INSIDE SATURDAY'S MATCHUP

- Saturday's season opener against Coastal Carolina marks the beginning of the 136th season of football at Virginia.
- Dating back to 2017, UVA has won seven of its last eight season openers and owns an 86-40-9 (.670) record in season-opening games.
- In UVA's fourth game of the 2024 season, the Cavaliers and Coastal squared off in the inaugural meeting of the series. Virginia exploded for 384 rushing yards - its most in a game since 1998 - on the way to a 43-24 victory, UVA's largest margin of victory in a road win under head coach **Tony Elliott**.
- UVA plays a Sun Belt team for the fourth straight season. The Cavaliers are 6-4 all-time against current Sun Belt members (Coastal Carolina: 1-0; James Madison: 2-2; Old Dominion: 2-0; Southern Miss: 0-2; Troy: 1-0).
- The 2025 matchup is currently the second and final of the scheduled home-and-home series between the two teams.
- UVA and Coastal were originally scheduled to open the series at Scott Stadium on Nov. 19, 2022, but the contest was canceled due to the tragedy on Grounds that claimed the lives of UVA football players Devin Chandler, Lavel Davis Jr. and D'Sean Perry on Nov. 13, 2022.
- The Cavaliers are 80-21-7 (.773) all-time in home season openers and have won their last six season openers at Scott Stadium.
- UVA is 2-1 in both season openers and home openers under **Tony Elliott**.
- The last two home openers at Scott Stadium (Richmond-2024 and JMU-2023) were delayed and later resumed due to severe inclement weather.

TOP STORYLINES

- Year No. 4 of the **Tony Elliott** era begins Saturday, when UVA welcomes Coastal Carolina for the Cavaliers' annual Paint The Town Orange - WEAR ORANGE! game.
- In 2024, UVA got off to a hot start, winning four of its first five games, including a 43-24 rout over the Chanticleers on the road. The Cavaliers received votes in the USA Today Coaches poll for the first time since 2021.
- This offseason, UVA added 32 transfers and 22 freshmen. Virginia leads the nation with 19 players who have been on a college football roster for at least six seasons, including three seventh-year players.
- The Cavaliers' transfer portal class was ranked as high as No. 18 by Rivals.com. The class features numerous players who have garnered preseason national recognition, including **Chandler Morris** (QB), **Jahmeer Edrine** (WR), **Cam Ross** (WR), **Brady Wilson** (OL), **Cazeem Moore** (DE), and **Fisher Camac** (DE).
- Including its season opener, Virginia will host seven games at Scott Stadium this year, highlighted by a Friday night matchup against Florida State (Sept. 26) and the regular-season finale against in-state rival Virginia Tech (Nov. 29).
- UVA is one of six Power-4 schools to return all 10 assistant coaches. Elliott and his staff are also seeking to increase UVA's ACC win total for the third consecutive year.
- Virginia played four ranked teams in its last six games of the 2024 season, including three CFP teams, Notre Dame, Clemson and SMU. Notre Dame was the national champion runners-up, while both Clemson and SMU squared off in the 2024 ACC championship game.
- Notable Virginia returners include **Xavier Brown** (RB), **Trell Harris** (WR), **Dakota Twitty** (TE), **McKale Boley** (OL), **Antonio Clary** (S), **Kam Robinson** (LB), **James Jackson** (LB), **Jahmeer Carter** (DT), **Jason Hammond** (DT) and **Anthony Britton** (DT).

UNIQUELY UVA

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA’s culture.

Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. “Campus” is never used.

First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a “senior” implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name “Commonwealth” instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

UNIVERSITY NICKNAMES

Virginia’s athletics teams have been accompanied by a somewhat confusing array of nicknames. The most prominent and widely accepted of these monikers are “Cavaliers,” “Wahoos” and “Hoos.”

Although the terms “Cavaliers,” “Wahoos” and “Hoos” are used almost interchangeably to refer to University teams and players, “Cavaliers” is more often used by the media, while “Wahoos” and “Hoos” are frequently used by Virginia students and fans.

Legend has it that Washington & Lee baseball fans dubbed the Virginia players “Wahoos” during the fiercely contested rivalry that existed between the two in-state schools in the 1890s. By 1940, “Wahoos” was in general use around Grounds to denote University students or events relating to them. The abbreviated “Hoos” sprang up later in student newspapers and has gained growing popularity in recent years.

THE CAVALIER MASCOT

The costumed Cavalier with a large character head debuted during Virginia’s 1984 football season and has remained the official mascot of the University.

The first documented Cavalier on horseback was Francis Bell, a Virginia student from Dublin, Va., in 1947. Bell rode onto the field dressed as Cavaliers for Virginia’s home football game with Harvard on the afternoon of October 11.

The Cavalier on horseback returned as the University’s mascot in 1963. The UVA Polo Club provided both the horse and rider. However, the mounted Cavalier and his horse parted company in 1974 with the inception of AstroTurf at Scott Stadium.

The mounted Cavalier made its return in the Florida Citrus Bowl at the end of the 1989 football season. Due to its instant popularity, the Cavalier on horseback returned the following season on a regular basis and continues to lead the Virginia football team onto the field at the beginning of all home games.

Since 2000, Kim Kirschnick led the Cavaliers out of the tunnel on horseback and retired after the 2021 season finale against Virginia Tech. 2022 marked Julie Caruccio first season as the mounted Cavalier. A former interim dean of students at UVA, Caruccio is the first female in school history to have the mounted Cavalier job on a full-time basis. When the tradition rotated among members of the club polo team until Kirschnick took over in 2000, at least two women – Bess Worrall and Kerry McDaniel – were on horseback for a few games in the early ‘90s.

UNIVERSITY COLORS

Orange and blue were adopted as the University of Virginia’s official athletic colors at a mass student meeting in 1888. UVA athletic teams had previously worn silver gray and cardinal red, but those colors did not stand out on muddy football fields, prompting a student movement to change them.

One of the students attending the mass meeting was Allen Potts, a star athlete who played on Virginia’s first football team in 1888. Potts showed up at the meeting wearing a navy blue-and-orange scarf that he had acquired during a summer boating expedition at Oxford University. Orange and blue were chosen as the official athletic colors after one of Potts’ fellow students pulled the scarf off Potts’ neck and, waving it to the crowd, yelled, “How will this do?” UVA later served as the inspiration for schools like Auburn and Florida when they selected school colors.

WAH-HOO-WA

The origin of “Wah-hoo-wa” is uncertain. The cheer was used to root on Virginia teams as early as 1890 and may have been borrowed from Dartmouth College, whose athletics teams were once known as the Indians.

Legend attributes the yell to Natalie Floyd Otey, who sang the ballad “Where’er You Are, There Shall My Love Be” at Charlottesville’s Levy Opera House in 1893. The predominantly student audience noticed that Otey warbled the first three words of the song between each of the stanzas and decided to join in the refrain. By evening’s end, goes the legend, the crowd had corrupted “Where’er You Are” into “Wah-hoo-wah.”

The Levy Opera House stands at the corner of High Street and Park Street and has since been renovated into an office building.



LAST YEAR'S MEETING AGAINST THE CHANTICLEERS

- Virginia's first-ever matchup with Coastal Carolina ended in a 43-24 victory, marking the Cavaliers' largest win on the road under **Tony Elliott**.
- On a hot, humid afternoon in front of a sold-out Brooks Stadium (Conway, S.C.), UVA ran for 384 yards, its most in a single game since 1998.
- The Cavaliers accumulated 525 yards of total offense (384 rush, 141 pass), also the most in a game under Elliott and most since racking up 588 against BYU in 2021.
- One of 43 unbeaten FBS teams at the time, the Chanticleers had won 23 of their previous 27 home games and had not trailed in any of their three contests leading up to the matchup with UVA.
- **Landon Danley** (LB) forced a fumble on the opening kickoff, and teammate **Eli Wood** (WR) recovered it. Both Danley and Wood were primary contributors on special teams last season, but are expected to have a larger role in plays from scrimmage this season.
- The fumble recovery helped the Hoos score a touchdown only 1:24 into the game. UVA led for the remainder of the game.

VIRGINIA-COASTAL CAROLINA CONNECTIONS

- Former UVA long snapper Payton Bunch, who exhausted his final year of eligibility at the end of last season, transferred to Virginia from Coastal Carolina for the 2024 season.
- Virginia defensive passing game coordinator/defensive backs coach **Curome Cox** spent five seasons (2013-17) as an assistant coach.
- At CCU, Cox coached both defensive backs and special teams, helping the Chanticleers to Big South Conference championships in 2013 and 2014. In 2016, Coastal led all FCS teams in interceptions.
- Virginia's Assistant Director of Football Performance Nutrition **Haylie Beck** is a former Coastal Carolina indoor and outdoor beach volleyball player. She earned her bachelor of science degree from CCU in Exercise and Sport Science in 2021.

YEAR FOUR UNDER TONY ELLIOTT

- **Tony Elliott** is in his fourth year at the helm of the Virginia football program.
- Additionally, Elliott returns his entire assistant coaching staff from 2024, including **Des Kitchings** (offensive coordinator) and **John Rudzinski** (defensive coordinator), making UVA one of only six Power-4 schools to return their entire coaching staff in 2025.
- Elliott brought a wealth of championship experience to Charlottesville following an 11-year tenure at Clemson

University, his alma mater. Elliott helped the Tigers win national championships in 2016 and 2018 and seven ACC championships (2011, 2015, 2016, 2017, 2018, 2019, 2020).

- In his 16 years as a full-time college coach, Elliott has been a part of 15 winning seasons including 10-win seasons at Clemson from 2011-20.
- With Elliott as offensive coordinator, Clemson went 89-10 and made four CFP National Championship game appearances.

ACC WIN IMPROVEMENT UNDER ELLIOTT

- Virginia has increased its ACC win total each year under head coach Tony Elliott.

FOURTH-QUARTER EMPHASIS

- Virginia was much improved in the fourth quarter last season, a point of emphasis by head coach **Tony Elliott**.
- In 2024, the Cavaliers outscored their opponents in the fourth quarter in seven of their 12 games by a combined margin of 97-66.
- In Elliott's first two seasons at UVA, the Cavaliers were outscored by their opponents in the fourth quarters 43-36 in 2022 and 114-54 in 2023.

TONY ELLIOTT: ONE OF 16 AFRICAN AMERICAN HEAD COACHES IN FBS

- In 2024, Fralin Family Football Head Coach **Tony Elliott** was one of 16 African American head coaches in FBS.
- The Cavaliers have six full-time African American assistant coaches.

A LOOK BACK AT 2024 SLATE

- Three of the Cavaliers' final four opponents (No. 23 Pitt, No. 8 Notre Dame, No. 13 SMU) of the 2024 season were ranked top in the AP top-25 poll at the time of each matchup.
- The SMU game marked only the sixth instance in program history (1949, 1996, 2002, 2005, 2019, 2021, 2024) in which the Cavaliers faced three consecutive opponents ranked in the AP top-25 poll.
- Entering the game against Pitt, UVA was tied for the fourth-most difficult remaining schedule, based on opponent win percentage, according to WarrenNolan.com.
- Both SMU and Clemson went on to secure their spot in the ACC Championship game and College Football Playoff.
- After knocking off Indiana, Georgia and Penn State in the CFP, Notre Dame advanced to the national championship game, where the Fighting Irish fell 34-24 to Ohio State.

2024 STORYLINES IN REVIEW

- Virginia (3-5 ACC) finished only one win away from .500 in league play in 2024. The Cavaliers mounted fourth-quarter comebacks at Wake Forest (31-30) and against Boston College (24-14). UVA earned its signature win in a 24-19 road win over then-No. 23 Pitt in primetime.
- Behind a dominant 384-rushing-yard performance, the Cavaliers downed Coastal Carolina 43-24 to secure UVA's largest margin of victory on the road under head coach **Tony Elliott**.
- After a standout senior campaign in 2024, former safety Jonas Sanker was selected 93rd overall by the New Orleans Saints in the third round of the 2025 NFL Draft.
- Sanker was a two-time First Team All-ACC selection and became UVA's only four-time ACC Defensive Back of the Week in the same season (2024).

NO PRESEASON RANKED OPPONENTS

- Virginia is the only Power Four team without an opponent ranked in the AP preseason top 25.
- The last time UVA entered a season without a preseason-ranked opponent on its schedule was 1986.
- According to ESPN's preseason power index, Virginia Tech (No. 31) is the highest-rated team on UVA's 2025 slate.

MORE ON THE 2025 SLATE

- Virginia will play seven home games in 2025, including four in the first five weeks of the season.
- Of UVA's 12 opponents, eight played in a bowl game in 2024.

MORRIS' FOURTH CONSECUTIVE YEAR STARTING

- Virginia's **Chandler Morris** is one of 15 FBS quarterbacks poised to open the season as his team's starting QB for the fourth consecutive year.
- Morris was named the top signal caller on UVA's depth chart heading into fall camp. The previous two seasons (2023-24) featured QB battles. Virginia does not return a QB that completed a pass in 2024.
- Morris started all 13 games for North Texas in 2024. At TCU, he started the first six games of the 2023 season before injuring his left knee – the same knee that had sidelined him in the 2022 season opener and subsequently kept him out for the remainder of the year.
- Morris is one of only four FBS QBs to start for at least three different schools. The others are Bowling Green's Drew Pyne (Missouri, Arizona State & Notre Dame), Eastern Michigan's Noah Kim (Coastal Carolina & Michigan State) and Fresno State's E.J. Warner (Rice & Temple).

BRYCE PERKINS EARNS UFL MVP HONORS

- Former UVA quarterback Bryce Perkins was named the 2025 MVP of the United Football League after passing for 1,342 yards and nine touchdowns in seven games. Perkins also rushed for 269 yards and five touchdowns.
- Perkins was previously a member of the Los Angeles Rams from 2020-22 and made his NFL debut in 2022, playing in five games with one start.
- He was a member of the Rams' roster, which defeated the Cincinnati Bengals 23-20 to win Super Bowl LVI in 2022.

- **Chandler Morris'** father, Chad Morris, coached alongside **Tony Elliott** at Clemson, where Morris served as offensive coordinator from 2011-14.
- As a child, Chandler often spent time around the Clemson football facility with the children of Dabo Swinney and Brent Venables.
- Chad was also the head coach at SMU (2015-17) and Arkansas (2018-19).
- On the timing of the decision, Elliott said: "to go in this offseason without a true quarterback controversy or battle or waiting until the end of camp ... I think was important for our football team especially with the number of transfers we brought in."

- This offseason, head coach Tony Elliott and his staff added 32 transfers to the 2025 roster.

AN EMBARRASSMENT OF RICHES

- Virginia is the only FBS program with 19 combined sixth- and seventh-year players.
- Additionally, UVA and Colorado are the only two FBS schools with three players who are in their seventh season of college football.
- Virginia's group seventh-years includes **Antonio Clary (S)**, **Cam Ross (WR)** and **Kenan Johnson (DB)**.
- UVA's sixth-year players are: **Chandler Morris (QB)**, **Harrison Waylee (RB)**, **Owen Gardner (RB)**, **Walker Wallace (TE)**, **Drake Metcalf (OL)**, **Monroe Mills (OL)**, **Ethan Sipe (OL)**, **Wallace Unamba (OL)**, **Brady Wilson (OL)**, **Tyshawn Wyatt (OL)**, **Mitchell Melton (DE)**, **Daniel Rickert (DE)**, **Jahmeer Carter (DT)**, **Da'Marcus Crosby II (DB)**, **Devin Neal (S)** and **Daniel Sparks (P)**.
- Clary has spent all seven seasons at UVA and battled numerous injuries throughout his career.
- Ross (James Madison) transferred to UVA in January, while Johnson transferred in May.
- Of its 16 sixth-year players, Carter is the only one who has played at UVA for the entirety of his college career.

LOOK HOOS DEEP IN THE TRENCHES

- With the addition of seven offensive linemen by way of the transfer portal this offseason, Virginia enters the 2025 season with the nation's most experienced offensive line, based on the combined number of career games played (334) and starts (213).
- Entering 2025, UVA is the only program whose offensive line combines for at least 300 career appearances and 200 career starts.
- **Noah Josey** (guard) and **McKale Boley** (tackle) are UVA's only returning starters on the offensive line from last year.
- Virginia's offensive line is led by assistant coach **Terry Heffernan**, who also serves as the program's Offensive Run Game Coordinator.
- Virginia is expected to be without tackles **Makilan Thomas** (Arkansas State) **Monroe Mills** (Louisville) to start the season. On Aug. 6, head coach **Tony Elliott** told the media that Thomas (foot) is expected to miss "multiple months," while Mills (knee) is not expected to play this season.
- **Elliott** on this year's offensive line group: "Even though I'm a receiver at heart and coached skill guys my whole life, you win up front ... And that's why the biggest area that we addressed was the offensive line and adding depth to the offensive line. That's probably the one position that we've been playing catch up the most over the last three years, but with the addition of the seven guys that we brought in this offseason, I think we're in a space now where we can have competitive depth, which creates for competitive practice, which allows us to create that chemistry."



TRANSFER CONNECTIONS

- Defensive end **Mitchell Melton** (Ohio State) and wideout **Jayden Thomas** (Notre Dame) squared off against each other in the 2024 national championship game, with the Melton and the Buckeyes prevailing, 34-23.
- Texas natives **Wallace Unamba** (OL) and **Da'Marcus Crosby II** (DB) both played at Kilgore Community College. Unamba played from spring 2021 through the end of the 2022 fall season, while Crosby played three full seasons from 2020-22.
- Army defensive back transfer **Donavon Platt's** most recent interception came against current UVA QB **Chandler Morris**. Platt intercepted a pass in the red zone in then-No. 18 Army's 14-3 victory over North Texas on Nov. 9, 2024.

BETRIDGE ON UVA'S CAREER SCORING LIST

- Placekicker **Will Bettridge** is inside Virginia's top-15 career scoring list and is one of eight placekickers to on the list.
- For the second consecutive season, Bettridge led all UVA scorers in 2024 with 78 points (18-21 FG, 24-24 PAT).
- He also tied for third among all ACC plackickers in FGs made and finished fifth in FG percentage (85.7).
- His 6.5 points-per-game average was good for 16th among all ACC players.

30-YEAR ANNIVERSARY: UVA'S HISTORIC WIN OVER FSU

- This season, Virginia hosts Florida State at Scott Stadium on Friday, Sept. 26 at 7 p.m. on ESPN.
- This year also marks the 30-year anniversary of UVA's 33-28 triumph over the nation's No. 2 team in front of a sold-out Scott Stadium.
- UVA's Anthony Poindexter and Adrian Burnim stopped FSU star running back Warrick Dunn on the goal line as time expired to solidify one of the most iconic victories in program history.
- The win marked the first-ever for an ACC team over the Seminoles, who joined the league in 1992. FSU had won 29 consecutive conference games prior to the Cavalier victory.
- FSU leads the all-time series 15-4, but the Cavaliers have won three of the last six meetings dating back to 2005.
- The last time the two teams played under the Scott Stadium lights was in 2019, when the Hoos scored three touchdowns in the fourth quarter to knock off the Seminoles, 31-24, in front of more than 57,000 fans.

IN GOOD HANDS

- Virginia is one of 13 schools with a female athletic trainer as its primary care provider for the football program. Associate Athletics Director for Sports Medicine, **Kelli Pugh**, has worked closely with the UVA football program since 2002.
- Of those 13 female athletic trainers, Pugh is one of six working at Power-4 institutions.

ACADEMIC REPORT CARD

- The UVA football program recorded its highest-ever semester team GPA with a 3.22 during the 2025 spring semester.
- At his introductory press conference head coach **Tony Elliott** stated, "I chose UVA because I wanted to lead a program that was partnered with a university that had world-class academics. I wanted to be able to recruit the best and the brightest student-athletes ... I wanted to be part of a university and athletic department that would not compromise its values to win."
- "My vision for the UVA football program is to become the model in college football, the model program in college football," Elliott said. "My goal is to contribute to changing the narrative in college football and demonstrate that you can win at the highest level and you can do so while achieving excellence in education, leadership and service."
- In 2002, Elliott earned his bachelor's degree in industrial engineering from Clemson, where he was a first-team All-ACC Academic selection and a CoSIDA Academic District III member. He was also a recipient of the ACC's Weaver-James-Corrigan Postgraduate Scholarship.

HARDIE FOOTBALL OPERATIONS CENTER

- In June 2024, Virginia Athletics proudly opened the 93,000-square-foot **Molly and Robert Hardie Football Operations Center**, which conveniently sits adjacent to the team's George Welsh Indoor Practice Facility and outdoor practice fields.
- The state-of-the-art space encompasses: the team locker, players' lounge and 96-person dining space, 14,000-square-foot strength and condition space with over 150,000 lbs of weight-lifting equipment, cardio mezzanine, 195-seat team meeting space, tiered-seating meeting spaces for each position group, and coaches' offices.
- The Hardie Center recently opened its full-service dining hall capable of providing meals for the entire team and staff.
- The exterior of the Hardie Center displays a classic yet chic design and is enclosed by red brick, which is synonymous with the architectural style of the University's most prominent edifices across Grounds such as The Rotunda.
- Of the Hardie Center, Fralin Family Football head coach **Tony Elliott** said, "I wanted the building to be timeless. I wanted to capture all different eras, to be contemporary enough to show the flash and the glitz and glamor as an area for certain recruits, but then also pay homage to all the guys that didn't have an opportunity to walk through those doors today but laid the foundation for Virginia football."

CARLA WILLIAMS ON CFP COMMITTEE

- On Feb. 8, 2024, Virginia Director of Athletics **Carla Williams** was named to the College Football Playoff (CFP) Management Committee.
- As a member of the committee, Williams began a three-year term beginning in the spring of 2024.
- “Carla is an outstanding advocate for college football and will be a knowledgeable, passionate and valuable member of the College Football Playoff Selection Committee,” said ACC Commissioner Jim Phillips. “Throughout her time at Virginia as well as her entire career, Carla has consistently shown to be a tremendous leader.”
- Williams is in her eighth year as director of athletics at Virginia. During her time in Charlottesville, UVA teams have captured multiple national titles across numerous sports, including the 2019 men’s basketball title, 2019 and 2021 men’s lacrosse titles, four straight women’s swimming and diving championships from 2021-24, and the 2022 and 2023 men’s tennis team titles. In addition, UVA has won 2022 ACC Championships.
- Williams was a three-year starter and All-SEC guard for the Georgia women’s basketball team from 1987-89. Williams then served as an assistant coach for the team before moving into administration as UGA’s assistant director of compliance for a year before taking administrative roles at Florida State and Vanderbilt.

Tony Elliott, a patient man, was looking for the right fit when it came time for him to leave the assistant coaching ranks and take on the responsibility of running a collegiate football program as the head coach. During his 11-year tenure at Clemson, his alma mater, several opportunities presented themselves, but it was not until Virginia came calling that he felt the setting was right for what he wants to accomplish.

On Dec. 10, 2021, Elliott was named the University of Virginia's Fralin Family Head Football Coach. At his introductory press conference, he explained his decision to become the Cavaliers' head coach and what he wants to accomplish in Charlottesville.

"I chose UVA because I wanted to lead a program that was partnered with a university that had world-class academics," he said "I wanted to be able to recruit the best and the brightest student-athletes.

"I wanted to compete in the best conference in college athletics. I wanted to be a part of an alignment with (athletic director) Ms. Carla (Williams) and President (Jim) Ryan that shared a vision that was similar to mine, which is centered around the holistic development of the student-athlete. And lastly, I wanted to be part of a university and athletic department that would not compromise its values to win.

"There is no better place for me than UVA. And there is no better time than now."

With that, Elliott went to work crafting what he had hoped to build for years - The Model Program.

"My vision for the UVA football program is to become the model in college football, the model program in college football," he said. "My goal is to contribute to changing the narrative in college football and demonstrate that you can win at the highest level and you can do so while achieving excellence in education, leadership and service."

Elliott's cornerstones of that culture are based on **H.E.A.R.T.- humility, effort, accountability, respect and toughness.**

"I think that building a championship culture starts with making sure that you have alignment and a vision," he said. "You clearly state the vision and you are particular in the people that you bring in and make sure that they align with the vision, and then you stay grounded to the principles that you set in place for the players and the staff, and you go to work every single day, and you keep an inside-out mentality. It's one day at a time, and eventually that will bring your championship culture to life."

Elliott's background and coaching pedigree is rich with championship experiences.

He spent 11 seasons as an assistant on Dabo Swinney's staff at Clemson. In January of 2021, he was named the program's assistant head coach and offensive coordinator. He previously served as the team's co-offensive coordinator (2014-20) and the team's running backs coach (2011-20).

At Clemson, Elliott was a part of a 10-season stretch in which the Tigers won 10 or more games. In that span, Clemson won six Atlantic Coast Conference Championships, made four appearances in the College Football Playoff National Championship game and captured national titles in 2016 and 2018.

After Elliott's promotion to co-offensive coordinator prior to the 2014 Russell Athletic Bowl, the Tigers posted an 89-10 record and ranked in the top 12 nationally in total offense. Clemson either led or ranked No. 2 in the ACC in total offense in five of his seven seasons as an offensive coordinator. Elliott's 2018 and 2019 offenses were responsible for two of the 22 650-point seasons in major college football history.

Elliott was named the Frank Broyles Award recipient as the nation's top assistant coach in 2017. Before transitioning to the tight ends room this year, Elliott was in charge of Clemson's running backs for his first 10 seasons. In that time, he guided Clemson running back Travis Etienne to one of the most illustrious careers in ACC and college football history, helping him set the NCAA record for most games scoring a touchdown (46) and secure ACC records for career rushing yards (4,952), total touchdowns (78), rushing touchdowns (70) and points (468).

As the program's offensive coordinator, Elliott worked with two first-round draft picks at quarterback, including the 2021 first overall pick Trevor Lawrence. From 2015-2020, a Clemson offensive player took home both the ACC's Player of the Year and Offensive Player of the Year awards four times.

Prior to returning to his alma mater, Elliott spent three seasons at Furman (2008-10) and two at South Carolina State (2006-07) coaching wide receivers at both schools. Prior to his coaching career he worked for Michelin North America for two years.

In 2002, Elliott earned his undergraduate degree in industrial engineering from Clemson, where he was a first-team Academic All-ACC selection as well as a CoSIDA Academic District III member. He was also a recipient of an ACC Weaver-James-Corrigan Postgraduate Scholarship.

Under Tommy Bowden, he came to Clemson as a walk-on wide receiver in the fall of 1999 and finished his career with four letters and appeared in 44 games. Swinney was his position coach his senior year (2003) in which he was named a co-captain of a team that finished with a 9-4 record and a No. 22 final ranking by AP and USA Today.

- The Carl Smith Center, home of David A. Harrison III Field at Scott Stadium, with its unique architectural design, scenic setting on the University's Grounds and exceptional sight lines, is one of the nation's finest college football settings.
- Opened in 1931, Scott Stadium might be one of the oldest campus college football stadiums in the nation, but you could never tell from its appearance. Numerous upgrades and expansions make it a modern home for the Cavaliers and their fans.
- Scott Stadium was the gift of Frederic William Scott and Elisabeth Strother Scott, and was dedicated to the memory of his parents, Frederic Robert Scott and Frances Branch Scott.
- Virginia played its dedication game at Scott Stadium on Oct. 15, 1931 against the Virginia Military Institute before a then-capacity crowd of 22,000. Prior to that season, the Cavaliers staged their home games at the University's Lambeth Field.
- Virginia has played 490 games in the historic venue. UVA's all-time record at Scott Stadium stands at 284-194-12.

Virginia Team Notes

- Virginia Tech improved to 62-38-5 in the all-time series against Virginia, first played in 1895. The Hokies extended their home win streak in the series to 12 games.
- Virginia dropped to 0-4 (2006, 2008, 2014, 2024) in games against Virginia Tech in which the game determined bowl eligibility for the Cavaliers.
- Virginia finished 3-3 on the road this season. The three road wins are the most since 2011.
- The Cavaliers fell to 3-2 in night games this season.
- Eight different Cavaliers recorded a reception in the contest.
- Virginia Tech opened the game with an 11-play, 90-yard scoring drive that ended with a touchdown, tied for the longest by an opponent this season - Coastal Carolina (8-for-90), Clemson (11-for-90).

Virginia Individual Player Notes

- Quarterback Tony Muskett made his first start under center this season and first since Nov. 4 against Georgia Tech (game eight). For the second straight game in which he appeared, Muskett matched a career-best with two rushing touchdowns and was 19-for-36 with 178 yards passing.
- Muskett is the third UVA quarterback in the last five meetings with two rushing touchdowns against Virginia Tech, joining Brennan Armstrong (2 in 2021) and Bryce Perkins (2 in 2019).
- Malachi Fields caught two passes for 20 yards and extended his streak with at least one reception to 27 consecutive games.
- Fields now has 129 career receptions, which is tied for 10th on UVA's all-time list with Perry Jones (2009-12) and Joe Reed (2016-19). Fields' 1,849 career receiving yards are the ninth most in UVA history.
- Suderian Harrison led the Cavaliers with career-highs in receptions (5) and receiving yards (54). He came into the contest with six catches for 45 yards.
- Jonas Sanker co-led the team in tackles with nine (five solo). It marked the fourth time he's led or co-led the team in tackles and the seventh time he's recorded eight or more tackles in a game this season. He finished the year with a team-high, 98 tackles (65 solo).
- Kempton Shine made his 37th consecutive starts dating back to his tenure at Eastern Michigan, the sixth most amongst active FBS secondary players.
- Will Bettridge moved into sole possession of 13th on UVA's career scoring list with a 37-yard field goal in the second quarter. Bettridge has 196 career points with 67 PATs and 42 field goals made.
- Noah Vaughn made his first career start at running back.
- Trell Harris started at wide receiver and made his first appearance since Sept 14 (vs. Maryland). Harris missed eight consecutive games due to injury.

- Virginia is 3-3 this season when trailing at the half.
- The Cavaliers finished Saturday's game with five turnovers, all of which occurred in the first half. The last time UVA committed five turnovers in a single game was against Notre Dame in 2019.

- With a 27-yard catch in the first quarter, Malachi Fields tallied his 25th consecutive game with at least one reception. The last time Fields did not haul in a reception was in the Cavaliers' 2021 matchup against Notre Dame.
- With four catches for 81 yards, Fields moved into ninth place on UVA's career receiving yards list (1,787) and now has 123 career receptions, tied with Terrell Jana (2017-20) for the 13th most in program history.
- Jonas Sanker finished with a career-high 13 tackles, including eight solo efforts and two tackles for loss. It was his fourth double-digit tackle effort of the season and 11th of his career. - Muskett's pair of rushing touchdowns tied his career high, which he achieved at Monmouth in 2021 against North Carolina A&T. His pair of rushing TDs is also his UVA career high. Muskett is the third Virginia quarterback with a rushing touchdown this season.
- Kempton Shine made his 35th consecutive career start dating back to his tenure at Eastern Michigan. Entering Saturday's contest against the Panthers, Shine was one of only seven FBS defensive backs with at least 30 consecutive starts.
- With two made PATs, Will Bettridge moved into a tie for 14th with Terry Kirby (1989-92) on UVA's career scoring list with 192 points. In 29 career games, Bettridge has made 42 field goals and 66 PATs.

Virginia Team Notes

- The Cavaliers improved to 5-10 all-time against Pitt and 3-7 against the Panthers as members of the ACC.
- Virginia is now 2-5 all-time at Acrisure Stadium with its only other victory coming in 2019 (30-14).
- Virginia has won two of its last four games against AP top-25 opponents. Under head coach Tony Elliott, UVA improved to 2-4 against ranked foes.
- UVA is 4-0 under Tony Elliott coming off a bye week, including last year's victory over then-No. 10 North Carolina in Chapel Hill.
- UVA is 3-1 on the road this season. The three road wins are the most by Virginia since 2011.
- UVA is 3-1 in night games this season and has won four of its last six night contests dating back to 2023. UVA is 4-2 all-time against the Panthers in night games.
- The Cavaliers improved to 5-4 overall and 3-3 in ACC play. It marks the first five-win season since 2020 and most league wins since earning four in 2021.
- Virginia recorded its first win in an NFL stadium since 2021, when it won at Hard Rock Stadium over Miami. UVA is 4-7 in NFL stadiums since 2018.
- Pitt entered Saturday's contest 10th in scoring offense (38.9) among FBS teams, and UVA held the Panthers to only 19 points. Pitt's 19 points are its second-lowest scoring output this season, and fewest in a loss since its 2023 season finale against Duke, when the Panthers also scored 19 points.
- Virginia improved to 3-2 this season when trailing at the half. The last time the Cavaliers trailed at the half and won was against Boston College (Oct. 5) after trailing 14-6.
- With UVA trailing by six in the third quarter, Jonas Sanker blocked a Pitt field goal attempt. It was the first blocked field goal by the Cavaliers since 2021 against William & Mary.
- UVA did not allow the Panthers' defense, which entered Saturday's game second nationally in defensive touchdowns (four) and pick sixes (four), to score.
- For the second time this season, the Cavalier secondary came up with two interceptions. This year, UVA also recorded a pair against BC. The last time the Hoos recorded two interceptions on the road was against Miami in 2023.
- UVA tied its season high of seven QB hurries. The Cavaliers also recorded seven QB hurries in its 31-30 win on the road at night against Wake Forest.

Virginia Individual Player Notes

- Pittsburgh native Corey Thomas Jr. came up with an interception with 1:42 left in the game on Pitt's final drive. It is Thomas Jr.'s first interception of the season and first interception since his freshman year (2019) at Akron.
- With two receptions for 11 yards, Malachi Fields extended his streak with at least one reception to 24 games. Fields now has 119 career receptions, only one shy from cracking UVA's top-15 career receptions list.
- Fields passed Heath Miller (2002-04) on UVA's all-time receiving yards list. Fields now has 1,706 career receiving yards, good for 11th all-time in school history.
- Kempton Shine made his 34th consecutive career start dating back to his tenure at Eastern Michigan. Entering Saturday's contest against the Panthers, Shine was one of only seven FBS defensive backs with at least 30 consecutive starts.
- Terrell Jones made his first career start at defensive end. Jones finished with a career-high six tackles, including four solo and 1.5 for-loss.
- Chico Bennett Jr.'s 18-game start streak came to a close, which began with the Cavaliers' 2023 home opener against James Madison. Bennett Jr. Finished with two tackles, including 0.5 for-loss, and one QB hurry.
- With a 24-yard catch in the first quarter, Andre Greene Jr. recorded the longest reception of his career. Greene also finished with a career-high 30 receiving yards on three catches.
- On the first play of the second quarter, quarterback Anthony Colandrea hauled in a 27-yard reception on a pass from wide receiver Sudeyan Harrison. It was the first reception by a UVA QB since Brennan Armstrong's 18-yard reception against Illinois on Sept. 11, 2021.
- Immediately following the Colandrea reception, Xavier Brown scored his first rushing touchdown of the season and second of his career from Pitt's 1-yard line. His other rushing TD came on Nov. 5, 2022, against North Carolina.
- With a 66-yard boot in the third quarter, Daniel Sparks now has 15 career punts (13 at UVA) of 60 yards or more. He eclipsed the 11 career 60-yard punts by Russ Henderson (1975-78) for the most ever by a Cavalier. It's also Sparks' furthest since his career-long 70-yard punt against BC in 2023.
- Chris Tyree recorded season highs in both receiving (42) and rushing (13) yards.
- Jam Jackson was credited with a half-sack in the second quarter, his first career takedown of a quarterback behind the line of scrimmage.
- With one made field goal and three successful PATs, placekicker Will Bettridge (2022-pres.) cracked UVA's top-15 career points list. Bettridge now has 190 career points and passed Bill Dudley (1939-41) on the all-time list.

Virginia Team Notes

- The contest marked the 129th all-time meeting between Virginia and North Carolina, "The South's Oldest Rivalry." It tied with Georgia-Auburn for the second-most played rivalry in FBS. North Carolina improved to 66-59-4 in the all-time series that was first played in 1892.
- North Carolina has won three-straight games at Scott Stadium and seven of the last eight against UVA in Charlottesville.
- Virginia is outscoring their opponents 74-40 in fourth quarters this season including an 8-3 edge against UNC.
- Despite the loss, Virginia has won five of the last eight meetings against North Carolina.
- UNC's Omarion Hampton (105 yards) is only the second player to rush for 100 yards in a game against UVA this season (Louisville's Issac Brown, 146 yards). Hampton has 100 yards in all but one game this season and eclipsed 1,000 yards for the second-straight year.
- The 135 total rushing yards are the fewest by the Tar Heels this season.
- JR Wilson became the 12th Cavalier to score a touchdown with a 68-yard reception in the fourth quarter.

Virginia Individual Player Notes

- Malachi Fields caught three passes for 48 yards and moved into 12th place on UVA's career receiving yards list. His 1,695 career receiving yards are eight yards shy of Heath Miller (2002-04) who finished his career with 1,703.
- Fields has now caught a pass in each of his last 23 games played.
- Tight end Tyler Neville eclipsed the 1,000-yard career receiving mark, with four catches for 32 yards against North Carolina. He has 1,013 for his career with 689 at Harvard and 317 at UVA.
- Jonas Sanker finished with seven tackles, including six unassisted. Sanker now has 154 career solo tackles.
- Kicker Will Bettridge, who came into the contest with the most field goals per game in the ACC, added successful tries of 30 and 27. He now has 184 career points, four shy of matching Bill Dudley (1939-41) for the No. 15 spot on UVA's all-time scoring list.
- Anthony Britton recorded a career-high 10 tackles, also a game high. Britton's previous career best was four which he achieved three times, most recently at Clemson last week.
- With an interception in the third quarter, Anthony Colandrea's four-game streak without an interception came to a close. His interception on the first drive in the third quarter was the first in his last 146 passing attempts.
- JR Wilson scored his first career touchdown on a 68-yard pass from Tony Muskett with 10:07 to play, which is Virginia's longest pass play this season and second-longest play from scrimmage.
- Wilson's touchdown also marks UVA's longest passing play since Kobe Pace's 75-yard catch against James Madison in 2023.
- With a 60-yard boot in the second quarter, Daniel Sparks now has 14 career punts (12 at UVA) of 60 yards or more. He eclipsed the 11 career 60-yard punts by Russ Henderson (1975-78) for the most ever by a Cavalier.

Virginia Team Notes

- Virginia scored 31 points in the contest, its second-most ever against Clemson in 50 all-time meetings. UVA scored 35 in a 40-35 loss in Clemson in 1966.
- UVA outscored Clemson 21-10 in the fourth quarter and is outscoring opponents 66-37 in fourth quarters this season.
- Virginia's 10-3 advantage in the second quarter marked its first lead over Clemson since the 2004 meeting, a span of five games in the series.
- Virginia's interception at the end of the first quarter was the first Clemson turnover since Sept. 28 against Stanford. Clemson entered Saturday's contest with three turnovers in 2024 (2 INT, 1 fumble).
- In four ACC games this season, Virginia has forced seven turnovers (5 INT, 2 fumbles).
- With its lost fumble in the third quarter, UVA committed its first turnover in its previous three games. It snapped a streak of 14-consecutive quarters without a turnover.
- A season-high 12 different UVA receivers caught a pass in the contest, including four different for a touchdown.
- Clemson recorded its sixth-straight win over Virginia and improved to 41-8-1 in the all-time series with Virginia.
- Clemson is 22-3-1 all-time against UVA at Memorial Stadium.

Virginia Individual Player Notes

- With 65 receiving yards, Malachi Fields cracked UVA's top-15 career receiving yards list ... In his 31st career game, Fields surpassed Tim Smith's 1,591 career-receiving-yards mark.
- Fields finished with three receptions, including a 44-yard touchdown, and has now hauled in at least one pass in 22-straight games played.
- Dakota Twitty caught his fourth touchdown pass of the season, a 44-yard completion from Anthony Colandrea to open the fourth quarter. It marked his third touchdown in his last four games and 10th of his career. The 44-yard catch is the longest touchdown reception of his career.
- Dakota Twitty caught his first career touchdown, an eight-yard reception to give UVA a 10-3 lead in the second quarter. The reception is the sixth of his career and fifth of the season. On the previous play, Twitty caught a five-yard pass over the middle for a first down at the Clemson 8-yard line.
- Kam Robinson intercepted his first pass of the season and third of his career. The interception setup UVA's first touchdown of the day.
- Ethan Davies caught a 65-yard touchdown pass from Tony Muskett with 1:39 to play. It marked UVA's second-longest play overall of the season and longest through the air.
- Sackett Wood Jr. recorded his first career touchdown, an eight-yard reception from Muskett with 2:11 left to play in the fourth quarter. It was Wood's second catch of the season and 23rd of his career.
- Muskett's pair of touchdowns marked his first multiple-passing-touchdown effort since UVA's home game against William & Mary on Oct. 7, 2023, when Muskett also had two.
- Linebacker Trey McDonald recorded a game-high 11 tackles, also his career best. In McDonald's second career start, he also tied for a game-high seven solo tackles along with teammates Jonas Sanker and Kam Robinson.

Virginia Team Notes

- Louisville won its third-straight meeting against Virginia and improved to 8-5 all-time against the Cavaliers.
- Four of the last six matchups between UVA and Louisville have been decided by one score.
- Louisville's go-ahead touchdown with 1:55 remaining in the game was the first points by a UVA opponent in the fourth quarter since Coastal Carolina on Sept. 21, a span of 37:10.
- The 24 points scored by Louisville matched a season low. Coming into the game, Louisville ranked 21st in the nation in offensive scoring (38.6 ppg).
- Virginia held Louisville to a season-low 231 yards passing. The Cardinals entered Saturday's contest as the nation's No. 13 team in passing offense (303.4 ypg).
- For the first time since 2019 (North Carolina, Georgia Tech, Liberty), Virginia tallied its third straight game with no turnovers.
- UVA is outscoring opponents 45-27 in the fourth quarter this season.
- Virginia trailed by as many as 10 points and took the lead 20-17 with 10:03 remaining in the game. It marked the third double-digit deficit UVA has overcome this season (14 points vs. Wake Forest & 14 points vs. Boston College).
- UVA's first touchdown (1-yard rush by Grady Brosterhous) with 9:39 left in the first quarter marked its first opening-drive score in ACC play this season. It was also the Cavaliers' first since opening-drive touchdown when their season opener against Richmond.
- The last time UVA recorded a touchdown on its first drive was against Miami in 2023.
- The Hoos have won 2 of their last 3 games when scoring on the opening drive.
- Virginia opened the game with an 11-play, 75-yard touchdown drive that ended with a Grady Brosterhous 1-yard plunge. It was the longest (by time, 5:21) touchdown drive by UVA to open a game since 2018 (vs. North Carolina). It was also the ninth time this season UVA has put together a scoring drive of 75 or more yards.
- Virginia outgained Louisville 449-408 in total offense and 301-231 in passing yards, which marks the second-straight season UVA outgained the Cardinals in total offense and passing.
- The Cavaliers have had more passing yards in each of the last three meetings against Louisville.

Virginia Individual Player Notes

- Wideout Malachi Fields finished with nine catches for 129 receiving yards, his third 100-yard game of the season, and third of his career. Fields surpassed 1,500 receiving yards for his career and has now caught a pass in 21 consecutive games.
- Tight end Tyler Neville eclipsed a career high with seven catches and added 64 receiving yards, three shy of matching a season best.
- Quarterback Anthony Colandrea was 26-for-45 passing with 279 yards and a touchdown. He also ran for 84 yards, only five yards short of his career high, which he set against Louisville in last season.
- Colandrea's 279 yards passing are his third-highest output of the season. He now has 11, 200-yard passing games in his career, including four this season.
- Linebacker Kam Robinson has a sack in three of his last four games and leads the team with three on the season. His sack came on third down with 11:47 remaining and forced Louisville to kick a 41-yard field goal which missed wide to right. Robinson finished with eight tackles (six solo) and a career-high two tackles for loss.
- Running back Xavier Brown caught a 46-yard touchdown pass, his first TD reception of his career and longest reception of his career. It was UVA's fourth-longest play from scrimmage this season.
- Kam Butler tallied his 50th career start. He also served as a game captain.
- Quarterback Grady Brosterhous recorded his team-leading fourth rushing touchdown of the season. He has four touchdowns on nine attempts this season.
- True freshman Ethan Minter recorded his first career interception. It marks the second straight season a UVA true freshman recorded a pick (2023: Kam Robinson - 2; Caleb Hardy - 1; Dre Walker - 1).

Virginia Team Notes

- Virginia is 4-1 for the first time since 2019 and the sixth time since 1999 - 2019 (4-1), 2017 (4-1), 2007 (4-1), 2004 (5-0), 2003 (4-1).
- UVA is 2-0 to start ACC play for the first time since 2019.
- Virginia has back-to-back ACC games for the first time since 2021 (vs. Duke 48-0 & vs. Georgia Tech 48-40).
- Virginia improved to 2-7 in the all-time series against BC and is now 2-2 against the Eagles at Scott Stadium.
- The Cavaliers erased a 14-point deficit, the second time this season (at Wake Forest) UVA has overcome a 14-point lead to win. It marked the first 14+ point comeback at Scott Stadium since 2019 when they trailed 17-0 against ODU after two quarters.
- UVA is now 2-0 this season when trailing after the first quarter and 2-0 when trailing at the half.
- UVA held BC scoreless over the last 43:07 of the game and scored 24 unanswered points.
- Virginia scored 18 points in the fourth quarter, the most since Louisville in 2021. Coming into the game, Boston College had not allowed a fourth quarter offensive touchdown.
- The Cavaliers scored 18 points in the fourth quarter, the most in the final stanza since 2021 at Louisville.
- UVA has not turned the ball over in back-to-back games for the first time since 2019.
- Virginia recognized members of its 1989 co-ACC championship team in between the first and second quarters. The '89 team finished with an overall record of 10-3 and its 10 wins are still a school single-season record.

Virginia Individual Player Notes

- Malachi Fields led the Cavaliers with four receptions for 63 yards and scored his third touchdown of the season. All three scores have come in the last two games. Fields has a reception in 20-straight games.
- Fields completed a 29-yard pass to Kobe Pace in the 3rd quarter. It was UVA's first completion for a first down by a non-quarterback since 2021 at Illinois (Dontayvion Wicks to Brennan Armstrong for 18 yards). Fields' completion was the longest by a non-quarterback since Perry Jones' 36-yard completion in 2012 to Tim Smith against Louisiana Tech.
- Chico Bennett recorded his first career interception. Today marked his 41st career collegiate football game (25 at UVA, 16 at GT). The pick was the first by a UVA defensive lineman since David Dean against Virginia Tech in 2014.
- Jonas Sanker scored his first career touchdown on a 40-yard fumble return in the fourth quarter. It was UVA's first fumble recovery for a touchdown since Eli Hanback recovered a fumble in the end zone to seal UVA's victory over Virginia Tech in 2019.
- In the first quarter, Terrell Jones (0.5) and Anthony Britton (0.5) teamed up to record their first career tackle-for-loss. It was Britton's first career start.
- Kendren Smith logged his third career interception and his first as a Cavalier. He added five tackles (2 solo) and one pass break-up.
- Daniel Sparks' 62-yard punt in the first quarter is his season long and his eighth career punt of at least 60 yards.

Virginia Team Notes

- Virginia and Coastal Carolina met for the first time. UVA improved to 6-4 all-time against current members of the Sun Belt Conference.
- The Chanticleers were one of 43 unbeaten teams in FBS coming into the weekend.
- UVA rushed for 384 yards, the first time UVA eclipsed the 300-yard rushing mark since 2018 vs. Richmond. It was the most rushing yards in a game by a UVA offense since compiling 446 yards against San Jose State in 1998.
- Virginia's 43 points were the most scored under Elliott and the most since scoring 49 against BYU in 2021.
- Virginia accumulated 525 yards of total offense (384 rush, 141 pass), the most in a game under Elliott and the most since racking up 588 against BYU in 2021.
- UVA is 3-1 on the season, its best start under head coach Tony Elliott and its best start since 2019 (4-0).
- Marks the fourth time in last 17 years (since 2008) Virginia has three or more wins through its first four games (2024 - 3-1; 2019 - 4-0; 2018 - 3-1; 2017 - 3-1).
- Virginia forced a season-high, three turnovers (two fumbles, one interception). It was the first time UVA forced three or more takeaways since forcing four against Boston College (4 - 2 fumbles, 2 interceptions). In addition, the Cavaliers forced a three of turnover on downs.
- UVA never trailed in the contest and took the lead 1:24 into the game.
- Second time in four games UVA scored on opening drive (Richmond - 3 plays, 77 yards). The scoring drive was UVA's shortest in yardage (13 yards) of the season.
- Announced attendance at Brooks Stadium was 22,104, the largest crowd in facility history. It broke the previous record of 21,324 set against Marshall on Oct. 23, 2023.

Virginia Individual Player Notes

- Xavier Brown rushed for 171 yards on nine carries (19.0 ypc). He is UVA's first 100-yard rusher since Perris Jones ran for 134 yards against William & Mary last season. He is the first Cavalier to rush for 150+ yards since Bryce Perkins vs. Virginia Tech in 2019 (164 yards) and the first UVA running back with 150+ since 2018 (Jordan Ellis vs. Ohio).
- 75-yard run by Brown is the longest by a UVA rusher since Jordan Ellis' 75-yard scamper against Louisville in 2018
- Grady Brosterhous rushed for two touchdowns on three carries. He has six carries for 10 yards and three touchdowns this season.
- Brosterhous is the first Cavalier with multiple rushing touchdowns in a game since Mike Hollins against North Carolina (3 touchdowns) in 2023. He's the first Cavalier quarterback with multiple rushing scores since Brennan Armstrong had two against Virginia Tech in 2021.
- The three rushing touchdowns this year by Brosterhous are the most in a season by a UVA quarterback since 2022 (Brennan Armstrong - 6).
- For the second time in his career, Malachi Fields caught two touchdown passes in a game. The TD receptions were his first two of the season and he ups his career total to eight. He finished the game with 4 receptions, 64 yards and two touchdowns.
- Dating back to last years' season finale, Fields has four touchdowns in his last five games.
- On the opening kickoff, Landon Danley forced a fumble that was recovered by Eli Wood. Today marked the fifth game of Danley's career.
- Daniel Sparks was credited with a 60-yard punt in the first quarter, his seventh career punt of 60+ yards.
- Antonio Clary led the team with eight tackles and came up his second career interception midway through the first quarter ... his other career interception was against Louisville in 2022.
- Kicker Will Bettridge was 3-for-3 on field goal attempts and 4-for-4 on extra point attempts. He tied his career long on a 47-yard field goal as time expired in the first half.
- Kam Butler was credited with his first sack of the season, running his career total up to 22.5 (7.5 at UVA).

Virginia Team Notes

- Virginia drops to 32-46-2 all-time against Maryland, and has lost each of the last four matchups. It marked the first meeting between the two schools in Charlottesville since 2012.
- Maryland was limited to seven points off UVA's four turnovers (two fumbles, two interceptions). The two fumbles lost by Virginia were the first two of the season.
- The Virginia defense was credited with eight pass breakups. It marks the second time in the last 26 games UVA had eight or more pass breakups (8 vs. Duke - 2023).
- Went over 100 rushing yards for the second time in three games.
- Virginia held a lead over Maryland at halftime for the second consecutive year.
- UVA was held scoreless in the second half for the first time since last year's meeting against the Terps.

- Quarterback Anthony Colandrea put UVA up 13-7 with :01 left in the first half with a 10-yard rushing touchdown, his second rushing TD of his career. He finished with 247 yards passing, his 10th career 200-yard game.
- Jahmeer Carter upped his career total to 2.5 with a takedown behind the line in the third quarter. It was his first sack since North Carolina on Oct. 21, 2023.

Virginia Team Notes

- With the win, the Cavaliers snapped a five-game losing skid in the series with Wake Forest and improved to 35-17 in the all-time series, which began in 1889.
- Virginia collected its first win in Winston-Salem since 2002, when it scored the final three touchdowns to erase a 17-point deficit and win, 38-34.
- Virginia is off to its first 2-0 start since 2021 and only the third since the 2013 season.
- UVA trailed for nearly 58 minutes until Will Bettridge's extra point with 2:07 remaining.
- Virginia trailed by as many as 14 points, the largest deficit overcome in a victory since 2021 (at Louisville).
- Wake Forest was the first UVA opponent to score a touchdown on the opening drive since JMU on Sept. 9, 2023, a span of 11 games.
- UVA had not won a game when an opponent has scored a touchdown on the opening drive since it defeated Georgia Tech on Oct. 23, 2021.
- The Virginia defense totaled six sacks, the most in a game since recording eight at Georgia Tech on Oct. 20, 2022.
- The Cavaliers won their first ACC opener on the road since knocking off Pitt in 2019. UVA came into the contest having lost three-straight ACC openers.

Virginia Individual Player Notes

- Malachi Fields finished with career high in receptions (11) and receiving yards (148). He recorded his second-straight 100-yard receiving effort. It marks the ninth-straight game a UVA wide receiver has gone over the century mark dating back to last season.
- Fields has 329 yards receiving in his last three games, which includes the 2023 season finale.
- Trell Harris caught a career-high seven passes for 91 yards, three yards shy of matching his career best.
- Tyler Neville recorded his first two-touchdown game of his career, catching first half scores of 18 and 24 yards. He now has 10 career touchdown receptions (8 at Harvard, 2 at UVA). He's the first Cavalier tight end with two touchdown receptions in a game since Tom Santi against Duke on Sept. 8, 2007. Neville finished the night with four catches for 68 yards.
- Quarterback Anthony Colandrea completed 33 of 43 passes (77 percent) for 357 yards and matched a career-best with three touchdown passes. His 33 completions were a career-high and the most by a UVA quarterback since 2021 (Brennan Armstrong, 36 at Pitt).
- For the second-straight week, Antonio Clary led the team in tackles with 11 and he added his second career sack. Fellow safety Jonas Sanker finished with 10 tackles including seven solo efforts and his first career sack.
- In his only rushing attempt of the night, quarterback Grady Brosterhous plunged forward for a one-yard rushing touchdown with 2:07 remaining, which ultimately led to Bettridge's game-winning PAT. It was the first rushing touchdown of Brosterhous' career. Linebacker Trey McDonald made a career-high nine tackles (four solo) and was credited with his first collegiate sack.
- With 1:24 remaining, Malcolm Greene forced a fumble after Wake's Taylor Morin hauled in a 20-yard reception, and Antonio Clary recovered the ball at the UVA 29-yard line. Greene's forced fumble was the second of his career and first as a Cavalier.
- Jahmeer Carter made his 25th consecutive start, the longest active streak on the team as a Cavalier.
