OPENING DRAW

GAME OVERVIEW

- Virginia returns to the road on Saturday for an ACC tilt with at North Carolina. Faceoff is set for 2 p.m.
- This week Virginia is ranked No. 4 in the USILA coaches poll and No. 6 in the Inside Lacrosse media poll. UNC is No. 3 in both the coaches and media polls.

THE SERIES VS. THE TAR HEELS

- Saturday marks the 86th all-time meeting between the Cavaliers and Tar Heels, a series the Cavaliers own a 53-32 advantage in since 1938. UVA faced the Tar Heels every year from 1964-2019 until the pandemic shutdown the 2020 season.
- After winning 19-of-21 meetings dating back to 1997, UVA dropped four straight against UNC until beating them 13-11 at the ACC Showcase Game in April 2014. UNC's four-game winning streak was the longest in the series for the Tar Heels since winning four straight during the 1990-92 seasons.
- After losing seven of eight meetings with the Tar Heels, UVA has won three of the last four games with UNC.

AITKEN IS AMONG A SPECIAL GROUP OF MIDFIELDERS

- Dox Aitken is tied for No. 18 all-time in DI midfielder scoring with 165 career points. He shares the spot with Syracuse's Roy Colsey. Full list on page No. 7.
- Aitken needs four assists to become the 17th midfielder in the history of the game at the DI level to record at least 100 career goals and 40 career assists.
- He is No. 4 all-time among ACC midfielders in career points.



Connor Shellenberger leads the nation's freshmen with 44 points, which is tied for No. 6 in the nation overall. He is also No. 4 in the nation in assists and has at least two assists in eight of UVA's 10 games in 2021.

COVERING THE CAVALIERS

UNIQUELY UVA

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

UNIVERSITY NICKNAMES

Virginia's athletics teams have been accompanied by a somewhat confusing array of nicknames. The most prominent and widely accepted of these monikers are "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos."

Although the terms "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are used almost interchangeably to refer to University teams and players, "Cavaliers" is more often used by the media, while "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are frequently used by Virginia students and fans.

Legend has it that Washington & Lee baseball fans dubbed the Virginia players "Wahoos" during the fiercely contested rivalry that existed between the two in-state schools in the 1890s. By 1940, "Wahoos"

was in general use around Grounds to denote University students or events relating to them. The abbreviated "Hoos" sprang up later in student newspapers and has gained growing popularity in recent years.

THE CAVALIER MASCOT

The costumed Cavalier with a large character head debuted during Virginia's 1984 football season and has remained the official mascot of the University.

UNIVERSITY COLORS

Orange and blue were adopted as the University of Virginia's official athletic colors at a mass student meeting in 1888. UVA athletic teams had previously worn silver gray and cardinal red, but those colors did not stand out on muddy football fields, prompting a student movement to change them.

One of the students attending the mass meeting was Allen Potts, a star athlete who played on Virginia's first football team in 1888. Potts showed up at the meeting wearing a navy blue-and-orange scarf that he had acquired during a summer boating expedition at Oxford University. Orange and blue were chosen as the official athletic colors after one of Potts' fellow students pulled the scarf off Potts' neck and, waving it to the crowd, yelled, "How will this do?" UVA later served as the inspiration for schools like Auburn and Florida when they selected school colors.

WAH-HOO-WAH

The origin of "Wah-hoo-wah" is uncertain. The cheer was used to root on Virginia teams as early as 1890 and may have been borrowed from Dartmouth College, whose athletics teams were once known as the Indians.

Legend attributes the yell to Natalie Floyd Otey, who sang the ballad "Where'er You Are, There Shall My Love Be" at Charlottesville's Levy Opera House in 1893. The predominantly student audience noticed that Otey warbled the first three words of the song between each of the stanzas and decided to join in the refrain. By evening's end, goes the legend, the crowd had corrupted "Where'er You Are" into "Wah-hoo-wah."

The Levy Opera House stands at the corner of High Street and Park Street and has since been renovated into an office building.

THE SERIES VS. THE TAR HEELS

- Virginia leads the all-time series with North Carolina by a 53-32 margin.
- The Cavaliers' 53 wins place the Tar Heels on UVA's list of most beaten opponents (UVA has defeated Duke 50 times).
- Overall Virginia has won 23 of the last 33 games dating back to 1997, but North Carolina has won seven of the past 12 meetings – including in the semifinal round of the 2012 ACC Championship and the 2013 ACC Finals.
- Three of the Tar Heels' wins in this span were all by two goals (7-5 in 2001, 11-9 in 2004 and again in 2012).
- UNC scored back-to-back goals with 2:33 and 2:38 left in the game to escape with an 11-10 win at Fetzer Field in Chapel Hill in 2014's regular season meeting.
- UNC won four of the last eight games by three goals: 10-7 in Charlottesville during the 2013 regular season meeting, 16-13 in the 2013 ACC Championship game at UNC's Kenan Stadium, 15-12 in 2017 at Klöckner Stadium and 16-13 earlier this season at Klöckner.
- North Carolina's previous five wins over UVA before the 2013 meetings had been by either one or two goals; until 2013 the Tar Heels had not won by more than two goals since a 15-7 win in the 1994 ACC Tournament.
- Virginia owned a 10-game winning streak over the Tar Heels, the longest winning streak in the series since winning six in a row from 1997-2000, but UNC snapped it in the ACC Tournament in 2012.
- UVA's 16-8 loss to UNC in 2016 at Kenan Stadium was UVA's worst loss in the series since dropping a 14-5 game to the Tar Heels in the 1992 ACC Tournament at Maryland.
- UVA used seven points from Michael Kraus (3 g, 4 a) and four goals from Mike D'Amario to record its first ACC win since 2014 when the Cavaliers won, 15-12, at Kenan Stadium in 2018. The ACC win snapped an 18-game losing streak in league play. Counting the 2018 win over UNC, UVA has won four of its last six games in ACC play.

LAST MEETING: MARCH 11, 2021 (UNC 16, UVA 13) - KLÖCKNER STADIUM

- The then-No. 8 Virginia Cavaliers fell behind early and couldn't overcome a first-half deficit, falling to the No. 1 North Carolina Tar Heels, 16-13, at Klöckner Stadium.
- An illegal stick by UNC's Zac Tucci gave UVA a three-minute full-time served extra-man possession to start the second quarter. UVA's Peter Garno was saved early on during the Cavalier possession by UNC's Collin Krieg. UNC turned the man-down situation into back-to-back goals during an 8-1 run that forced the Cavaliers to play catchup all night.
- Nicky Solomon scored at 10:24 in the first to start the 8-1 UNC streak that was the turning point for the Tar Heels, which included the two man-down goals to start the second quarter. Solomon's unassisted score with 2:40 left in the first half capped the run, giving UNC an 11-3 lead. Griffin Harris stopped the bleeding for the Cavaliers with 43 seconds left in the second quarter to send UVA into the intermission down by seven goals, 11-4.
- Harris' goal started a 5-1 UVA run that made it a four-goal game, 12-8, when Matt Moore scored an unassisted goal with 7:32 left in the third quarter. UNC scored back-to-back goals to make it 15-9 with 12:06 left to play when Matt Wright scored on a Brian Cameron helper.
- UVA didn't go away, scoring four goals in a row. The first two were assisted by Moore, who found Quinn and Connor Shellenberger. Conner scored his second on a Shellenberger assist, while Shellenberger capped the streak with an unassisted score with 1:35 left to play, cutting the UVA deficit to 15-13. UVA won the ensuing faceoff, but after UNC was flagged for pushing, Moore's shot was saved by Krieg. UNC pushed transition and scored an empty-net goal to seal the victory with 10 seconds left.

LAST MEETING AT DORRANCE FIELD: 2019 (UVA 14, UNC 13) - ACC SEMIFINALS

- The then-No. 6 Virginia Cavaliers used a 6-1 run in the fourth quarter to outlast the North Carolina Tar Heels, 14-13, at Dorrance Field to advance to the ACC Championship final for the second year in a row.
- This game serves as the last time a team beat UNC. Since April 27, 2019, UNC has gone 13-0. The Tar Heels went 7-0 in 2020 before the season was shut down and are 6-0 this season.
- Virginia jumped out to a quick 3-0 lead, courtesy of goals from Matt Moore, Ryan Conrad and Petey LaSalla. UNC made the game close, 4-3, after scoring three goals in a 3-1 run. Ian Laviano and Ryan Conrad scored to conclude the first quarter with a 6-3 lead after 15 minutes. Moore tied his career-high with four assists in the first frame.
- After scoring with 14 seconds left in the first quarter, UVA didn't score again for the next 26:17 in which UNC reeled off a 7-0 run to take a commanding 10-6 lead with 8:16 left in the third quarter. Michael Kraus broke through with an unassisted goal at 3:06 to cut UVA's deficit to three goals, 10-7. North Carolina responded with a 2-0 run, taking a 12-8 lead with 14:09 left to play.
- Dox Aitken started the comeback with 7:31 left in the game, scoring back-to-back goals to cut the UVA deficit to two goals, 12-10. Aitken's first goal was the 100th of his career and the second goal broke Shamel Bratton's school record for career points by a midfielder.
- After Aitken's goals, Laviano scored on a Moore helper at 6:32 in the fourth, followed by an acrobatic goal on another Moore assist by Mikey Herring with 5:37 left to play to tie the game at 12-12.
- Alex Trippi bounced in a shot at 3:24 to give UNC the lead, 13-12 for the final time. Kraus tied the game, 13-12, with an unassisted goal at 3:05. After a huge save by Patrick Burkinshaw and an ensuing ground ball by Matt Dziana, UVA moved the ball in transition and Cade Saustad recorded his first career assist when he found Laviano for the game-winning goal at 1:30 in the fourth.

UVA AND UNC OPENED UP METLIFE STADIUM

- The 2010 meeting was a No. 1 (UVA) vs. No. 2 (UNC) matchup that served as the first-ever event at MetLife Stadium, home of the New York Giants and New York Jets. The event was a triple header titled the Big City Classic. UVA won the second game of the day over the Tar Heels, 7-5.

CAVALIERS BETTER IN THE CLEARING GAME OF LATE

- After a troublesome start in the clearing game, UVA has been much better of late, including 91.7 percent (33-of-36) over the last two games (at Notre Dame, vs. Richmond).
- Over the last four games, which includes ACC games vs. UNC and at Notre Dame, UVA is clearing at 85.5 percent (59-of-69).
- UVA started the season (first six games) clearing just 79.4 percent.

LASALLA AND CONNERS PICKING UP THE GB

- UVA's Petey LaSalla is No. 3 in the nation with 80 ground balls. LSM Jared Conners is tied for No. 23 with 41 ground balls, which is No. 2 among LSMs, trailing only Duke's Tyler Carpenter (44) by three GBs.
- GK Alex Rode leads the nation's goalies with 29 ground balls.

LASALLA GETTING THE WIN AT THE FACEOFF X

- Petey LaSalla won a career-high 23 faceoffs (28 attempts) against Robert Morris on March 20. It marks the first time in program history a Cavalier won 20+ faceoffs in back-to-back games. He previously won 21 faceoffs against then-No. 1 North Carolina on March 11.
- He joins former teammate, Justin Schwenk, as the only Cavaliers to win 20+ faceoffs in a game multiple times during a career.
- LaSalla faced Notre Dame's Kyle Gallagher on March 27, who was No. 1 in the nation with an 85.1 percent winning percentage entering the game. LaSalla won 11-of-21 against Gallagher and was 13-of-25 in the game, gaining a slight advantage.
- LaSalla is No. 9 in the nation with a 65.5 percent winning mark (156-of-238). If you remove the 11-of-30 showing at Syracuse, LaSalla is winning at a 69.7 percent clip against all other opponents.
- LaSalla is No. 1 in the nation with 156 faceoff wins and No. 1 in faceoffs taken (238).

KOLOGY PROVIDING DEFENSIVE COVERAGE

- Preseason All-American D Kyle Kology is starting to heat up.
- He currently is No. 6 in the nation with 18 caused turnovers.
- He has 16 ground balls and 14 caused turnovers over the past seven games.
- Kology had five ground balls and five caused turnovers in the win over High Point while guarding All-American Asher Nolting. While Kology guarded Nolting, the HPU senior did not score a goal. Nolting scored his only goal on an EMO situation while Kology was in the penalty box.
- Nolting had 12 turnovers against UVA on March 3.
- Kology caused three turnovers against Robert Morris on March 20.

SAUSTAD HAS BEEN STEADY

- D Cade Saustad has been steady in 2021 after returning to the fold from an injury that kept him out in 2020.
- Saustad held Notre Dame's Pat Kavanagh to only two assists on March 27, one of which came on EMO. For the season he has 20 GBs and seven CTs.

CORMIER AND SHELLENBERGER MAKING MARKS EARLY

- A/M Payton Cormier leads the team with 30 goals in through 10 games. He had 12 goals in UVA's six games in 2020. Cormier also has at least a hat-trick in 10 of his 16 career games.
- Cormier is No. 5 in the nation with 30 goals and No. 14 in the nation with 38 points.
- A/M Connor Shellenberger is off to a productive start in his career. He leads the team in points with 44. Shellenberger dished out at least two assists in eight of UVA's 10 games, including a career-high four against Air Force. He also has dished three assists against Towson, at No. 11 Loyola, against No. 19 High Point and against Robert Morris.
- Shellenberger is tied for No. 4 in the nation with 26 assists and tied for No. 6 in the nation with 44 points.

DIFFERENT MILESTONES THAT COULD BE HIT SOON

- There are various Cavaliers on the verge of career milestones.
- Charlie Bertrand, one of two active lacrosse player in the nation with at least 200 career goals (226), needs five points to reach 300 career points. He is currently No. 3 among active players with 295 career points, behind Duke's Michael Sowers (353) and Fairfield's Matt Chlastawa (302).
- Matt Moore needs eight assists to become the fifth Cavalier in program history with 100 career goals and 100 career assists. He would join Kevin Pehlke, Danny Glading, Steele Stanwick and Michael Kraus.
- Moore needs six points to become just the 13th Cavalier with 200 career points.
- Moore needs eight assists to become just the 10th Cavalier with 100 career assists.
- Dox Aitken and Jared Connors each have played in 69 career games. They need to play in three more games to pass Bray Malphrus (71) for the UVA career record for games played.
- As the schedule stands, the April 24 game against Syracuse will be the 200th all-time men's lacrosse game at Klöckner Stadium.

The No. 5 Virginia Cavaliers (1-0) used a seven-goal second quarter to distance themselves from the Towson Tigers (0-1), 20-11, at Klöckner Stadium.

The No. 3 Virginia Cavaliers (2-0) picked up a key non-conference home win over the No. 12 Army West Point Black Knights (0-1), 14-9. The contest was played at the Lower Turf practice field due to field conditions at Klöckner Stadium.

The No. 8 Virginia Cavaliers fell behind early and couldn't overcome a first-half deficit, falling to the No. 1 North Carolina Tar Heels, 16-13, at Klöckner Stadium.

An illegal stick by UNC's Zac Tucci gave UVA a three-minute full-time served extra-man possession to start the second quarter. UVA's Peter Garno was saved early on during the Cavalier possession by UNC's Collin Krieg. UNC turned the man-down situation into back-to-back goals during an 8-1 run that the forced the Cavaliers to play catchup all night.
