The 2025-26 season will be the 22nd year the Virginia men's golf program is under the direction of Bowen Sargent. His run with the Cavaliers has been the most successful period in the program's history. ACC champions, NCAA appearances, record-setting performances and academic excellence are all hallmarks of his program. He has watched numerous players go on to play in the professional ranks including the PGA Tour.

Virginia made history in 2025-26, capturing the program's first ever ACC Championship with a 3-2 victory over North Carolina in the match play final, overcoming the league's largest field. The veteran

laden Cavalier squad earned the ACC's automatic bid to the NCAA postseason and its 17th straight NCAA Regional Appearance, reserving a spot in the Reno Regional.

Senior Paul Chang became the second Cavalier ever to win a Regional, propelling UVA to its third-straight NCAA Championship appearance. After finishing the first of four stroke play rounds in 25th place, the Cavaliers mounted a monumental comeback and rose seventh place, qualifying for match play competition for the third-consecutive year. UVA became the only program in the country to reach NCAA match play in three-straight seasons (2023-25).

The Cavaliers ousted the defending national champion Auburn, 3-2 in to advance in the NCAA Championship Semifinal and then downed the 2023 NCAA champs, the Florida Gators 3-2 to advance to the program's first ever national championship match. The Cavaliers finished as the 2025 National Runner-up, falling to Oklahoma State in the finals, their first match play loss of the season.

For his efforts in 2025-26, Sargent was named the Golf Pride Grips East Region Coach of the Year for the first time, one of six coaches nationally to be recognized by the Golf Coaches Association of

America (GCAA) as well as the ACC Coach of the Year for the first time since 2010. Sargent was also one of five finalists for the Dave Williams Award which annually honors the National Coach of the Year.

Five Cavaliers earned Ping East All-Region honors and Ben Hogan Award finalist, Ben James, was named a first team All-American for the third-consecutive season, the first Cavalier in program history to accomplish the feat.

The 2024 season featured the second year in a row where Sargent led the team back to the NCAA match play championship. UVA finished stroke play in third place in 2024. Also for the second straight season, the Cavaliers fell to the eventual national champions.

At the 2024 NAAs, Sargent saw Ben James finish as a runner-up, the high finish ever by a Cavalier in stroke play. James along with George and Josh duangmanee all earned All-America honors, marking the first time in program history UVA has had three All-Americans in a single season.

In 2024, Sargent became the first UVA mens' golf coach to hold the position of Tony Markel Family Men's Golf Head Coach thanks to a commitment of \$3 million to endow the position.

In 2022-23, Sargent led UVA to the most successful season in program history to that point. UVA reached the quarterfinals of match play at the NCAA championships after a seventh-place finish in stroke play. UVA lost to eventual national champion Florida 3-2. Sargent saw UVA first-year Ben James win the Phil Mickelson Award as the nation's outstanding freshman player while also earning First-Team All-America honors.

Over the course of the 2022-23 season, the Cavaliers picked up wins at the season-opening Streamsong Invitational and the Hamptons Intercollegiate. UVA finished third or better in eight of 12 tournaments during the season and set a school record at the Streamsong Invitational, shooting 56-under 808. The Cavaliers bookended that accomplishment by posting their best-ever score (-45, 819) and finish (third) at a NCAA regional site. Virginia reached the match play portion of the ACC championships for the first time since the format was adopted in 2021.

In 2021-22, the Cavaliers made their 14th consecutive appearance in the post-season, capping a campaign that saw UVA open the season with a win at the Hamptons Intercollegiate. During the spring campaign, the Cavaliers won their own Lewis Chitengwa Memorial Tournament, the first held at Birdwood Golf Course since its renovation.

Sargent also added another first for the program when UVA inked the nation's top recruiting class that featured the top-ranked junior in Ben James and Bryan Lee, who was ranked no. 5 at the time he signed with the Cavaliers.

In 2021, playing just a spring schedule, the Cavaliers qualified for the postseason for the 13th consecutive season, competing at the NCAA regional in Kingston Springs, Tenn. That came on the heels of having the 2020 season end prematurely due to the covid-19 pandemic.

The 2021 squad was named a Golf Coaches Association of America All-Academic Team. The Cavaliers were among only 41 Division I programs to earn President's Special Recognition status for having a team grade point average of 3.5 or better. A total of four UVA players were named to the 2021 All-ACC academic team and the Srixon/Cleveland golf All-America Scholars and 10 earned ACC honor roll accolades.

In 2020, a total of five of his players were named to the ACC Academic Honor Roll after eight received the honor in 2019.

In 2019, the team participated in the NCAA Stanford Regional. That came on the heels of UVA finishing second at the ACC championships, matching the best showing at the league championship in the history of the program at the time.

That same year senior Thomas Walsh picked up National Academic honors for the second consecutive season in addition to earning all-ACC Accolades

for a second straight season. As a junior, Walsh became the second UVA golfer in as many years to win the ACC individual championship and the third under Sargent's watch. Walsh did more than just hoist the medalist trophy, he shot 16-under 200, the lowest score in the rich history of the tournament.

UVA took top honors at the Palmetto Intercollegiate in 2018, marking the 13th-consecutive season Virginia won a tournament title. The victory was the 21st for Sargent with the Cavaliers.

The 2017 campaign went down as one of the most memorable in Virginia's history. In addition to finishing a program-best 10th at the NAAs, the Cavaliers saw three players earn All-America honors and produced the ACC individual champion and the league's Scholar-Athlete of the Year.

Senior Jimmy Stanger picked up the last two honors en route to becoming the first PING First-Team All-American in UVA history. He was joined in the All-America ranks by classmate Derek Bard and sophomore Thomas Walsh.

Stanger was a member of the victorious 2017 Palmer Cup team and joined at the U.S. Amateur Championships by Bard and UVA freshman Ashton Poole.

During the 2017 season, UVA won four of its first five tournaments and reached the no. 1 ranking in the golfstat standings for the first time in its history. He was named the 2017 Coach of the Year by the Virginia State Golf Coaches Association. It marked the sixth time in his career to receive the honor.

In 2016, the Cavaliers advanced to the NCAA championships, placing 22nd as Bard turned in a top-20 performance and later earned third-team all-america honors. Bard was joined on the All-ACC team by Stanger.

Bard was named to the Palmer Cup during the season and also competed as one of six amateur players at The Masters in addition to playing at the U.S. Open and U.S. Amateur Championships.

UVA placed 18th at the 2015 NCAA championships and senior Denny McCarthy competed in the individual championships for the fourth time in his career. McCarthy, a three-time All-American, became the first player in UVA history to earn all-ACC honors all four seasons of their career.

In 2014, McCarthy finished sixth at the NCAA championships. Later that summer he played in the British Amateur Championship, reached the semifinals of the U.S. Amateur Championship and helped the United States win the World Team Amateur Championship in Japan.

In the summer of 2015, McCarthy finished 42nd at the U.S. Open.

The 2014 season was highlighted by three tournament titles, none more impressive than UVA's record-setting showing at the Jim West Intercollegiate in McKinney, Texas. The Cavaliers shot 45-under 819 to run away with the tournament title. Virginia's score was the second best against par ever by an ACC program. Playing on a TPC network course, the Hoos' performance topped the school's previous best scoring mark by 23 strokes.

Sargent witnessed Ben Rusch capture the 2012 ACC individual crown to become the first Cavalier to win the ACC championship since 1955. That same season McCarthy was named the ACC Freshman of the Year and senior Ben Kohles crushed the program's all-time tournament scoring record, shooting 18-under 198 to win the Chris Schenkel Invitational.

Later that summer, Kohles, a collegiate All-American, drew the attention of the golf world when he won his first two professional tournaments on the web.com tour and earned his PGA Tour card.

In 2011, Virginia won three tournaments, was the runner-up in two other events and participated in the NCAA East Regional. Kohles repeated as the ACC Player of the Year.

In 2010, UVA made its third consecutive appearance at the NCAA Championships, one of just 12 teams in the 30-squad field to accomplish that achievement. Virginia tied for 11th overall, just one stroke out of a playoff for the final berth in the event's match play segment. The finish matched the best ever for a UVA squad at the national championships and was the best since regional qualifying was used to determine the championship field.

During the 2009-10 campaign, UVA placed in the top five in 11 of 13 tournaments and capped its season by being ranked no. 12 in the final GolfStat poll.

UVA was second at the ACC championships, the team's best showing since 1996, won the Cavalier

Classic and saw Kohles, a sophomore, named the ACC's co-Player of the Year. Kohles was later recognized as the sixth All-American in the program's history.

His conference peers recognized Sargent's achievements when they voted him the 2010 ACC Coach of the Year.

During the 2008-09, Sargent's team used a strong showing in the spring to move on to postseason play. The Cavaliers won the Argonaut Invitational and placed second at both the Seminole Invitational and the Hootie @ Bulls Bay Tournament. Seeded ninth in the 14-team field at the NCAA East Regional, the Cavaliers cruised to a fourth-place finish, earning their second straight trip to the NCAA championships, placing 27th.

For his efforts, Sargent was recognized for the second consecutive year as the state of Virginia's Golf coach of the Year by his peers in the Commonwealth.

Sargent earned the honor a year earlier when the Cavaliers pulled off stunning rally at the 2008 NCAA East Regional Championships to return to the NAAs for the first time under his watch.

When Sargent was named UVA's head coach Aug. 31, 2004, he became the eighth person to direct the program in the last 30 years.

In Sargent's first year at UVA, the Cavaliers qualified for the NCAA east regional and placed 12th.

In 2006, the Cavaliers experienced some growing pains, failing to make a return trip to the NAAs. Virginia picked up its first win under Sargent when the Cavaliers won the Mason Rudolph Intercollegiate. Senior Brad Tilley ended the year on a high note by taking medalist honors at the Cavalier Classic thanks to a dramatic six-hole playoff victory.

In 2007, Sargent saw sophomore Conrad von Borsig earn All-ACC honors and the team finish the season on a positive note by winning the Cavalier Classic by a whopping 24 strokes.

In addition to returning to the NAAs for the first time since 2000, the Cavaliers won the Palmas Del Mar collegiate in Puerto Rico and the Cavalier Classic for the sixth time in the program's history. The team saved its best performance for the NCAA East Regional when it made up a nine-stroke deficit and jumped from 16th to 10th on the final day of the tourney to grab the final berth to the NAAs where UVA finished 26th.

Sargent took over the Cavalier program after working as an assistant coach at Tennessee for three seasons. He was intimately involved with the daily operations and recruiting efforts of the Volunteer program, in 2004, his last season at UT, Sargent became the second recipient of the Jan Strickland National Assistant Coach of the Year award. Presented by the Golf Coaches Association of America, the award is given annually to the assistant coach who, among other things, has excelled in working with their student-athletes both on the course and in the classroom. That season he helped the Volunteers to three tournament wins and a no. 12 final national ranking.

Prior to coaching at Tennessee, Sargent was a professional golfer for nine years from 1992 to 2000. He is credited with eight professional victories. He has since regained his amateur status and annually competes in several area events. Sargent's first coaching opportunity came at Vanderbilt when he worked as a volunteer assistant for the 1993-94 season.

A 1992 graduate of NC State, where he earned a bachelor's degree in communications, Sargent was a two-time Honorable Mention All-American. He received the honor in 1988 after his freshman year and in 1991 when he was a junior. He received all-ACC honors in 1990 and 1991.

The Wolfpack team captain in 1991, Sargent helped NC State to a 14th-place finish at the NCAA championships that season. The team also placed 14th during his junior campaign. He played at the NAAs during all four of his seasons with the Wolfpack. The team was 18th in 1988 and 23rd in 1989. During his junior campaign NC State won its first ACC title.

An outstanding student, he was the recipient of NC State's Tom Coffey Award for academic excellence during his senior season.





ASSISTANT COACH

DUSTIN GROVES



A native of Charlottesville, Dustin Groves joined the Virginia program as an assistant coach in August of 2022 and has played a critical role in the most successful three-season stretch in Virginia history. In addition to his administrative duties, Groves is a steady presence with the Cavaliers on the course.

UVA is the only program in college golf to reach match play at the NCAA Championships in each of the last three seasons. Groves helped the Cavaliers end a 70-year drought by capturing the program's first ever ACC Championship in 2025.

Under his watch, Ben James became the first ever three-time, first team All-American (2023, 2024, 2025) and won the 2023 Phil Mickelson Award as the nation's Outstanding Freshman Player.

In addition Paul Chang (2025), Josh Duangmanee (2024), George Duangmanee (2024) and Bryan Lee (2024) have garnered honorable mention All-America honors from multiple publications.

Before joining the UVA staff, Groves was very familiar with the Cavalier program. He was all-state performer while attending nearby Monticello High School and went on to be an all-conference player at Wake Forest.

At Wake Forest, Groves was a regular in the Demon Deacons' lineup his final three seasons. He led Wake Forest in stroke average (72.9) as a senior in 2009. That season he had four top-five finishes and earned All-Atlantic Coast Conference and PING all-Southeast Region honors. During his collegiate career, he played in the NCAA Championship in 2007, 2008 and 2009.

After graduating from Wake Forest, Groves remained in North Carolina and turned professional, playing on the eGolf and Web.com tours. He played five years on those circuits before taking on caddying duties with his former Demon Deacon teammate, Kyle Reifers from 2015 to 2017.

Groves played four years of high school golf at Monticello High School for coach Pam Bradley. He was named the Virginia State Golf

Association Junior Player of the Year in 2003.

Since returning to Charlottesville with his family in 2017, Groves has made quite an impact on the local golf scene. He won the Jefferson Cup in 2018 and 2021. Since 2020, he has made a pair third-place finishes at the VSGA Mid-Amateur Championships (2020, 2021) and a fifth-place finish at the 2021 VSGA Amateur.

Prior to joining the UVA program Groves worked as a real estate portfolio manager overseeing properties in Virginia and North Carolina. He also served as the manager for Whispering Meadow Farm.

Groves earned his undergraduate degree from Wake Forest in religion. His father, Larry, served as an associate dean of admissions at UVA. In 2020 he was voted the VSGA Volunteer of the Year. Dustin Groves and his wife Aislin, have two children - Lyal and Rory.





NCAA CHAMPIONSHIP HISTORY

The legacy of Virginia golf in the annals of NCAA Championship history is nearly as old as the event itself. The NCAA began tournament play in 1939, and the University of Virginia's Dixon Brooke was crowned as its national champion the next year.

Brooke, a junior from Birmingham, Ala., was not even the number-one golfer on the Cavalier squad when he headed for the Ekwanok course in Manchester, Vt. Nevertheless, the 20-year-old overcame more experienced competitors in battling from five strokes back, taking the 36-hole match by one stroke over Harry Haverstick of Swarthmore. Brooke's dramatic comeback caused The New York Times to report: "Seldom has there been a greater demonstration of courage than the Virginia junior gave today."

Led by Brooke, the Virginia squad tied for 15th place in the 1940 team competition. In 1946, Virginia posted its best NCAA result, finishing 11th in an 18-team field.

Dixon Brooke's legacy lives on in an endowed scholarship established by his family. In addition, the Dixon Brooke Award is given annually to the Cavalier golfer who best demonstrates leadership, cooperative spirit and unselfish service.


Since the 1990s, the Virginia golf program has again risen to national prominence. The Cavaliers have reached an NCAA Regional Tournament site in 18 of the last 20 championships, including each of the last 17 years. Virginia reached the NCAA Championships 10 times during that span. From 2023-25, Virginia was the only college golf program to reach match play at the NCAA Championships each year.

After defeating the previous two National Champions (Florida & Auburn), were the national runner-up after falling to Oklahoma State in the NCAA Championship Match Play final.

The Cavaliers have had eight players turn in top-10 finishes at NCAA stroke play. Ben James tied for second in stroke play as a sophomore in 2024, the highest finish by a Cavalier since Brooke in 1940.

In 2014, Denny McCarthy also placed sixth overall to cement All-America honors. His opening round 5-under 65 was the lowest gross single round score by a UVA competitor at the NAAs. McCarthy played in the NCAA Championships four times during his career.

Making its first appearance at NCAA Championships in six years, the 2023 squad turned in a 277 in the fourth round breaking the program's previous low mark of 280 in 2010 and advanced UVA to its first match play at NCAA Championships since the inception of the format in 2009.

The tournament's namesake, **Lewis Chitengwa**, was a two-time All-American at Virginia (1995, 1996) and earned All-ACC honors in 1995 when he was named the league's rookie of the year. He finished seventh at the 1996 NCAA Championships, at the time the best finish by a UVA performer in 50 years. During his four-year career he won two tournaments and recorded 17 top-10 finishes.

Chitengwa turned professional in 1998 and played on the Tear Drop, Buy.com and Canadian Tours in addition to competing at the PGA's St. Jude Memphis Classic. At the age of 26, he passed away as a result of meningitis. At the time, he was competing in the Canadian Tour's Edmonton Open. In 2015, he was recognized posthumously for his immense contribution to golf by being inducted into Mercedes-Benz Southern African Golf Hall of Fame.




BIRDWOOD GOLF COURSE



In the summer of 2020, Virginia's Birdwood Golf Course reopened after an extensive 18-month renovation. The UVA Foundation hired Davis Love III of the Love Golf Design team to develop and redesign the course. His plan included building a course that will challenge UVA's golf teams, meet the needs of 21st century golfers and provide a venue to host NCAA championship events. The redesigned Birdwood includes several new holes on 80 acres of previously unused property, redesigned original holes and the elimination of some original holes.

Taking advantage of the landscape to highlight the region's beautiful views of the neighboring Blue Ridge Mountains, Birdwood now features Zoysia fairways and V8 Bent greens.

Set on 573 acres in the foothills of the Blue Ridge Mountains and located approximately two miles from UVA's Rotunda, Birdwood Golf Course originally opened in 1984 and has consistently been ranked one of the nation's top-25 college courses by Golfweek. Following its reopen, it was rated the No. 7 course

for the Commonwealth of Virginia by Golf Magazine. In 2023, GolfDigest rated Birdwood the No. 12 college course in the nation. Golfweek gave it the same ranking in its 2022 review of the country's best college courses.

The project including a relocation of the UVA golf program's Oehmig Short Game Facility, creating a half-acre putting course and an entirely new par-3 short course to help reach a broader range of golfers.

Birdwood resides on the grounds of the spectacular Boar's Head Resort, which boasts 168 luxurious guest rooms along with a state-of-the-art sports club and a world-renowned racquet sports facility.

LEW OEHMIG SHORT-GAME PRACTICE AREA



In the summer of 2020, Virginia's new Lew Oehmig Short Game Facility opened as part of the renovation of Birdwood Golf Course. Its new location is directly adjacent to the Dean Golf Performance Center and more than doubles the size of its previous location at Birdwood.

With four practice greens, multiple hitting locations, targets and a variety of bunkers, it gives Cavalier golfers unlimited opportunities to enhance their games short games.

The facility is named for Lew Oehmig, a member of the Southern Golf Association's Hall of Fame and one of the most established amateur players in the sport's history.

At UVA, Oehmig was a National Intercollegiate co-medalist, as well as a semifinalist at the 1937 NCAA Championships. He captained the Cavaliers in 1938. He won the Tennessee State Amateur Championship eight times spanning five decades beginning in 1937 and the last in 1971. He was the Tennessee Senior Amateur Champion five times; Tennessee Open Low Amateur two times; a medalist in the Southern Amateur Championship in 1963 and a semifinalist in 1956. As a senior golfer, Oehmig was a finalist in the U. S. Senior Amateur Championship five times - winning in 1972 and 1976. He was the winner of the International Senior Championship in 1976 and served as Captain of the United States Walker Cup Team in 1977. He was elected as Captain of the U. S. World Cup team for 1982-1983.
