MATCH NOTES

FOR STARTERS

- Of the 11 ACC teams participating this Fall, Virginia and Virginia Tech are the only two programs yet to play an ACC regular season match in 2020.
- The Cavaliers come into Friday with a six-game win streak against ACC opponents dating back to last season. The streak, that includes the 2019 postseason, began with a 2-0 win over then-No. 25 Virginia Tech on Oct. 25, 2019.
- Virginia comes into the match as the No. 5 team in the country according to the latest United Soccer Coaches poll.
- 2020 will be the 77th year of soccer at Virginia and 25th under the direction of head coach George Gelnovatch.
- A win on Friday night against Louisville would be the 300th overall win for the Cavaliers at Klöckner Stadium.

OPENING NIGHT

- Virginia will be playing its seventh-straight season opener at home.
- Under Gelnovatch, Virginia is 18-6 in season openers. The Cavaliers have won six-consecutive season openers, four of them coming against nationally ranked opponents.
- The last time Virginia opened its season in October was 1974 (Oct. 1) and the latest a Virginia soccer season has started was in 1946 on Oct. 19, a 3-0 loss in the first of 86 meetings against North Carolina.

THE KLÖCKNER ADVANTAGE

- Virginia has won 81 percent (299-59-27) of its matches at Klöckner Stadium since its opening in 1992.
- Virginia went 15-1 at Klöckner Stadium in 2019, the most home wins of any team in the country and tied for the most in school history (1995).
- Klöckner Stadium has hosted an NCAA Tournament match in all 28 years of its existence.
- The Cavaliers are 40-12-2 (.759) at Klöckner in the NCAA postseason.

SERIES HISTORY

- Louisville holds a 3-2-1 edge in the all-time series that began in 2013.
- The Cavaliers have won the last two meetings at Klöckner Stadium, including a 2-0 win against the Cardinals on Oct. 4, 2019.
- The then-No. 1 Cavaliers improved to 10-0 last season and 4-0 in the ACC for the first time in 2008 after last year's clean sheet.
- Louisville goalkeeper Jake Gelnovatch is the son of Virginia head coach George Gelnovatch. Jake has been the Cardinals starting goalkeeper against Virginia in the last two meetings (2017 & 2019).

QUARTER CENTURY AT THE HELM

- George Gelnovatch enters his 25th season as head coach of the Virginia Cavaliers, a tenure that is marked by two National Championships, five ACC Championships, six College Cup appearances and 24 consecutive appearances in the NCAA Tournament.
- Gelnovatch is one of nine active coaches that have 24 or more years at only one school and his 338 career wins are the most among the group.
- He currently stands as the ACC's longest tenured coach and ranks third all-time amongst the league's coaches in career victories.
- Gelnovatch is the first coach in NCAA Division I soccer to lead 20-straight teams to the NCAA Tournament.
- Gelnovatch has won 10 or more games in all 24 seasons as head coach. Only Maryland's Sasho Cirovski has more consecutive 10+ win seasons (25) among active NCAA head coaches.

NATIONAL PICTURE

- In the first United Soccer Coaches poll of the fall (Sept. 22), Virginia was ranked No. 3 in the country. Despite not playing a match, the Cavaliers have slipped to No. 5 in the last two polls.
- Virginia has been ranked in the top five in the United Soccer Coaches Poll in all but one week since Sept. 17, 2019
- Virginia opened the season as the nation's top team in the TopDrawerSoccer.com Power Rankings and have dropped to No. 4 in this week's rankings.

TEAM COMPOSITION

- The Cavaliers return 10 student-athletes from the 2019 ACC Championship and NCAA Runner-Up team. Of those 10 returners eight saw action in over 16 games.
- The 10 returners accounted for 23 of the team's 46 goals last season.
- Virginia lost four underclassman - Joe Bell (Viking FK), Daryl Dike (Orlando City SC), Henry Kessler (New England Revolution) and Daniel Steedman (Atlanta United 2) depart for the professional ranks.
- According to TopDrawerSoccer.com, the Cavaliers boasted the No. 8 recruiting class, comprised of eight true freshmen, three transfers and two graduate transfers.

PLAYER NOTABLES

- Serving as a co-captain alongside sophomore Andreas Ueland, Nathaniel Crofts returns for his senior season as the team's top returning scorer from a year ago (6g, 3a). He was part of the 11-man Preseason ACC Players to Watch List.
- Ueland, a freshman All-American after playing every minute of every match as a true freshman was one of eight ACC underclassmen identified as a top underclassman prospect by TopDrawerSoccer.com
- Goalkeeper Colin Shutler earned Preseason First Team All-America honors from College Soccer News after a consensus First Team All-America nod in 2019. He returns to UVA as a graduate student in 2020 and enters the year with the lowest career goals against average (0.53) among active NCAA goalkeepers.

RECORD CHASING

- Goalkeeper Colin Shutler was credited with his 23rd career shutout in the 2019 NCAA Third Round win over St. John's to tie him with Bob Willen and former teammate Jeff Caldwell.
- Shutler has 23 shutouts in 39 career starts for the Cavaliers.
- The redshirt junior owns the NCAA's lowest active career goals against average (0.53) which is the fourth lowest in UVA history.

HEAD COACH GEORGE GELNOVATCH



George Gelnovatch enters his 25th season as the head coach of the Virginia men's soccer program. The longest tenured head coach in program history, Gelnovatch has led the Cavaliers to a pair of national championships in 2009 and 2014 as well as six NCAA College Cup appearances and 24-consecutive berths in the NCAA tournament.

Gelnovatch became the program's all-time leader in wins on August 25, 2017 with a 3-2 double-overtime victory over Villanova, surpassing his UVA mentor Bruce Arena for the program record in wins with 296. He reached the 300-win plateau on Sept. 15, 2017 with a 2-1 triumph at Virginia Tech, becoming just the fourth coach in Atlantic Coast Conference history to win 300 career matches.

A former Cavalier soccer All-American and assistant coach, Gelnovatch has guided Virginia to five ACC tournament titles, three regular-season ACC championships and a record of 338-131-58 (.696) during his tenure as UVA head coach. Over the course of his 30 years as an assistant and head coach at Virginia, he has been a part of all seven of the Cavaliers' national championships.

Gelnovatch is the first coach in NCAA Division I men's soccer history to lead 20-straight teams to the NCAA tournament. He is one of just eight coaches in the Division I men's soccer annals to take 20 teams to the tournament and one of only four active coaches to do so.

Gelnovatch ranks as the seventh-winningest active head coach in Division I college soccer, with a .696 career winning percentage. He stands 13th in career wins among current head coaches. Among Division I coaches all-time, he ranks 34th in both career winning percentage and wins. These figures are even more striking when considering Gelnovatch's teams play one of the nation's toughest schedules on a yearly basis.

Virginia has won at least 15 games in a season 10 times under Gelnovatch, including 2019 when it won 21 games the second most in the history of the program en route to an ACC Coastal Division Championship, an ACC Tournament crown and a Runner-Up finish in the NCAA College Cup.

Gelnovatch has developed a number of Major League Soccer players during his UVA tenure, with 30 players going in MLS drafts and 12 in the MLS Supplemental Draft, while eight signed Project-40/Generacion Adidas contracts and Jordan Allen (2014), Derrick Etienne (2015), Scott Thomsen (2015) and Aboubacar Keita (2018) each signed MLS Homegrown contracts. Jason Moore (1999) and Alecko Eskandarian (2003) were selected No. 1 in the MLS Draft, as 13 Cavaliers have been picked in the first round of the various MLS drafts.

Gelnovatch was named the 10th coach of the Virginia program on Jan. 3, 1996, after Bruce Arena announced he would end his 18-year career at the helm of UVA soccer to become head coach and assistant general manager of Major League Soccer's D.C. United.

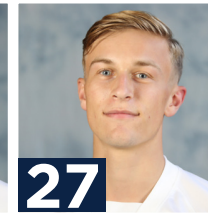
