OPENING DRAW

GAME OVERVIEW

- Virginia returns home on Thursday night for an ACC tilt with Duke. Faceoff is set for 7 p.m.
- This week Virginia is ranked No. 4 in the USILA coaches poll and No. 3 in the Inside Lacrosse media poll. Duke is No. 3 in the coaches poll and No. 4 in the media poll.

THE SERIES VS. DUKE

- Thursday marks the 85th all-time meeting between the Cavaliers and Blue Devils, a series in which the Cavaliers own a 50-34 advantage since 1938. The 50 victories are the second most wins UVA has against an opponent in program history, but the Blue Devils have won 19 of the last 21 meetings, including the last 15 regular season meetings. Virginia's two wins in the series came in the 2010 ACC Tournament and the semifinals of the 2019 NCAA Tournament.
- UVA and Duke have different all-time series records due to the fluidity of when a program was a "varsity" sport up until the conclusion of WWII. UVA lists its "varsity only" record against Duke above.
- UVA won the last meeting between these two programs in double-overtime at Lincoln Financial Field in the 2019 NCAA Tournament on an Ian Laviano game-winning goal.

AITKEN IS AMONG A SPECIAL GROUP OF MIDFIELDERS

- Dox Aitken is No. 18 all-time in DI midfielder scoring with 166 career points. Full list on page No. 7.
- Aitken needs four assists to become the 17th midfielder in the history of the game at the DI level to record at least 100 career goals and 40 career assists.
- He is No. 4 all-time among ACC midfielders in career points.



Jeff Conner (right) tallied a career-high four goals at then-No. 3 North Carolina on April 10. In action over the last six games, Conner has nine goals and four assists on 17 shots. He has also picked up 11 ground balls over the last six games.

COVERING THE CAVALIERS

UNIQUELY UVA

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

UNIVERSITY NICKNAMES

Virginia's athletics teams have been accompanied by a somewhat confusing array of nicknames. The most prominent and widely accepted of these monikers are "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos."

Although the terms "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are used almost interchangeably to refer to University teams and players, "Cavaliers" is more often used by the media, while "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are frequently used by Virginia students and fans.

Legend has it that Washington & Lee baseball fans dubbed the Virginia players "Wahoos" during the fiercely contested rivalry that existed between the two in-state schools in the 1890s. By 1940, "Wahoos"

was in general use around Grounds to denote University students or events relating to them. The abbreviated "Hoos" sprang up later in student newspapers and has gained growing popularity in recent years.

THE CAVALIER MASCOT

The costumed Cavalier with a large character head debuted during Virginia's 1984 football season and has remained the official mascot of the University.

UNIVERSITY COLORS

Orange and blue were adopted as the University of Virginia's official athletic colors at a mass student meeting in 1888. UVA athletic teams had previously worn silver gray and cardinal red, but those colors did not stand out on muddy football fields, prompting a student movement to change them.

One of the students attending the mass meeting was Allen Potts, a star athlete who played on Virginia's first football team in 1888. Potts showed up at the meeting wearing a navy blue-and-orange scarf that he had acquired during a summer boating expedition at Oxford University. Orange and blue were chosen as the official athletic colors after one of Potts' fellow students pulled the scarf off Potts' neck and, waving it to the crowd, yelled, "How will this do?" UVA later served as the inspiration for schools like Auburn and Florida when they selected school colors.

WAH-HOO-WAH

The origin of "Wah-hoo-wah" is uncertain. The cheer was used to root on Virginia teams as early as 1890 and may have been borrowed from Dartmouth College, whose athletics teams were once known as the Indians.

Legend attributes the yell to Natalie Floyd Otey, who sang the ballad "Where'er You Are, There Shall My Love Be" at Charlottesville's Levy Opera House in 1893. The predominantly student audience noticed that Otey warbled the first three words of the song between each of the stanzas and decided to join in the refrain. By evening's end, goes the legend, the crowd had corrupted "Where'er You Are" into "Wah-hoo-wah."

The Levy Opera House stands at the corner of High Street and Park Street and has since been renovated into an office building.

THE SERIES VS. THE BLUE DEVILS

- Virginia leads the all-time series by a 50-34 margin, but Duke has won 19 of the last 21.
- Duke had won eight in a row before losing to UVA in the ACC Tournament on April 23, 2010, serving as the longest series winning streak since winning seven in a row from 1939-50. Duke went on to win the next 11 for its longest winning-streak of the series until Ian Laviano's double-overtime goal in the 2019 NCAA Tournament's semifinal round snapped the streak. The win over the Blue Devils in 2019 helped the Cavaliers' run to the 2019 NCAA title.
- UVA and Duke played three times in 2010. After UVA beat the Blue Devils in the 2010 ACC Tournament, Duke topped the Cavaliers in the 2010 NCAA semifinal round, 14-13, starting the recently snapped 11-game winning streak for the Blue Devils.
- The Cavaliers have defeated Duke more than any other team in school history but one (UNC-53).

TURNER AGAINST DUKE

- It was 14 years ago in the regular season that current UVA assistant coach Kip Turner made 20 saves against Duke in a 7-6 overtime loss in Durham, N.C., on April 14, 2017.

BATTLE AT THE FACEOFF-X ON THURSDAY

- Thursday night will be a battle between two of the nation's top faceoff men. UVA's Petey LaSalla is No. 8 in the nation with a winning mark of 65.9 percent. Duke's Jake Naso is No. 5 in the nation at 67.3 percent.

DUKE SHUTS DOWN THE CAVALIER OFFENSE

- Duke has been among the most powerful offenses in the country recently, but it has been the Blue Devil defense that has helped during the streak of 19 wins over last 21 meetings with UVA.
- The Cavaliers reached double figures in 34-of-35 meetings from 1962-98, but have scored 10+ in just 16 of the last 31.
- Virginia reached double digits once during the former eight-game losing streak to Duke (2009 regular season).
- Prior to the regular season loss in 2009, the last time Virginia scored at least 10 goals occurred in a 13-4 win in 2004, which also represented UVA's last victory until a 16-12 triumph on April 23, 2010 in the ACC Tournament in College Park, Md.
- During the recent 11-game losing streak, UVA did manage double figures in seven of the 11 losses.

LAST MEETING: UVA 13, DUKE 12 - 2OT (2019 NCAA SEMIFINALS)

- The No. 3 national seeded Virginia Cavaliers advanced to the NCAA title game for the first time since 2011 after disposing of the No. 2 national seeded Duke Blue Devils in double-overtime, 13-12, the last time these teams met.
- The win snapped an 11-game losing streak to Duke that started in the 2010 NCAA semifinal round. Virginia advanced to the NCAA title game for the 10th time in program history.
- Matt Moore found Ian Laviano 51 seconds into the second overtime to send UVA to the NCAA title game. Virginia trailed by four goals (8-4) in the third quarter and trailed by two scores with 47 seconds left (12-10). But Michael Kraus scored with 46 seconds left, while Laviano sent the game to overtime with a score with 15 seconds left in regulation, courtesy of a Moore assist.
- Faceoff specialist Petey LaSalla won the last eight faceoffs of the game, including the two in overtime. Neither team could break through in the first overtime as UVA took three shots and committed two turnovers, while Duke took four shots, two of which were saves by Alex Rode.
- Virginia struck first and led 2-1 after back-to-back goals by Ryan Conrad, the second coming on a Kraus assist with 4:55 left in the first quarter. Duke responded with four-straight goals and a 7-2 run to take the 8-4 lead with 7:03 left in the third quarter. UVA committed 13 turnovers in the first half that attributed to Duke's 5-2 halftime lead.
- At 6:55 LaSalla picked up a faceoff and streaked toward the goal, scoring to start the UVA comeback. Trailing 11-8 with 9:49 left, UVA received back-to-back goals from Dox Aitken to bring UVA within one goal, 11-10, with 7:55 left.
- Kevin Quigley from Duke pushed one through as the shot clock expired with 1:56 left to give the Blue Devils a two-goal cushion, 12-10. LaSalla won back-to-back faceoffs that led to the tying of the game in regulation.

UVA ON THE GREEN GRASS OF KLÖCKNER

- Virginia owns a 156-41 (.7919) all-time record at Klöckner Stadium, including a 5-1 mark in 2021 and are winners of 17 of last 20 played in the historic edifice. UVA also is 12-3 all-time at Klöckner Stadium in the NCAA Tournament.
- UVA is 29-9 all-time at Klöckner Stadium under head coach Lars Tiffany.
- Klöckner Stadium first hosted lacrosse in 1993.

JEFF CONNER HEATING UP

- After appearing in only one of UVA's first three games, Jeff Conner has seen more time and is heating up.
- In action over the last six games, Conner has nine goals and four assists on 17 shots. He has also picked up 11 ground balls over the last six games.
- He notched a career-high four goal on April 10 at No. 3 UNC.

CAVALIERS BETTER IN THE CLEARING GAME OF LATE

- After a troublesome start in the clearing game, UVA has been much better of late, including 91.4 percent (53-of-58) over the last two games (at Notre Dame, vs. Richmond, at North Carolina).
- Over the last five games, which includes ACC games vs. UNC (x2) and at Notre Dame, UVA is clearing at 86.8 percent (79-of-91).
- UVA started the season (first six games) clearing just 79.4 percent.

- LaSalla is No. 1 in the nation with 182 faceoff wins and No. 1 in faceoffs taken (276).

The No. 5 Virginia Cavaliers (1-0) used a seven-goal second quarter to distance themselves from the Towson Tigers (0-1), 20-11, at Klöckner Stadium.

Connor Shellenberger scored seven points on four goals and three assists in his collegiate debut. Payton Cormier added a career-high six goals and one assist, while graduate transfer Charlie Bertrand notched four goals and two assists in his UVA debut.

HOW IT HAPPENED

UVA scored 52 seconds into the game to take an early 1-0 lead on an unassisted Shellenberger score. Towson rebounded with a 4-1 spurt to take a 4-2 lead with 6:26 left in the first frame. Cormier broke through with his first goal at 3:50 in the first quarter to jumpstart a 7-0 Cavalier run, pushing the Cavaliers ahead for good. The No. 3 Virginia Cavaliers (2-0) picked up a key non-conference home win over the No. 12 Army West Point Black Knights (0-1), 14-9. The contest was played at the Lower Turf practice field due to field conditions at Klöckner Stadium.
