MATCH NOTES

FOR STARTERS

- Virginia and James Madison will meet for the first time since 2016, a 3-1 Cavalier victory.
- The Cavaliers are one of seven teams nationally without a loss this season.
- The Virginia defense leads the country in goals against average (0.18), save percentage (.818) and shutouts (9).
- In the first installment of the NCAA RPI, Virginia ranks No.1 among the 206 DI men's soccer pro-grams. The Cavaliers are No. 1 in Monday's TopDrawer.com Poll while the United Soccer Coaches poll is revealed on Tuesday (Oct. 15).
- Virginia is 6-0 at home this season and has won seven-straight matches at Klöckner Stadium dating back to last season.
- The Cavaliers are 4-0 against nationally ranked opponents in 2019.
- Virginia comes into the contest unbeaten in its last 13 regular season non-conference matches 12-0-1.

AGAINST JAMES MADISON

- Virginia is unbeaten in its last 19 matches against James Madison.
- Under head coach George Gelnovatch, the Cavaliers are 5-0-1 against the Dukes.
- Virginia owns a 19-4-2 advantage in the all-time series that first began in 1972.
- This marks the third time that both teams come into the match up nationally ranked and first time since 2000.

DOMINANT DRAW

- In its third true road game of the season Virginia drew even with Boston College, 1-1 on soggy Friday night in Newton Mass.
- Junior Spencer Patton broke a 0-0 stalemate in the 57th minute but a little under eight minutes later, BC was the beneficiary of a UVA own goal to level the match at one.
- It marked the first time Virginia has surrendered an own goal since a 3-2 win over Wright State on Oct. 16, 2012 and also snapped a 692-minute opponent scoreless streak.
- Virginia dominated the match in all facets, with a 21-3 shot advantage and took 14 of the 15 cor-ner kick attempts on the night. The Eagles did not take a single shot on goal.
- The draw snapped a 10-game winning streak, the best start in the George Gelnovatch era.

DISSECTING THE DEFENSE

- Virginia has surrendered two goals in 11 games, the fewest in the country. Only Navy (3 goals in 12 games) and Missouri State (4 goals in 11 games) have allowed less than five goals this season.
- Friday night against Boston College was the second time this season (Western Michigan – Sept. 23) an opponent has failed to register a shot on target.
- Virginia has held opponents to five or less total shots four times and single-digit shots six times.
- The Cavaliers have trailed for a total of 22:23 of the 832:07 minutes played this year.
- The defensive trio comprised of Robin Afamefuna Henry Kessler, Andreas Ueland have started all 11 games and have missed a total of four minutes of game action as a unit.
- Virginia allowed one goal through its first 10 games, the fewest in the 76-year history of the pro-gram. Last season the Cavaliers went seven games before conceding the season's second goal, which had happened only one other time (1985).

HOW THEY SCORE IT

- A total of 11 different goal scorers are responsible for the 19 Virginia goals scored this season.
- Only Clemson (14), the nation's top scoring offense (3.50 gpg) and Wake Forest (12) have more goal scorers among ACC teams.
- Sophomore Daryl Dike leads the team in points (3g, 5a) with 12. Not included in his stats are the fouls he drew to setup the game-winning goals against George Washington and Notre Dame.
- Dike's six assists are the third most in the ACC and 20th most in the country
- Joe Bell has four points (1g, 2a) in his last four games. The Cavaliers are 11-2-1 in his three sea-seasons when he registers a point.
- Against Boston College junior Spencer Patton scored his third goal of the year on Friday night and all of three have come against ACC opponents. He logged 58 minutes in Friday night's match and has appeared in every game this season with starts against Duke (Sept.13) and Louisville (Oct. 4).

RECORD CHASING

- Goalkeeper Colin Shutler was credited with his 17th career shutout last Friday (Oct. 4) against Louisville, moving him into a tie with Tony Meola for the seventh most on the program's career shutout list.
- Shutler has 17 shutouts in 26 career starts for the Cavaliers.
- The redshirt junior is also the NCAA's active leader with a career goals against average (0.48) which is the third lowest in UVA history.

COACHING WINS

• Virginia head coach George Gelnovatch (327 wins) is looking to move into a tie with Boston College head coach Ed Kelly (328 wins) for the most wins among active ACC head coaches.
 • Gelnovatch's surpassed Sasho Cirovski (321 wins) back on Sept. 20. for sole possession of third place on the all-time ACC coaching wins list.
 • Gelnovatch is in his 24th season at the helm and owns the 7th-highest winning percentage (.693) among active NCAA coaches and the highest among ACC Coaches (minimum 10 years coaching).
 • Last Friday's (Oct. 4) win over Louisville matched Virginia's win total from a year ago (10-4-3) and marks the 24th-straight season under Gelnovatch and 39th season overall, the Cavaliers have recorded double-digit wins. Only Maryland's Sasho Cirovski has more consecutive 10+ win seasons (25) among active NCAA head coaches.

FAST START

Virginia won its first 10 games of the season six times in its 76-year history. The 10-0 start for the Cavaliers was the first since 1993 and the best in George Gelnovatch's 24-year tenure.

SCORELESS STREAK

• Virginia held opponents scoreless for 692 consecutive minutes, a span of eight games from Sept. 13 through Oct. 11.
 • The Cavalier defense recorded six-consecutive shutouts, the most since 2009.

DEFENSIVE HIGHLIGHTS

• The Cavaliers have twice held opponents to no shots on target this season (W. Michigan - Sept. 23 & BC - Oct. 11).
 • Virginia did not allow a NC State shot attempt for the first 80 minutes on Sept. 20. The four Wolfpack shots in the contest all came in the final 10 minutes including its lone shot on goal.
 • Virginia has held six of its 11 opponents this season to single-digit shots, including five against No. 1 Maryland, the fewest shots by the Terps since Nov. 17, 2013, also against the Cavaliers.

CAPTAIN'S IMPACT

• Captains Robin Afamefuna and Joe Bell have been mainstays on the pitch for the Cavaliers in recent years. Bell has started every game of his career, a span of 49 matches while Afamefuna has started 34-consecutive matches.

• The duo has been on the field for all but four minutes of the last 28 games, a stretch that includes 20 wins and 18 shutouts.

SCHEDULE GAUNTLET

• Including matches against ranked foes, Duke and Maryland, the Cavaliers played five 2018 NCAA Tournament teams through their first six games of the season.
 • Virginia and Georgetown are the only two programs to face 2018 postseason qualifiers in the first six games.

FACING NO. 1 AND NO. 2

• Virginia has faced the No. 1 and the No. 2 nationally ranked team in the country in the same season eight times.
 • Prior to this season, Virginia had only taken down both the No. 1 and No. 2 teams in the country twice, in 2009 and 2014, both National Championship seasons.

PRESEASON NOTES

• Virginia comes into the 2019 season ranked 12th in the country by the United Soccer Coaches, the highest preseason ranking since 2015 when it ranked 2nd after winning the program's seventh National Championship in the fall prior.
 • For the third-straight season, Virginia was picked to finish second in the Coastal Division in a poll of the league's 12 head coaches.
 • The Cavaliers were one of four teams (UNC, Duke & Wake Forest) to receive a first place vote for the league's overall champion.

HOOS BACK

• The Cavaliers return 15 letterwinners including eight of 11 starters from last season.
 • Headed by junior Nathaniel Crofts (4g, 6a), six of the top seven point scorers from 2018 are on this year's roster. Virginia returns 83 percent of its scoring (20 of 24 goals) along with goalkeepers Colin Shutler and Marcel DaSilva.

DECORATED SECOND YEARS

• Virginia set an ACC record with four honorees on the ACC All-Freshman team in 2018.
 • Second years Daryl Dike, Cabrel Happi Kamseu and Daniel Steedman are all back for their sophomore campaigns. Dike and Happi Kamseu led the Cavaliers with five goals each. Steedman added a pair of goals both in conference play.
 • Defender Aboubacar Keita signed a homegrown contract with the Columbus Crew SC and has appeared in six MLS matches through last Sunday.

HEAD COACH GEORGE GELNOVATCH



George Gelnovatch is in the midst of his 24th season as the head coach of the Virginia men's soccer program. The longest tenured head coach in program history, Gelnovatch has led the Cavaliers to a pair of national championships in 2009 and 2014 as well as five NCAA College Cup appearances and 23-consecutive berths in the NCAA tournament.

Gelnovatch became the program's all-time leader in wins on August 25, 2017 with a 3-2 double-overtime victory over Villanova, surpassing his UVA mentor Bruce Arena for the program record in wins with 296. He reached the 300-win plateau on Sept. 15, 2017 with a 2-1 triumph at Virginia Tech, becoming just the fourth coach in Atlantic Coast Conference history to win 300 career matches.

A former Cavalier soccer All-American and assistant coach, Gelnovatch has guided Virginia to four ACC tournament titles, two regular-season ACC championships and a record of 317-129-57 (.687) in his first 23 seasons as UVA head coach. Over the course of his 30 years as an assistant and head coach at Virginia, he has been a part of all seven of the Cavaliers' national championships.

Gelnovatch is the first coach in NCAA Division I men's soccer history to lead 20-straight teams to the NCAA tournament. He is one of just eight coaches in the Division I men's soccer annals to take 20 teams to the tournament and one of only four active coaches to do so.

Gelnovatch ranks as the seventh-winningest active head coach in Division I college soccer, with a .687 career winning percentage. Going into the 2019 season he stood 15th in career wins among current head coaches. Among Division I coaches all-time, he ranked 38th in career winning percentage and 41st in wins going into 2019. These figures are even more striking when considering Gelnovatch's teams play one of the nation's toughest schedules on a yearly basis.

Virginia has won at least 15 games in a season nine times under Gelnovatch, including 2009 when the team recorded 19 victories en route to the conference and national championships.

Gelnovatch has developed a number of Major League Soccer players during his UVA tenure, with 27 players going in MLS drafts and nine in the MLS Supplemental Draft, while six signed Project-40/Generation Adidas contracts and Jordan Allen (2014), Derrick Etienne (2015), Scott Thomsen (2015) and Aboubacar Keita (2018) each signed MLS Homegrown contracts. Jason Moore (1999) and Alecko Eskandarian (2003) were selected No. 1 in the MLS Draft, as 11 Cavaliers have been picked in the first round of the various MLS drafts.

Gelnovatch was named the 10th coach of the Virginia program on Jan. 3, 1996, after Bruce Arena announced he would end his 18-year career at the helm of UVA soccer to become head coach and assistant general manager of Major League Soccer's D.C. United.

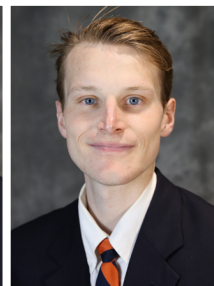
