OPENING DRAW

GAME OVERVIEW

- Virginia welcomes the North Carolina Tar Heels to Klöckner Stadium on Thursday night. Faceoff is set for 7 p.m.
- This week Virginia is ranked No. 8 in both the USILA coaches and Inside Lacrosse media polls. UNC is No. 1 in the coaches poll and No. 2 in the media poll.

THE SERIES VS. THE TAR HEELS

- Thursday marks the 85th all-time meeting between the Cavaliers and Tar Heels, a series the Cavaliers own a 53-31 advantage in since 1938. UVA faced the Tar Heels every year from 1964-2019 until the pandemic shutdown the 2020 season.
- After winning 19-of-21 meetings dating back to 1997, UVA dropped four straight against UNC until beating them 13-11 at the ACC Showcase Game in April 2014. UNC's four-game winning streak was the longest in the series for the Tar Heels since winning four straight during the 1990-92 seasons.
- After losing seven of eight meetings with the Tar Heels, UVA has won the last three games with UNC.

UVA VS. THE NO. 1 TEAM IN THE NATION

- UVA is 15-25 all-time against teams ranked No. 1 in the USILA coaches poll, however since 1990 the record is even at 12-12. The 2012 ACC title game at No. 1 UNC is the last time UVA has faced the top-ranked team.
- UVA is 7-2 against the USILA coaches No. 1 team when the game is played at Klöckner Stadium.
- The last time UVA hosted the No. 1 team in the nation at Klöckner Stadium was a 12-11 win over then-No. 1 Syracuse in 2011.



Connor Shellenberger is No. 2 in the nation with 16 assists, tied with UNC's Chris Gray and Georgetown's TJ Haley. Shellenberger leads the nation's freshmen with 27 points.

COVERING THE CAVALIERS

UNIQUELY UVA

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

UNIVERSITY NICKNAMES

Virginia's athletics teams have been accompanied by a somewhat confusing array of nicknames. The most prominent and widely accepted of these monikers are "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos."

Although the terms "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are used almost interchangeably to refer to University teams and players, "Cavaliers" is more often used by the media, while "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are frequently used by Virginia students and fans.

Legend has it that Washington & Lee baseball fans dubbed the Virginia players "Wahoos" during the fiercely contested rivalry that existed between the two in-state schools in the 1890s. By 1940, "Wahoos"

was in general use around Grounds to denote University students or events relating to them. The abbreviated "Hoos" sprang up later in student newspapers and has gained growing popularity in recent years.

THE CAVALIER MASCOT

The costumed Cavalier with a large character head debuted during Virginia's 1984 football season and has remained the official mascot of the University.

UNIVERSITY COLORS

Orange and blue were adopted as the University of Virginia's official athletic colors at a mass student meeting in 1888. UVA athletic teams had previously worn silver gray and cardinal red, but those colors did not stand out on muddy football fields, prompting a student movement to change them.

One of the students attending the mass meeting was Allen Potts, a star athlete who played on Virginia's first football team in 1888. Potts showed up at the meeting wearing a navy blue-and-orange scarf that he had acquired during a summer boating expedition at Oxford University. Orange and blue were chosen as the official athletic colors after one of Potts' fellow students pulled the scarf off Potts' neck and, waving it to the crowd, yelled, "How will this do?" UVA later served as the inspiration for schools like Auburn and Florida when they selected school colors.

WAH-HOO-WAH

The origin of "Wah-hoo-wah" is uncertain. The cheer was used to root on Virginia teams as early as 1890 and may have been borrowed from Dartmouth College, whose athletics teams were once known as the Indians.

Legend attributes the yell to Natalie Floyd Otey, who sang the ballad "Where'er You Are, There Shall My Love Be" at Charlottesville's Levy Opera House in 1893. The predominantly student audience noticed that Otey warbled the first three words of the song between each of the stanzas and decided to join in the refrain. By evening's end, goes the legend, the crowd had corrupted "Where'er You Are" into "Wah-hoo-wah."

The Levy Opera House stands at the corner of High Street and Park Street and has since been renovated into an office building.

THE SERIES VS. THE TAR HEELS

- Virginia leads the all-time series with North Carolina by a 53-31 margin.
- The Cavaliers' 53 wins place the Tar Heels on UVA's list of most beaten opponents (UVA has defeated Duke 50 times).
- Overall Virginia has won 23 of the last 32 games dating back to 1997, but North Carolina has won seven of the past 11 meetings – including in the semifinal round of the 2012 ACC Championship and the 2013 ACC Finals.
- Three of the Tar Heels' wins in this span were all by two goals (7-5 in 2001, 11-9 in 2004 and again in 2012).
- UNC scored back-to-back goals with 2:33 and 2:38 left in the game to escape with an 11-10 win at Fetzer Field in Chapel Hill in 2014's regular season meeting.
- UNC won three of the last seven games by three goals, 10-7 in Charlottesville during the 2013 regular season meeting, 16-13 in the 2013 ACC Championship game at UNC's Kenan Stadium and 15-12 in 2017 at Klöckner Stadium.
- North Carolina's previous five wins over UVA before the 2013 meetings had been by either one or two goals; until 2013 the Tar Heels had not won by more than two goals since a 15-7 win in the 1994 ACC Tournament.
- Virginia owned a 10-game winning streak over the Tar Heels, the longest winning streak in the series since winning six in a row from 1997-2000, but UNC snapped it in the ACC Tournament in 2012.
- UVA's 16-8 loss to UNC in 2016 at Kenan Stadium was UVA's worst loss in the series since dropping a 14-5 game to the Tar Heels in the 1992 ACC Tournament at Maryland.
- UVA used seven points from Michael Kraus (3 g, 4 a) and four goals from Mike D'Amario to record its first ACC win since 2014 when the Cavaliers won, 15-12, at Kenan Stadium in 2018. The ACC win snapped an 18-game losing streak in league play. Counting the 2018 win over UNC, UVA has won four of its last six games in ACC play.

LAST MEETING: 2019 AT UNC (UVA 14, UNC 13) - ACC SEMIFINALS

- The then-No. 6 Virginia Cavaliers used a 6-1 run in the fourth quarter to outlast the North Carolina Tar Heels, 14-13, at UNC Lacrosse Stadium to advance to the ACC Championship final for the second year in a row.
- This game serves as the last time a team beat UNC. Since April 27, 2019, UNC has gone 13-0. The Tar Heels went 7-0 in 2020 before the season was shut down and are 6-0 this season.
- Virginia jumped out to a quick 3-0 lead, courtesy of goals from Matt Moore, Ryan Conrad and Petey LaSalla. UNC made the game close, 4-3, after scoring three goals in a 3-1 run. Ian Laviano and Ryan Conrad scored to conclude the first quarter with a 6-3 lead after 15 minutes. Moore tied his career-high with four assists in the first frame.
- After scoring with 14 seconds left in the first quarter, UVA didn't score again for the next 26:17 in which UNC reeled off a 7-0 run to take a commanding 10-6 lead with 8:16 left in the third quarter. Michael Kraus broke through with an unassisted goal at 3:06 to cut UVA's deficit to three goals, 10-7. North Carolina responded with a 2-0 run, taking a 12-8 lead with 14:09 left to play.
- Dox Aitken started the comeback with 7:31 left in the game, scoring back-to-back goals to cut the UVA deficit to two goals, 12-10. Aitken's first goal was the 100th of his career and the second goal broke Shamel Bratton's school record for career points by a midfielder.
- After Aitken's goals, Laviano scored on a Moore helper at 6:32 in the fourth, followed by an acrobatic goal on another Moore assist by Mikey Herring with 5:37 left to play to tie the game at 12-12.
- Alex Trippi bounced in on a shot at 3:24 to give UNC the lead, 13-12 for the final time. Kraus tied the game, 13-12, with an unassisted goal at 3:05. After a huge save by Patrick Burkinshaw and an ensuing ground ball by Matt Dziama, UVA moved the ball in transition and Cade Saustad recorded his first career assist when he found Laviano for the game-winning goal at 1:30 in the fourth.

UVA AND UNC OPENED UP METLIFE STADIUM

- The 2010 meeting was a No. 1 (UVA) vs. No. 2 (UNC) matchup that served as the first-ever event at MetLife Stadium, home of the New York Giants and New York Jets. The event was a triple header titled the Big City Classic. UVA won the second game of the day over the Tar Heels, 7-5.

UVA ON THE GREEN GRASS OF KLÖCKNER

- Virginia owns a 154-40 (.7938) all-time record at Klöckner Stadium, including a 3-0 mark in 2021 and are winners of 15 of last 17 played in the historic edifice. UVA also is 12-3 all-time at Klöckner Stadium in the NCAA Tournament.
- UVA is 27-8 all-time at Klöckner Stadium under head coach Lars Tiffany.
- Klöckner Stadium first hosted lacrosse in 1993.

KOLOGY HEATING UP

- Preseason All-American D Kyle Kology is starting to heat up. He has 14 ground balls and nine caused turnovers over the past three games.
- Kology had five ground balls and five caused turnovers in the win over High Point while guarding All-American Asher Nolting. While Kology guarded Nolting, the HPU senior did not score a goal. Nolting scored his only goal on an EMO situation while Kology was in the penalty box.
- Nolting had 12 turnovers against UVA on March 3.

CORMIER AND SHELLENBERGER MAKING MARKS EARLY

- A/M Payton Cormier shares (Bertrand) the team lead with 14 goals in just six games. He had 12 goals in UVA's six games in 2020. Cormier also has at least a hat-trick in six of his 12 career games.
- A/M Connor Shellenberger is off to a productive start in his career. He leads the team in points with 27. Shellenberger dished out at least two assists in five of UVA's six games, including a career-high four against Air Force the last time out. He also has dished three assists against Towson, at No. 11 Loyola and against No. 19 High Point.
- Shellenberger is No. 2 in the nation with 16 assists and No. 7 in the nation with 27 points.

UVA GETS A GOAL-SCORING MACHINE IN BERTRAND

- Charlie Bertrand scored 210 goals over 58 career games at Merrimack from 2017-20, which includes at least one in all 58 career games for MC. During that span he helped Merrimack win back-to-back NCAA DII titles in 2018 and 2019, while also being named the NCAA DII National Player of the Year in each of those seasons. Merrimack made the jump to DI in 2020 and Bertrand scored 18 goals and dished five assists for 23 points in just six games in 2020 before the season was canceled due to the pandemic.

- In his first game with the Cavaliers he tallied four goals and two assists against Towson.

• The Cavaliers are No. 2 in the nation in the riding game, limiting its opponents to .683 clearing. The one teams ranked higher than Virginia has only played one game, while UVA has played six. Lafayette has the nation's lead at .650 after one game.
 • In 2020 Virginia was No. 2 in the nation in riding, limiting its opponents to .737 clearing. Bucknell was No. 1 in the nation at .690.
 • UVA was No. 2 in the nation in 2019 at .711, trailing only Cleveland State (.707).

VIRGINIA IS A GROUND BALL MACHINE

• Virginia is currently No. 1 in the nation with 44.80 ground balls per game.
 • Entering 2021, UVA has led the nation in ground balls seven of the last 12 years, including the last four seasons under Lars Tiffany.
 • UVA is the only school in the nation to finish in the Top-5 nationally in ground balls per game 11 times over the last 12 seasons.
 • Duke is the closest team to UVA, finishing in the Top-5 five times during the same span.
 • The only school in 2016 to finish with more ground balls per game was UVA head coach Lars Tiffany's 2016 Brown team.
 • Lars Tiffany-coached teams have led the nation in ground balls in six-straight seasons, including the 2015 and 2016 seasons at Brown.

MOORE NAMED ACC OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK (FEB. 23)

• A Matt Moore (Garnet Valley, Pa.) was named the ACC Offensive Player of the Week on Feb. 23. It was the first career weekly ACC accolade of Moore's career.

• Moore led UVA with five goals in the Cavaliers' 15-12 win at No. 11 Loyola.

• Moore scored three times in a key third quarter that spelled the difference in the game. Twice in the third quarter his goals broke a tie, including for the last time in the game with 2:58 remaining in the period to give UVA a 10-9 lead.

• His fifth goal iced the game in the fourth quarter.

GAVIN NAMED ACC DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK (FEB. 16)

• GK Bobby Gavin (San Diego, Calif.) was named the ACC Defensive Player of the Week on Feb. 16.

• Gavin made his first collegiate start against No. 12 Army after he was pressed into action for starter Alex Rode, the 2019 NCAA Tournament's Most Outstanding Player, who was not available.

• In just his second collegiate game, Gavin made 13 saves and helped UVA defeat the Black Knights, 14-9.

• After allowing four goals on the first four shots he saw on goal, Gavin saved 13 of the Black Knights next 18 shots on goal to aid the Cavalier defense.

• Gavin also saved seven of nine shots on goal by Army's All-American attackman Brendan Nichtern. He also picked up six ground balls and caused two turnovers in the winning cause.

CONNERS AND FOX REPEAT AS TEAM CAPTAINS IN 2021

• Virginia men's lacrosse head coach Lars Tiffany announced that long-stick midfielder Jared Conners and midfielder John Fox have been selected as captains for the 2021 season, as voted on by their peers.

The No. 5 Virginia Cavaliers (1-0) used a seven-goal second quarter to distance themselves from the Towson Tigers (0-1), 20-11, at Klöckner Stadium.
