OPENING DRAW

GAME OVERVIEW

- Virginia earned an at-large bid to the NCAA Tournament as the No. 4 seed, hosting Bryant, champions of the NEC, at Klöckner Stadium on Sunday. Faceoff is set for 12 p.m.
- This week Virginia is ranked No. 5 in the USILA coaches and Inside Lacrosse media polls. Bryant is ranked No. 19 in both the coaches and media poll.

THE SERIES VS. BRYANT

- The Cavaliers and Bulldogs are meeting for the second time in series history and for the first time in the NCAA Tournament.
- UVA beat Bryant in its first-ever DI game in 2009. The Cavaliers beat the Bulldogs, 10-4, at Klöckner Stadium.
- UVA is facing the NEC champion in the NCAA Tournament for the second tournament in a row. UVA's run to the 2019 NCAA title started with a 19-10 win over Robert Morris.
- UVA is 2-0 all-time against the NEC in the NCAA Tournament, a conference that started full men's lacrosse play in 2011.

VIRGINIA IN THE NCAA

- This is Virginia's 40th NCAA Championships appearance.
- Only Johns Hopkins (47 times) and Maryland (43 times) has been to the tournament more times than the Cavaliers.
- Virginia has a 52-33 all-time playoff record and is fourth in tournament wins behind Johns Hopkins (71), Syracuse (65) and Maryland (63).



Matt Moore enters Sunday with 24 career points in the NCAA Tournament on 12 goals and 12 assists. His 4.80 points per NCAA Tournament game ranks No. 3 all-time in program history for a career. He was named to the All-ACC team this week for the second time in his career.

COVERING THE CAVALIERS

UNIQUELY UVA

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

UNIVERSITY NICKNAMES

Virginia's athletics teams have been accompanied by a somewhat confusing array of nicknames. The most prominent and widely accepted of these monikers are "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos."

Although the terms "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are used almost interchangeably to refer to University teams and players, "Cavaliers" is more often used by the media, while "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are frequently used by Virginia students and fans.

Legend has it that Washington & Lee baseball fans dubbed the Virginia players "Wahoos" during the fiercely contested rivalry that existed between the two in-state schools in the 1890s. By 1940, "Wahoos"

was in general use around Grounds to denote University students or events relating to them. The abbreviated "Hoos" sprang up later in student newspapers and has gained growing popularity in recent years.

THE CAVALIER MASCOT

The costumed Cavalier with a large character head debuted during Virginia's 1984 football season and has remained the official mascot of the University.

UNIVERSITY COLORS

Orange and blue were adopted as the University of Virginia's official athletic colors at a mass student meeting in 1888. UVA athletic teams had previously worn silver gray and cardinal red, but those colors did not stand out on muddy football fields, prompting a student movement to change them.

One of the students attending the mass meeting was Allen Potts, a star athlete who played on Virginia's first football team in 1888. Potts showed up at the meeting wearing a navy blue-and-orange scarf that he had acquired during a summer boating expedition at Oxford University. Orange and blue were chosen as the official athletic colors after one of Potts' fellow students pulled the scarf off Potts' neck and, waving it to the crowd, yelled, "How will this do?" UVA later served as the inspiration for schools like Auburn and Florida when they selected school colors.

WAH-HOO-WAH

The origin of "Wah-hoo-wah" is uncertain. The cheer was used to root on Virginia teams as early as 1890 and may have been borrowed from Dartmouth College, whose athletics teams were once known as the Indians.

Legend attributes the yell to Natalie Floyd Otey, who sang the ballad "Where'er You Are, There Shall My Love Be" at Charlottesville's Levy Opera House in 1893. The predominantly student audience noticed that Otey warbled the first three words of the song between each of the stanzas and decided to join in the refrain. By evening's end, goes the legend, the crowd had corrupted "Where'er You Are" into "Wah-hoo-wah."

The Levy Opera House stands at the corner of High Street and Park Street and has since been renovated into an office building.

VIRGINIA AS THE TOURNEY'S NO. 4 SEED

- Virginia is the No. 4 seed in the NCAA Championship for the fourth time in program history.
- This is the first time since 2005 that UVA has been the tournament's No. 4 seed.
- UVA is 4-4 all-time as the No. 4 seed, including reaching Championship Weekend in 2005.
- UVA has been the No. 4 seed in 2005, 1985, 1984 and 1979.

VIRGINIA VS. THE TOURNAMENT FIELD

- Virginia is 4-4 against teams in the 2021 NCAA Tournament field.
- UVA owns wins over High Point, Loyola, North Carolina and Notre Dame. UVA has lost to Duke, North Carolina and Syracuse (2).

UVA ON THE GREEN GRASS OF KLÖCKNER

- Virginia owns a 157-43 (.7850) all-time record at Klöckner Stadium, including a 6-3 mark in 2021 and are winners of 18 of last 23 played in the historic edifice. UVA also is 12-3 all-time at Klöckner Stadium in the NCAA Tournament.
- UVA is 30-11 all-time at Klöckner Stadium under head coach Lars Tiffany.
- Klöckner Stadium first hosted lacrosse in 1993.

THE SERIES VS. THE BULLDOGS

- Brian Carroll tied his career high with three goals and goalkeeper Adam Ghitelman made 12 saves to propel Virginia to a 10-4 victory over Bryant on Feb. 16, 2009 at Klöckner Stadium, the only time these two teams met in lacrosse.
- The 2009 game was Bryant's first-ever game at the Division I level and came 48 hours after UVA opened the 2009 season with a victory against Drexel.
- After a back-and-forth opening six minutes, the Cavaliers scored two goals one-and-a-half minutes apart through the first quarter to take the lead they would never relinquish.
- Then-freshman Steele Stanwick opened the scoring at the 8:54 mark by converting a nice pass from Danny Glading into the first of his two goals. A minute later midfielder Max Pomper found Steve Giannone cutting toward the goal and hit him with a nice lead pass for an easy goal to give the Cavaliers a 2-0 lead.
- Attackman Kevin Hoagland, Bryant's leading returning scorer from 2008, tallied the first of his two goals with less than five minutes to play in the first quarter to cut Virginia's lead in half.
- The Cavaliers answered with four goals over the next 10 minutes to build a 6-1 lead midway through the second quarter. Carroll scored twice during the run, while John Haldy and Glading scored once. The teams traded goals the rest of the half with Virginia enjoying an 8-3 advantage at halftime.
- Bryant matched Virginia shot for shot (19) in the first half, but only scored three times as Ghitelman consistently turned Bulldog shots aside. He made seven of his 12 saves in the first half.
- While Ghitelman's play certainly highlighted an outstanding effort by the Cavalier defense, he also got tremendous performances from the defenders in front of him. Ken Clausen snared a career-high 10 ground balls and caused four turnovers, while Matt Kelly and longstick midfielder Mike Timms each finished with three ground balls. Ryan Nizolek held Zack Greer, the former NCAA's all-time leading goal scorer, to just two assists while missing all five shot attempts. In five previous games against Virginia while playing at Duke, Greer scored 13 goals on just 25 shots.

UVA HAS A 22-DAY LAYOFF BETWEEN GAMES

- UVA last played on April 24 against Syracuse. UVA is set to play 22 days later, which is tied for the longest break between a UVA regular season finale and the NCAA Tournament. The 1997 season also saw 22 days (April 26-May 18).
- UVA also had 21 day breaks in 1980, 1995 and 1996.

PRESSLER, UVA AND TIFFANY CONNECTIONS

- Bryant head coach Mike Pressler has multiple connections with the Commonwealth of Virginia and UVA.
- Pressler is a 1982 graduate of Washington & Lee down in Lexington and faced UVA each of his four seasons in college, going 0-4 against the Cavaliers.
- He was the head coach at VMI for one season (1983) and later developed a close friendship with former UVA head coach and hall of famer Dom Starsia.
- Lars Tiffany faced Pressler's Bryant team eight times while he was at Brown (2009-16), which includes the first eight seasons of Bryant's DI era. Bryant beat Tiffany's 2016 team in Providence, 11-10, in overtime. It was one of Brown's three losses during its 2016 Final Four season.
- Tiffany was a former assistant (1997-98) at Pressler's alma mater, Washington & Lee.

UNIQUE BYRANT CONNECTION WITH UVA

- Bryant's starting goalie, Luke Caracciolo, hails from Centreville, Va., and is the younger brother of UVA football's Danny Caracciolo. UVA's Caracciolo came to UVA in 2020 as a long snapper after playing football and men's lacrosse at Bryant for two seasons (2018-19 and 2019-20 academic years).
- UVA's Caracciolo was on JMU's FCS National Championship squad in 2016.

CORMIER AND SHELLENBERGER CREATING OFFENSE

- A/M Payton Cormier leads the team with 37 goals in through 14 games. He had 12 goals in UVA's six games in 2020. Cormier also has at least a hat-trick in 10 of his 20 career games. Cormier is No. 9 in the nation with 37 goals.
- A/M Connor Shellenberger is off to a productive start in his career. He leads the team in points with 55. Shellenberger dished out at least two assists in 11 of UVA's 14 games, including a career-high four against Air Force. MILESTONES REACHED AGAINST UTAH ON APRIL 17

- Charlie Bertrand, one of two active lacrosse player in the nation with at least 200 career goals (230), scored his 300th collegiate point against the Utes. He is currently No. 4 among active players with 302 career points, behind Duke's Michael Sowers (369), Fairfield's Matt Chlastawa (310) and UNC's Chris Gray (307).
- With two assists against the Utes, Matt Moore became the fifth Cavalier in program history with 100 career goals and 100 career assists. He joined Kevin Pehlke, Danny Glading, Steele Stanwick and Michael Kraus. He also became the 10th Cavalier to reach 100 career assists.
- Dox Aitken and Jared Conners passed Bray Malphrus (71) for the UVA career record for games played, which now stands at 73.
- Petey LaSalla won 20 faceoffs against the Utes, giving the midfielder his fourth career game with 20+ faceoff wins. That is a career UVA record that was previously held by Justin Schwenk (3).

SAUSTAD HAS BEEN STEADY

- D Cade Saustad has been steady in 2021 after returning to the fold from an injury that kept him out in 2020.
- Saustad held Notre Dame's Pat Kavanagh to only two assists on March 27, one of which came on EMO.
- He held UNC's Chris Gray mostly in check on April 10, allowing two goals and an assist while guarding him straight up.
- He guarded Duke's Michael Sowers, keeping him somewhat in check most of the night.
- For the season he has 26 GBs and 13 CTs.

LASALLA AND CONNERS PICKING UP THE GB

- UVA's Petey LaSalla is No. 7 in the nation with 110 ground balls. LSM Jared Conners is No. 19 with 70 ground balls, which is No. 1 among LSMs. Duke's Tyler Carpenter (60) trails Conners by 10 GBs.
- GK Alex Rode leads the nation's goalies with 42 ground balls.

LASALLA GETTING THE WIN AT THE FACEOFF X

- Petey LaSalla won a career-high 26 faceoffs (38 attempts) at UNC on April 10. It marks the first time in program history a Cavalier has won 20+ faceoffs in a game at least three times in the same season.
- LaSalla previously won a career-high 23 faceoffs (28 attempts) against Robert Morris on March 20. It marked the first time in program history a Cavalier won 20+ faceoffs in back-to-back games. He previously won 21 faceoffs against then-No. 1 North Carolina on March 11. His 20 wins (26 attempts) against Utah gave LaSalla a fourth game in 2021 with 20+ wins, giving him the most career 20+ faceoff win games in program history.
- He joins former teammate, Justin Schwenk, as the only Cavaliers to win 20+ faceoffs in a game multiple times during a career.
- LaSalla faced Notre Dame's Kyle Gallagher on March 27, who was No. 1 in the nation with an 85.1 percent winning percentage entering the game. LaSalla won 11-of-21 against Gallagher and was 13-of-25 in the game, gaining a slight advantage.
- LaSalla faced Duke's Jake Naso on April 15 who entered the game No. 5 in the nation in faceoff winning percentage (67.3). Naso had a season low of 40 percent (8-of-20).
- LaSalla is No. 7 in the nation with a 64.1 percent winning mark (221-of-345). If you remove the 12-of-46 showing vs. Syracuse, LaSalla is winning at a 69.9 percent clip against all other opponents.
- LaSalla is No. 2 in the nation with 221 faceoff wins and No. 1 in faceoffs taken (345).

The No. 5 Virginia Cavaliers (1-0) used a seven-goal second quarter to distance themselves from the Towson Tigers (0-1), 20-11, at Klöckner Stadium.

Connor Shellenberger scored seven points on four goals and three assists in his collegiate debut. Payton Cormier added a career-high six goals and one assist, while graduate transfer Charlie Bertrand notched four goals and two assists in his UVA debut.

HOW IT HAPPENED

UVA scored 52 seconds into the game to take an early 1-0 lead on an unassisted Shellenberger score. Towson rebounded with a 4-1 spurt to take a 4-2 lead with 6:26 left in the first frame. The No. 3 Virginia Cavaliers (2-0) picked up a key non-conference home win over the No. 12 Army West Point Black Knights (0-1), 14-9. The contest was played at the Lower Turf practice field due to field conditions at Klöckner Stadium.

The Cavaliers won 10-of-13 first-half faceoffs to control possession and alleviate a first-time starter in goal, Bobby Gavin, from a strong Army attack. LaSalla was a perfect 10-of-10 in the second period from the faceoff X, helping seven-different Cavaliers score during the 8-0 run with Laviano the only UVA player to score twice during the streak. Dickson capped the run with 11:20 left in the third quarter.

The 8-0 run was part of a larger 13-2 run that spelled the difference in the game. A Will Cory unassisted goal with 5:38 left to play capped the run and the UVA scoring.

Despite strong offensive and defensive efficiency, the No. 5 Virginia Cavaliers dropped its final regular season game of the season, 13-11, to the No. 11 Syracuse Orange at Klöckner Stadium.

Syracuse faceoff specialist set the tone for the entire game, winning 24-of-27 draws to pace the Orange's significant possession advantage.

HOW IT HAPPENED

With the game tied early, 2-2, Syracuse started a 5-0 run with 24 seconds left in the first quarter to take a sizeable advantage. Owen Hiltz capped the run off an Owen Seebold pass with 9:32 left in the second quarter to give the Orange a 7-2 lead.

By the time UVA took another shot, Syracuse had already finished a 4-0 run to push its lead back up to five, 13-8. UVA tried one more push to get back in the game with a 3-0 run to finish the game. Bertrand scored back-to-back goals to make it 13-11, his second coming with 1:59 left to play on a Matt Moore helper. The Cavaliers were unable to get any closer and Syracuse closed out a key ACC win.
