- Lavel Davis Jr. 62-yard reception in the second quarter was the 13th catch of 20 or more yards in his career. He has 26 career receptions.
- Jay Woolfolk's 31-yard rush late in the fourth quarter was the longest rush of his career.
- Keytaon Thompson led all Cavaliers with five receptions, the fifth time in the last six games he's caught five or more passes. He finished with 62 yards receiving
- Wide receiver Billy Kemp IV was held without a catch for the first time since Nov. 2, 2019, snapping a 28-game receptions streak, tied for the second-longest active streak in college football going into the game.
- Quarterback Brennan Armstrong did not record a touchdown pass in the contest, snapping a school-record streak of 18 games.

Game Notes

- Virginia improved to 2-0 all-time against ODU. The only other meeting between the two schools came in 2019 at Scott Stadium (UVA, 28-17).
- UVA is 12-2 at home in the month of September since the 2017 season.
- After a 37-yard kickoff return by Demick Starling, Virginia drove 56 yards on six plays in the final 1:01 of the game to setup a 26-yard field goal by Brendan Farrell as time expired.
- It marked the first UVA game-winning field goal as time expired since Robert Randolph's 23-yarder at Indiana in 2011.
- Virginia has won four games in the final minute of a game since the 2011 season, two of them on game-winning drives orchestrated by quarterback Brennan Armstrong.
- The Cavaliers amassed 513 yards of total offense (229 rush, 284 pass), the 11th time in the last 15 games that UVA eclipsed the 500-yard mark.
- Brennan Armstrong broke the program's career passing record with a 17-yard completion to Lavel Davis Jr. in the fourth quarter. He passed Matt Schaub on UVA's all-time list who threw for 7,502 from 2000-03. Armstrong accounted for 284 passing yards in the contest and now has 7,504 for his career.
- Armstrong's 200-yard passing performance was his 20th of his career, tying him with Schaub for the most in school history.
- Keytaon Thompson recorded his 100th career reception with a 47-yard catch in the third quarter, his longest of the 2022 season. He has caught a pass in 17-straight games, the longest active streak on the team. All but one of Thompson's career receptions have come at UVA. He is the 27th player catch 100 passes in a Cavalier uniform.
- Thompson finished with nine catches and 118 yards receiving, the first 100-yard receiver of the 2022 season for UVA. He has caught a pass in 17-straight games, the longest active streak on the team.
- Thompson was one reception shy of his career-high of 11 last season at Pitt. Thompson has caught five or more passes in six of the last seven games.
- On the final drive of the game, Armstrong hit Davis for a 30-yard pass down the middle. Of his 28 career receptions, 14 have gone for 20 or more yards.
- Brendan Farrell went 3-for-4 in field goals with makes from 26, 30 and 26. His lone miss was from 36 yards out with 3:07 left in the game. It was his first career miss in 13 career attempts from 39 yards and in. The three field goals for Farrell were a single-game, career-high.
- True freshman Xavier Brown rushed for 88 yards on nine carries (9.8 avg.). Brown's ninth career carry went for 38 yards, the longest by a UVA rusher this season.

- Keytaon Thompson led the Cavaliers with 55 yards receiving on nine catches. He has now caught a pass in 18-straight games, the longest active streak on the team. Of his 55 yards, 32 of them came after the catch.
- Thompson also carried the ball twice for 10 yards and scored Virginia's first touchdown of the night from one yard out. The rushing touchdown was his 18th of his career, eight have come in a UVA uniform.
- Kam Butler forced his second fumble of the season, stripping Sean Tucker in the first quarter. He has two forced fumbles this season and five in his career. He is one of four ACC players with two forced fumbles in 2022.
- True freshman kicker Will Bettridge made his collegiate debut, converting the extra point try on UVA's first touchdown.
- Brennan Armstrong's four-yard passing touchdown to Lavel Davis Jr. in the fourth quarter put UVA up 20-19 with 5:51 remaining. Game Notes

- Virginia snapped a seven-game win streak against Duke and suffered its first loss against the Blue Devils since 2014 in Durham (20-13).
- The Cavaliers own a 40-34 advantage in the all-time series and drop to 17-23 all-time in Durham.
- With a 2-3 record through the first three games, UVA is below the .500 mark for the first time since the 2020 season and only the second time since the beginning of the 2018 season.
- Seven different Cavaliers caught a pass in the contest, matching a season-high (Richmond).
- Virginia went 83 yards on 11 plays to score its first touchdown of the game, tied for the longest touchdown scoring drive (yards) of the season. The second touchdown of the season against Richmond went 14 plays for 83 yards.
- Brennan Armstrong tied Shawn Moore (1987-90) for second all-time on UVA's career passing touchdown list with his 55th on a 11-yard pass to Perris Jones in the final two minutes of the first half. Armstrong is one touchdown shy of matching Matt Schaub's career mark of 56.
- Armstrong scored UVA's second touchdown on a five-yard rush in the fourth quarter. It was his 16th career rushing TD, the fifth most by a quarterback in UVA history.
- Armstrong threw for 202 yards to record the 21st 200-yard passing game in his career. That makes him UVA's all-time leader for that category.
- Perris Jones notched his team-best, fourth touchdown of the season to put UVA on the board with 1:12 remaining in the second quarter. It was his second receiving touchdown, both his touchdown receptions this season have gone for 11 yards.
- Keytaon Thompson led the Cavaliers for the fourth-straight game with six catches and accumulated 61 receiving yards. He's caught a pass in 19-straight games and has five or more receptions in nine of his last 10 games.
- Despite sitting out the first half due to a targeting penalty in UVA's previous game against Syracuse, Nick Jackson registered 10 tackles and went over the 300-tackle mark for his career. He has 301 career tackles and Saturday marked the 17th double-digit tackle effort of his career (all in the last three years). Jackson's 27-game start streak ended due to the suspension.
- Jonas Sanker finished with a team-best and career-high, 11 tackles.
- Tight end Grant Misch caught three passes for 19 yards and has a reception in all five games this season.
- Jestus Johnson started at center for the Cavaliers, his first career start.
- First career reception for Sackett Wood was a nine-yard reception on third down in the second quarter.
- First year Will Bettridge was successful on his first career field goal attempt, drilling a 34-yard attempt in the third quarter.

Game Notes

- Louisville improved to 6-5 all-time against Virginia and recorded only its second win in Charlottesville in six tries.
- Virginia ended a three-game win streak on homecomings and dropped to 49-46-2 in its 97 total homecomings contests. It was the second time UVA has played Louisville on Homecomings (1989, 16-15 UVA win).
- Virginia has lost back-to-back ACC home openers which includes a 37-17 loss to Wake Forest last season. UVA is 0-3 to start ACC play for the first time since the 2013 season.
- Virginia was credited with six yards rushing, the fewest since rushing for five yards against Virginia Tech in 2017.
- The UVA defense recorded its 10th and 11th takeaways of the season (7 fumble recoveries & 4 interceptions) with a pair of interceptions on the afternoon. UVA came into the weekend ranked third in the ACC in turnovers gained.
- Brennan Armstrong threw his 56th career touchdown pass, tying him with Matt Schaub for the most in program history. The record-tying touchdown pass came in the first quarter, a 40-yard scoring strike to Dontayvion Wicks.
- Armstrong accumulated a season-high, 313 yards passing. He added to his own school record with his 12th 300-yard passing effort of his career.
- True freshman Will Bettridge connected on a 47-yard field goal in the first quarter to open the game's scoring. It was the longest field goal by a UVA kicker this season and the longest since Brian Delaney kicked a 48-yarder against Virginia Tech in 2019.
- Keytaon Thompson led UVA in receptions for the fifth-straight game, catching nine passes for 98 yards. It marked the seventh time in his career he's accumulated nine or more receptions in a game. He's registered five or more receptions in 10 of his last 11 games.
- Thompson has caught a pass in 20-straight games dating back to the 2020 season. He moved up to 13th on UVA's all-time receptions list with 126. He has 127 receptions for his career including one while at Mississippi State.
- Lavel Davis Jr.'s 25-yard reception in the first quarter was his fifth reception of 20 or more yards this season. Of his 34 career catches, 16 have gone for 20 or more yards.
- Anthony Johnson intercepted his second pass of the season and also recorded a career-high three breakups. One of his breakups led to the other UVA interception. Johnson has seven career interceptions, including five in his time at UVA.
- Antonio Clary was credited with his first career interception. Clary has played in 29 games (nine starts) for UVA.
- Linebacker Nick Jackson led the Cavaliers with 11 tackles, his fourth double-digit tackle effort in six games this season. He moved into 15th place on UVA's all-time tackle list with 312, passing former teammate Joey Blount (2017-21) and Phil Thomas (1986-89) who each had 306.

Game Notes

- Virginia improved to 22-21-1 and have won four of the last five against the Yellow Jackets.
- The Cavaliers picked up their first win at Bobby Dodd Stadium since 2008, dropping their previous five decisions.
- It marked only the second time in the 44-games between the two schools that Georgia Tech failed to reach double-digit points (UVA won 24-7 in Atlanta in 1994).
- Virginia picked up its first road win of the season and first victory away from Charlottesville since winning at Louisville on Oct. 9, 2021, a span of five games.
- The Cavaliers accumulated eight sacks, the second-most ever in a game in program history and the most since setting the school record with nine against Duke in 2006. UVA has recorded eight sacks in a game, four times, most recently in 1996 against Wake Forest.
- The eight sacks were the most by an ACC team this season. Including UVA, only seven schools in the country have recorded eight or more sacks in a game this season.
- UVA defense did not allow a first down in the third quarter and held Georgia Tech to 14 total yards in the third quarter on four drives (all 3-and-outs). It forced the Yellow Jackets to go 3-and-out on its first six possessions of the second half.
- The Georgia Tech offense did not score in the second half, the first time a UVA opponent was held scoreless in the second half since blanking Duke in the final 30 minutes last season.
- The UVA defense held the Yellow Jackets to 202 yards of total offense (146 pass/55 rush), the fewest in a game since allowing 183 against William & Mary in 2021 and the fewest allowed to an FBS/ACC opponent since yielding 199 to Pitt in 2013.
- Brennan Armstrong threw his 57th touchdown pass of his career, a 44-yard catch and run by Dontayvion Wicks in the second quarter to break UVA's career touchdown record. He surpassed Matt Schaub who threw for 56 touchdowns from 2000-03.
- Both Schaub and Armstrong broke the UVA career TD record in their 38th game. Schaub broke Shawn Moore's then-record with a 52-yard strike to Heath Miller in the 2003 Continental Tire Bowl against Pitt.
- Atlanta native Nick Jackson finished with a team-high eight tackles, recorded two sacks and recovered a fumble in the contest. It was his first ever multiple sack game and first fumble recovery of his career.
- Jackson moved up to 14th place all-time on UVA's all-time career tackle list and now has 324 in his four seasons as a Cavalier.
- Chico Bennett Jr., a transfer from Georgia Tech, also put together his first multi-outing sack of his career. He leads the team six on the season.
- Wicks had a season-high, 99 yards receiving on four catches. A total of 43 of his yards came after the catch. Wicks had two catches of 20 or more yards the 44-yard TD catch and a 37-yard catch in the third quarter. He has 34 catches of 20 or more yards, the most by any Cavalier receiver since 2000.
