### MATCH NOTES

#### FOR STARTERS

- Virginia is looking to go 4-0 for the first time since 2006 when it started the season winning the first eight games.
- The Cavaliers come into Friday's match 3-0 for the fifth time under George Gelnovatch (2019, 2017, 2006, 2004, 2002).
- Virginia is one of five teams in the country (Missouri St., Penn. St. Francis-Brooklyn, Villanova) that has yet to concede a goal in 2019.
- Duke will be the fourth-straight opponent that participated in the 2018 NCAA Tournament. Only Virginia and Georgetown will face five 2018 NCAA Tournament participants in its first six games. Duke will play four NCAA Tournament teams in its first six games.

#### AGAINST DUKE

- Virginia holds a 41-38-10 advantage in the all-time series against Duke that was first played in 1946.
- The Blue Devils have won the last two meetings by way of the shutout but Virginia holds a 4-3-3 edge in the last 10 matches.
- Duke handed Virginia its first loss of the 2018 season in a 2-0 triumph over the Cavaliers in Charlottesville.
- The Cavaliers entered the 2018 matchup with a 6-0-2 record
- Virginia had allowed just two goals through its first eight games and Duke scored twice in the game's first 20 minutes. An opponent scored multiple goals on the Virginia defense only three times during the 2018 season.

#### #1 AND #2

- For the eighth time in program history and the first time since 2014, Virginia will play the No. 1 and No. 2 teams in the country in the same season.
  - On Labor Day in Washington, D.C., the Cavaliers knocked off No. 1 Maryland 2-0 in a neutral site game at Audi Field.
  - Only in 2009 and 2014, both National Championship seasons, Virginia defeated both No. 1 and No. 2 in the same season.

#### CLEAN SHEETS

- Through 270 minutes goalkeeper Colin Shutler has made seven saves. He was second in the ACC with eight shutouts in 2018 and now has 11 in his career, two-shy of 10th all-time in Virginia history.
- Virginia hasn't started the season off with four-straight shutouts since 2006 (4). The school-record for shutouts to start a season is five, set in 2005.
- The Virginia offense limited Maryland to just five shots on Monday, the lowest total by a Terps team since Nov. 17, 2013, also against Virginia.

#### ACC PLAYER OF THE WEEK X 2

- Goalkeeper Colin Shutler was named ACC co-Defensive Player of the Week on Monday, Sept. 9 after a pair of shutouts including a clean sheet against No. 1 Maryland on Sept. 2. Shutler has collected ACC weekly honors three times in the last two seasons.
- For his two-goal performance in the season-opener against Pacific, junior Irakoze Donasiyano was named the ACC Offensive Player of the Week on Tuesday, Sept. 3.
- Donasiyano scored in the 44th minute of the season opener and again in the 48th minute. He became the first Cavalier to tally two goals on opening night since Tony Tchani scored twice against Portland in the first game of the 2009 season.

NOTES CONTINUED

- Virginia moved up one spot in the United Soccer Coaches poll. The Cavaliers are one of four ACC teams in the Top-10. A total of eight ACC Teams are ranked inside the Top-20

- Last season the Cavaliers got up to No. 6 in the national rankings and haven't been in the top-5 since early in the 2015 season.

- Virginia vaulted up to the No. 3 spot in the TopDrawerSoccer.com poll after coming in at No. 16 last week. In the College Soccer News Top-25 the Cavaliers were bumped up five spots to No. 7.

• In the second-annual "Battle for the DMV" played at Audi Field in Washi-ng-ton, D.C. on Monday night (Sept. 2), Virginia knocked off the defending National Champion and No. 1 Team Maryland with a 2-0 victory.

- Virginia used first half goals by Nathaniel Crofts and Daryl Dike that were just one minute and 15 seconds apart beginning in the 21st minute.

- The goal by Crofts was the first scored on the Terps in 611 minutes dating back to last season. The win for Virginia ended a six-game winless streak against Maryland.

- It marked the second-straight season Virginia has faced the No. 1 team in the country.

- Under head coach George Gelnovatch the Cavaliers improved to 5-3-4 against top-ranked teams.

• Virginia comes into the 2019 season ranked 12th in the country by the United Soccer Coaches, the highest preseason ranking since 2015 when it ranked 2nd after winning the program's seventh National Championship in the fall prior.

• For the third-straight season, Virginia was picked to finish second in the Coastal Division in a poll of the league's 12 head coaches.

- The Cavaliers were one of four teams (UNC, Duke & Wake Forest) to receive a first place vote for the league's overall champion.

- The Cavaliers return 15 letterwinners including eight of 11 starters from last season.
- Headed by junior Nathaniel Crofts (4g, 6a), six of the top seven point scorers from 2018 are on this year's roster. Virginia returns 83 percent of its scoring (20 of 24 goals) along with goalkeepers Colin Shutler and Marcel DaSilva.

- Junior Joe Bell was featured on the first-ever preseason ACC Watch List, comprised of one representative from each school and voted upon as part of the league's preseason coaches poll.
- The midfielder was also listed on the TopDrawerSoccer.com Best XI Second Team.
- Last season, Bell earned United Soccer Coaches Second Team All-Region and Third Team All-ACC honors in 2018.
- He was one of two Cavaliers to play every minute of last year's 17 matches and was second on the team with five assists.

- Virginia set an ACC record with four honorees on the ACC All-Freshman team in 2018.
- Second years Daryl Dike, Cabrel Hapki Kamseu and Daniel Steedman are all back for their sophomore campaigns. Dike and Hapki Kamseu led the Cavaliers with five goals each. Steedman added a pair of goals both in conference play.
- Defender Aoubacar Keita signed a homegrown contract with the Columbus Crew SC and has appeared in six MLS matches through last Sunday.

# HEAD COACH GEORGE GELNOVATCH



George Gelnovatch is in the midst of his 24th season as the head coach of the Virginia men's soccer program. The longest tenured head coach in program history, Gelnovatch has led the Cavaliers to a pair of national championships in 2009 and 2014 as well as five NCAA College Cup appearances and 23-consecutive berths in the NCAA tournament.

Gelnovatch became the program's all-time leader in wins on August 25, 2017 with a 3-2 double-overtime victory over Villanova, surpassing his UVA mentor Bruce Arena for the program record in wins with 296. He reached the 300-win plateau on

Sept. 15, 2017 with a 2-1 triumph at Virginia Tech, becoming just the fourth coach in Atlantic Coast Conference history to win 300 career matches.

A former Cavalier soccer All-American and assistant coach, Gelnovatch has guided Virginia to four ACC tournament titles, two regular-season ACC championships and a record of 317-129-57 (.687) during his tenure as UVA head coach. Over the course of his 30 years as an assistant and head coach at Virginia, he has been a part of all seven of the Cavaliers' national championships.

Gelnovatch is the first coach in NCAA Division I men's soccer history to lead 20-straight teams to the NCAA tournament. He is one of just eight coaches in the Division I men's soccer annals to take 20 teams to the tournament and one of only four active coaches to do so.

Gelnovatch ranks as the seventh-winningest active head coach in Division I college soccer, with a .687 career winning percentage. He stands 15th in career wins among current head coaches. Among Division I coaches all-time, he ranks 38th in career winning percentage and 41st in wins. These figures are even more striking when considering Gelnovatch's teams play one of the nation's toughest schedules on a yearly basis.

Virginia has won at least 15 games in a season nine times under Gelnovatch, including 2009 when the team recorded 19 victories en route to the conference and national championships.

Gelnovatch has developed a number of Major League Soccer players during his UVA tenure, with 27 players going in MLS drafts and nine in the MLS Supplemental Draft, while six signed Project-40/Generation Adidas contracts and Jordan Allen (2014), Derrick Etienne (2015), Scott Thomsen (2015) and Aboubacar Keita (2018) each signed MLS Homegrown contracts. Jason Moore (1999) and Alecko Eskandarian (2003) were selected No. 1 in the MLS Draft, as 11 Cavaliers have been picked in the first round of the various MLS drafts.

Gelnovatch was named the 10th coach of the Virginia program on Jan. 3, 1996, after Bruce Arena announced he would end his 18-year career at the helm of UVA soccer to become head coach and assistant general manager of Major League Soccer's D.C. United.

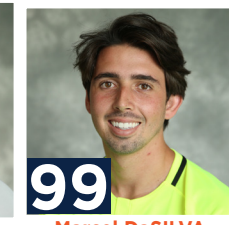

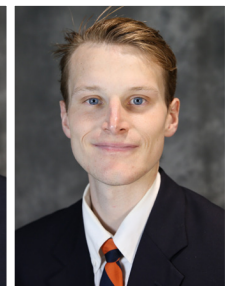
