OPENING DRAW

GAME OVERVIEW

- Virginia opens ACC play on Saturday at the Carrier Dome against the Syracuse Orange. Faceoff is set for 6 p.m.
- This week Virginia is ranked No. 3 in the USILA coaches poll and No. 2 in the Inside Lacrosse media poll. Syracuse is No. 10 this week in the coaches poll and No. 9 in the media poll.

THE SERIES VS. THE ORANGE

- The Cavaliers and Orange are meeting for the 37th time in series history, but are playing each other for only the seventh time as part of ACC play. Virginia has won 10 of the last 17 regular-season meetings, but four of the last seven losses have come at the Carrier Dome (2011, 2013, 2015, 2017).
- The series is tied, 18-18, and the all-time goals are even as well, 466-466.
- UVA and Syracuse won four combined NCAA titles between 2006-11.

RENEWING OF A LACROSSE RIVALRY

- The Virginia and Syracuse series in men's lacrosse has been one of the nation's more anticipated matchups each lacrosse season.
- Normally a late February or early March meeting, the 2020 schedule had Syracuse traveling to Klöckner Stadium on April 18. With the COVID-19 pandemic shutting the season down on March 12, the annual meeting never took place between these two storied programs. Saturday's game will take place 729 days after the last meeting in 2019 (March 2), which is the longest time frame between meetings since the series started back up in 1994.
- Saturday also marks the first time in series history that back-to-back games have been played at Syracuse.



Matt Moore tallied five goals last time out in UVA's 15-12 win at No. 11 Loyola. Moore earned ACC Offensive Player of the Week honors for his performance.

#GOHOOS: BY THE NUMBERS

1	UVA is No. 1 in the nation in ground balls per game with 43. A Lars Tiffany-coached team has led the nation in GBs every year since 2015, which includes two seasons at Brown.
8	Matt Moore needs eight goals to become the 19th Cavalier in program history to reach 100 career goals.
285	Merrimack College graduate transfer Charlie Bertrand has tallied 285 career points (217 g/s, 68 assists), including 11 at UVA (7-4-11).

COVERING THE CAVALIERS

UNIQUELY UVA

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

UNIVERSITY NICKNAMES

Virginia's athletics teams have been accompanied by a somewhat confusing array of nicknames. The most prominent and widely accepted of these monikers are "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos."

Although the terms "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are used almost interchangeably to refer to University teams and players, "Cavaliers" is more often used by the media, while "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are frequently used by Virginia students and fans.

Legend has it that Washington & Lee baseball fans dubbed the Virginia players "Wahoos" during the fiercely contested rivalry that existed between the two in-state schools in the 1890s. By 1940, "Wahoos"

was in general use around Grounds to denote University students or events relating to them. The abbreviated "Hoos" sprang up later in student newspapers and has gained growing popularity in recent years.

THE CAVALIER MASCOT

The costumed Cavalier with a large character head debuted during Virginia's 1984 football season and has remained the official mascot of the University.

UNIVERSITY COLORS

Orange and blue were adopted as the University of Virginia's official athletic colors at a mass student meeting in 1888. UVA athletic teams had previously worn silver gray and cardinal red, but those colors did not stand out on muddy football fields, prompting a student movement to change them.

One of the students attending the mass meeting was Allen Potts, a star athlete who played on Virginia's first football team in 1888. Potts showed up at the meeting wearing a navy blue-and-orange scarf that he had acquired during a summer boating expedition at Oxford University. Orange and blue were chosen as the official athletic colors after one of Potts' fellow students pulled the scarf off Potts' neck and, waving it to the crowd, yelled, "How will this do?" UVA later served as the inspiration for schools like Auburn and Florida when they selected school colors.

WAH-HOO-WAH

The origin of "Wah-hoo-wah" is uncertain. The cheer was used to root on Virginia teams as early as 1890 and may have been borrowed from Dartmouth College, whose athletics teams were once known as the Indians.

Legend attributes the yell to Natalie Floyd Otey, who sang the ballad "Where'er You Are, There Shall My Love Be" at Charlottesville's Levy Opera House in 1893. The predominantly student audience noticed that Otey warbled the first three words of the song between each of the stanzas and decided to join in the refrain. By evening's end, goes the legend, the crowd had corrupted "Where'er You Are" into "Wah-hoo-wah."

The Levy Opera House stands at the corner of High Street and Park Street and has since been renovated into an office building.

THE SERIES VS. SYRACUSE

- The series is tied, 18-18, which mimics the back-and-forth scoring characteristic of the games between the two teams.
- Not only is the series tied, but the all-time score when you combine all the games is also tied, 466-466. The last five games in the series have been decided by one goal, three of which have been won by Syracuse.
- The two schools battled only three times between 1938-93, but have met at least once each season between 1994 and 2019 before the COVID-19 pandemic snapped the streak in 2020.
- The regular-season series began in 1995.
- The two schools have also met six times in the NCAA Tournament since 1995.
- The 2019 season was the first time UVA and Syracuse met in the ACC Tournament, an 11-10 win for UVA in the semifinals.
- Virginia has won 11 of the last 18 meetings in the series, including six straight regular-season match-ups until a 2011 setback at the Carrier Dome.
- The Orange won in overtime, 9-8, in the 2003 at the Dome. It was the first time in the series that neither team scored in the double figures.
- Another heartbreaking UVA loss saw the Orange pull out a dramatic come-from-behind 12-11 double overtime win in the semifinals of the 2008 NCAA Tournament on the way to capturing the national championship.
- The 2008 Syracuse NCAA win ended Virginia's five-game series winning streak, the longest by either team in the series.
- Both teams are known for their high-scoring offenses, but it is interesting to note that since 1999 both UVA (03-06-06-14-19) and Syracuse (2002-03-04-06-15) have scored at least 15 goals only five times in the series.
- Virginia's loss in 2011 snapped a three-game win streak in the "Dome" over Syracuse, a feat boasted by no other opponent of the Orange.
- The 2014 meeting at Klöckner Stadium between UVA and Syracuse, James Pannell scored a career-high seven goals in a 17-12 UVA triumph. It was Syracuse's first-ever ACC game.
- The Orange in 2016 and 2017 have come out on top, 14-13, over the Cavaliers. Syracuse's win at Klöckner Stadium in 2016 snapped UVA's four-game winning streak in Charlottesville.

LAST MEETING: 2019 AT THE CARRIER DOME (UVA 15, SU 14, OT)

- The then-No. 10 Virginia Cavaliers used a 6-1 run to overcome a four-goal deficit in the fourth quarter, upending the then-No. 14 Syracuse Orange in overtime, 15-14, inside the Carrier Dome the last time these teams met.
- Virginia won the overtime faceoff and with 1:31 left in the extra fame Mikey Herring scored his first goal of the season after Michael Kraus found the senior five yards out. It was Herring's only shot of the day and Kraus' third assist of the game.
- The win was the first by the Cavaliers at the Carrier Dome since a 13-12 triumph in 2009.
- Syracuse went up 13-9 with 10:02 left in the game after Stephen Rehffuss capped a 4-1 Orange run. Dox Aitken responded with a goal with 9:00 left in the game, jumpstarting a 6-1 UVA sprint to close the day. During the run six different Cavaliers scored. Matt Moore scored an EMO goal, followed by a Ryan Conrad score with 5:36 left. Conrad's goal capped a 3-0 UVA run and brought the score to 13-12, advantage Syracuse.
- Bradley Voight scored a man-down goal for the Orange with 3:45 on a fast break, pushing the Cuse lead back to two goals, 14-12. Jared Conners scored a clutch long-pole goal on a Kraus helper at 2:09 as the junior was camped on the crease. Kraus followed at 1:12 with the game-tying score from five yards out.
- Syracuse won the ensuing faceoff, but a big save from UVA goalie Alex Rode with two seconds left sent the game into overtime, setting up Herring's heroics.

A UVA WIN SATURDAY PUTS THE CAVALIERS IN SPECIAL COMPANY

- A UVA win on Saturday will give the Cavaliers their sixth all-time victory over the Orange inside the Carrier Dome. That would tie Johns Hopkins for most opponent wins over the Orange inside the Carrier Dome.
- Johns Hopkins is 6-11 all-time inside the "Dome" against the Orange, while UVA is currently 5-7.
- Cornell (5-16) is tied with UVA for second-most wins against the Orange inside the Carrier Dome.
- Outside of Army (4-18), who just won its fourth game over Syracuse inside the Carrier Dome, no other opponent has more than two wins over Syracuse at home.

TIGHT GAMES CHARACTERIZE SERIES

- The potential for a high-scoring game such as the classic 1997 match-up won by Syracuse, 22-21, is one of the main reasons this game is so widely anticipated.
- However, since 1996 a three-goal win can be considered a "blowout"
- 21 of the last 29 games since then have been decided by just one or two goals.
- More than half the games between the two schools (23 of 36), have been decided by one or two goals, including both games in 2008, which went to overtime.
- In the history of the series, the biggest win by either team is a 13-4 Syracuse win in 1938 in the first meeting between the two squads.
- Virginia's biggest win is a 15-7 victory in the Carrier Dome in 1995.
- UVA's 14-10 win in 2012 was the largest winning-margin for the Cavaliers in the series since winning 17-10 in the 2006 Final Four.
- UVA's 2014 win was a five-goal margin, 17-12, at Klöckner Stadium.
- Syracuse's 2015 win was a six-goal margin, 15-9, at the Dome, its largest win in the series since winning 18-12 in Charlottesville in 2004.
- All five meetings since 2016 have been one-goal games, with Syracuse holding a slim 3-2 margin over that time frame.

NO WONDER THE SERIES IS NEARLY 50/50

- Since 1994, the two teams have met 33 times—with Syracuse winning 17 times and Virginia 16.
- 22 of those games have been decided by one or two goals, including a string of five meetings - both games in 2008 went to overtime - until UVA's four-goal win in 2012 in Charlottesville snapped the streak.
- Currently the series has a five-game streak of one-goal games and the series has never had six-straight one-goal games.

LARS TIFFANY AND THE CARRIER DOME

- Lars Tiffany hails from LaFayette, N.Y., and attended LaFayette High School, which is roughly 10 miles from the Carrier Dome.
- The 2017 meeting between UVA and Syracuse was the first time Tiffany was on the sidelines of the Carrier Dome since his final game as a student-athlete at Brown in 1990, when the Bears fell to the Orange, 20-12, in the NCAA Quarterfinals. The 1990 season also served as the Gait brothers' final season with the Orange.
- The 2019 overtime win for Virginia at the Carrier Dome was the first win for Tiffany inside the venue. After the 2019 game, esteemed stick maker Alfie Jacques of the Onondaga Indian Reservation spoke to the team and gave Tiffany one of his hand-made short sticks.

BERTRAND RETURNS HOME

- Fifth-year senior Charlie Bertrand returns to Syracuse for his first game in the Carrier Dome since high school.
- Bertrand hails from Baldwinsville, N.Y., which is roughly 15 miles down I-690 to the Carrier Dome.
- Bertrand's only previous game inside the "Dome" came in his final career high school game in 2016. Bertrand's Baldwinsville Bees fell to the Fayetteville-Manlius Hornets, 8-7, with less than a minute to play of the Section III Class A Boy's Lacrosse Championship.

CORMIER AND SHELLENBERGER MAKING MARKS EARLY

- A/M Payton Cormier leads UVA with 12 goals in just three games. He had 12 goals in UVA's six games in 2020. Cormier also has at least a hat-trick in six of his nine career games.
- A/M Connor Shellenberger is off to a productive start in his career. He is tied for the team lead in points with 15, sharing with Cormier. Shellenberger has dished out at least two assists in each game this year, including season highs of three against Towson and at No. 11 Loyola.

MOORE NAMED ACC OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK (FEB. 23)

- A Matt Moore (Garnet Valley, Pa.) was named the ACC Offensive Player of the Week on Feb. 23. It was the first career weekly ACC accolade of Moore's career.
- Moore led UVA with five goals in the Cavaliers' 15-12 win at No. 11 Loyola.
- Moore scored three times in a key third quarter that spelled the difference in the game. Twice in the third quarter his goals broke a tie, including for the last time in the game with 2:58 remaining in the period to give UVA a 10-9 lead.
- His fifth goal iced the game in the fourth quarter.

GAVIN NAMED ACC DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK (FEB. 16)

- GK Bobby Gavin (San Diego, Calif.) was named the ACC Defensive Player of the Week on Feb. 16.
- Gavin made his first collegiate start against No. 12 Army after he was pressed into action for starter Alex Rode, the 2019 NCAA Tournament's Most Outstanding Player, who was not available.
- In just his second collegiate game, Gavin made 13 saves and helped UVA defeat the Black Knights, 14-9.
- After allowing four goals on the first four shots he saw on goal, Gavin saved 13 of the Black Knights next 18 shots on goal to aid the Cavalier defense.
- Gavin also saved seven of nine shots on goal by Army's All-American attackman Brendan Nichtern. He also picked up six ground balls and caused two turnovers in the winning cause.

AITKEN RETURNS TO UVA AFTER FOOTBALL STINT AT VILLANOVA

- Aitken, who graduated from UVA last May with a degree in foreign affairs, enrolled last fall at Villanova to play football.
- With uncertainty of being able to play a full FCS schedule this spring, Aitken was able to transfer back for the men's lacrosse season.

DOX AITKEN LEADS THE NATION'S MIDFIELD

- Senior Dox Aitken has 123 career goals, which leads all active midfielders.
- He is the only midfielder currently playing that has 100+ career goals.

UVA GETS A GOAL-SCORING MACHINE IN BERTRAND

• Charlie Bertrand scored 210 goals over 58 career games at Merrimack from 2017-20, which includes at least one in all 58 career games. During that span he helped Merrimack win back-to-back NCAA DI titles in 2018 and 2019, while also being named the NCAA DI National Player of the Year in each of those seasons. Merrimack made the jump to DI in 2020 and Bertrand scored 18 goals and dished five assists for 23 points in just six games in 2020 before the season was canceled due to the pandemic.
 • Bertrand left Merrimack with 274 career points on 210 goals and 64 assists.
 • In his first game with the Cavaliers he tallied four goals and two assists against Towson.
 • In his college career he has recorded at least two goals in 55 of his 61 career games (90.2), while in 43 of his 61 career games (70.5) he scored at least three goals.

The No. 5 Virginia Cavaliers (1-0) used a seven-goal second quarter to distance themselves from the Towson Tigers (0-1), 20-11, at Klöckner Stadium.

Connor Shellenberger scored seven points on four goals and three assists in his collegiate debut. Payton Cormier added a career-high six goals and one assist, while graduate transfer Charlie Bertrand notched four goals and two assists in his UVA debut.

HOW IT HAPPENED

UVA scored 52 seconds into the game to take an early 1-0 lead on an unassisted Shellenberger score. Towson rebounded with a 4-1 spurt to take a 4-2 lead with 6:26 left in the first frame. Cormier broke through with his first goal at 3:50 in the first quarter to jumpstart a 7-0 Cavalier run, pushing the Cavaliers ahead for good. Cormier scored four times during the run and capped it on a Shellenberger helper with 9:37 left in the second quarter, giving UVA an 9-4 lead.

Leading at the half, 11-5, UVA opened the third quarter scoring on a 7-2 streak to put the game out of reach. A dropdown shot by Peter Garno on another Shellenberger assist closed the third quarter scoring as UVA led 18-7 heading into the fourth quarter.

FROM THE LOCKER ROOM

“Give Towson a ton of credit. The way they came at us in the first quarter – they scored those four goals and hit three pipes. They were all over us. They came to Charlottesville to get a win and they were not intimidated at all. I was really impressed with their team and their coaching staff and how prepared they were. For us, it was getting into a rhythm at the face-off X, and Petey LaSalla started to pick up some tough ground balls and winning the possessions there. I thought we really did a nice job with our shooting. The No. 3 Virginia Cavaliers (2-0) picked up a key non-conference home win over the No. 12 Army West Point Black Knights (0-1), 14-9. The contest was played at the Lower Turf practice field due to field conditions at Klöckner Stadium.

The Cavaliers won 10-of-13 first-half faceoffs to control possession and alleviate a first-time starter in goal, Bobby Gavin, from a strong Army attack. Gavin, starting for Alex Rode who wasn’t available, allowed four goals on the first four shots he saw from Army.
