#### MATCH NOTES

#### FOR STARTERS

- The Cavaliers are the consensus No. 1 team in the country for the first time since 2014.
- Virginia and Louisville will meet for the first time since the 2017 ACC Quarterfinal match, a 0-0 draw at Lynn Stadium.
- The 9-0 start for Virginia is the best start in George Gelnovatch's 24-year tenure at UVA.
- Virginia is one of four undefeated, untied teams remaining in collegiate soccer.
- Virginia comes into Friday's match as the country's leader in goals against average (0.11), save percentage (.955) and shut-outs (8).
- The Cavaliers have not allowed a goal in the last 537 minutes and have pitched a shutout in five-straight matches for the first time since 2009.
- Virginia is looking to go 4-0 in the ACC for the first time since 2008. The Cavaliers have won four or more ACC games 12 times under George Gelnovatch.

#### AGAINST THE CARDINALS

- Louisville holds a 3-1-1 advantage in the all-time series that first began in 2013.
- The last Virginia victory against the Cardinals came on Oct. 2, 2015, a 3-2 win at Klöckner Stadium.
- Sixth-seeded Virginia advanced past third-seeded Louisville on penalty kicks after the two teams played to a 110-minute scoreless draw in the 2017 ACC Quarterfinal.
- Cardinal goalkeeper Jake Gelnovatch is the son of Virginia head coach George Gelnovatch. The 2017 meeting was the only time the two have squared off against each other. Jake Gelnovatch made one save and was credited with a shutout before being relieved by Will Meyer in the decisive shootout.

#### OFFENSIVE ONSLAUGHT

- Virginia matched a season-high with three goals in Tuesday night's win over George Washington.
- All three goal scorers – Robin Afamefuna, Philip Horton and Bret Halsey - recorded their first tallies of the season. For Horton and Halsey the goals were the first of their collegiate careers.
- Virginia peppered a season-high 21 shots against the Colonials, the most since unleashing 23 against Portland on Oct. 2, 2017.

#### STOUT DEFENSE

- Virginia has allowed only one goal through its first nine games, the fewest in the 76-year history of the program. Last season the Cavaliers went seven games before conceding the season's second goal, which had happened only one other time (1985).
- Only four teams nationally have surrendered three or less goals (Virginia, Navy-2, Villanova-3 and SMU-3).
- The Cavalier defensive trio comprised of Robin Afamefuna Henry Kessler, Andreas Ueland have started all nine games and have missed a total of four minutes of game action as a unit.

#### WELL ROUNDED ATTACK

- A total of 11 different goal scorers are responsible for the 16 Virginia goal scorers this season. Only Clemson, the nation's top scoring offense (3.8 gpg), has more goal scorers (14) among ACC teams.
- Five players – Joe Bell, Daryl Dike, Nathaniel Crofts, Irakoze Donasiyano and Daryl Dike – share the team-lead in goals with two.
- Dike leads the team in points with eight (2g, 4a) and his four helpers are tied for fifth in the ACC.
- Working his way back into his lineup, sophomore Cabrel Happi Kamseu has a goal and an assist in the last 79 minutes of action off the bench, a span of three games. He co-lead the team with five goals last season.

#### THE KLÖCKNER ADVANTAGE

- Virginia comes into Friday's match with a 6-0 record at home and have won seven-straight games at Klöckner Stadium dating back to last season.
- On Tuesday, Virginia registered its 290th win at Klöckner Stadium with a 3-0 win at George Washington.
- The Cavaliers have won 81 percent of its matches at Klöckner Stadium since its opening in 1992.
- Against NC State on Sept. 20, Virginia drew 3,858 fans, the largest crowd since Sept. 22, 2017 when 4,205 turned out for a match against North Carolina.

#### UNDEFEATED, UNTIED IN COLLEGE SOCCER

- The Cavaliers are one of four teams (Missouri St., Navy, SMU) in the country unbeaten and untied.
- No. 1 Virginia – 9-0 vs. No. 24 Louisville (10/4)

## FAST START

Virginia has won its first nine games of the season six times in its 76-year history. The 9-0 start for the Cavaliers is the first since 1993 and the best in George Gelnovatch's 24-year tenure.

## PLAYER OF THE WEEK X2

• For the second time this season and the fourth time in his career, Colin Shutler was named the ACC Defensive Player of the Week.  
• Shutler was credited with clean sheets against Western Michigan and Notre Dame. Against the Irish he made a save in each half, including a close range shot in the 67th minute to keep the game scoreless. Junior Joe Bell scored the game-winning goal just over two minutes later.

## DEFENSIVE HIGHLIGHTS

• Against Western Michigan on (Sept. 23), Virginia allowed just two shots and none on target.  
• Virginia did not allow a NC State shot attempt for the first 80 minutes on Sept. 20. The four Wolfpack shots in the contest all came in the final 10 minutes including its lone shot on goal.  
• Virginia has held five of its nine opponents this season to single-digit shots, including five against No. 1 Maryland, the fewest shots by the Terps since Nov. 17, 2013, also against the Cavaliers.

## CAPTAIN'S IMPACT

• Captains Robin Afamefuna and Joe Bell have been mainstays on the pitch for the Cavaliers in recent years. Bell has started every game of his career, a span of 47 matches while Afamefuna has started 32-consecutive matches.  
• The duo has been on the field for all but four minutes of the last 26 games, a stretch that includes 19 wins and 17 shutouts.

## SCHEDULE GAUNTLET

• Including matches against ranked foes, Duke and Maryland, the Cavaliers played 2018 NCAA Tournament teams through their first six games of the season. • Virginia and No. 2 Georgetown are the only two programs to poised face five, 2018 postseason qualifiers in the first six games.

## FACING NO. 1 AND NO. 2

• Virginia has faced the No. 1 and the No. 2 nationally ranked team in the country in the same season eight times.

• Prior to this season, Virginia had only took down both the No. 1 and No. 2 teams in the country twice, in 2009 and 2014, both National Championship seasons.

## WEEKLY HONORS

• Goalkeeper Colin Shutler has been named ACC Defensive Player of the Week twice this season (9/9 & 9/30). He's collected four weekly honors in two years as the Cavaliers' starting goalkeeper.  
• For his two-goal performance in the season-opener against Pacific, junior Irakoze Donasiyano was named the ACC Offensive Player of the Week on Tuesday, Sept. 3.  
• Donasiyano scored in the 44th minute of the season opener and again in the 48th minute. He became the first Cavalier to tally two goals on opening night since Tony Tchani scored twice against Portland in the first game of the 2009 season.

## PRESEASON NOTES

• Virginia comes into the 2019 season ranked 12th in the country by the United Soccer Coaches, the highest preseason ranking since 2015 when it ranked 2nd after winning the program's seventh National Championship in the fall prior.  
• For the third-straight season, Virginia was picked to finish second in the Coastal Division in a poll of the league's 12 head coaches.  
• The Cavaliers were one of four teams (UNC, Duke & Wake Forest) to receive a first place vote for the league's overall champion.

## HOOS BACK

• The Cavaliers return 15 letterwinners including eight of 11 starters from last season.  
• Headed by junior Nathaniel Crofts (4g, 6a), six of the top seven point scorers from 2018 are on this year's roster. Virginia returns 83 percent of its scoring (20 of 24 goals) along with goalkeepers Colin Shutler and Marcel DaSilva.

## DECORATED SECOND YEARS

• Virginia set an ACC record with four honorees on the ACC All-Freshman team in 2018.  
• Second years Daryl Dike, Cabrel Happi Kamseu and Daniel Steedman are all back for their sophomore campaigns. Dike and Happi Kamseu led the Cavaliers with five goals each. Steedman added a pair of goals both in conference play.  
• Defender Aboubacar Keita signed a homegrown contract with the Columbus Crew SC and has appeared in six MLS matches through last Sunday.

# HEAD COACH GEORGE GELNOVATCH



George Gelnovatch is in the midst of his 24th season as the head coach of the Virginia men's soccer program. The longest tenured head coach in program history, Gelnovatch has led the Cavaliers to a pair of national championships in 2009 and 2014 as well as five NCAA College Cup appearances and 23-consecutive berths in the NCAA tournament.

Gelnovatch became the program's all-time leader in wins on August 25, 2017 with a 3-2 double-overtime victory over Villanova, surpassing his UVA mentor Bruce Arena for the program record in wins with 296. He reached the 300-win plateau on

Sept. 15, 2017 with a 2-1 triumph at Virginia Tech, becoming just the fourth coach in Atlantic Coast Conference history to win 300 career matches.

A former Cavalier soccer All-American and assistant coach, Gelnovatch has guided Virginia to four ACC tournament titles, two regular-season ACC championships and a record of 317-129-57 (.687) during his tenure as UVA head coach. Over the course of his 30 years as an assistant and head coach at Virginia, he has been a part of all seven of the Cavaliers' national championships.

Gelnovatch is the first coach in NCAA Division I men's soccer history to lead 20-straight teams to the NCAA tournament. He is one of just eight coaches in the Division I men's soccer annals to take 20 teams to the tournament and one of only four active coaches to do so.

Gelnovatch ranks as the seventh-winningest active head coach in Division I college soccer, with a .687 career winning percentage. He stands 15th in career wins among current head coaches. Among Division I coaches all-time, he ranks 38th in career winning percentage and 41st in wins. These figures are even more striking when considering Gelnovatch's teams play one of the nation's toughest schedules on a yearly basis.

Virginia has won at least 15 games in a season nine times under Gelnovatch, including 2009 when the team recorded 19 victories en route to the conference and national championships.

Gelnovatch has developed a number of Major League Soccer players during his UVA tenure, with 27 players going in MLS drafts and nine in the MLS Supplemental Draft, while six signed Project-40/Generation Adidas contracts and Jordan Allen (2014), Derrick Etienne (2015), Scott Thomsen (2015) and Aboubacar Keita (2018) each signed MLS Homegrown contracts. Jason Moore (1999) and Alecko Eskandarian (2003) were selected No. 1 in the MLS Draft, as 11 Cavaliers have been picked in the first round of the various MLS drafts.

Gelnovatch was named the 10th coach of the Virginia program on Jan. 3, 1996, after Bruce Arena announced he would end his 18-year career at the helm of UVA soccer to become head coach and assistant general manager of Major League Soccer's D.C. United.

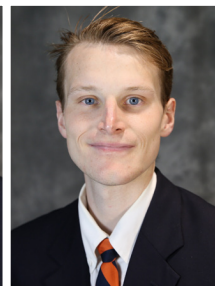
