STORYLINES: VIRGINIA VS. NORFOLK STATE

INSIDE FRIDAY'S MATCHUP

- Virginia and Norfolk State will meet on the gridiron for the first time on Friday night. The two Commonwealth institutions are separated by only 163 miles on the I-64 corridor.
- Both programs have been playing football concurrently for 88 years with Norfolk State's first contest occurring in 1938. Virginia officially recognizes 1888 as its first season.
- The contest will be the first of two games against Commonwealth programs for Virginia. The Cavaliers' annual clash with Virginia Tech will serve as the 2026 regular-season finale in Blacksburg.
- UVA has played eight of the 10 Division I opponents located in the Commonwealth of Virginia, with only Hampton left to play. The two schools are scheduled to square off in 2029.
- Last week's open date for Virginia was the earliest bye week in program history. UVA will play eight straight games before its next weekend off on Nov. 7 prior to hosting Cal. It marked the earliest bye week since having the weekend of Sept. 10th open during the 2005 season and only the second off week in September since 2018.
- Now in his fifth season at Virginia, Tony Elliott is 6-0 immediately after the bye week, which includes a 27-7 win over Virginia Tech in last year's regular-season finale at Scott Stadium.
- The Norfolk State game will be the first of two Friday night contests at Scott Stadium this season. The Cavaliers will host Duke on Friday, Oct. 23 in a rematch of the 2025 ACC Championship game. The only other year in which Scott Stadium hosted two non-Saturday games was in 2019.
- A total of 87 players rostered for Norfolk State (51) and UVA (36) going into Friday night's game hail from the Commonwealth of Virginia.
- The Virginia defense has forced a turnover in 11 of its last 12 games. The Cavaliers have forced a total of 20 turnovers (14 INT, 6 FR) in its last 12 games including a pair in the opener against NC State (1 INT, 1 FR).

TOP STORYLINES

- Virginia was scheduled to host a Thursday night contest at Scott Stadium against Penn State on Sept. 13, 2001, before the terrorist attacks of Sept. 11, 2001 canceled athletic events nationwide. The game was eventually rescheduled for Dec. 1 and resulted in a 20-14 victory for UVA. The first UVA football game after 9/11 was coincidentally at Clemson, where Tony Elliott was a second-year wide receiver. Virginia was victorious against the Tigers 26-24 at Memorial Stadium for only the third time in program history.
- One of the most decorated offensive linemen in UVA history, Elton Brown, currently serves as the Norfolk State offensive line coach under second-year head coach Michael Vick. Brown was a consensus All-American and the recipient of the Jacobs Blocking Trophy in 2003 and 2004 as the conference's top blocker. Vick, who played at rival Virginia Tech (1998-2000), played at Scott Stadium once (1999) during his collegiate playing career.
- UVA kicker **Will Bettridge** is on the verge of becoming Virginia's all-time scoring leader. He currently sits at 327 career points and needs only six points to surpass Connor Hughes (2002-05) as the program's top scorer.
- In its 34-8 season-opening win over NC State (Aug. 29), Virginia rushed for 258 yards, the most in an ACC game since 2020. To complemented the run game, the Cavaliers enter Week 2 with the third-highest pass efficiency rating in the country (260.18) behind defending national champion Indiana (285.03) and Louisiana Tech (280.29)

VIRGINIA BY THE NUMBERS

Despite being separated by only 163 miles, Friday's game marks the first-ever meeting between Virginia and Norfolk State.

Beau Pribula threw only 11 passes for the Cavaliers in their 34-8 season-opening win over NC State two weeks ago. That's the fewest attempts by UVA in a game since Nov. 4, 1989, when the Cavaliers threw 10 in a 20-9 road win over the Wolfpack.

THE UNIVERSITY OF VIRGINIA

UNIQUELY UVA

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

UNIVERSITY NICKNAMES

Virginia's athletics teams have been accompanied by a somewhat confusing array of nicknames. The most prominent and widely accepted of these monikers are "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos."

Although the terms "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are used almost interchangeably to refer to University teams and players, "Cavaliers" is more often used by the media, while "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are frequently used by Virginia students and fans.

Legend has it that Washington & Lee baseball fans dubbed the Virginia players "Wahoos" during the fiercely contested rivalry that existed between the two in-state schools in the 1890s. By 1940, "Wahoos" was in general use around Grounds to denote University students or events relating to them. The abbreviated "Hoos" sprang up later in student newspapers and has gained growing popularity in recent years.

THE CAVALIER MASCOT

The costumed Cavalier with a large character head debuted during Virginia's 1984 football season and has remained the official mascot of the University.

The first documented Cavalier on horseback was Francis Bell, a Virginia student from Dublin, Va., in 1947. Bell rode onto the field dressed as Cavaliers for Virginia's home football game with Harvard on the afternoon of October 11.

The Cavalier on horseback returned as the University's mascot in 1963. The UVA Polo Club provided both the horse and rider. However, the mounted Cavalier and his horse parted company in 1974 with the inception of AstroTurf at Scott Stadium.

The mounted Cavalier made its return in the Florida Citrus Bowl at the end of the 1989 football season. Due to its instant popularity, the Cavalier on horseback returned the following season on a regular basis and continues to lead the Virginia football team onto the field at the beginning of all home games.

Since 2000, Kim Kirschnick led the Cavaliers out of the tunnel on horseback and retired after the 2021 season finale against Virginia Tech. 2022 marked Julie Caruccio first season as the mounted Cavalier. A former interim dean of students at UVA, Caruccio is the first female in school history to have the mounted Cavalier job on a full-time basis. When the tradition rotated among members of the club polo team until Kirschnick took over in 2000, at least two women – Bess Worrall and Kerry McDaniel – were on horseback for a few games in the early '90s.

UNIVERSITY COLORS

Orange and blue were adopted as the University of Virginia's official athletic colors at a mass student meeting in 1888. UVA athletic teams had previously worn silver gray and cardinal red, but those colors did not stand out on muddy football fields, prompting a student movement to change them.

One of the students attending the mass meeting was Allen Potts, a star athlete who played on Virginia's first football team in 1888. Potts showed up at the meeting wearing a navy blue-and-orange scarf that he had acquired during a summer boating expedition at Oxford University. Orange and blue were chosen as the official athletic colors after one of Potts' fellow students pulled the scarf off Potts' neck and, waving it to the crowd, yelled, "How will this do?" UVA later served as the inspiration for schools like Auburn and Florida when they selected school colors.

WAH-HOO-WA

The origin of "Wah-hoo-wa" is uncertain. The cheer was used to root on Virginia teams as early as 1890 and may have been borrowed from Dartmouth College, whose athletics teams were once known as the Indians.

Legend attributes the yell to Natalie Floyd Otey, who sang the ballad "Where'er You Are, There Shall My Love Be" at Charlottesville's Levy Opera House in 1893. The predominantly student audience noticed that Otey warbled the first three words of the song between each of the stanzas and decided to join in the refrain. By evening's end, goes the legend, the crowd had corrupted "Where'er You Are" into "Wah-hoo-wah."

The Levy Opera House stands at the corner of High Street and Park Street and has since been renovated into an office building.

**A WIN FOR THE CAVALIERS WOULD...**

- Mark the 10th straight victory over an FCS opponent. The last time UVA lost to an FCS foe was against Richmond in a 37-20 setback on Sept. 3, 2016.
- Be UVA's third straight over a non-conference opponent.
- Mark their second 2-0 start under **Tony Elliott** and first since 2024.
- Be UVA's third consecutive at Scott Stadium and eighth out of its last nine home games, dating back to the 2025 season opener.
- Mark UVA's seventh straight win following a bye week. Since 2022, Elliott's first season as head coach, the Cavaliers have never lost a game coming off a bye.
- Be their second straight victory on a Friday night. The Wahoos triumphed over then-No. 8 Florida State 46-38 in double overtime last season on Friday, Sept. 26.

UPCOMING MILESTONES

- Placekicker **Will Bettridge** is five points away from tying the program's all-time scoring record and six points away from breaking it.
- Offensive lineman **Noah Josey**'s next appearance will be the 50th of his career and potentially his 45th consecutive start.
- Quarterback **Beau Pribula** needs 22 rushing yards to reach 1,000 for his career.
- Running back **Xavier Brown** needs 21 yards for 1,000 career rushing yards.
- Linebacker **Kam Robinson**, who tore his ACL in UVA's 11th game of the 2025 season at Duke (Nov. 15), is one tackle away from No. 200 of his career.
- Defensive end **Fisher Camac** needs one more tackle to reach the 100th of his career.
- Receiver **Jacques Gibson** has 90 receptions and 948 career receiving yards
- Defensive lineman **Justin Townsend** needs three tackles to reach 100 for his career.

A FIRST FOR EVERYTHING

- Despite being separated by only 167 miles, Friday's game marks the first-ever meeting between Virginia and Norfolk State.
- Virginia has won seven of its last eight matchups against first-time opponents, including its last two (Washington State and Stanford in 2025).
- Since 2000, the Cavaliers are 17-11 overall in inaugural matchups, including 12-7 at Scott Stadium.
- Norfolk State is UVA's third first-time opponent from the Commonwealth of Virginia since 2000. The others were Old Dominion (2019) and Liberty (2018).

VIRGINIA VS. THE COMMONWEALTH

- With Friday's matchup, Virginia will have faced nine of the 10 Division I football programs in the Commonwealth of Virginia.
- The only DI program from the Commonwealth that UVA has not faced is Hampton. However, the two teams are slated to play each other on Sept. 15, 2029.

BETRIDGE ON UVA'S CAREER SCORING LIST

- Placekicker **Will Bettridge** is one of three players in UVA history to reach the 300-point club.
- In 2025 he's averaged 8.6 points per game, good for third among all ACC players and 13th nationally.
- For the third consecutive season, Bettridge led all UVA scorers in 2025 with 121 points (24-30 FG, 49-49 PAT).

YEAR FIVE UNDER TONY ELLIOTT

- **Tony Elliott** is in his fifth year at the helm of the Virginia football program.
- In 2025, Elliott steered UVA to the program's most successful season ever as the Cavaliers won a program-record 11 games, and made their second-ever appearance in the ACC Championship game.
- The Wahoos also defeated No. 25 Missouri in the TaxSlayer Gator Bowl, 13-7, which marked UVA's first bowl win in seven years.
- For his efforts, Elliott was named the ACC Coach of the Year by his peers and the Associated Press. He also was named the Bear Bryant ACC Coach of the Year and took home the Bobby Ross Coach of the Year Award from the Touchdown Club of Richmond.
- He was also named a finalist for the Eddie Robinson, Paul "Bear" Bryant and George Munger national Coach of the Year awards.
- Additionally, Elliott returns all but one of his assistant coaches from 2025. The only departure was offensive line coach Terry Heffernan, who accepted the offensive coordinator position at Stanford following the 2025 season. Joey Orck, who previously held the title of assistant offensive line coach, was promoted to offensive line coach.
- Elliott brought a wealth of championship experience to Charlottesville following an 11-year tenure at Clemson University, his alma mater. Elliott helped the Tigers win national championships in 2016 and 2018 and seven ACC championships (2011, 2015, 2016, 2017, 2018, 2019, 2020).
- In his 16 years as a full-time college coach, Elliott has been a part of 15 winning seasons including 10-win seasons at Clemson from 2011-20.
- With Elliott as offensive coordinator, Clemson went 89-10 and made four CFP National Championship game appearances.

ACC WIN IMPROVEMENT UNDER ELLIOTT

- Virginia has increased its ACC win total each year under head coach Tony Elliott.

FOURTH-QUARTER EMPHASIS

- Over the previous two seasons (2024-25), Virginia has improved in the fourth quarter, a point of emphasis by head coach **Tony Elliott**.
- In that same time span, UVA outscored its opponents 146-125 in fourth quarters and 170-144 when factoring in overtime periods.
- The Cavaliers achieved a 3-1 in overtime games last season with wins over then-No. 8 Florida State (46-38), Louisville (30-27), North Carolina (17-16). Its lone defeat in overtime came against Duke (27-20) in the ACC Championship game at Bank of America Stadium.
- In Elliott's first two seasons at UVA, the Cavaliers were outscored in fourth quarters by their opponents 43-36 in 2022 and 114-54 in 2023.

IMPROVEMENT IN ONE-SCORE GAMES

- The Cavaliers have shown significant improvement in one-score games over the course of Tony Elliott's tenure as UVA head coach.

WAHOOS' DEFENSIVE DELIVERANCE

- In its Week 0 season opener, Virginia held NC State to only eight points after holding the Wolfpack scoreless on their first eight drives of the game.
- Led by defensive coordinator **John Rudzinski**, Virginia's 19.6 points-allowed-per-game average was good for second in the ACC in 2025.
- UVA also finished in the top-5 in forced fumbles (11; 2nd), sacks (31; 4th) and interceptions (14; T-4th).
- The Cavaliers gained momentum as the 2025 season progressed, closing out the year in strong fashion.
- In UVA's last eight games of 2025, its opponents averaged only 13.9 points per game (in regulation), a span in which it did not allow more than 21 points in any game.
- The Cavaliers finished the 2025 season 9-1 when forcing at least one turnover.

TONY ELLIOTT: ONE OF 14 AFRICAN AMERICAN HEAD COACHES IN FBS

- Fralin Family Head Football Coach **Tony Elliott** is one of only 14 African American FBS head football coaches.
- The ACC leads all P4 conferences with three black head coaches, including Elliott, Fran Brown (Syracuse) and James Franklin (Virginia Tech).
- Entering his fifth season, Elliott was named Virginia's 41st head coach on Dec. 10, 2021. He is also UVA's second African American head football coach, following Mike London, who led the program from 2010-15.

2025 STORYLINES IN REVIEW

- With a record of 7-1 in conference play, Virginia finished alone atop the ACC standings for the first time in program history. As a result, Tony Elliott was named ACC Coach of the Year.
- The Cavaliers won a school-record 11 wins, capped by a 13-7 triumph over No. 25 Missouri in the TaxSlayer Gator Bowl.
- The win in the Gator Bowl was UVA's first postseason win since dominating South Carolina 28-0 in the 2018 Belk Bowl.
- Virginia finished 6-1 in games contested at Scott Stadium in 2025. The Cavaliers' six home wins were their most in the previous 34 years.
- UVA played in four overtime contests in 2025 and achieved a 3-1 in such games. The Cavaliers knocked off then-No. 8 Florida State in double overtime, and on the road at both Louisville and North Carolina. UVA's lone overtime loss came at the hands of Duke in the ACC championship game.
- UVA was 16th in the final AP poll, its highest ranking since 1995 and first appearance in the final poll since 2004. The Cavaliers were also ranked in each of the six College Football Playoff rankings for the first time ever.
- Behind one of the league's best offensive lines, UVA tailback J'Mari Taylor finished as the ACC's regular-season leading rusher with 997 yards.

**PROTECT THE BALL, PROTECT THE QB**

- Virginia head coach **Tony Elliott** has said that the ball and the quarterback “are the program,” underscoring the central role both play in a team’s success.
- UVA did not turn the ball over in its 34-8 season-opening win over NC State (8/29).
- In 2025, UVA tied for 13th nationally in fumbles lost (4). The Cavaliers entered Week 12 against Wake Forest (Nov. 8) as one of two teams nationally to not lose a fumble, but lost three in that game.
- UVA finished third in the ACC in turnovers lost per game (14).
- The Cavaliers did not allow a sack in five games last season, including their first three, which marked the first time since 2011 that UVA went three consecutive games without giving up a sack.

CAVALIERS REFORTIFY ON BYE WEEKS

- Under fifth-year head coach **Tony Elliott**, Virginia is 6-0 all-time in games immediately following an idle week.
- Two of those wins came on the road against ranked opponents, highlighted by a victory over then-No. 10 North Carolina — the highest-ranked road win in program history.
- UVA will look to defeat Norfolk State (9/11) and Cal (11/14) at Scott Stadium following its pair of bye weeks in 2026.

MORE ON THE 2026 SLATE

- For the second consecutive season, Virginia will play seven home games at Scott Stadium in 2026, including five ACC contests.
- Of UVA’s 12 opponents, six (NC State, Delaware, SMU, Duke, Wake Forest and Cal) appeared in a bowl game in 2025. All except for Cal won their bowl games.
- The Hoos will host two first-time opponents, Norfolk State (Sept. 11) and Delaware (Sept. 26).
- In 2025, UVA posted a 5-3 record against teams it will face again in 2026 with wins over Cal, Duke, North Carolina, Florida State and Virginia Tech.
- The Cavaliers host Duke and North Carolina at Scott Stadium in the same season for the first time since 2020, when UVA won both contests.

THIRTY-ONE (31) NEW CAVALIER TRANSFERS

- This offseason, head coach **Tony Elliott** and his staff added 31 transfers to the 2026 roster.
- Of the 31 newest transfers, 13 play offense, 16 play defense, and two are long snappers.

- Virginia leads the nation with 31 combined players in at least their fifth year of college (16 5th-years, six sixth-years, eight seventh-years and one eighth-year).
- UVA’s lone eighth-year is returner **Ja’Maric Morris** (DB), while its seventh-years include returners **Drake Metcalf** (OL), **Monroe Mills** (OL) and **Daniel Sparks** (P), and transfers **Nnanna Anyanwu** (DE), **Kervins Choute** (DL), **Darrion Henry-Young** (DT) and **Lukas Ungar** (TE).
- The Cavaliers’ group of sixth-year players includes **Tyson Davis** (WR), **Noah Josey** (OL), **Jalen McNair** (S), **Makilan Thomas** (OL) and **Justin Townsend** (DL).
- Of UVA’s sixth-, seventh- and eighth-year players, Josey is the only Cavalier who has played at UVA for the entirety of his college career. This year marks Sparks’ fifth season in Charlottesville.
- In 2025, Virginia was the only FBS program with 19 combined sixth- and seventh-year players.
- Additionally, UVA and Colorado were the only two FBS schools with three seventh-year players on their 2025 rosters.

COMMITMENT TO ACADEMICS

- At his introductory press conference head coach **Tony Elliott** stated, "I chose UVA because I wanted to lead a program that was partnered with a university that had world-class academics. I wanted to be able to recruit the best and the brightest student-athletes ... I wanted to be part of a university and athletic department that would not compromise its values to win."
- "My vision for the UVA football program is to become the model in college football, the model program in college football," Elliott said. "My goal is to contribute to changing the narrative in college football and demonstrate that you can win at the highest level and you can do so while achieving excellence in education, leadership and service."
- In 2002, Elliott earned his bachelor's degree in industrial engineering from Clemson, where he was a first-team All-ACC Academic selection and a CoSIDA Academic District III member. He was also a recipient of the ACC's Weaver-James-Corrigan Postgraduate Scholarship.

CARLA WILLIAMS ON CFP COMMITTEE

- On Feb. 8, 2024, Virginia Director of Athletics **Carla Williams** was named to the College Football Playoff (CFP) Management Committee.
- As a member of the committee, Williams began a three-year term beginning in the spring of 2024.
- “Carla is an outstanding advocate for college football and will be a knowledgeable, passionate and valuable member of the College Football Playoff Selection Committee,” said ACC Commissioner Jim Phillips. “Throughout her time at Virginia as well as her entire career, Carla has consistently shown to be a tremendous leader.”
- Williams was appointed Director of Athletics at UVA in October 2017, making history as the first female Director of Athletics at UVA and the first African American female athletics director at a Power Five conference institution.
- During her time in Charlottesville, UVA teams have captured 12 national titles across numerous sports, including the 2019 men’s basketball title, 2019 and 2021 men’s lacrosse titles, six consecutive women’s swimming and diving championships from 2021-26, and men’s tennis titles in 2022, 2023 and 2026.
- Additionally, UVA entered the 2026-27 academic year having won won 26 total ACC Championships during Williams’ tenure at Virginia.
- Williams was a three-year starter and All-SEC guard for the Georgia women’s basketball team from 1987-89. Williams then served as an assistant coach for the team before moving into administration as UGA’s assistant director of compliance for a year before taking administrative roles at Florida State and Vanderbilt.

ACC SCHEDULE FORMAT

- Beginning in 2026, the ACC introduced a new schedule structure through a transitional season designed to balance competitive equity, honor existing non-conference game contracts and account for the league’s unique 17-team footprint. Twelve teams (including UVA) will play a 9+1 schedule (nine ACC games plus at least one Power Four non-conference opponent) while five teams will play an 8+2 schedule (eight ACC games paired with at least two Power Four non-conference matchups).
- Starting in 2027, 16 teams will play a nine-game ACC schedule, with one team playing eight league games while scheduling two Power Four non-conference opponents to fulfill the league’s required minimum of 10 P4 games.

- Signal caller **Beau Pribula** transferred to Virginia in January 2026 after stops at Missouri (2025) and Penn State (2022-24), bringing a wealth of high-level college football experience to Charlottesville.
- After winning the starting job for the Tigers during fall camp, he started in all 10 games he appeared in last season .
- Pribula finished third in the SEC in completion percentage (67.4%) and passed for 1,941 yards and 11 TDs, while rushing for six more scores.
- He earned Maxwell Award National Player of the Week, Davey O'Brien "Great Eight", and PFF National Team of the Week honors following a 334-yard, three-touchdown performance against Kansas (Sept. 6, 2025).

HAPPY VALLEY

- In three seasons at Penn State, Pribula appeared in 24 games from 2023-24 while backing up Drew Allar and carving out a role as one of the nation's most effective change-of-pace quarterbacks.
- Pribula helped the Nittany Lions to multiple New Year's Six bowl appearances and the College Football Playoff (CFP) before transferring to Missouri for the 2025 season.
- He also accounted for 19 touchdowns as a Nittany Lion, including 10 rushing TDs.

PENNSYLVANIA PRODUCT

- A native of York, Pennsylvania, Pribula starred at Central York High School, where he became one of the state's top quarterback prospects.
- He finished his prep career with more than 6,000 yards of total offense and earned all-state recognition while leading Central York to multiple playoff appearances.
- Pribula was rated among Pennsylvania's top recruits before signing with Penn State.

YOU DON'T KNOW BEAU

- Known for his athleticism, Pribula has proven capable of making plays through the air and with his legs.
- He was frequently utilized in short-yardage and red-zone situations at Penn State, developing a reputation for extending drives and finishing possessions.
- His versatility gives Virginia an experienced quarterback capable of stressing defenses in multiple ways.

FOOTBALL FAMILY

- Beau's father, Tad, was a four-year letterwinner at wide receiver at Shippensburg. Tad later went into college administration serving as the Director of Athletics at Shippensburg from 1982-2001 before being inducted into the Shippensburg Athletic Hall of Fame (2002), Chester County Sports of Hall of Fame (2013) and West Chester Halls of Fame.
- His older brother, Cade, also played quarterback collegiately at Delaware and Sacred Heart, while his younger brother, Ty, is a quarterback at Penn State.
- His grandfather, Jim Pribula, was an AP All-American at West Chester before serving as Shippensburg's athletic director from 1982-2001.
- His aunt, Shari (Pribula) Schalge lettered two years in field hockey at Penn State (1984-85).

PROGRAM CHANGER

- Head coach Tony Elliott labeled Robinson a "program-changer" and a "diamond in the rough" for Virginia's recruiting efforts.
- He was a coveted four-star prospect. Robinson was also ranked as the No. 8 overall recruit in the Commonwealth of Virginia.
- He honored his commitment to the Cavaliers over late recruiting pushes and official visits to traditional powers like Florida State and South Carolina, while also holding offers from Penn State and Tennessee.
- During the recruiting process, Virginia's staff made him such a priority that eight UVA coaches attended one of his high school basketball games.

ESSEX EXCELLENCE

- A multi-sport star at Essex High School in Tappahannock, Virginia, Robinson excelled in football, basketball, and baseball.
- He rarely left the football field during his high school career. Robinson featured as a linebacker, wide receiver, kick returner, and even punted.



CLUTCH CAVALIER

- Robinson earned Third-Team All-ACC honors in 2025 following a spectacular junior campaign.
- He developed a reputation for game-altering plays in 2025. Robinson recorded a game-winning safety in a 22-20 victory against Washington State.
- Two weeks later, he sealed a 31-21 road win at Cal with a 35-yard interception return for a touchdown with just 34 seconds remaining.
- In 2023 as a true freshman, Robinson was an immediate force. He racked up 71 total tackles, 4.5 tackles for loss, two interceptions, and a touchdown.

DO-IT-ALL DEFENDER

- Before suffering a season-ending torn ACL in Week 12 against Duke last season, Robinson compiled 64 tackles and two sacks in just eight games.
- He stuffed the 2025 stat sheet in all phases of the game. Robinson recorded two interceptions, two touchdowns, a fumble recovery, a pass deflection, and a blocked punt.
- He is targeting a Week 0 return for the 2026 season as he works his way back from injury.

Virginia Team Notes

- The official attendance for Saturday's season opener was 62,779, the eighth-largest crowd in UVA history and largest since the 2008 season opener against USC.
- The victory was No. 700 for the program. UVA became the 39th FBS team to reach 700 all-time wins.
- The Cavaliers snapped a four-game skid in the series with NC State. The win marked the Cavaliers' first victory over the Wolfpack since 2012 and first at Scott Stadium since 2006.
- UVA is 4-1 in season openers under head coach Tony Elliott and 3-0 in the month of August.
- The Cavaliers finished with 258 total rushing yards, which marked the fifth game of at least 250 rushing yards under Elliott, including second time against NC State (2024).
- Virginia's 23-play, 75-yard drive over the span of 12:15 in the fourth quarter set a pair of school records: the longest scoring drive by number of plays and longest scoring drive by time elapsed. The drive included four fourth-down conversions.
- UVA was 9-for-11 passing (81.8%), which marks its best completion percentage since 2018 (vs. Ohio-25-30) and best against a P5 opponent since 2004 (vs. North Carolina-13-16).
- Virginia's 11 pass attempts are the fewest in single-game history, dating back to 1995 (via Sports-Reference.com).
- The Cavalier defense held NC State to just 168 yards of total offense (76 rush, 89 pass). The 168 yards are the fewest by a Cavalier opponent since limiting VMI to 78 yards in 2013. It's also the fewest yards allowed versus a P4 opponent since 2006, when Duke had 100 (-21 rushing and 121 passing).
- NC State's offense averaged four plays and 16 yards per drive.
- The 89 yards passing by NC State Quarterback C.J. Bailey was his lowest output in 23 collegiate starts and the first time he was held under 100 yards passing.
- NC State did not score on its first eight possessions, including four three-and-outs.
- The Wolfpack's touchdown in the third quarter was the first against a UVA defense since the first drive of the Gator Bowl, a total of 96:57.
- Dating back to 2025, Virginia improved to 10-1 when forcing a turnover.

Virginia Individual Player Notes

- In his UVA debut, quarterback Beau Pribula rushed for a career-high 110 yards, including a long of 22. He averaged 7.3 yards per carry. His previous best was 78 yards at Arkansas last year, also his final game as a Missouri Tiger.
- The last UVA quarterback to rush for 100 yards was Brennan Armstrong in UVA's 2022 season opener against Richmond, when Armstrong had 105.
- Pribula (9-11/.818) is the first UVA starting QB since Bryce Perkins (21-26/.808) to complete at least 80% of his passes against a P5 opponent since 2018 (vs. Ga. Tech).
- Pribula is also the first UVA starting QB to record at least an 81.8 completion percentage against a P5 opponent since Marques Hagans (10-12/.833) did so on Sept. 11, 2004, against North Carolina, also his first career start at Scott Stadium.
- Xavier Brown recorded his fourth career rushing touchdown and first since a 4-yard score against William & Mary last season. Three of his four career rushing scores have come against ACC foes.
- The last two occasions a UVA player has rushed a touchdown and caught a touchdown in the same game have been by Xavier Brown (NC State-2026 & Pitt-2024).
- D'Shawn Martin tallied his fifth career touchdown on a 47-yard reception from Beau Pribula on UVA's first drive of the second half.
- Xay Davis recorded his first career touchdown. It capped UVA's 23-play, 75-yard drive in the fourth quarter.
- Brandyn Hillman intercepted the second pass of his career on a tipped ball at the line by Fisher Camac in the first quarter.
- Hillman forced a fumble on the UVA 7-yard line that was recovered by Landon Danley, his first fumble recovery of his career.
- Myles Brown finished with a team-high eight total tackles, all of which were assisted.
- Will Bettridge opened the scoring by matching a career long 47-yard field goal. He has 327 career points and is now five points behind UVA's all-time leader, Connor Hughes (2002-05).
- Daniel Sparks' final punt of the game traveled 63 yards, his 16th career punt of 60 or more yards, the most in UVA history.
