INSIDE TODAY'S MATCHUP

- Virginia is off to its best start (3-1) under third-year head coach Tony Elliott and best since 2019 when it started the season 4-0.
- UVA is coming off the first of two bye weekends on the 2024 schedule. The Cavaliers are 2-0 off the bye in Elliott's first two seasons with wins on the road over Georgia Tech (16-9) in 2022 and at then-No. 10 North Carolina (31-27) in 2023.
- The Cavaliers are looking to start 2-0 in ACC play for the first time since 2019.
- UVA has not won back-to-back ACC games since the 2021 season defeating Duke (48-0) and Georgia Tech (48-40) both at Scott Stadium.
- Virginia has three wins through its first four games for only the fourth time since 2008 and the first time since 2019 (4-0). Virginia has won three (or more) of its first four games four times in the last 17 years (2024 - 3-1; 2019 - 4-0; 2018 - 3-1; 2017 - 3-1).
- UVA is looking to improve to 4-1 to start the season for the first time since 2019 and the sixth time since 1999 - 2019 (4-1); 2017 (4-1); 2007 (4-1), 2004 (5-0); 2003 (4-1).

TOP STORYLINES

- Virginia (4 games) and Boston College (5 games) have been flagged for 17 penalties this season, the fewest in the ACC. The Eagles have the fewest penalties per game (3.60), total penalty yards (126) and penalty yards per game (23.75) in the league.
- Virginia and Boston College are two of 57 FBS teams with either one or no losses this season. BC, UVA, Clemson, Duke, Miami, Louisville, SMU are among schools unbeaten in ACC play entering the week. Clemson is the only 2-0 team in the league.
- Virginia's offense churned out 384 yards on the ground in its 43-24 win over Coastal Carolina on Sept. 21, the most rushing yards by the Cavaliers in a game since 1998. It also racked up the most total yards (525) and scored the most points (43) in a game in Tony Elliott's tenure as head coach.
- The Cavaliers will match up against a Boston College rushing attack allowing 101.4 yards per game, sixth-lowest in the ACC. The Eagles allowed just 21 rushing yards on 16 carries in their ACC season opener against Florida State.
- During Saturday's Virginia will celebrate the 35th anniversary of its 1989 team, which earned a share of the ACC title. The Cavaliers will don special throw back helmets in honor of the '89 team. See more on page 10.

UNIQUELY UVA

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

UNIVERSITY NICKNAMES

Virginia's athletics teams have been accompanied by a somewhat confusing array of nicknames. The most prominent and widely accepted of these monikers are "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos."

Although the terms "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are used almost interchangeably to refer to University teams and players, "Cavaliers" is more often used by the media, while "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are frequently used by Virginia students and fans.

Legend has it that Washington & Lee baseball fans dubbed the Virginia players "Wahoos" during the fiercely contested rivalry that existed between the two in-state schools in the 1890s. By 1940, "Wahoos" was in general use around Grounds to denote University students or events relating to them. The abbreviated "Hoos" sprang up later in student newspapers and has gained growing popularity in recent years.

THE CAVALIER MASCOT

The costumed Cavalier with a large character head debuted during Virginia's 1984 football season and has remained the official mascot of the University.

The first documented Cavalier on horseback was Francis Bell, a Virginia student from Dublin, Va., in 1947. Bell rode onto the field dressed as Cavaliers for Virginia's home football game with Harvard on the afternoon of October 11.

The Cavalier on horseback returned as the University's mascot in 1963. The UVA Polo Club provided both the horse and rider. However, the mounted Cavalier and his horse parted company in 1974 with the inception of AstroTurf at Scott Stadium.

The mounted Cavalier made its return in the Florida Citrus Bowl at the end of the 1989 football season. Due to its instant popularity, the Cavalier on horseback returned the following season on a regular basis and continues to lead the Virginia football team onto the field at the beginning of all home games.

Since 2000, Kim Kirschnick led the Cavaliers out of the tunnel on horseback and retired after the 2021 season finale against Virginia Tech. 2022 marks Julie Caruccio first season as the mounted Cavalier. A former interim dean of students at UVA, Caruccio is the first female in school history to have the mounted Cavalier job on a full-time basis. When the tradition rotated among members of the club polo team until Kirschnick took over in 2000, at least two women - Bess Worrall and Kerry McDaniel - were on horseback for a few games in the early '90s.

UNIVERSITY COLORS

Orange and blue were adopted as the University of Virginia's official athletic colors at a mass student meeting in 1888. UVA athletic teams had previously worn silver gray and cardinal red, but those colors did not stand out on muddy football fields, prompting a student movement to change them.

One of the students attending the mass meeting was Allen Potts, a star athlete who played on Virginia's first football team in 1888. Potts showed up at the meeting wearing a navy blue-and-orange scarf that he had acquired during a summer boating expedition at Oxford University. Orange and blue were chosen as the official athletic colors after one of Potts' fellow students pulled the scarf off Potts' neck and, waving it to the crowd, yelled, "How will this do?" UVA later served as the inspiration for schools like Auburn and Florida when they selected school colors.

WAH-HOO-WA

The origin of "Wah-hoo-wa" is uncertain. The cheer was used to root on Virginia teams as early as 1890 and may have been borrowed from Dartmouth College, whose athletics teams were once known as the Indians.

Legend attributes the yell to Natalie Floyd Otey, who sang the ballad "Where'er You Are, There Shall My Love Be" at Charlottesville's Levy Opera House in 1893. The predominantly student audience noticed that Otey warbled the first three words of the song between each of the stanzas and decided to join in the refrain. By evening's end, goes the legend, the crowd had corrupted "Where'er You Are" into "Wah-hoo-wah."

The Levy Opera House stands at the corner of High Street and Park Street and has since been renovated into an office building.

- Came in relief of injured Tony Muskett in the fourth quarter of season opener against then-No. 12 Tennessee (9/12). Appeared in his fifth game of the year after Muskett was injured in the first series against Georgia Tech (11/4).
- In his first collegiate start, Colandrea finished 20-for-26 with 377 yards and two touchdowns against James Madison, all single-game UVA freshman records at the time. His two touchdown passes matched the school mark held by Jameel Sewell (2006) and Scott Gardner who did it twice in 1972.
- His 377-yard passing performance against JMU was fifth-best of any ACC quarterback in 2023.
- His 75-yard touchdown pass to Kobe Pace on the first play of the second half against JMU was the longest ever by a UVA freshman quarterback (Previous: Todd Kirtley, 73-yard TD pass vs. NC State in 1978). The throw also eclipsed UVA's single-game passing record by a freshman (previous: 243 by Jameel Sewell vs. Maryland in 2006).

AGAINST BOSTON COLLEGE

- Virginia is 1-7 all-time against Boston College, including a 1-5 mark since the Eagles joined the ACC.
- Only win against BC came at Scott Stadium in 2020, a 43-32 victory in front of 250 fans, because of COVID-19 protocols.
- Virginia led 21-7 at the half in last year's meeting and was outscored 20-3 in the final 30 minutes. It was one of four occasions last season that an opponent overcame a double-digit lead to defeat UVA.
- The Eagles and Cavaliers will play one another in back-to-back seasons for the first time.

1989 (WAHOOS' VERSION)

- During Saturday's game, Virginia will welcome back members of its 1989 team.
- Led by legendary head coach George Welsh, the '89 Cavaliers finished 10-3 overall and 6-1 in ACC games to earn a share of the league championship (with Duke) that season. UVA's 10 wins are still a school record.
- Virginia peaked at No. 15 in the AP poll, earned a berth in the Citrus Bowl, and knocked off two ranked opponents - No. 12 Penn State [14-6] and No. 18 NC State [20-9].
- The '89 team helped establish the foundation for a memorable decade of UVA football that followed. From 1989-98, the Hoos compiled a record of 81-38-1 and made an appearance in the AP poll each year from 1989-96, including three straight weeks at No. 1 during the 1990 season.
- Virginia assistant coach (defensive ends) **Chris Slade** was a true freshman on the 1989 team and finished sixth on the team in tackles (52) and second in sacks (four) that season. He holds the school record for career sacks (40) and tackles for-loss (56). Slade's jersey was retired following his senior season.

YEAR THREE UNDER TONY ELLIOTT

- **Tony Elliott** is in his third year at the helm of the Virginia football program. His staff only has one newcomer, Mike Adams. Elliott and Adams previously coached together at South Carolina State as assistant coaches during the 2006 and 2007 seasons.
- Elliott brings a wealth of championship football experience to Charlottesville. In his 16 years as a full time college coach, Elliott has been a part of 15 winning seasons including 10-win seasons at Clemson from 2011-2020.
- As the offensive coordinator, Clemson went 89-10 and made four CFP National Championship game appearances.
- Elliott is one of 15 African-American head coaches in college football and one of seven running Power-5 programs. The Cavaliers have six full-time African-American assistant coaches.

TYLER NEVILLE'S INSPIRATIONAL STORY

- Virginia tight end **Tyler Neville**, who transferred to UVA this offseason after playing three seasons at Harvard, has overcome an unconscionable number of medical obstacles dating back to the day he was born.
- Born without hearing, ear tube surgery was the first of more than 20 surgeries, including Pectus-Excavatum, Septoplasty and a dozen ear tube surgeries, before Neville's 18th birthday.
- Despite the many medical challenges Neville overcame, it was the cancer diagnosis (Hodgkin lymphoma) in the fall of 2016 that really knocked the wind out of him.
- Due to his Pectus-Excavatum condition and surgery in which a metal rod was inserted into his chest, radiation treatment was not an option. As a freshman in high school Neville was forced to undergo chemotherapy beginning in the fall of 2016, but after four months of chemo treatment was declared cancer free – and without missing a single football or basketball practice.

ANTONIO CLARY BACK FROM INJURY

- Safety **Antonio Clary** opted to return to Virginia in 2024 for his sixth year of college (fifth playing season) after missing the 2023 season due to an ankle injury.
- Clary has led the Hoos in tackles in all three games, is second in the ACC and tied for 11th nationally in tackles per game (11.0).
- In UVA's 31-30 comeback victory over Wake Forest (9/7), Clary recovered a fumble with 1:24 to effectively seal the win.
- He is the team's only two-time UVA graduate, having earned his bachelor's degree in history with a minor in African & American Studies in 2022 and master's degree in Educational Psychology.

HOOS' EXPERIENCE ON DEFENSE

- Virginia has one of the most experienced defenses in the country.
- Entering 2024, UVA's projected starting defense had combined for 343 games played and 231 starts, including **Kam Butler** (44) and **Kempton Shine** (40).
- Virginia's projected defensive starters entered 2024 with an average of 31.2 career games played and 21.0 starts.
- Shine, who transferred to UVA from Eastern Michigan this offseason, entered 2024 with 39 consecutive starts, which led the country among all defensive backs.

THE GRADY BUNCH

- Inspired by the Philadelphia Eagles' infamous 'tush push,' the Cavaliers have their own rendition with a personnel package known as, "The Grady Bunch."
- With reserve quarterback **Grady Brosterhous** under center, UVA often calls upon this package in short-yardage situations.
- The older brother of UVA offensive lineman **Blake Steen**, Tyler Steen, is currently a member of the Philadelphia Eagles and provided the UVA coaching staff with tips on how the Eagles like to execute the 'tush push.'

BAND OF BROTHERS

- Virginia has two sets of brothers on the team: **Malcolm and Miles Greene** and **Eli and Sackett (Jr.) Wood**.
- Both sets of brothers are from the commonwealth of Virginia.
- The Greenes are from Richmond and attended Highland Springs High School, while the Woods are from Lynchburg and attended E.C. Glass High.

CHARLOTTESVILLE NATIVES FIELDS & SANKER

- Virginia standouts **Malachi Fields** (WR) and **Jonas Sanker** (S) are both seniors in 2024 and Charlottesville natives.
- Fields played at Monticello High School and Sanker played for The Covenant School.
- The duo are arguably the best in the ACC at their respective positions.
- Fields set career highs in receiving yards in his first two games of the 2024 season against Richmond (100) and Wake Forest (148). In 2023, Fields caught 58 passes, including five touchdowns, for 811 yards.
- Sanker was a First Team All-ACC selection in 2023 after starting in all 12 possible games and leading the Hoos in total tackles (107), pass breakups (11) and forced fumbles (3).

HARDIE FOOTBALL OPERATIONS CENTER

- This past summer, Virginia Athletics proudly opened the 93,000-square-foot **Molly and Robert Hardie Football Operations Center**, which conveniently sits adjacent to the team’s George Welsh Indoor Practice Facility and outdoor practice fields.
- The state-of-the-art space encompasses: the team locker, players’ lounge and 96-person dining space, 14,000-square-foot strength and condition space with over 150,000 lbs of weight-lifting equipment, cardio mezzanine, 195-seat team meeting space, tiered-seating meeting spaces for each position group, and coaches’ offices.
- The exterior of the Hardie Center displays a classic yet chic design and is enclosed by red brick, which is synonymous with the architectural style of the University’s most prominent edifices across Grounds such as The Rotunda.
- Of the Hardie Center, Fralin Family Football head coach **Tony Elliott** said, “I wanted the building to be timeless. I wanted to capture all different eras, to be contemporary enough to show the flash and the glitz and glamor as an area for certain recruits, but then also pay homage to all the guys that didn’t have an opportunity to walk through those doors today but laid the foundation for Virginia football.”

SIGNIFICANT UPGRADES TO SCOTT STADIUM

- This past year the Cavaliers’ home venue, Scott Stadium, underwent one of the most significant transformations since it debuted in 1931.
- A 6,700-square-foot videoboard, the Ramon W. Breeden Jr. Videoboard, was constructed along with an accompanying custom-point audio system.
- The new videoboard replaced the previous ‘Hoo Vision’ board, which was installed in 2009, and elevates Virginia into the upper echelon of college football in this space.
- Other fan experience refinements include the addition of new access points to The Hill behind the north end zone to enhance fan safety and manage capacity, expanded concession options, and additional free shuttles to and from Scott Stadium.

CARLA WILLIAMS ON CFP COMMITTEE

- On Feb. 8, 2024, Virginia Director of Athletics **Carla Williams** was named to the College Football Playoff (CFP) Management Committee.
- As a new member, Williams began a three-year term beginning in the spring of 2024.
- “Carla is an outstanding advocate for college football and will be a knowledgeable, passionate and valuable member of the College Football Playoff Selection Committee,” said ACC Commissioner Jim Phillips. “Throughout her time at Virginia as well as her entire career, Carla has consistently shown to be a tremendous leader.”
- Williams is in her seventh year as director of athletics at Virginia. During her time in Charlottesville, UVA teams have captured multiple national titles across numerous sports, including the 2019 men’s basketball title, 2019 and 2021 men’s lacrosse titles, three straight women’s swimming and diving championships from 2021-23, and the 2022 and 2023 men’s tennis team titles. In addition, UVA has won 17 ACC Championships.
- Williams was a three-year starter and All-SEC guard for the Georgia women’s basketball team from 1987-89. Williams then served as an assistant coach for the team before moving into administration as UGA’s assistant director of compliance for a year before taking administrative roles at Florida State and Vanderbilt.

Tony Elliott, a patient man, was looking for the right fit when it came time for him to leave the assistant coaching ranks and take on the responsibility of running a collegiate football program as the head coach. During his 11-year tenure at Clemson, his alma mater, several opportunities presented themselves, but it was not until Virginia came calling that he felt the setting was right for what he wants to accomplish.

On Dec. 10, 2021, Elliott was named the University of Virginia's Fralin Family Head Football Coach. At his introductory press conference, he explained his decision to become the Cavaliers' head coach and what he wants to accomplish in Charlottesville.

"I chose UVA because I wanted to lead a program that was partnered with a university that had world-class academics," he said "I wanted to be able to recruit the best and the brightest student-athletes.

"I wanted to compete in the best conference in college athletics. I wanted to be a part of an alignment with (athletic director) Ms. Carla (Williams) and President (Jim) Ryan that shared a vision that was similar to mine, which is centered around the holistic development of the student-athlete. And lastly, I wanted to be part of a university and athletic department that would not compromise its values to win.

"There is no better place for me than UVA. And there is no better time than now."

With that, Elliott went to work crafting what he had hoped to build for years - The Model Program.

"My vision for the UVA football program is to become the model in college football, the model program in college football," he said. "My goal is to contribute to changing the narrative in college football and demonstrate that you can win at the highest level and you can do so while achieving excellence in education, leadership and service."

Elliott's cornerstones of that culture are based on **H.E.A.R.T.- humility, effort, accountability, respect and toughness.**

"I think that building a championship culture starts with making sure that you have alignment and a vision," he said. "You clearly state the vision and you are particular in the people that you bring in and make sure that they align with the vision, and then you stay grounded to the principles that you set in place for the players and the staff, and you go to work every single day, and you keep an inside-out mentality. It's one day at a time, and eventually that will bring your championship culture to life."

Elliott's background and coaching pedigree is rich with championship experiences.

He spent 11 seasons as an assistant on Dabo Swinney's staff at Clemson. In January of 2021, he was named the program's assistant head coach and offensive coordinator. He previously served as the team's co-offensive coordinator (2014-20) and the team's running backs coach (2011-20).

At Clemson, Elliott was a part of a 10-season stretch in which the Tigers won 10 or more games. In that span, Clemson won six Atlantic Coast Conference Championships, made four appearances in the College Football Playoff National Championship game and captured national titles in 2016 and 2018.

After Elliott's promotion to co-offensive coordinator prior to the 2014 Russell Athletic Bowl, the Tigers posted an 89-10 record and ranked in the top 12 nationally in total offense. Clemson either led or ranked No. 2 in the ACC in total offense in five of his seven seasons as an offensive coordinator. Elliott's 2018 and 2019 offenses were responsible for two of the 22 650-point seasons in major college football history.

Elliott was named the Frank Broyles Award recipient as the nation's top assistant coach in 2017. Before transitioning to the tight ends room this year, Elliott was in charge of Clemson's running backs for his first 10 seasons. In that time, he guided Clemson running back Travis Etienne to one of the most illustrious careers in ACC and college football history, helping him set the NCAA record for most games scoring a touchdown (46) and secure ACC records for career rushing yards (4,952), total touchdowns (78), rushing touchdowns (70) and points (468).

As the program's offensive coordinator, Elliott worked with two first-round draft picks at quarterback, including the 2021 first overall pick Trevor Lawrence. From 2015-2020, a Clemson offensive player took home both the ACC's Player of the Year and Offensive Player of the Year awards four times.

Prior to returning to his alma mater, Elliott spent three seasons at Furman (2008-10) and two at South Carolina State (2006-07) coaching wide receivers at both schools. Prior to his coaching career he worked for Michelin North America for two years.

In 2002, Elliott earned his undergraduate degree in industrial engineering from Clemson, where he was a first-team Academic All-ACC selection as well as a CoSIDA Academic District III member. He was also a recipient of an ACC Weaver-James-Corrigan Postgraduate Scholarship.

Under Tommy Bowden, he came to Clemson as a walk-on wide receiver in the fall of 1999 and finished his career with four letters and appeared in 44 games. Swinney was his position coach his senior year (2003) in which he was named a co-captain of a team that finished with a 9-4 record and a No. 22 final ranking by AP and USA Today.

SCOTT STADIUM, HOME OF THE CAVALIERS

- The Carl Smith Center, home of David A. Harrison III Field at Scott Stadium, with its unique architectural design, scenic setting on the University's Grounds and exceptional sight lines, is one of the nation's finest college football settings.
- Opened in 1931, Scott Stadium might be one of the oldest campus college football stadiums in the nation, but you could never tell from its appearance. Numerous upgrades and expansions make it a modern home for the Cavaliers and their fans.
- Scott Stadium was the gift of Frederic William Scott and Elisabeth Strother Scott, and was dedicated to the memory of his parents, Frederic Robert Scott and Frances Branch Scott.
- Virginia played its dedication game at Scott Stadium on Oct. 15, 1931 against the Virginia Military Institute before a then-capacity crowd of 22,000. Prior to that season, the Cavaliers staged their home games at the University's Lambeth Field.
- Virginia has played 490 games in the historic venue. UVA's all-time record at Scott Stadium stands at 284-194-12.

- UVA has won seven of its last eight season openers and owns an 86-40-9 (.670) all-time record in season-opening games
- The Cavaliers are 80-21-7 (.773) all-time in home season openers and have won 23 of their last 28 season openers in Scott Stadium
- Virginia improves to 31-3-2 all-time against Richmond have won 13 of the last 14 meetings.
- Virginia's first completed pass of the season went for a touchdown, a 35-yard completion from Anthony Colandrea to Trell Harris. It marked the first time in 135-year history of Virginia football that the first completed pass of the season went for a touchdown.
- The 497 yards of total offense by Virginia was the most in a game since posting 513 against Old Dominion on Sept. 16, 2022.
- It was the first time UVA scored on its first completed pass in a game since 2018 when Bryce Perkins found Olamide Zaccheaus for 86-yard strike against Ohio (Sept. 15).

- On UVA's first drive of the game, Trell Harris notched his first touchdown reception as a Cavalier on a 35-yard completion from Colandrea. It was Harris' third touchdown of his career, he had one in each of his first two years at Kent State.
- Jack Griese notched his second career touchdown (first receiving) on a 57-yard reception late in the first quarter ... It was the fourth reception of his career and the longest reception of his career.
- Malachi Fields first career 100-yard receiving effort. His previous career-high was 89 yards against Virginia Tech last season. A Cavalier has recorded a 100-yard receiving performance in Eight-straight games dating back to last season.
- Kobe Pace career-high is 191 yards against Wake Forest (at Clemson) in 2021. He has two career 100-yard games, both came at Clemson.
- Anthony Colandrea accounted for 346 yards of total offense (297 pass, 49 rush), the second-highest total of his career (403 vs. Louisville in 2023). His three total touchdowns (2 pass, 1 rush) matched a career-best. He recorded his first career rushing touchdown with a seven-yard keeper with 8:31 left in the third quarter.
- Jason Hammond III made his first college start at defensive tackle. First years Ethan Minter and Billy Koudelka made their collegiate debuts.

- With the win, the Cavaliers snapped a five-game losing skid in the series with Wake Forest and improved to 35-17 in the all-time series, which began in 1889.
- UVA collected its first win in Winston-Salem since 2002, when it scored the final three touchdowns to erase a 17-point deficit and win, 38-34.
- Virginia is off to its first 2-0 start since 2021 and only the third since the 2013 season.
- UVA trailed for nearly 58 minutes until Will Bettridge's extra point with 2:07 remaining.
- Virginia trailed by as many as 14 points, the largest deficit overcome in a victory since 2021 (at Louisville).
- Wake Forest was the first UVA opponent to score a touchdown on the opening drive since JMU on Sept. 9, 2023, a span of 11 games.
- UVA had not won a game when an opponent has scored a touchdown on the opening drive since it defeated Georgia Tech on Oct. 23, 2021.
- The Virginia defense totaled six sacks, the most in a game since recording eight at Georgia Tech on Oct. 20, 2022.
- The Cavaliers won their first ACC opener on the road since knocking off Pitt in 2019. UVA came into the contest having lost three-straight ACC openers.

Virginia Individual Player Notes

- Malachi Fields finished with career high in receptions (11) and receiving yards (148). He recorded his second-straight 100-yard receiving effort. It marks the ninth-straight game a UVA wide receiver has gone over the century mark dating back to last season.
- Fields has 329 yards receiving in his last three games, which includes the 2023 season finale.
- Trell Harris caught a career-high seven passes for 91 yards, three yards shy of matching his career best.
- Tyler Neville recorded his first two-touchdown game of his career, catching first half scores of 18 and 24 yards. He now has 10 career touchdown receptions (8 at Harvard, 2 at UVA). He's the first Cavalier tight end with two touchdown receptions in a game since Tom Santi against Duke on Sept. 8, 2007. Neville finished the night with four catches for 68 yards.
- Quarterback Anthony Colandrea completed 33 of 43 passes (77 percent) for 357 yards and matched a career-best with three touchdown passes. His 33 completions were a career-high and the most by a UVA quarterback since 2021 (Brennan Armstrong, 36 at Pitt).
- For the second-straight week, Antonio Clary led the team in tackles with 11 and he added his second career sack. Fellow safety Jonas Sanker finished with 10 tackles including seven solo efforts and his first career sack.
- In his only rushing attempt of the night, quarterback Grady Brosterhus plunged forward for a one-yard rushing touchdown with 2:07 remaining, which ultimately led to Bettridge's game-winning PAT. It was the first rushing touchdown of Brosterhus' career. Linebacker Trey McDonald made a career-high nine tackles (four solo) and was credited with his first collegiate sack.
- With 1:24 remaining, Malcolm Greene forced a fumble after Wake's Taylor Morin hauled in a 20-yard reception, and Antonio Clary recovered the ball at the UVA 29-yard line. Greene's forced fumble was the second of his career and first as a Cavalier.
- Jahmeer Carter made his 25th consecutive start, the longest active streak on the team as a Cavalier.

Virginia Team Notes

- Virginia drops to 32-46-2 all-time against Maryland, and has lost each of the last four matchups. It marked the first meeting between the two schools in Charlottesville since 2012.
- Maryland was limited to seven points off UVA's four turnovers (two fumbles, two interceptions). The two fumbles lost by Virginia were the first two of the season.
- The Virginia defense was credited with eight pass breakups. It marks the second time in the last 26 games UVA had eight or more pass breakups (8 vs. Duke - 2023).
- Went over 100 rushing yards for the second time in three games.
- Virginia held a lead over Maryland at halftime for the second consecutive year.
- UVA was held scoreless in the second half for the first time since last year's meeting against the Terps.
- The Cavaliers offense produced three plays over 30 yards in the contest and now have 11 on the season.

Virginia Individual Player Notes

- Antonio Clary set a career-high 14 tackles, including one for-loss to go along with two pass breakups.
- Jonas Sanker had 11 tackles putting him over the 200-tackle mark for his career.
- Wide receiver Kameron Courtney recorded his first career catch, a 33-yard reception in the first quarter ... he finished with two receptions for 36 yards.
- Quarterback Anthony Colandrea put UVA up 13-7 with :01 left in the first half with a 10-yard rushing touchdown, his second rushing TD of his career. He finished with 247 yards passing, his 10th career 200-yard game.
- Jahmeer Carter upped his career total to 2.5 with a takedown behind the line in the third quarter. It was his first sack since North Carolina on Oct. 21, 2023.
- Trell Harris' diving 45-yard catch in the first quarter is the longest of his career. Harris led all UVA wideouts with 72 yards receiving on the night.

Virginia Team Notes

- Virginia and Coastal Carolina met for the first time. UVA improved to 6-4 all-time against current members of the Sun Belt Conference.
- The Chanticleers were one of 43 unbeaten teams in FBS coming into the weekend.
- UVA rushed for 384 yards, the first time UVA eclipsed the 300-yard rushing mark since 2018 vs. Richmond. It was the most rushing yards in a game by a UVA offense since compiling 446 yards against San Jose State in 1998.
- Virginia's 43 points were the most scored under Elliott and the most since scoring 49 against BYU in 2021.
- Virginia accumulated 525 yards of total offense (384 rush, 141 pass), the most in a game under Elliott and the most since racking up 588 against BYU in 2021.
- UVA is 3-1 on the season, its best start under head coach Tony Elliott and its best start since 2019 (4-0).
- Marks the fourth time in last 17 years (since 2008) Virginia has three or more wins through its first four games (2024 - 3-1; 2019 - 4-0; 2018 - 3-1; 2017 - 3-1).
- Virginia forced a season-high, three turnovers (two fumbles, one interception). It was the first time UVA forced three or more takeaways since forcing four against Boston College (4 - 2 fumbles, 2 interceptions). In addition, the Cavaliers forced a three of turnover on downs.
- UVA never trailed in the contest and took the lead 1:24 into the game.
- Second time in four games UVA scored on opening drive (Richmond - 3 plays, 77 yards). The scoring drive was UVA's shortest in yardage (13 yards) of the season.
- Announced attendance at Brooks Stadium was 22,104, the largest crowd in facility history. It broke the previous record of 21,324 set against Marshall on Oct. 23, 2023.

Virginia Individual Player Notes

- Xavier Brown rushed for 171 yards on nine carries (19.0 ypc). He is UVA's first 100-yard rusher since Perris Jones ran for 134 yards against William & Mary last season. He is the first Cavalier to rush for 150+ yards since Bryce Perkins vs. Virginia Tech in 2019 (164 yards) and the first UVA running back with 150+ since 2018 (Jordan Ellis vs. Ohio).
- 75-yard run by Brown is the longest by a UVA rusher since Jordan Ellis' 75-yard scamper against Louisville in 2018
- Grady Brosterhus rushed for two touchdowns on three carries. He has six carries for 10 yards and three touchdowns this season.
- Brosterhus is the first Cavalier with multiple rushing touchdowns in a game since Mike Hollins against North Carolina (3 touchdowns) in 2023. He's the first Cavalier quarterback with multiple rushing scores since Brennan Armstrong had two against Virginia Tech in 2021.
- The three rushing touchdowns this year by Brosterhus are the most in a season by a UVA quarterback since 2022 (Brennan Armstrong - 6).
- For the second time in his career, Malachi Fields caught two touchdown passes in a game. The TD receptions were his first two of the season and he ups his career total to eight. He finished the game with 4 receptions, 64 yards and two touchdowns.
- Dating back to last years' season finale, Fields has four touchdowns in his last five games.
- On the opening kickoff, Landon Danley forced a fumble that was recovered by Eli Wood. Today marked the fifth game of Danley's career.
- Daniel Sparks was credited with a 60-yard punt in the first quarter, his seventh career punt of 60+ yards.
- Antonio Clary led the team with eight tackles and came up his second career interception midway through the first quarter ... his other career interception was against Louisville in 2022.
- Kicker Will Bettridge was 3-for-3 on field goal attempts and 4-for-4 on extra point attempts. He tied his career long on a 47-yard field goal as time expired in the first half.
- Kam Butler was credited with his first sack of the season, running his career total up to 22.5 (7.5 at UVA).
