MATCH NOTES

FOR STARTERS

- Wake Forest will be the seventh ranked opponent for Virginia this season. The Cavaliers are 6-0 this season against the top-25.
- Klöckner Stadium will host only its third ACC Semifinal ever (1996, 2017 & 2019) and second in three years.
- The appearance in the ACC Semifinal is the 26th in Virginia history and 17th in 24 seasons under George Gelnovatch.
- Virginia has advanced to the ACC Semifinals for the second time in three years
- The Cavaliers come into Wednesday with the second lowest goals against average (0.35), second highest save percentage (.882) and the most shutouts (12) in the country.
- The Cavaliers own a 11-1 record at home this season, the most home wins of any team in the NCAA. No. 1 Clemson is the only other program with double-digit home wins (10).
- Virginia's 15 wins are tied for the second most in collegiate soccer, second only to Missouri State's 16 victories.
- Virginia is one of nine programs nationally with one or no losses this season and Virginia's .912 winning percentage is the third highest in the NCAA.
- The Cavaliers have conceded just six goals this season, tied with Georgetown for the fewest by any team in DI soccer.

AGAINST WAKE FOREST

- In 57 all-time meetings, either Virginia or Wake Forest has been the No. 1 team in the nation 13 times. Including Wednesday's match, one or both teams have been ranked in the top five in 32 of the 57 all-time matchups.
- The Cavaliers are unbeaten (13-0-5) against Wake Forest in ACC Tournament games. The last four ACC postseason matchups have need extra time. Among the five draws, the Demon Deacons have advanced past Virginia twice (2006 & 2017) in PKs.
- The two teams engaged in a wild, back and forth match that saw Wake Forest score two unanswered, second-half goals just 1:37 apart to come away with a 3-2 victory in front of 2,791 fans at Klöckner Stadium last season. Virginia held its only lead after a Daniel Steedman bicycle kick goal in the 73rd minute. Three of the game's four second half goals came in a 4:52 span.
- Wednesday's semifinal is also a rematch of the 2017 ACC Championship final that ended in a scoreless draw. The Demon Deacons claimed the tournament title after defeating the Cavaliers in penalty kicks, 4-3.

HOW WE GOT HERE

- The Cavaliers reached the 15-win plateau for the first time since 2009 after a 2-1 victory over Syracuse on Sunday afternoon. Virginia has won 15 games under Gelnovatch 10 times.
- Virginia scored two goals in the first 18 minutes of action in the quarterfinal round against 10th-seeded Syracuse. Joe Bell converted his team-high, third PK in the 11th minute and was followed by Nathaniel Crofts' fourth goal of the season in the 18th minute.
- Syracuse became just the fifth team to score against the Cavaliers this season, cutting the Cavalier lead in half on a goal by Luther Archimede in the 70th minute.
- The Cavaliers withstood a late Syracuse charge, fending off the game's final four shots and two corner Orange kicks in the final 20 minutes.

VIRGINIA IN THE NATIONAL RANKINGS

- The Cavaliers came in at No. 2 in this week's United Soccer Coaches Top-25 poll. It's spent 10-straight weeks in the top-7 and a total of eight in the top-5
- TopDrawerSoccer.com and College Soccer News each have Virginia as the No. 1 team in the country.
- Coming into Wednesday's match, Virginia also occupies the top spot in the latest NCAA RPI rankings while Wake Forest is ranked fifth.
- Back on Nov. 1, the NCAA DI men's soccer selection committee released its top 16 rankings and Virginia came in at No. 2 while Wake Forest was fifth.

VIRGINIA IN THE ACC TOURNAMENT

- The Cavaliers own the most wins (43), goals (114), finals appearances (19) and tournament titles (10) in 32 years of the ACC Tournament.
- Under George Gelnovatch, Virginia has won four ACC Tournament Championships (1997, 2003, 2004, 2009) in his 24-year tenure.
- The Cavaliers have made it to the ACC Championship game 19 times with the last appearance coming in 2017, a 0-0 draw and PK shootout loss to Wake Forest.
- The Cavaliers earned a first-round bye in this year's tournament by winning the Coastal Division Championship for the first time in the current two-division format (2014-present).
- The No. 2 seed in the tournament is Virginia's highest since 2005.
- The Cavaliers have earned a first-round bye once (2015) in the last six seasons.
- Virginia is 423-19-12 in ACC Tournament games. Only eight tournament games have been played at Klöckner Stadium (two in 2017) in which the Cavaliers own 7-2 mark.

NOTES CONTINUED

REGULAR SEASON TO REMEMBER

- Virginia won six ACC games for the fifth time in program history (1984, 1986, 2001, 2005 & 2019) and third under head coach George Gelnovatch.
- Gelnovatch was a player on the 1984 and 1986 teams that won six ACC games and later as head coach led the Cavaliers to six league victories in 2001, 2005 and 2019.
- Virginia won its first Coastal Division Championship under the current two-division format (2014-present). The regular season crown is the first since 2001 and the third under Gelnovatch (1996, 2001, 2019).
- Virginia won 14 regular season games for the first time since winning 15 matches in 2006.
- The Cavaliers won all eight of its non-conference matches and did not concede a goal in their non-conference slate for the first time in school history. The non-conference schedule included a 2-0 win over then-No. 1 and defending National Champion Maryland at Audi Field on Sept. 2.
- Virginia allowed only five goals in 16 regular season games, matching a school record set in 1969 (10 games) and 1988 (18 games).
- Virginia spent three weeks as the nation's No. 1 team in the United Coaches Top 25 poll. The Cavaliers were ranked No. 12 in the preseason, jumped five spots in week one and have not been outside the top seven since.

CLEAN SHEETS

- Virginia has produced a shutout in 12 of its 17 matches this season, the most in the country.
- Under George Gelnovatch, the Cavaliers have reached 10+ shutouts, eight times including the National Championship seasons of 2009 and 2014.
- The 12 clean sheets in the regular season are the most in Gelnovatch's tenure and tied for fourth most in UVA history.

HOW THEY SCORE IT

- A total of 12 different goal scorers are responsible for the 27 Virginia goals scored this season.
- Sophomore Daryl Dike leads the team in points (7g, 7a) with 21. The 21 points are the most by a Cavaliers since Will Bates totaled 25 (12g, 1a) in 2012, one of four 20+ point seasons for Bates.
- Not included in Dike's stats are the fouls he drew to setup the game-winning goals against George Washington and Notre Dame. He also drew a foul in the box against Syracuse in the ACC Quarterfinals to setup a Joe Bell, first-half goal.
- Dike's seven assists are tied for the sixth-most in the ACC.
- Nathaniel Crofts has four game-winning goals, tied for the second most in the ACC. Three of the four game-winners have come against ACC Schools.
- Joe Bell had four assists in league play this season, tied for the third most of any ACC player. The Cavaliers are 12-2-1 in his three seasons when he registers a point.

FRIDAY OF FIRSTS

- Virginia suffered its only loss of the season on Oct. 18 against Pittsburgh. The Panthers scored on two of their four shots on goal in a 2-0 victory.
- The two goals were the first two scored by an opponent at Klöckner Stadium in nine games and the loss snapped a nine-game home regular season win streak.
- The Cavaliers trailed for the first time going into the halftime break. Prior to the match, Virginia had only trailed for 23 minutes through its first 12 games.

CAPTAIN'S IMPACT

- Captains Robin Afamefuna and Joe Bell have been mainstays on the pitch for the Cavaliers in recent years. Bell has started every game of his career, a span of 55 matches while Afamefuna has started 40-consecutive matches.
- The duo has been on the field for all but 11 minutes of the last 40 games, a stretch that includes 27 wins and 24 shutouts.

DISSECTING THE DEFENSE

- Virginia has surrendered six goals in 17 games, tied for the fewest in the country.
- Against Boston College (Oct. 11) was the second time this season (Western Michigan – Sept. 23) an opponent has failed to register a shot on target.
- Virginia has held opponents to five or less total shots five times and single-digit shots 10 times.
- The defensive trio comprised of Robin Afamefuna, Henry Kessler, Andreas Ueland have started all 17 games and have missed a total of 11 minutes of game action as a unit.
- Virginia allowed one goal through its first 10 games, the fewest in the 76-year history of the program. Last season the Cavaliers went seven games before conceding the season's second goal, which had happened only one other time (1985).

RECORD CHASING

- Goalkeeper Colin Shutler was credited with his 20th career shutout in the team's road finale at Virginia Tech, moving him into sole possession of sixth place on the program's career shutout list.
- Shutler has 20 shutouts in 32 career starts for the Cavaliers.
- The redshirt junior owns the NCAA's lowest active career goals against average (0.51) which is tied for the third lowest in UVA history.

COACHING WINS

- Virginia head coach George Gelnovatch (332 wins) is the most wins among active ACC head coaches.
- Gelnovatch's surpassed Sasho Cirovski (321 wins) back on Sept. 20. for sole possession of third place on the all-time ACC coaching wins list.
- Gelnovatch is in his 24th season at the helm and owns the 7th-highest winning percentage (.694) among active NCAA coaches and the highest among ACC Coaches (minimum 10 years coaching).
- Gelnovatch has won 10 or more games in all 24 seasons as head coach and the program has won 10 or more games in 39-straight seasons. Only Maryland's Sasho Cirovski has more consecutive 10+ win seasons (25) among active NCAA head coaches.

FAST START

Virginia won its first 10 games of the season six times in its 76-year history. The 10-0 start for the Cavaliers was the first since 1993 and the best in George Gelnovatch's 24-year tenure.

- Virginia held opponents scoreless for 692 consecutive minutes, a span of eight games from Sept. 13 through Oct. 11.

DEFENSIVE HIGHLIGHTS

- Virginia dominated the match against Boston College in all facets, with a 21-3 shot advantage and took 14 of the 15 corner kick attempts on the night. The Eagles did not take a single shot on goal.
- The Cavaliers have twice held opponents to no shots on target this season (W. Michigan - Sept. 23 & BC - Oct. 11).
- Virginia did not allow a NC State shot attempt for the first 80 minutes on Sept. 20. The four Wolfpack shots in the contest all came in the final 10 minutes including its lone shot on goal.
- Virginia has held 10 of its 17 opponents this season to single-digit shots, including five against No. 1 Maryland, the fewest shots by the Terps since Nov. 17, 2013, also against the Cavaliers.

SCHEDULE GAUNTLET

- Including matches against ranked foes, Duke and Maryland, the Cavaliers played five 2018 NCAA Tournament teams through their first six games of the season.
- Virginia and Georgetown were the only two programs to face 2018 postseason qualifiers in five of the first six games.

FACING NO. 1 AND NO. 2

- Virginia has faced the No. 1 and the No. 2 nationally ranked team in the country in the same season eight times.

PRESEASON NOTES

- Virginia comes into the 2019 season ranked 12th in the country by the United Soccer Coaches, the highest preseason ranking since 2015 when it ranked 2nd after winning the program's seventh National Championship in the fall prior.
- For the third-straight season, Virginia was picked to finish second in the Coastal Division in a poll of the league's 12 head coaches.
- The Cavaliers were one of four teams (UNC, Duke & Wake Forest) to receive a first place vote for the league's overall champion.

HOOS BACK

- The Cavaliers return 15 letterwinners including eight of 11 starters from last season.
- Headed by junior Nathaniel Crofts (4g, 6a), six of the top seven point scorers from 2018 are on this year's roster. Virginia returns 83 percent of its scoring (20 of 24 goals) along with goalkeepers Colin Shutler and Marcel DaSilva.

DECORATED SECOND YEARS

- Virginia set an ACC record with four honorees on the ACC All-Freshman team in 2018.

HEAD COACH GEORGE GELNOVATCH



George Gelnovatch is in the midst of his 24th season as the head coach of the Virginia men's soccer program. The longest tenured head coach in program history, Gelnovatch has led the Cavaliers to a pair of national championships in 2009 and 2014 as well as five NCAA College Cup appearances and 23-consecutive berths in the NCAA tournament.

Gelnovatch became the program's all-time leader in wins on August 25, 2017 with a 3-2 double-overtime victory over Villanova, surpassing his UVA mentor Bruce Arena for the program record in wins with 296. He reached the 300-win plateau on Sept. 15, 2017 with a 2-1 triumph at Virginia Tech, becoming just the fourth coach in Atlantic Coast Conference history to win 300 career matches.

A former Cavalier soccer All-American and assistant coach, Gelnovatch has guided Virginia to four ACC tournament titles, two regular-season ACC championships and a record of 317-129-57 (.687) in his first 23 seasons as UVA head coach. Over the course of his 30 years as an assistant and head coach at Virginia, he has been a part of all seven of the Cavaliers' national championships.

Gelnovatch is the first coach in NCAA Division I men's soccer history to lead 20-straight teams to the NCAA tournament. He is one of just eight coaches in the Division I men's soccer annals to take 20 teams to the tournament and one of only four active coaches to do so.

Gelnovatch ranks as the seventh-winningest active head coach in Division I college soccer, with a .692 career winning percentage. Going into the 2019 season he stood 15th in career wins among current head coaches. Among Division I coaches all-time, he ranked 38th in career winning percentage and 41st in wins going into 2019. These figures are even more striking when considering Gelnovatch's teams play one of the nation's toughest schedules on a yearly basis.

Virginia has won at least 15 games in a season nine times under Gelnovatch, including 2009 when the team recorded 19 victories en route to the conference and national championships.

Gelnovatch has developed a number of Major League Soccer players during his UVA tenure, with 27 players going in MLS drafts and nine in the MLS Supplemental Draft, while six signed Project-40/Generation Adidas contracts and Jordan Allen (2014), Derrick Etienne (2015), Scott Thomsen (2015) and Aboubacar Keita (2018) each signed MLS Homegrown contracts. Jason Moore (1999) and Alecko Eskandarian (2003) were selected No. 1 in the MLS Draft, as 11 Cavaliers have been picked in the first round of the various MLS drafts.

Gelnovatch was named the 10th coach of the Virginia program on Jan. 3, 1996, after Bruce Arena announced he would end his 18-year career at the helm of UVA soccer to become head coach and assistant general manager of Major League Soccer's D.C. United.

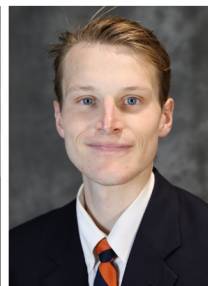
