MATCH NOTES

FOR STARTERS

- The Cavaliers come into Wednesday with a seven-game win streak against ACC opponents dating back to last season. The streak, that includes the 2019 postseason, began with a 2-0 win over then-No. 25 Virginia Tech on Oct. 25, 2019.
- Head Coach George Gelnovatch is seeking his 90th career ACC regular season victory and looking to become only the third coach in ACC history with 90 league wins.
- Wednesday is one of two road games this season (Notre Dame – Oct. 24) for Virginia. The Cavaliers went 3-0-1 in true road games in 2019.
- Virginia and Virginia Tech will play two times in 2020, the second meeting occurring on Nov. 6 at Klöckner Stadium. The two programs have played twice in one season on two occasions, 1961 and 2014.
- Both Virginia and Virginia Tech played their first matches of the season this past weekend. Every other ACC team has played two or more games at this junction of the season.
- Virginia is ranked fifth for the third-straight week and has been ranked in the top 5 in all but one week since Sept. 17, 2019.

ELITE COMPANY

- George Gelnovatch seeking 90th career ACC win and would be the fastest coach in ACC history to 90 ACC regular season wins.
- Only three coaches in ACC history have reached the 90-win mark.
- Gelnovatch has one other milestone victory at Virginia Tech, he won his 300th game at Thompson Field on Sept. 15, 2017.

QUARTER CENTURY AT THE HELM

- George Gelnovatch enters his 25th season as head coach of the Virginia Cavaliers, a tenure that is marked by two National Championships, five ACC Championships, six College Cup appearances and 24 consecutive appearances in the NCAA Tournament.
- Gelnovatch is one of nine active coaches that have 24 or more years at only one school and his 339 career wins are the most among the group.
- He currently stands as the ACC's longest tenured coach and ranks third all-time amongst the league's coaches in career victories.
- Gelnovatch is the first coach in NCAA Division I soccer to lead 20-straight teams to the NCAA Tournament.
- Gelnovatch has won 10 or more games in all 24 seasons as head coach. Only Maryland's Sasho Cirovski has more consecutive 10+ win seasons (25) among active NCAA head coaches.

SERIES HISTORY

- Since 2004, Virginia and Virginia Tech have met every year with the exception of the 2015 season.
- The Cavaliers own a 41-4-5 overall record against the Hokies in an all-time series that dates back to 1960.
- Virginia is unbeaten in its last 15 matches against Virginia Tech, a stretch that includes five draws.
- George Gelnovatch is 14-2-5 against Virginia in his tenure as head coach.
- Since Thompson Field opened in 2003, the Cavaliers are 6-1-2

LAST MEETING

- Virginia rolled to its 12th shutout in 15 games thanks to a 2-0 win over 25th-ranked Virginia Tech on Oct. 25, 2019.
 - Nathaniel Crofts landed himself on SportsCenter's Top 10 with his game-winning goal in the 33rd minute and later assisted on a Daryl Dike second half tally.

- Colin Shutler posted five saves, matching a season-high at the time, as Virginia Tech went on to out-shoot Virginia 11-10 in the contest.

HISTORIC OPENING NIGHT

- Virginia won its seventh-straight season opener with a 2-1, double-overtime victory over Louisville.
- The 300th all-time victory at Klöckner Stadium was clinched by a Philip Horton PK in the 109th minute.
- Louisville tied the match in the 90th minute and out-shot the Cavaliers 18-9.
- The last time Virginia opened its season in October was 1974 (Oct. 1) and the latest a Virginia soccer season has started was in 1946 on Oct. 19, a 3-0 loss in the first of 86 meetings against North Carolina.

• Dating back to last season, Virginia has been outshot seven times and lost only one of those matches, the 2019 National Championship game against Georgetown. After two overtimes, the match ended in a 3-3 draw but the Hoyas prevailed in a penalty kick shootout. By rule, the winner of the shootout in a National Championship game is credited with a win.

PLAYER OF THE WEEK

• Goalkeeper Colin Shutler matched a career-high with eight saves in Friday's victory on his way to co-ACC Defensive Player of the Week honors as well as a spot on TopDrawerSoccer.com's National Team of the Week. Shutler has won the ACC Defensive POTW award five times in his career.
 • Shutler owns the lowest career goals against average (0.60) and the highest career save percentage (.820) among active NCAA DI goalkeepers. His 23 career shutouts are the second-most among his active NCAA cohorts and currently tied for the fourth most in UVA history.

PLAYER NOTABLES

• Nathaniel Crofts, the Cavaliers leading returning scorer, notched his 11th career goal in the 52nd minute against Louisville. Crofts was nearly credited with his seventh career game-winning goal until Louisville's Pedro Fonseca scored in the final minute of regulation. Crofts' five game-winners last season were tied for the second most in the ACC.
 • In their collegiate debuts, Joan Gibert and Isaiah Byrd were credited with assists on Crofts' goal.
 • A total of six Cavaliers played their first games with the program after transferring in (Afonso, Byrd, Kaya Ignacio, Oliver Gerbig (transfer), Gibert, Reed Kessler).

THE KLÖCKNER ADVANTAGE

• Virginia has won 81 percent (300-59-27) of its matches at Klöckner Stadium since its opening in 1992.
 • The program's 300th victory at Klöckner came in the 2020 season opener against Louisville, a 2-1, double overtime thriller.
 • Virginia went 15-1 at Klöckner Stadium in 2019, the most home wins of any team in the country and tied for the most in school history (1995).
 • Klöckner Stadium has hosted an NCAA Tournament match in all 28 years of its existence.
 • The Cavaliers are 40-12-2 (.759) at Klöckner in the NCAA postseason.

NATIONAL PICTURE

• In the first United Soccer Coaches poll of the fall (Sept. 22), Virginia was ranked No. 3 in the country. Despite not playing a match, the Cavaliers have slipped to No. 5 in the last two polls.
 • Virginia has been ranked in the top five in the United Soccer Coaches Poll in all but one week since Sept. 17, 2019
 • Virginia opened the season as the nation's top team in the TopDrawerSoccer.com Power Rankings and were dropped to No. 4 in its latest rankings (Oct. 8).

TEAM COMPOSITION

• The Cavaliers return 10 student-athletes from the 2019 ACC Championship and NCAA Runner-Up team. Of those 10 returners eight saw action in over 16 games.
 • The 10 returners accounted for 23 of the team's 46 goals last season.
 • Virginia lost four underclassman – Joe Bell (Viking FK), Daryl Dike (Orlando City SC), Henry Kessler (New England Revolution) and Daniel Steedman (Atlanta United 2) depart for the professional ranks.
 • According to TopDrawerSoccer.com, the Cavaliers boasted the No. 8 recruiting class, comprised of eight true freshmen, three transfers and two graduate transfers.

PRESEASON HONORS

• Serving as a co-captain alongside sophomore Andreas Ueland, Nathaniel Crofts returns for his senior season as the team's top returning scorer from a year ago (6g, 3a). He was part of the 11-man Preseason ACC Players to Watch List.
 • Ueland, a freshman All-American after playing every minute of every match as a true freshman was one of eight ACC underclassmen identified as a top underclassman prospect by TopDrawerSoccer.com
 • Goalkeeper Colin Shutler earned Preseason First Team All-America honors from College Soccer News after a consensus First Team All-America nod in 2019. He returns to UVA as a graduate student in 2020 and enters the year with the lowest career goals against average (0.53) among active NCAA goalkeepers.

RECORD CHASING

• Goalkeeper Colin Shutler was credited with his 23rd career shutout in the 2019 NCAA Third Round win over St. John's to tie him with Bob Willen and former teammate Jeff Caldwell.
 • Shutler has 23 shutouts in 40 career starts for the Cavaliers.
 • The redshirt junior owns the NCAA's lowest active career goals against average (0.60) which is the fourth lowest in UVA history.
 • Shutler is 13 saves shy of 10th all-time in UVA history

HEAD COACH GEORGE GELNOVATCH



George Gelnovatch enters his 25th season as the head coach of the Virginia men's soccer program. The longest tenured head coach in program history, Gelnovatch has led the Cavaliers to a pair of national championships in 2009 and 2014 as well as six NCAA College Cup appearances and 24-consecutive berths in the NCAA tournament.

Gelnovatch became the program's all-time leader in wins on August 25, 2017 with a 3-2 double-overtime victory over Villanova, surpassing his UVA mentor Bruce Arena for the program record in wins with 296. He reached the 300-win plateau on Sept. 15, 2017 with a 2-1 triumph at Virginia Tech, becoming just the fourth coach in Atlantic Coast Conference history to win 300 career matches.

A former Cavalier soccer All-American and assistant coach, Gelnovatch has guided Virginia to five ACC tournament titles, three regular-season ACC championships and a record of 339-131-58 (.697) during his tenure as UVA head coach. Over the course of his 30 years as an assistant and head coach at Virginia, he has been a part of all seven of the Cavaliers' national championships.

Gelnovatch is the first coach in NCAA Division I men's soccer history to lead 20-straight teams to the NCAA tournament. He is one of just eight coaches in the Division I men's soccer annals to take 20 teams to the tournament and one of only four active coaches to do so.

Gelnovatch ranks as the seventh-winningest active head coach in Division I college soccer, with a .697 career winning percentage. He stands 13th in career wins among current head coaches. Among Division I coaches all-time, he ranks 34th in career wins and 37th in career winning percentage. These figures are even more striking when considering Gelnovatch's teams play one of the nation's toughest schedules on a yearly basis.

Virginia has won at least 15 games in a season 10 times under Gelnovatch, including 2019 when it won 21 games the second most in the history of the program en route to an ACC Coastal Division Championship, an ACC Tournament crown and a Runner-Up finish in the NCAA College Cup.

Gelnovatch has developed a number of Major League Soccer players during his UVA tenure, with 30 players going in MLS drafts and 12 in the MLS Supplemental Draft, while eight signed Project-40/Generation Adidas contracts and Jordan Allen (2014), Derrick Etienne (2015), Scott Thomsen (2015) and Aboubacar Keita (2018) each signed MLS Homegrown contracts. Jason Moore (1999) and Alecko Eskandarian (2003) were selected No. 1 in the MLS Draft, as 13 Cavaliers have been picked in the first round of the various MLS drafts.

Gelnovatch was named the 10th coach of the Virginia program on Jan. 3, 1996, after Bruce Arena announced he would end his 18-year career at the helm of UVA soccer to become head coach and assistant general manager of Major League Soccer's D.C. United.

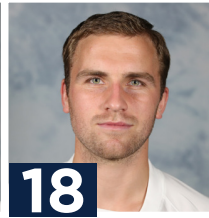

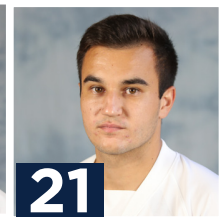

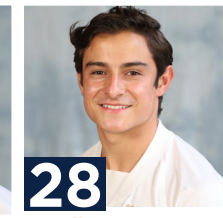
