#### MATCH NOTES

#### FOR STARTERS

- Virginia is back in the ACC Championship game for the second time in three seasons and is seeking its 16th ACC title.
- Head Coach George Gelnovatch has won four ACC Tournament Championships in his tenure – 1997, 2003, 2004, 2009. His teams have now been to the ACC Final 13 times in 24 seasons
- Clemson is Virginia's third first-time opponent in the ACC Tournament. The Cavaliers did not face Syracuse (quarterfinal) or Wake Forest (semifinal) during the 2019 regular season.
- The Cavaliers and Tigers will meet in the ACC postseason for the first time since 2006. Virginia is 4-2-2 against Clemson in ACC Tournament action.
- Sunday will be the fourth time Virginia and Clemson meet in the ACC Title game (1993, 1995 & 2001). The Cavaliers took home the trophy in 1993 & 1995 and fell 1-0 in the 2001 Championship in Clemson.
- Virginia comes into the match winners of its last five matches, the second five-match win streak of the season.
- Clemson is the second No. 1 ranked team Virginia will face in 2019. The Cavaliers knocked off defending National Champion and then-No. 1 Maryland, 2-0 on Sept. 2 at Audi Field in Washington, D.C.
- The Tigers will be the eighth ranked opponent Virginia has faced this season and third in the last five games. The Cavaliers are 7-0 against teams from the United Soccer Coaches Top-25.

#### MEMORIES IN CARY

- Virginia has won two National Championships (2009 & 2014) and three ACC Titles (2002, 2003 & 2009) at Sahlen's Stadium.
- In its last appearance in Cary, Virginia outlasted UCLA in penalty kicks to win the 2014 National Championship, the program's seventh national title.
- The Cavaliers have been in Cary for 10 ACC Tournaments and two College Cups. Virginia owns a 16-5-3 all-time record at Sahlen's Stadium.

#### NATIONAL RANKINGS

- The Cavaliers come into Sunday with the lowest goals against average (0.33), highest save percentage (.885) and the most shutouts (13) in the country.
- Virginia's 16 wins are tied with Clemson and Missouri State for the most in collegiate soccer.
- With identical 16-1-1 records, Virginia and Clemson own a .917 winning percentage, the third highest percentage in DI men's soccer behind Missouri State (1.000) and St. Mary's (.938)
- Virginia is one of eight programs nationally with one or no losses this season.
- The Cavaliers have conceded just six goals this season, the fewest in the country. Only two other teams – New Hampshire (7) and Georgetown (8) – have allowed less than 10 goals this season.

#### VIRGINIA IN THE ACC TOURNAMENT

- The Cavaliers own the most wins (44), goals (115), finals appearances (20) and tournament titles (10) in 32 years of the ACC Tournament.
- The Cavaliers have made it to the ACC Championship game 20 times with the last appearance coming in 2017, a 0-0 draw and PK shootout loss to Wake Forest.
- The Cavaliers earned a first-round bye in this year's tournament by winning the Coastal Division Championship for the first time in the current two-division format (2014-present).
- The No. 2 seed in the tournament is Virginia's highest since 2005.
- The Cavaliers have earned a first-round bye once (2015) in the last six seasons.
- Virginia is 44-19-12 in ACC Tournament games.

#### PLAYER NOTES

- Nathaniel Crofts has scored two of the three Cavalier goals in the ACC Tournament. Four of his nine career goals have come in either the ACC or NCAA Tournament.
- Cavalier captain Robin Afamefuna recorded his third career assist in Wednesday's semifinal win over Syracuse. The senior defender has started 41-straight games, the longest active streak on the team.
- Defenders Henry Kessler and Andreas Ueland are the only two Cavaliers that have played every minute of every game this season.
- Junior Joe Bell earned his first cap with the New Zealand full National Team on Thursday in a friendly against Ireland. He will play on Sunday for the All Whites against Lithuania before returning to the Cavaliers next week. Bell had started all 55 games of his collegiate career prior to missing Wednesday's match.
- Filling a void left in the midfield by Bell, sophomore Cabrel Happi Kamseu made his first start of the season. Working through an injury-riddled year, Happi Kamseu was the Cavaliers co-leading scorer as a freshman last season with five goals.
- Striker Daryl Dike had his four-game point-streak snapped in Wednesday's semifinal. His 21 points are the most by a Cavalier since Will Bates totaled 25 in 2012.

## COACHING WINS

- Virginia head coach George Gelnovatch (333 wins) is the most wins among active ACC head coaches.
- Gelnovatch's surpassed Sasho Cirovski (321 wins) back on Sept. 20. for sole possession of third place on the all-time ACC coaching wins list.
- Gelnovatch is in his 24th season at the helm and owns the 7th-highest winning percentage (.695) among active NCAA coaches and the highest among ACC Coaches (minimum 10 years coaching).
- Gelnovatch has won 10 or more games in all 24 seasons as head coach and the program has won 10 or more games in 39-straight seasons. Only Maryland's Sasho Cirovski has more consecutive 10+ win seasons (25) among active NCAA head coaches.

## FAST START

Virginia won its first 10 games of the season six times in its 76-year history. The 10-0 start for the Cavaliers was the first since 1993 and the best in George Gelnovatch's 24-year tenure.

## SCORELESS STREAK

- Virginia held opponents scoreless for 692 consecutive minutes, a span of eight games from Sept. 13 through Oct. 11.
- The Cavalier defense recorded six-consecutive shutouts, the most since 2009.

## DEFENSIVE HIGHLIGHTS

- In the ACC semifinals against Wake Forest, UVA held the Demon Deacons to just one shot on target and five shots total. Wake Forest came into the contest ranked 19th in the country in scoring offense (2.11 gpg)
- Virginia dominated the match against Boston College on Oct. 11 in all facets, with a 21-3 shot advantage and took 14 of the 15 corner kick attempts on the night. The Eagles did not take a single shot on goal.
- The Cavaliers have twice held opponents to no shots on target this season (W. Michigan - Sept. 23 & BC - Oct. 11).
- Virginia did not allow a NC State shot attempt for the first 80 minutes on Sept. 20. The four Wolfpack shots in the contest all came in the final 10 minutes including its lone shot on goal.
- Virginia has held 11 of its 18 opponents this season to single-digit shots, including five against No. 1 Maryland, the fewest shots by the Terps since Nov. 17, 2013, also against the Cavaliers.

## SCHEDULE GAUNTLET

- Including matches against ranked foes, Duke and Maryland, the Cavaliers played five 2018 NCAA Tournament teams through their first six games of the season.
- Virginia and Georgetown were the only two programs to face 2018 postseason qualifiers in five of the first six games.

## FACING NO. 1 AND NO. 2

- Virginia has faced the No. 1 and the No. 2 nationally ranked team in the country in the same season eight times.
- Prior to this season, Virginia had only took down both the No. 1 and No. 2 teams in the country twice, in 2009 and 2014, both National Championship seasons.

## PRESEASON NOTES

- Virginia comes into the 2019 season ranked 12th in the country by the United Soccer Coaches, the highest preseason ranking since 2015 when it ranked 2nd after winning the program's seventh National Championship in the fall prior.
- For the third-straight season, Virginia was picked to finish second in the Coastal Division in a poll of the league's 12 head coaches.
- The Cavaliers were one of four teams (UNC, Duke & Wake Forest) to receive a first place vote for the league's overall champion.

## HOOS BACK

- The Cavaliers return 15 letterwinners including eight of 11 starters from last season.

# HEAD COACH GEORGE GELNOVATCH



George Gelnovatch is in the midst of his 24th season as the head coach of the Virginia men's soccer program. The longest tenured head coach in program history, Gelnovatch has led the Cavaliers to a pair of national championships in 2009 and 2014 as well as five NCAA College Cup appearances and 23-consecutive berths in the NCAA tournament.

Gelnovatch became the program's all-time leader in wins on August 25, 2017 with a 3-2 double-overtime victory over Villanova, surpassing his UVA mentor Bruce Arena for the program record in wins with 296. He reached the 300-win plateau on Sept. 15, 2017 with a 2-1 triumph at Virginia Tech, becoming just the fourth coach in Atlantic Coast Conference history to win 300 career matches.

A former Cavalier soccer All-American and assistant coach, Gelnovatch has guided Virginia to four ACC tournament titles, two regular-season ACC championships and a record of 317-129-57 (.687) in his first 23 seasons as UVA head coach. Over the course of his 30 years as an assistant and head coach at Virginia, he has been a part of all seven of the Cavaliers' national championships.

Gelnovatch is the first coach in NCAA Division I men's soccer history to lead 20-straight teams to the NCAA tournament. He is one of just eight coaches in the Division I men's soccer annals to take 20 teams to the tournament and one of only four active coaches to do so.

Gelnovatch ranks as the seventh-winningest active head coach in Division I college soccer, with a .692 career winning percentage. Going into the 2019 season he stood 15th in career wins among current head coaches. Among Division I coaches all-time, he ranked 38th in career winning percentage and 41st in wins going into 2019. These figures are even more striking when considering Gelnovatch's teams play one of the nation's toughest schedules on a yearly basis.

Virginia has won at least 15 games in a season nine times under Gelnovatch, including 2009 when the team recorded 19 victories en route to the conference and national championships.

Gelnovatch has developed a number of Major League Soccer players during his UVA tenure, with 27 players going in MLS drafts and nine in the MLS Supplemental Draft, while six signed Project-40/Generation Adidas contracts and Jordan Allen (2014), Derrick Etienne (2015), Scott Thomsen (2015) and Aboubacar Keita (2018) each signed MLS Homegrown contracts. Jason Moore (1999) and Alecko Eskandarian (2003) were selected No. 1 in the MLS Draft, as 11 Cavaliers have been picked in the first round of the various MLS drafts.

Gelnovatch was named the 10th coach of the Virginia program on Jan. 3, 1996, after Bruce Arena announced he would end his 18-year career at the helm of UVA soccer to become head coach and assistant general manager of Major League Soccer's D.C. United.

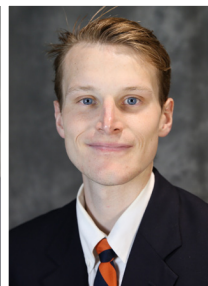
