OPENING DRAW

GAME OVERVIEW

- Virginia heads to Notre Dame on Saturday to face the Fighting Irish at Arlotta Stadium. Faceoff is set for noon.
- This week Virginia is ranked No. 9 in both the USILA coaches and Inside Lacrosse media polls. Notre Dame is ranked No. 6 in both polls.

THE SERIES VS. THE FIGHTING IRISH

- Saturday marks the 16th all-time meeting between the Cavaliers and Fighting Irish.
- Notre Dame leads the all-time series with UVA, 8-7, and have won seven of the last nine meetings. UVA has won the last two meetings, including the 2019 ACC title game.

LASALLA GETTING THE WIN AT THE FACEOFF X

- Petey LaSalla won a career-high 23 faceoffs (28 attempts) against Robert Morris last time out. It marks the first time in program history a Cavalier won 20+ faceoffs in back-to-back games. He previously won 21 faceoffs against No. 1 North Carolina.
- He joins former teammate, Justin Schwenk, as the only Cavaliers to win 20+ faceoffs in a game multiple times during a career.
- LaSalla will face Notre Dame's Kyle Gallagher on Saturday, who is No. 1 in the nation with an 85.1 percent winning percentage. LaSalla (124) has won 77 more faceoffs than Gallagher has taken on the season (47). LaSalla is No. 10 in the nation with a 66.7 percent winning mark (124-of-186). If you remove the 11-of-30 showing at Syracuse, LaSalla is winning at a 72.4 percent clip against all other opponents.



Petey LaSalla became the first Cavalier with 20+ faceoff wins in back-to-back games in program history after winning 23 last time out against Robert Morris and 21 against No. 1 North Carolina on March 11. He was named ACC Defensive Player of the Week on March 23 for his efforts.

COVERING THE CAVALIERS

UNIQUELY UVA

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

UNIVERSITY NICKNAMES

Virginia's athletics teams have been accompanied by a somewhat confusing array of nicknames. The most prominent and widely accepted of these monikers are "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos."

Although the terms "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are used almost interchangeably to refer to University teams and players, "Cavaliers" is more often used by the media, while "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are frequently used by Virginia students and fans.

Legend has it that Washington & Lee baseball fans dubbed the Virginia players "Wahoos" during the fiercely contested rivalry that existed between the two in-state schools in the 1890s. By 1940, "Wahoos"

was in general use around Grounds to denote University students or events relating to them. The abbreviated "Hoos" sprang up later in student newspapers and has gained growing popularity in recent years.

THE CAVALIER MASCOT

The costumed Cavalier with a large character head debuted during Virginia's 1984 football season and has remained the official mascot of the University.

UNIVERSITY COLORS

Orange and blue were adopted as the University of Virginia's official athletic colors at a mass student meeting in 1888. UVA athletic teams had previously worn silver gray and cardinal red, but those colors did not stand out on muddy football fields, prompting a student movement to change them.

One of the students attending the mass meeting was Allen Potts, a star athlete who played on Virginia's first football team in 1888. Potts showed up at the meeting wearing a navy blue-and-orange scarf that he had acquired during a summer boating expedition at Oxford University. Orange and blue were chosen as the official athletic colors after one of Potts' fellow students pulled the scarf off Potts' neck and, waving it to the crowd, yelled, "How will this do?" UVA later served as the inspiration for schools like Auburn and Florida when they selected school colors.

WAH-HOO-WAH

The origin of "Wah-hoo-wah" is uncertain. The cheer was used to root on Virginia teams as early as 1890 and may have been borrowed from Dartmouth College, whose athletics teams were once known as the Indians.

Legend attributes the yell to Natalie Floyd Otey, who sang the ballad "Where'er You Are, There Shall My Love Be" at Charlottesville's Levy Opera House in 1893. The predominantly student audience noticed that Otey warbled the first three words of the song between each of the stanzas and decided to join in the refrain. By evening's end, goes the legend, the crowd had corrupted "Where'er You Are" into "Wah-hoo-wah."

The Levy Opera House stands at the corner of High Street and Park Street and has since been renovated into an office building.

THE SERIES VS. NOTRE DAME

- The series tilts in favor of Notre Dame, 8-7. UVA has lost seven of the last nine meetings, but has won the last two meetings which includes the 2019 ACC title game.
- Notre Dame head coach Kevin Corrigan, a UVA alum, is in his 33rd season with the Fighting Irish after spending two seasons as an assistant coach for the Cavaliers under former head coaching legend Jim Adams.
- UVA's 13-11 win at Klöckner Stadium in the 2019 regular season snapped a seven-game losing streak to Notre Dame.
- The teams had a three-year series that ended in 2003 and have met 10 times since, the 2006 and 2012 NCAA Tournaments, as well as ACC play in 2014-19.
- Four of the meetings between UVA and Notre Dame have come in the NCAA Tournament (1993, 1994, 2006, 2012) and UVA holds a 3-1 record.
- The 2014 ACC matchup marked the first time the series had been played in Notre Dame. The first six games in the series were contested at UVA's Klöckner Stadium.
- Weather in South Bend forced the 2014 meeting inside at the Loftus Sports Center.
- The 2012 meeting came in the quarterfinal round of the 2012 NCAA Tournament at PPL Park in Chester, Pa.
- Notre Dame's first victory was an 11-8 win in 2001 as the Fighting Irish advanced to Championship Weekend that season before falling to Syracuse in the semifinals.
- The Fighting Irish, ranked sixth at game time, became just the second team ranked fifth or lower to defeat the Cavaliers at Klöckner.
- Notre Dame won the most recent NCAA meeting, a 12-10 triumph over UVA to advance to the 2012 Championship Weekend before falling to Loyola in the semifinals.
- The 2012 meeting was the final game in the illustrious career of UVA's Steele Stanwick. UVA's all-time point leader finished his career with seven points and five assists against Notre Dame.
- Virginia's 23-4 win in the 1994 Tournament represents its biggest win over a ranked team in program history (Notre Dame was ranked 14th at game time.) The margin of victory also marks UVA's greatest in NCAA Tournament action.
- 2006 Tewaaron Trophy winner Matt Ward led UVA with four goals in the 2006 meeting between UVA and Notre Dame, as the Cavaliers won 14-10 in the NCAA First Round on their way to the program's fourth NCAA title.

CAVALIERS, IRISH SHARE TIES

- UVA and Notre Dame share several ties which could be intriguing.
- Notre Dame head coach Kevin Corrigan is a graduate of UVA and played on three Cavalier squads that made the NCAA Tournament from 1979-81.
- Corrigan was an assistant coach on Jim Adams' staff at UVA in 1987 and 1988 before being named head coach at Notre Dame prior to the 1989 season.
- Corrigan's father, Gene Corrigan, served as athletics director at UVA from 1971-80, was the UVA lacrosse head coach from 1959-67, was the soccer coach from 1958-65 (among other positions).
- Gene Corrigan left UVA to become Notre Dame's athletics director in 1981 and left in 1987 to become the ACC's third-ever commissioner from 1987-1997.
- Notre Dame head coach Kevin Corrigan is first cousins with former UVA women's basketball head coaching legend Debbie Ryan.

CORMIER AND LASALLA SWEEP ACC POW HONORS (MARCH 23)

• A Payton Cormier (Oakville, Ontario) was named the ACC Offensive Player of the Week on March 23. It was the first career weekly ACC accolade of Cormier's career. M Petey LaSalla (Miller Place, N.Y.) was named the ACC Defensive Player of the Week. It was the first career weekly ACC accolade of LaSalla's career.

• Cormier led UVA with five goals and one assist in UVA's 14-12 win over Robert Morris. He scored four goals in the first half and also picked up six ground balls in the win.

• Petey LaSalla was 23-of-28 from the faceoff X, including a perfect 12-of-12 in the first half. LaSalla became the first Cavalier in program history to win at least 20 faceoffs in back-to-back games. He previously won 21 against No. 1 North Carolina. LaSalla also assisted a goal and picked up 10 ground balls in the win over Robert Morris.

KOLOGY HEATING UP

• Preseason All-American D Kyle Kology is starting to heat up.

• He currently is No. 4 in the nation with 16 caused turnovers.

• He has 15 ground balls and 12 caused turnovers over the past five games.

• Kology had five ground balls and five caused turnovers in the win over High Point while guarding All-American Asher Nolting. While Kology guarded Nolting, the HPU senior did not score a goal. Nolting scored his only goal on an EMO situation while Kology was in the penalty box.

• Nolting had 12 turnovers against UVA on March 3.

• Kology caused three turnovers against Robert Morris on March 20.

CORMIER AND SHELLENBERGER MAKING MARKS EARLY

• A/M Payton Cormier leads the team with 22 goals in through eight games. He had 12 goals in UVA's six games in 2020. Cormier also has at least a hat-trick in eight of his 14 career games.

• A/M Connor Shellenberger is off to a productive start in his career. He leads the team in points with 36. Shellenberger dished out at least two assists in seven of UVA's eight games, including a career-high four against Air Force. He also has dished three assists against Towson, at No. 11 Loyola, against No. 19 High Point and against Robert Morris.

• Shellenberger is No. 4 in the nation with 22 assists and No. 5 in the nation with 36 points.

LASALLA AND CONNERS PICKING UP THE GB

• UVA's Petey LaSalla is tied for No. 2 in the nation with 63 ground balls. He shares the spot with Denver's Alec Stathakis. LSM Jared Conners is tied for No. 17 with 33 ground balls, which is No. 2 among LSMs, trailing only Duke's Tyler Carpenter (34) by one GB.

• GK Alex Rode leads the nation's goalies with 24 ground balls.

VIRGINIA IN THE POLLS

• Virginia has been ranked in the top five of the USILA Coaches poll 294 weeks all-time.

• UVA has been ranked in the Top 10 in 445 polls all-time.

• UVA has been ranked No. 1 in the nation in 68 all-time polls.

• The USILA Poll began in 1973.

DIFFERENT MILESTONES THAT COULD BE HIT SOON

• There are various Cavaliers on the verge of career milestones.

• Matt Moore needs just two goals to become the 19th Cavalier to score at least 100 goals in a career.

• Charlie Bertrand, one of two active lacrosse player in the nation with at least 200 career goals (225), needs six points to reach 300 career points. He is currently No. 3 among active players with 294 career points, behind Duke's Michael Sowers (346) and Fairfield's Matt Chlastawa (299).

• Matt Moore needs two goals and 13 assists to become the fifth Cavalier in program history with 100 career goals and 100 career assists. He would join Kevin Pehlke, Danny Glading, Steele Stanwick and Michael Kraus.

• Dox Aitken and Jared Conners each have played in 67 career games. They need to play in five more games to pass Bray Malphrus (71) for the UVA career record for games played.

• As the schedule stands, the April 24 game against Syracuse will be the 200th all-time men's lacrosse game at Klöckner Stadium.

VIRGINIA IS A GROUND BALL MACHINE

- Virginia is currently No. 2 in the nation with 45.00 ground balls per game.
- Entering 2021, UVA has led the nation in ground balls seven of the last 12 years, including the last four seasons under Lars Tiffany.
- UVA is the only school in the nation to finish in the Top-5 nationally in ground balls per game 11 times over the last 12 seasons.
- Duke is the closest team to UVA, finishing in the Top-5 five times during the same span.
- The only school in 2016 to finish with more ground balls per game was UVA head coach Lars Tiffany's 2016 Brown team.
- Lars Tiffany-coached teams have led the nation in ground balls in six-straight seasons, including the 2015 and 2016 seasons at Brown.

BERTRAND'S GOAL-SCORING STREAK

- Grad transfer Charlie Bertrand had his 65 goal-scoring streak halted on March 20 against Robert Morris. He took only two shots against the Colonials. He previously had scored at least one goal in all 65 of his collegiate games.
- Bertrand's 65-game goal scoring streak is a collegiate record when spanning all DI, DII and DIII players.

CONNERS, CORMIER AND MOORE ON TEWAARATON WATCH LIST

- Jared Conners, Payton Cormier and Matt Moore were named to the 2021 Tewaaraton Trophy Watch List, announced the Tewaaraton Foundation on March 11.
- The trio is part of 55 male student-athletes named to the watch list.
- Conners is on the watch list for the third time, while Moore is on the list for the second time in his career. It is the first time for Cormier.

MOORE NAMED ACC OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK (FEB. 23)

- A Matt Moore (Garnet Valley, Pa.) was named the ACC Offensive Player of the Week on Feb. 23. It was the first career weekly ACC accolade of Moore's career.
- Moore led UVA with five goals in the Cavaliers' 15-12 win at No. 11 Loyola.
- Moore scored three times in a key third quarter that spelled the difference in the game. Twice in the third quarter his goals broke a tie, including for the last time in the game with 2:58 remaining in the period to give UVA a 10-9 lead.
- His fifth goal iced the game in the fourth quarter.

GAVIN NAMED ACC DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK (FEB. 16)

- GK Bobby Gavin (San Diego, Calif.) was named the ACC Defensive Player of the Week on Feb. 16.
- Gavin made his first collegiate start against No. 12 Army after he was pressed into action for starter Alex Rode, the 2019 NCAA Tournament's Most Outstanding Player, who was not available.
- In just his second collegiate game, Gavin made 13 saves and helped UVA defeat the Black Knights, 14-9.
- After allowing four goals on the first four shots he saw on goal, Gavin saved 13 of the Black Knights next 18 shots on goal to aid the Cavalier defense.
- Gavin also saved seven of nine shots on goal by Army's All-American attackman Brendan Nichtern. He also picked up six ground balls and caused two turnovers in the winning cause.

UVA ON THE GREEN GRASS OF KLÖCKNER

- Virginia owns a 155-41 (.79082) all-time record at Klöckner Stadium, including a 4-1 mark in 2021 and are winners of 16 of last 19 played in the historic edifice. UVA also is 12-3 all-time at Klöckner Stadium in the NCAA Tournament.
- UVA is 28-9 all-time at Klöckner Stadium under head coach Lars Tiffany.
- Klöckner Stadium first hosted lacrosse in 1993.

UVA GETS A GOAL-SCORING MACHINE IN BERTRAND

- Charlie Bertrand scored 210 goals over 58 career games at Merrimack from 2017-20, which includes at least one in all 58 career games for MC. During that span he helped Merrimack win back-to-back NCAA DII titles in 2018 and 2019, while also being named the NCAA DII National Player of the Year in each of those seasons. Merrimack made the jump to DI in 2020 and Bertrand scored 18 goals and dished five assists for 23 points in just six games in 2020 before the season was canceled due to the pandemic.
- Bertrand left Merrimack with 274 career points on 210 goals and 64 assists.
- In his first game with the Cavaliers he tallied four goals and two assists against Towson.
- In his college career he has recorded at least two goals in 57 of his 66 career games (86.4), while in 44 of his 66 career games (66.7) he scored at least three goals.

The No. 3 Virginia Cavaliers (2-0) picked up a key non-conference home win over the No. 12 Army West Point Black Knights (0-1), 14-9. The contest was played at the Lower Turf practice field due to field conditions at Klöckner Stadium.
