### INSIDE SATURDAY'S MATCHUP

- William & Mary will be Virginia's final non-ACC opponent of the 2023 season. UVA is 2-4 against non-conference foes over the past two years.
- The Tribe come into the contest ranked No. 1 in FCS in total defense (200.6 yards per game) and No. 2 in scoring defense (10.6 ppg). Three of the five W&M opponents have been held under 10 points this season.
- Separated by 125 miles, Virginia and William & Mary will go head-to-head for the 39th time. UVA has won 31 of 39 matchups in an all-time series that dates back to 1908.
- A total of 29 of the previous 38 matchups have occurred in Charlottesville, including each of the last 16.
- Virginia has won five-straight games against William & Mary and 11 of the last 12.
- The Cavaliers blanked the Tribe, 43-0 in the 2021 season opener at Scott Stadium, UVA's first shutout of the Tribe since 1951 (46-0).

### TOP STORYLINES

- William & Mary is one of five of Virginia's remaining seven opponents with at least four wins through the first five weeks of the season. The final seven UVA opponents have a combined record of 25-8 and include ranked foes No. 14 North Carolina (4-0), No. 17 Miami (4-0), No. 19 Duke (4-1) and No. 25 Louisville (5-0).
- UVA wideouts Malik Washington and Malachi Fields are the top receiving duo in the ACC and among the top receiving tandems in the country. Their 911 yards combined receiving yards are the fourth-most of any two teammates in FBS competition. The pair have also combined for 64 receptions, most in the league and seventh most of any FBS duo.
- Quarterback Tony Muskett returned from an injury sustained in week one against Tennessee to start against Boston College last week and was 22-for-34 with 247 yards and three touchdowns. Over the last four games with either Muskett or true freshman Anthony Colandrea under center, UVA has averaged 289.5 yards per game through the air.
- Virginia has owned double-digit leads in three of its five games this season. The Cavaliers have been on the wrong end of three games decided by three points or less this season. In the first 15 games of Tony Elliott's tenure, the Cavaliers have been a part of seven games decided by a field goal or less and are 1-6 in those contests.
- Dre Walker and Jaden Gibson became the fourth and fifth true freshmen to earn a start for UVA this season, joining Colandrea, WR Suderian Harrison and LB Kam Robinson. A total of nine true freshmen have seen action this year and 23 Cavaliers have made their collegiate debuts.
- William & Mary head coach Mike London was the head coach at Virginia for six seasons (2010-15). His staff includes former UVA players Darryl Blackstock, Keenan Carter, Ras-I Dowling and Matt Johns as well Terry Smith who spent time at UVA as an assistant coach under London.

**UNIQUELY UVA**

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

**Grounds:** The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

**First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year:** Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

**Commonwealth:** Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

**UNIVERSITY NICKNAMES**

Virginia's athletics teams have been accompanied by a somewhat confusing array of nicknames. The most prominent and widely accepted of these monikers are "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos."

Although the terms "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are used almost interchangeably to refer to University teams and players, "Cavaliers" is more often used by the media, while "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are frequently used by Virginia students and fans.

Legend has it that Washington & Lee baseball fans dubbed the Virginia players "Wahoos" during the fiercely contested rivalry that existed between the two in-state schools in the 1890s. By 1940, "Wahoos" was in general use around Grounds to denote University students or events relating to them. The abbreviated "Hoos" sprang up later in student newspapers and has gained growing popularity in recent years.

**THE CAVALIER MASCOT**

The costumed Cavalier with a large character head debuted during Virginia's 1984 football season and has remained the official mascot of the University.

The first documented Cavalier on horseback was Francis Bell, a Virginia student from Dublin, Va., in 1947. Bell rode onto the field dressed as Cavaliers for Virginia's home football game with Harvard on the afternoon of October 11.

The Cavalier on horseback returned as the University's mascot in 1963. The UVA Polo Club provided both the horse and rider. However, the mounted Cavalier and his horse parted company in 1974 with the inception of AstroTurf at Scott Stadium.

The mounted Cavalier made its return in the Florida Citrus Bowl at the end of the 1989 football season. Due to its instant popularity, the Cavalier on horseback returned the following season on a regular basis and continues to lead the Virginia football team onto the field at the beginning of all home games.

Since 2000, Kim Kirschnick led the Cavaliers out of the tunnel on horseback and retired after the 2021 season finale against Virginia Tech. 2022 marks Julie Caruccio first season as the mounted Cavalier. A former interim dean of students at UVA, Caruccio is the first female in school history to have the mounted Cavalier job on a full-time basis. When the tradition rotated among members of the club polo team until Kirschnick took over in 2000, at least two women - Bess Worrall and Kerry McDaniel - were on horseback for a few games in the early '90s.

**UNIVERSITY COLORS**

Orange and blue were adopted as the University of Virginia's official athletic colors at a mass student meeting in 1888. UVA athletic teams had previously worn silver gray and cardinal red, but those colors did not stand out on muddy football fields, prompting a student movement to change them.

One of the students attending the mass meeting was Allen Potts, a star athlete who played on Virginia's first football team in 1888. Potts showed up at the meeting wearing a navy blue-and-orange scarf that he had acquired during a summer boating expedition at Oxford University. Orange and blue were chosen as the official athletic colors after one of Potts' fellow students pulled the scarf off Potts' neck and, waving it to the crowd, yelled, "How will this do?" UVA later served as the inspiration for schools like Auburn and Florida when they selected school colors.

**WAH-HOO-WAH**

The origin of "Wah-hoo-wah" is uncertain. The cheer was used to root on Virginia teams as early as 1890 and may have been borrowed from Dartmouth College, whose athletics teams were once known as the Indians.

Legend attributes the yell to Natalie Floyd Otey, who sang the ballad "Where'er You Are, There Shall My Love Be" at Charlottesville's Levy Opera House in 1893. The predominantly student audience noticed that Otey warbled the first three words of the song between each of the stanzas and decided to join in the refrain. By evening's end, goes the legend, the crowd had corrupted "Where'er You Are" into "Wah-hoo-wah."

The Levy Opera House stands at the corner of High Street and Park Street and has since been renovated into an office building.

- Ranks second among FBS freshman quarterbacks with 923 yards passing.
  - Averaging 14.65 yards per completion, the second-highest in the ACC and 20th-best in the country.
  - Made collegiate debut in season opener against No. 12 Tennessee.
  - In his first collegiate start, Colandrea was 20-for-26 with 377 yards and two touchdowns against James Madison, all single-game UVA freshman records. The two touchdown passes matched the school mark held by Jameel Sewell (2006) and Scott Gardner who did it twice in 1972.
  - His 75-yard touchdown pass to Kobe Pace on the first play of the second half against JMU was the longest ever by a UVA freshman quarterback (Previous: Todd Kirtley, 73-yard TD pass vs. NC State in 1978). The throw also eclipsed UVA's single-game passing record by a freshman (previous: 243 by Jameel Sewell vs. Maryland in 2006).
  - His 377 yards is second to only the 399 from McCae Hillstead of Utah State by a freshman this season.
  - His 652 yards passing through the first four weeks are the second most of any freshman in FBS.

- 79 yards shy of 1,000 yards rushing for his career (872 at Clemson).
  - One of three ACC running backs with multiple receiving touchdowns (Will Shipley - Clemson & Bhayshul Tuten - Virginia Tech).
  - Has started last two games (NC State & BC), his first two starts since 2021 while at Clemson.
  - Has scored three touchdowns (1 rush, 2 receiving) in five games. Had one receiving TD in three seasons at Clemson and has two in first four games at UVA
  - Co-led UVA in rushing in his UVA debut with 39 yards against then-No. 12 Tennessee. Broke off a 22-yard rush, the second-longest play of the game for UVA.
  - Caught the longest pass of his career, a 75-yard reception against JMU and also added a 3-yard rushing score in the contest. It was the first time he scored twice in a game since 2021 against Wake Forest (while at Clemson). His only other TD reception came as a true freshman against Georgia Tech.

- Enrolled at Clemson while Tony Elliott was the Tigers' offensive coordinator
  - Brought 793 career rushing yards to the Cavalier offense. His 641 yards in 2021 would have been the most by a UVA running back since 2018 (Jordan Ellis).
  - Has two career 100-yard games, including 125-yard effort in 19-13 win over BC on Oct. 2, 2021 while at Clemson. He went on to earn ACC Running back of the week honors.
  - Earned ACC Running Back of the Week and shared team offensive player of the game honors after rushing for a career-high 191 yards on 24 carries with two touchdowns vs. No. 13 Wake Forest in 2021.

  - Served as the lone game captain in the home opener against JMU, tabbed as UVA Strong Day at Scott Stadium.
  - Rushed for two touchdowns in home opener against JMU. It was his second multi-score game of his career (William & Mary, 2019). It was his first touchdown since scoring against ODU (9/17) last season. He finished the game with a team-high 28 yards rushing on 12 carries.

- Leads the ACC in receiving yards (556), receiving yards per game (111.2), receptions (37) and receptions per game (7.4).
- His 681 all purpose yards are the second-most in the ACC and rank 17 in all of FBS.
- Is 96 yards shy of 2,000 receiving yards for his career. There are only 22 active FBS players with 2,000 receiving yards entering week six.
- Named ACC Offensive Receiver of the Week after establishing career-highs in receptions (10), receiving yards (170) and receiving touchdowns (2) against NC State on 9/15.
- The 170-yards receiving were the 12th most ever in a game by a UVA wide receiver and he is one of 22 wide receivers nationally to record 170 or more yards in a game in 2023.
- Amassed 201 all-purpose yards against NC State, the first Cavalier with 200 all-purpose yards since Joe Reed at Georgia Tech in 2018.
- With 119 receiving yards vs. JMU, 141 at Maryland and 170 against NC State, Washington became the third Cavalier ever (Dontayvion Wicks - 2021 & Germane Crowell - 1997) to record three-straight 100-yard receiving games in a season. Had 97 yards against BC, three yards shy of becoming the first Cavalier ever to have four-straight 100-yard receiving games.
- Washington enters Saturday with a reception in 30-straight games dating back to his time at Northwestern.
- Washington enters Saturday with 157 career receptions, the third-most of any active ACC receiver.

- Ganyard is the oldest player in college football and one of six student-athletes that are above the age of 30 in college football this season. Of the six players over 30, he's the only American born player (4 Australia, 1 England).
- Ganyard earned his undergraduate degree from UVA in 2009 and enlisted in the Marines where he was a Cobra Helicopter pilot. He's currently in his second year at UVA's Darden School of Business.
- Based on available research Ganyard is the third oldest D-I player to ever play college football. Only RB Joe Thomas (55 - S.C. State) and WR Tim Frisby (40 - South Carolina), former Army Ranger, are known to be older.

**LAST MEETING**

- The two teams opened the 2021 season against one another, a night game at Scott Stadium.
- Brennan Armstrong threw for two touchdowns and rushed for two more as Virginia shut out William & Mary 43-0.
- It marked the 13th shutout against William & Mary in 39 all-time games. The last time the Cavaliers shutout the Tribe was in 1951, a 46-0 victory in Charlottesville.
- It was the first opening-day shutout for Virginia since the 2003 season.
- Virginia amassed 545 yards of offense while limiting the Tribe to 183 yards in the victory. Armstrong passed for 336 yards on the night and the Cavaliers posted seven tackles for loss, including a third-quarter safety in the win.
- UVA led 17-0 at the half and went on to score 26 points in the second half.

**UVA COACHING TIES**

- William & Mary head coach Mike London will return to Charlottesville for the second time as the head coach of the Tribe. London was the head coach at UVA from 2010-15, amassing a 27-46 record in that span.
- London had two different stints as an assistant at UVA, 2001-04 and again from 2006-07 before being named head coach in 2010.
- William & Mary co-defensive coordinator Ras-I Dowling was a two-time All-ACC selection as a cornerback for the Cavaliers from 2007-10 and also served as a team captain his senior season. He was a 2011 draft pick (33rd overall) of the New England Patriots.
- William & Mary passing game coordinator Matt Johns was a quarterback at UVA from 2013-16. He ranks in a the top-10 in most career and season passing. He threw for 4,233 yards and 30 touchdowns, still ranking in the top-15 all-time in each category. He served as a graduate assistant at UVA in 2018.
- William & Mary special teams coordinator Darryl Blackstock played linebacker at UVA from 2002-04 and accumulated 24 career seconds, third-most in program history behind current UVA coaches Chris Slade and Clint

Sintim.  
 · William & Mary quality control coach Terry Smith worked with London as a grad assistant at Virginia in 2000. He earned his master's degree from UVA in 2003.

Tony Elliott, a patient man, was looking for the right fit when it came time for him to leave the assistant coaching ranks and take on the responsibility of running a collegiate football program as the head coach. During his 11-year tenure at Clemson, his alma mater, several opportunities presented themselves, but it was not until Virginia came calling that he felt the setting was right for what he wants to accomplish.

On Dec. 10, 2021, Elliott was named the University of Virginia's Fralin Family Head Football Coach. At his introductory press conference, he explained his decision to become the Cavaliers' head coach and what he wants to accomplish in Charlottesville.

**"I chose UVA because I wanted to lead a program that was partnered with a university that had world-class academics," he said "I wanted to be able to recruit the best and the brightest student-athletes.**

"I wanted to compete in the best conference in college athletics. I wanted to be a part of an alignment with (athletic director) Ms. Carla (Williams) and President (Jim) Ryan that shared a vision that was similar to mine, which is centered around the holistic development of the student-athlete. And lastly, I wanted to be part of a university and athletic department that would not compromise its values to win.

**"There is no better place for me than UVA. And there is no better time than now."**

With that, Elliott went to work crafting what he had hoped to build for years - The Model Program.

**"My vision for the UVA football program is to become the model in college football, the model program in college football," he said. "My goal is to contribute to changing the narrative in college football and demonstrate that you can win at the highest level and you can do so while achieving excellence in education, leadership and service."**

Elliott's cornerstones of that culture are based on **H.E.A.R.T.- humility, effort, accountability, respect and toughness.**

**"I think that building a championship culture starts with making sure that you have alignment and a vision," he said. "You clearly state the vision and you are particular in the people that you bring in and make sure that they align with the vision, and then you stay grounded to the principles that you set in place for the players and the staff, and you go to work every single day, and you keep an inside-out mentality. It's one day at a time, and eventually that will bring your championship culture to life."**

Elliott's background and coaching pedigree is rich with championship experiences.

He spent 11 seasons as an assistant on Dabo Swinney's staff at Clemson. In January of 2021, he was named the program's assistant head coach and offensive coordinator. He previously served as the team's co-offensive coordinator (2014-20) and the team's running backs coach (2011-20).

At Clemson, Elliott was a part of a 10-season stretch in which the Tigers won 10 or more games. In that span, Clemson won six Atlantic Coast Conference Championships, made four appearances in the College Football Playoff National Championship game and captured national titles in 2016 and 2018.

After Elliott's promotion to co-offensive coordinator prior to the 2014 Russell Athletic Bowl, the Tigers posted an 89-10 record and ranked in the top 12 nationally in total offense. Clemson either led or ranked No. 2 in the ACC in total offense in five of his seven seasons as an offensive coordinator. Elliott's 2018 and 2019 offenses were responsible for two of the 22 650-point seasons in major college football history.

Elliott was named the Frank Broyles Award recipient as the nation's top assistant coach in 2017. Before transitioning to the tight ends room this year, Elliott was in charge of Clemson's running backs for his first 10 seasons. In that time, he guided Clemson running back Travis Etienne to one of the most illustrious careers in ACC and college football history, helping him set the NCAA record for most games scoring a touchdown (46) and secure ACC records for career rushing yards (4,952), total touchdowns (78), rushing touchdowns (70) and points (468).

As the program's offensive coordinator, Elliott worked with two first-round draft picks at quarterback, including the 2021 first overall pick Trevor Lawrence. From 2015-2020, a Clemson offensive player took home both the ACC's Player of the Year and Offensive Player of the Year awards four times.

Prior to returning to his alma mater, Elliott spent three seasons at Furman (2008-10) and two at South Carolina State (2006-07) coaching wide receivers at both schools. Prior to his coaching career he worked for Michelin North America for two years.

In 2002, Elliott earned his undergraduate degree in industrial engineering from Clemson, where he was a first-team Academic All-ACC selection as well as a CoSIDA Academic District III member. He was also a recipient of an ACC Weaver-James-Corrigan Postgraduate Scholarship.

Under Tommy Bowden, he came to Clemson as a walk-on wide receiver in the fall of 1999 and finished his career with four letters and appeared in 44 games. Swinney was his position coach his senior year (2003) in which he was named a co-captain of a team that finished with a 9-4 record and a No. 22 final ranking by AP and USA Today.

**GAME 1 • TENNESSEE 49, VIRGINIA 13**  
**Sept. 2 • Nashville, Tenn.**

**Game Notes**

- UVA drops to 85-40-9 in season openers and lost for the first time in a season opener since 2016, snapping a six-game win streak.
- The neutral site season opener was only the fourth (1890, 1960, 1989, 2023) in the 134 seasons of Virginia football. UVA is 1-3 in neutral site openers.
- Saturday marked the fifth meeting between Tennessee and Virginia and the first since the 1991 Sugar Bowl. The Volunteers are 4-1 all-time against the Cavaliers.
- Tennessee was UVA's first regular season SEC opponent since 2003 (South Carolina).
- Announced attendance at Nissan Stadium was 69,507, the largest crowd in the facility's history. It's the largest regular season crowd UVA has played in front of since 2019 at Notre Dame (77,622).
- Malachi Fields caught four passes for a career-high 63 yards receiving. His 30-yard reception in the second quarter from quarterback Tony Muskett led to Virginia's first field goal.
- Perris Jones scored UVA's first touchdown of the season, a 17-yard run the with 7:23 left in the third quarter. It was Jones' third career touchdown and his longest touchdown run of his career. Jones has recorded a rushing touchdown in each of the last two season openers.
- Punter Daniel Sparks, a preseason All-ACC selection, punted a career-high nine times and accumulated 398 yards. His 62-yard punt in the second quarter was the second-longest of his UVA career. He has four 60-yard punts in his last two games played for the Cavaliers (three 60-yard punts in 2022 season-finale vs. Pitt). He also matched a career-high with three punts downed inside the 20-yard line.
- Linebacker Stevie Bracey led the Cavalier defense with a career-high 10 tackles, including seven solo efforts.
- Oluasunkunmi Agunloye was credited with UVA's lone sack on the afternoon and it was the second of his career. Agunloye also recovered a fumble on a Tennessee punt return, the first recovery of his career.
- All eight of Kam Butler's tackles were of the solo variety, the most tackles in a game he's made in 11 games at UVA. His career-high is 11 while at Miami (Ohio) against Army in 2021.
- Kicker Will Bettridge was 2-for-3 in field goal attempts converting from 30 and 40 yards. He improves to 4-5 from 40 or more yards in his career.

**GAME 2 • JAMES MADISON 36, VIRGINIA 35**  
**Sept. 9 • Charlottesville, Va.**

**Game Notes**

- Announced attendance at Scott Stadium was 56,508, the largest crowd for a home opener since 2015 against Notre Dame (58,200).
- UVA scored on touchdowns of 63 and 75 yards in the contest. The last time UVA had two touchdowns of 60 or more yards in a game was on Nov. 21, 2020 against Abilene Christian. Lavel Davis Jr. (90-yard TD reception) and D'Sean Perry (84-yard interception return) scored the two touchdowns vs. ACU.
- Saturday marked the 500th game at Scott Stadium. UVA is 283-205-12 all-time at the facility. The first game of at Scott Stadium was on Oct. 15, 1931.
- JMU snapped UVA's five-game win streak in home openers. UVA drops to 60-26-5 and loses its first home opener since 2016 (Richmond).
- Virginia and JMU squared off for the first time since 1983. UVA is 2-2 all-time against the Dukes.
- The game endured a one hour, 10-minute weather delay at the 12:06 mark of the fourth quarter.
- In his first collegiate start, quarterback Anthony Colandrea was 20-for-26 with 377 yards and two touchdowns, all single-game UVA freshman records. The two touchdown passes matched the school mark held by Jameel Sewell (2006) and Scott Gardner who did it twice in 1972.
- Colandrea's 75-yard touchdown pass to Kobe Pace on the first play of the second half was the longest ever by a UVA freshman quarterback (Previous: Todd Kirtley, 73-yard TD pass vs. NC State in 1978). The 75-yard completion was the longest by the Cavaliers since Brennan Armstrong's 70-yard pass to Dontayvion Wicks at BYU in 2021. The pass also eclipsed UVA's single-game passing record by a freshman (previous: 243 by Jameel Sewell vs. Maryland in 2006).
- Running back Mike Hollins rushed for two touchdowns in the contest, matching a career-best previously set against William & Mary in 2019. He scored on a four-yard rush with 1:02 remaining in the first half and again with 16 seconds left in the third quarter to put UVA up by two scores. It was his first touchdown since scoring against ODU (9/17) last season. He finished the game with 28 yards rushing on 12 carries.
- In his 42nd career game, Malik Washington recorded his first 100-yard receiving effort. He caught five passes for 119 yards, the first UVA 100-yard receiver since Keyton Thompson vs. ODU last season.

**Game Notes**

- Virginia and Maryland met for the first time since the 2013 season. The Terrapins have won three-straight-games against the Cavaliers and own a 45-32-2 advantage in the all-time series that was first played in 1919.
- UVA has dropped six-straight games dating back to last season and is 0-3 to start the year for first time since 2016.
- Virginia committed four turnovers, including its first fumble in six games dating to last season.
- The Cavaliers are 1-9 all-time against Big Ten opponents on the road.
- Malik Washington established career-highs in receptions (9) and receiving yards (141). It marked his second-straight 100-yard receiving effort and he is the first Cavalier to record back-to-back 100-yard receiving games since Keytaon Thompson in 2021 (101 vs Notre Dame & 126 vs. Pitt).
- The 141 yards receiving by Washington are the third-most ever by a UVA player in a game against Maryland - Billy McMullen - 175 yards 10/6/2001; Mikell Simpson - 152 yards 10/20/07.
- Washington has caught a pass in 28 consecutive games.
- Jonas Sanker, who came into the contest with the second-most tackles in the ACC, led UVA with nine stops, including seven solo efforts.
- Malachi Fields was one catch shy of matching his career-high set last week against JMU. He finished with seven receptions for 70 yards and currently leads the team with 12 receptions.
- For the second-straight week, Kobe Pace caught a touchdown pass. He had one touchdown reception. In his first 28 collegiate games and has two in the last two weeks.
- Perris Jones scored the game's first touchdown on a 13-yard run to put UVA up 7-0. It was his fourth career rushing touchdown and sixth overall.
- True freshman Jaden Gibson was credited with his first career reception, a three-yard catch late in the third quarter.
- Kam Butler upped his season sack total to 2.5 with a third-down sack in the third quarter. He finished with four tackles, including two behind the line of scrimmage. He has started 46-consecutive collegiate games and all 13 of his games at UVA.
- Freshman quarterback Anthony Colandrea was 23-for-39 with 263 yards passing and a touchdown in his second-straight start. He completed 10 of his first 11 passes that led to UVA's 14-0 lead in the first quarter.

**Game Notes**

- The meeting between Virginia and NC State was the first since 2020. NC State has won five of the last six meetings against UVA, including three-straight at Scott Stadium.
- The night game at Scott Stadium was the first for UVA since playing Notre Dame in 2021.
- Dating back to last season, UVA has lost seven-straight games and is 0-4 for the first time since 1982, Hall of Fame coach George Welsh's first year with the program. UVA has lost four-straight games for the first time since 2020.
- Virginia converted its first two-point conversion since 2021 (at Miami) to tie the game with 36 seconds left in regulation.
- UVA finished with a season-high 113 yards rushing, the most in a game since North Carolina last season (186 yards).
- Brennan Armstrong's 48-yard touchdown pass by to Kevin Concepcion is the second-longest play from scrimmage surrendered by UVA this season (64-yard TD pass at Maryland on 9/15).
- Wide receiver Malik Washington finished with a career-highs in receptions (10), receiving yards (170) and touchdowns (2). Washington is one of 12 receivers in UVA history to record 170 yards or more in a game.
- With 119 receiving yards vs. JMU, 141 at Maryland and 170 against NC State, Washington became the third Cavalier ever to record three-straight 100-yard receiving games in a season. Dontayvion Wicks did it in 2021 and Germane Crowell had three-straight 100-yard games in 1997. Washington did not have a 100-yard effort in his first 41 games of his collegiate career, including all 40 at Northwestern.
- Washington has now caught a pass in 29-straight games.
- Washington is the first Cavalier receiver with 10 receptions in a game since Keytaon Thompson and Dontayvion Wicks at Pitt in 2021.
- True freshman Kam Robinson led the Cavalier defense tackles with 11, including eight solo efforts. He had one QB hurry and combined on a tackle for loss.
- Micah Gaffney recorded his first career interception, picking off former teammate Brennan Armstrong in the second quarter. It was the first Cavalier interception of the season. Gaffney finished with a career-high three tackles, including a tackle for loss.
- Despite playing just the first half, defensive end Kam Butler recorded a sack in his fourth-straight game. He finished with four tackles (three solo) before leaving with an injury.

- Virginia dropped to 0-4 in road games against Boston College. It marked the first trip to Chestnut Hill since 2010. BC leads the all-time series that was first played in 1963 against UVA, 7-1.
- UVA has lost eight-straight games dating back to last season, its longest losing skid since 2013 (final nine games). UVA is 0-5 for the first time since 1982, the first year of Hall of Fame coach George Welsh's tenure at Virginia.
- Virginia forced a season-high four turnovers (2 INT, 2 FR) in the contest. UVA has lost its last three games when forcing four or more turnovers (2022 at Syracuse & 2022 at Illinois). The Cavaliers came into the contest with two turnovers on the year (1 INT, 1 FR).
- The 21 points scored in the first half were a season-high and the most in the first half since scoring 21 against Virginia Tech in 2021.
- UVA scored on its opening drive for the second time this season (JMU). The drive lasted 10 plays and went for 75 yards, tied for the longest touchdown drive of the season.
- Virginia led by as many as 14 points, tied for the largest lead in a game this season. The Cavaliers have owned double-digit leads in three of their five games this season.
- Saturday was UVA's first multi-interception game since picking off two against Louisville last season.
- Wide receiver Malik Washington led the Cavaliers in receptions and receiving yards for the third-straight game with nine catches for 97 yards. He was three-yards shy of becoming UVA's first player to ever record four-straight 100-yard receiving games.
- Washington extended his consecutive games with a reception streak to 30 games. He also went over the 150 career reception mark and has 157 for his career.
- Quarterback Tony Muskett was 22-of-34 passing for 247 yards and three touchdowns. He is the first UVA quarterback with three touchdown passes in a game since Brennan Armstrong had three at Pitt in 2021.
- A UVA quarterback has thrown for 200 or more yards in three-straight games. It was Muskett's 18th 200-yard passing game of his career and first at UVA.
- Running back Mike Hollins scored on a five-yard touchdown reception in the first quarter, his first receiving touchdown of his career. It was his Hollins' 10th career touchdown.
- Making his second-straight start, true freshman Dre Walker recorded his first career interception. He is the first true freshman with an interception since Bryce Hall had two in 2016 against Duke.
- Linebacker Josh Ahern recorded his first career interception to go along with five tackles. It was the first interception by a UVA linebacker since D'Sean Perry vs. Abilene Christian in 2020.
- True freshmen Jaden Gibson and third year Bryce Carter made their first collegiate starts in the contest. Gibson caught two passes for 30 yards. Carter added four tackles.
