MATCH NOTES

FOR STARTERS

- The Cavaliers are the consensus No. 1 team for the second-straight week. The Cavaliers haven't been ranked No. 1 in consecutive weeks since 1996, George Gelnovatch's first season as head coach.
- The 10-0 start for Virginia is the best start in George Gelnovatch's 24-year tenure at UVA.
- Virginia is one of three undefeated, untied teams remaining in collegiate soccer.
- Virginia comes into Friday's match as the country's leader in goals against average (0.10), save percentage (.962) and shutouts (9).
- The Cavaliers have not allowed a goal in the last 627 minutes and have pitched a shutout in six-straight matches for the first time since 2009.
- Virginia is looking to go 5-0 in the ACC for the first time since 2005. The Cavaliers have won five or more ACC games four times (2000, 2001, 2005, 2006) under George Gelnovatch.
- Boston College and Virginia will meet for the first time since the Cavaliers ousted the Eagles in the first round of the 2017 tournament. Virginia hasn't won in Newton since 2005 and are 1-2-2 all-time in road games against Boston College.
- Friday will be the third of four true road games for Virginia in 2019. The Cavaliers have won five-straight regular season road games dating back to last season.

COACHING WINS

- Virginia head coach George Gelnovatch (327 wins) is looking to move into a tie with Boston College head coach Ed Kelly (328 wins) for the most wins among active ACC head coaches.
- Gelnovatch's surpassed Sasho Cirovski (321 wins) back on Sept. 20, for sole possession of third place on the all-time ACC coaching wins list.
- Gelnovatch is in his 24th season at the helm and owns the 7th-highest winning percentage (.693) among active NCAA coaches and the highest among ACC Coaches (minimum 10 years coaching).
- Last Friday's win over Louisville matched Virginia's win total from a year ago (10-4-3) and marks the 24th-straight season under Gelnovatch and 39th season overall, the Cavaliers have recorded double-digit wins. Only Maryland's Sasho Cirovski has more consecutive 10+ win seasons (25) among active NCAA head coaches.

STOUT DEFENSE

- Virginia has allowed only one goal through its first 10 games, the fewest in the 76-year history of the program. Last season the Cavaliers went seven games before conceding the season's second goal, which had happened only one other time (1985).
- Only four teams nationally have surrendered three or less goals (Virginia, Navy-2, Villanova-3 and Missouri State-3) in 2019.
- The Cavalier defensive trio comprised of Robin Afamefuna Henry Kessler, Andreas Ueland have started all 10 games and have missed a total of four minutes of game action as a unit.

WEEKLY ACCOLADES

- For the second-straight week and the fourth time this season a Cavalier was bestowed ACC weekly honors when Robin Afamefuna was recognized for his defensive prowess. Afamefuna was also listed on the College Soccer News Team of the Week.
- Afamefuna is the first Cavalier defender to garner ACC defensive accolades since 2017 and the four weekly ACC awards for Virginia are the most since 2016.
- Junior Henry Kessler was one of three defenders on the TopDrawerSoccer.com Team of the Week. Sophomore Daryl Dike with his three points against Louisville was a TopDrawerSoccer.com Team of the Week Honorable Mention.

HOW THEY SCORE IT

- A total of 11 different goal scorers are responsible for the 18 Virginia goals scored this season. Only Clemson (14), the nation's top scoring offense (3.45 gpg) and Wake Forest (12) have more goal scorers among ACC teams.
- Sophomore Daryl Dike leads the team in points (3g, 5a) with 11. He drew fouls to setup the game-winning goals against George Washington and Notre Dame.
- Dike's five assists are tied for the third most in the ACC and 23rd most in the country
- Spencer Patton, who scored the second goal against Louisville last Friday has scored in both of his two starts this season (9/13 at Duke).

ON THIS DATE

- On Oct. 11, 1992, Virginia improved to 12-0 and extended its unbeaten streak to 29 games with a 3-2 overtime victory over Clemson. With no golden goal rule in effect, Virginia scored two of its three goals in overtime, overcoming a 2-1 deficit in front of 4,117 fans in Clemson, S.C.
- Ben Crawley converted a penalty kick at the 115:08 mark the second overtime for the game-winning score. It was one of his school-record nine, game-winners that season. Crawley was a First Team All-American selection and led the ACC in goals scored with 17 in 1992.
- The 1992 Cavaliers went on to win its first 14 games of the year, matching a school record set by the 1987 squad.

RECORD CHASING

- Goalkeeper Colin Shutler was credited with his 17th career shutout last Friday, moving him into a tie with Tony Meola for the seventh most on the program's career shutout list. Shutler has 17 shutouts in 25 career starts for the Cavaliers.

FAST START

Virginia has won its first 10 games of the season six times in its 76-year history. The 10-0 start for the Cavaliers is the first since 1993 and the best in George Gelnovatch's 24-year tenure.

DEFENSIVE HIGHLIGHTS

- Against Western Michigan on (Sept. 23), Virginia allowed just two shots and none on target.
- Virginia did not allow a NC State shot attempt for the first 80 minutes on Sept. 20. The four Wolfpack shots in the contest all came in the final 10 minutes including its lone shot on goal.
- Virginia has held five of its 10 opponents this season to single-digit shots, including five against No. 1 Maryland, the fewest shots by the Terps since Nov. 17, 2013, also against the Cavaliers.

CAPTAIN'S IMPACT

- Captains Robin Afamefuna and Joe Bell have been mainstays on the pitch for the Cavaliers in recent years. Bell has started every game of his career, a span of 48 matches while Afamefuna has started 33-consecutive matches.
- The duo has been on the field for all but four minutes of the last 27 games, a stretch that includes 20 wins and 18 shutouts.

SCHEDULE GAUNTLET

- Including matches against ranked foes, Duke and Maryland, the Cavaliers played five 2018 NCAA Tournament teams through their first six games of the season.
- Virginia and Georgetown are the only two programs to face 2018 postseason qualifiers in the first six games.

FACING NO. 1 AND NO. 2

- Virginia has faced the No. 1 and the No. 2 nationally ranked team in the country in the same season eight times.
- Prior to this season, Virginia had only took down both the No. 1 and No. 2 teams in the country twice, in 2009 and 2014, both National Championship seasons.

PRESEASON NOTES

- Virginia comes into the 2019 season ranked 12th in the country by the United Soccer Coaches, the highest preseason ranking since 2015 when it ranked 2nd after winning the program's seventh National Championship in the fall prior.
- For the third-straight season, Virginia was picked to finish second in the Coastal Division in a poll of the league's 12 head coaches.
- The Cavaliers were one of four teams (UNC, Duke & Wake Forest) to receive a first place vote for the league's overall champion.

HOOS BACK

- The Cavaliers return 15 letterwinners including eight of 11 starters from last season.
- Headed by junior Nathaniel Crofts (4g, 6a), six of the top seven point scorers from 2018 are on this year's roster. Virginia returns 83 percent of its scoring (20 of 24 goals) along with goalkeepers Colin Shuter and Marcel DaSilva.

DECORATED SECOND YEARS

- Virginia set an ACC record with four honorees on the ACC All-Freshman team in 2018.
- Second years Daryl Dike, Cabrel Happi Kamseu and Daniel Steedman are all back for their sophomore campaigns. Dike and Happi Kamseu led the Cavaliers with five goals each. Steedman added a pair of goals both in conference play.
- Defender Aboubacar Keita signed a homegrown contract with the Columbus Crew SC and has appeared in six MLS matches through last Sunday.

HEAD COACH GEORGE GELNOVATCH



George Gelnovatch is in the midst of his 24th season as the head coach of the Virginia men's soccer program. The longest tenured head coach in program history, Gelnovatch has led the Cavaliers to a pair of national championships in 2009 and 2014 as well as five NCAA College Cup appearances and 23-consecutive berths in the NCAA tournament.

Gelnovatch became the program's all-time leader in wins on August 25, 2017 with a 3-2 double-overtime victory over Villanova, surpassing his UVA mentor Bruce Arena for the program record in wins with 296. He reached the 300-win plateau on Sept. 15, 2017 with a 2-1 triumph at Virginia Tech, becoming just the fourth coach in Atlantic Coast Conference history to win 300 career matches.

A former Cavalier soccer All-American and assistant coach, Gelnovatch has guided Virginia to four ACC tournament titles, two regular-season ACC championships and a record of 317-129-57 (.687) in his first 23 seasons as UVA head coach. Over the course of his 30 years as an assistant and head coach at Virginia, he has been a part of all seven of the Cavaliers' national championships.

Gelnovatch is the first coach in NCAA Division I men's soccer history to lead 20-straight teams to the NCAA tournament. He is one of just eight coaches in the Division I men's soccer annals to take 20 teams to the tournament and one of only four active coaches to do so.

Gelnovatch ranks as the seventh-winningest active head coach in Division I college soccer, with a .687 career winning percentage. Going into the 2019 season he stood 15th in career wins among current head coaches. Among Division I coaches all-time, he ranked 38th in career winning percentage and 41st in wins going into 2019. These figures are even more striking when considering Gelnovatch's teams play one of the nation's toughest schedules on a yearly basis.

Virginia has won at least 15 games in a season nine times under Gelnovatch, including 2009 when the team recorded 19 victories en route to the conference and national championships.

Gelnovatch has developed a number of Major League Soccer players during his UVA tenure, with 27 players going in MLS drafts and nine in the MLS Supplemental Draft, while six signed Project-40/Generation Adidas contracts and Jordan Allen (2014), Derrick Etienne (2015), Scott Thomsen (2015) and Aboubacar Keita (2018) each signed MLS Homegrown contracts. Jason Moore (1999) and Alecko Eskandarian (2003) were selected No. 1 in the MLS Draft, as 11 Cavaliers have been picked in the first round of the various MLS drafts.

Gelnovatch was named the 10th coach of the Virginia program on Jan. 3, 1996, after Bruce Arena announced he would end his 18-year career at the helm of UVA soccer to become head coach and assistant general manager of Major League Soccer's D.C. United.

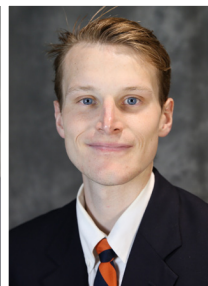
