THE UNIVERSITY OF VIRGINIA

UNIQUELY UVA

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

UNIVERSITY NICKNAMES

Virginia's athletics teams have been accompanied by a somewhat confusing array of nicknames. The most prominent and widely accepted of these monikers are "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos."

Although the terms "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are used almost interchangeably to refer to University teams and players, "Cavaliers" is more often used by the media, while "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are frequently used by Virginia students and fans.

Legend has it that Washington & Lee baseball fans dubbed the Virginia players "Wahoos" during the fiercely contested rivalry that existed between the two in-state schools in the 1890s. By 1940, "Wahoos" was in general use around Grounds to denote University students or events relating to them. The abbreviated "Hoos" sprang up later in student newspapers and has gained growing popularity in recent years.

THE CAVALIER MASCOT

The costumed Cavalier with a large character head debuted during Virginia's 1984 football season and has remained the official mascot of the University.

UNIVERSITY COLORS

Orange and blue were adopted as the University of Virginia's official athletic colors at a mass student meeting in 1888. UVA athletic teams had previously worn silver gray and cardinal red, but those colors did not stand out on muddy football fields, prompting a student movement to change them.

One of the students attending the mass meeting was Allen Potts, a star athlete who played on Virginia's first football team in 1888. Potts showed up at the meeting wearing a navy blue-and-orange scarf that he had acquired during a summer boating expedition at Oxford University. Orange and blue were chosen as the official athletic colors after one of Potts' fellow students pulled the scarf off Potts' neck and, waving it to the crowd, yelled, "How will this do?" UVA later served as the inspiration for schools like Auburn and Florida when they selected school colors.

WAH-HOO-WAH

The origin of "Wah-hoo-wah" is uncertain. The cheer was used to root on Virginia teams as early as 1890 and may have been borrowed from Dartmouth College, whose athletics teams were once known as the Indians.

Legend attributes the yell to Natalie Floyd Otey, who sang the ballad "Where'er You Are, There Shall My Love Be" at Charlottesville's Levy Opera House in 1893. The predominantly student audience noticed that Otey warbled the first three words of the song between each of the stanzas and decided to join in the refrain. By evening's end, goes the legend, the crowd had corrupted "Where'er You Are" into "Wahhoo-wah."

The Levy Opera House stands at the corner of High Street and Park Street and has since been renovated into an office building.

EARLY ARRIVALS

Of Virginia's 17 newcomers, five were able to join the team in January of 2024 and compete with the team in the spring including: Nick Dang, Michael Howard, Luc Mikula, Drew Serafino, Cameron Yirondo.

NOTABLE DEPARTURES

- The Cavaliers enter the 2024 season missing four players which accounted for over 78% of its goals in 2024
- · Stephen Annor Gyamfi (10), Mouhameth Thiam (5), Leo Afonso (5), and Axel Ahlander (2) combined for 22 of UVA's total of 28 goals scored in 2023
- · Annor Gyamfi was Virginia's first freshman to be named an All-American since Claudio Reyna (1991) and just the fourth alltime joining Reyna, Tony Meola (1988) and Jeff Agoos (1986). Thiam was named a second-team All-American by Top Drawer Soccer as well as the ACC Co-Midfielder of the Year.
- · Virginia has also graduated two of its three first-choice center backs from the 2023 season, Aidan O'Connor and Will Citron
- · Holden Brown, who started each of Virginia's first seven games in goal, departed for Indiana as a graduate transfer
- · Among Virginia's departures are each of its three captains from 2023: Afonso, Brown and Citron.

2024 Draft Selections in MLS:

- · Leo Afonso was the first Cavalier of the 2024 draft class to make his professional debut (March 23) in a 4-0 defeat to NYRB. Afonso set up a goal which was ultimately disallowed after coming on in the 59th minute of play.
- · O'Connor and Afonso each signed a first-team contracts running through the remainder of the 2024 season.
- · Afonso scored his first goal as a member of the first team in a 2-2 draw with Colorado (April 6) and recorded the gamewinning goal in thrilling fashion against Philadelphia (June 15).
- · O'Connor made his first-team debut as a substitute in a 1-0 win over Orlando (June 1)

TOP RETURNERS

- · Paul Wiese (D) 55 appearances for UVA (most of any current player), led team in assists as an outside back last season with 8 (fifth most in ACC)
- Reese Miller (D) 35 appearances with 33 starts since his debut as a freshman...2g, 3a for his career
- · Joey Batrouni (GK) Started season as UVA's No. 2 GK...replaced Holden Brown after 7 games...finished season with a record of 7-2-3 and a save percentage of .828
- · Albin Gashi (M) A mainstay in the Cavalier midfield, made 34 appearances and 28 starts since his debut as a freshman in the 2022 season opener
- · Umberto Pelà Breakout season at CDM in 2023, started all 18 games missing just one due to injury...made just four appearances in 2022

THE VIRGINIA CAPTAINS

George Gelnovatch announced a trio of Virginia captains ahead of 2024 in Paul Wiese, Albin Gashi and Umberto Pelà.

- · Wiese enters the season with the most appearances in a Cavalier shirt of any player on the current roster (55). He comes off a season in which he led the team in assists (8) ranking fifth among all players in the ACC and eighth among defenders in NCAA Division I
- · Gashi has been a fixture of the UVA midfield since his arrival in 2022. Since his debut as a freshman in the 2022 season opener, he has appeared in 34 of Virginia's 38 games while making 28 starts.
- · Pelà comes of a breakout season in 2023. The sophomore made started the first 18 games of the season before missing Virginia's third round match in the NCAA Men's Soccer Championship due to injury.

ACC SUCCESS

- Virginia recorded back-to-back five-win seasons (2022-2023) for the first time since 2005-2006
- The Cavaliers are the only team in the conference coming off back-to-back five-win seasons in ACC play
- In 2022, Virginia went unbeaten on the road in ACC play with a 3-0-1 record
- This season, the ACC features 15 teams with the addition of California, SMU and Stanford. 10 of those 15 have been ranked in the preseason top-25.

NATIONAL PEDIGREE

- Virginia is the only team in NCAA DI coming off back-to-back top-eight seeds in the NCAA tournament
- UVA was the No. 4 seed in 2022, and the No. 7 seed in 2023
- The Cavaliers earned back-to-back top-eight seeds for the first time in the program's history since a six-year run from 1997-2002—a run that started in George Gelnovatch's second season as head coach

PLAYING THE BEST

In 2022 and 2023, Virginia played some of the toughest schedules NCAA Division I had to offer.

- In 2022, the Cavaliers played the toughest-ranked schedule in NCAA DI while posting a record of 10-4-5
- · In 2023, Virginia played the sixth-toughest rated schedule while posting a record of 11-4-4

BATROUNI TAKES THE NO. 1 SHIRT

Cavalier goalkeeper Joey Batrouni started the 2023 season behind Holden Brown on the depth chart, but would become Virginia's starter after the first eight games of the season. He is set to return for the 2024 campaign and is expected to be the Cavalier's first choice between the posts.

- Batrouni made his Cavalier debut in the second game of the 2023 campaign. Against LMU, he played the full 90 minutes while conceding three goals and making 4 saves in a 3-1 loss.
- Despite a rocky start, Batrouni was rock solid in his 11 starts following posting a record of 7-1-3 with a save percentage of .863 for the remainder of the season.
- The highlight of the season for Batrouni came in the ACC quarterfinal round when he made 13 saves against Syracuse—just one shy of the UVA single-game record. He would go on to make a save in penalties but the Cavaliers would be eliminated on pens.

RETURNING FROM INJURY

Two Cavaliers are set to make their return to college soccer following a 2023 season in which they missed significant time.

- Junior forward Triton Beauvois is set to make his return following a knee injury suffered on Sept. 9 in a 2-0 loss to Duke.
- Graduate transfer Hayes Wood missed almost the entirety of the 2023 season at Lipscomb following a knee injury sustained in the first game of the season.

WHEN IN ROME...

- A transfer from Providence ahead of the 2023 season, Austin Rome is a towering 6-3 presence on the defensive end, but found it difficult to break into the Virginia starting eleven.
- After injuries to Aidan O'Connor and Jack Singer, Rome entered the scene first as a resereve, and made his first start in a road game at Boston College.
- After making his first start against BC, Rome never relinquished his spot in the Cavalier lineup making six consecutive starts at center back—he is expected to be a fixture for the team in 2024.

RULE CHANGES IN COLLEGE SOCCER

Substitutions

• To eliminate re-entry in the second half for field players and make all periods the same (no re-entry). [A player who appears in the first half and leaves the game, can re-enter in the second].

NASHVILLE TO CHARLOTTESVILLE

Virginia's group of 17 newcomers for the 2024 season features a pair of transfers from Lipscomb: Hayes Wood (F) and Nick Dang (D).

- Both Wood and Dang are Tennessee natives and have each been a part of three consecutive Lipscomb teams to make the NCAA Men's Soccer Championship including a 2022 season when the Bisons were the No. 9 seed
- Wood and Dang have been a part of three consecutive ASUN Championship teams at Lipscomb
- Nick Dang joined the Cavaliers as a mid-season transfer in January and competed with the team in the spring. He was voted Virginia's most valuable player by opposing teams
- Dang was recognized on Top Drawer Soccer's Preseason Best XI second team.
- Dang has accounted for four goals and three assists in his career at Lipscomb
- Wood joins the Cavaliers as a graduate transfer with 21 goals and 12 assist to his record in college soccer
- Wood stepped onto the college soccer scene as a freshman at Lipscomb in 2019—the last season Virginia made it to the College Cup Final.

LAMBE PRIMED FOR YEAR TWO

Though ACC Freshman of the Year, Stephen Annor Gyamfi was the headliner from an impressive Virginia recruiting class in 2023, Brendan Lambe proved to be one of Virginia's most reliable first-years.

- $\,\cdot\,$ Lambe was named to the ACC All-Freshman team following a strong 2023 season
- The North Carolina native appeared in 18/19 games while making one start
- Excellent with the ball at his feet, Lambe is a versitle player who is likely to see time at the defensive midfield, center back, or fullback positions.

MANGAROV BACK FOR YEAR THREE IN VIRGINIA

- · A UNCG transfer ahead of the 2022 season, Danny Mangarov returns to the fold as a grad student in 2024.
- · Taking on the No. 10 shirt, Mangarov is expected to feature as the Cavaliers primary attacking midfielder.
- · Mangarov burst onto the scene at Klöckner Stadium in 2022, scoring on his Cavalier debut the last time Virginia faced off with Rider in a 4-0 win.
- · Mangarov accounted for six goals and six assists in his first two seasons as a Cavalier.

MAGAROV STARTS HOT...AGAIN

Since his arrival at Virginia, Danny Mangarov has opened the scoring for UVA in each of his three seasons with the team.

- · Mangarov scored on his debut against Rider (8/29/22) to open the scoring for Virginia that season
- · He struck late in the 2023 season opener to clinche a 1-0 win over Iona (8/24/23)
- · Scored the first goal in a 3-0 win over Rider (8/22/24)

DANG BURSTS ONTO THE SCENE

A junior transfer from Lipscomb, Nick Dang announced himself to the Cavalier faithful in style in Virginia's opener against Rider.

- · The defender played 87 minutes as a center back helping Virginia keep a clean sheet in a 3-0 win.
- · With a thunderous header in the 84th minute, Dang scored his first goal as a Cavalier, becoming the first UVA player to score on his debut since Danny Mangarov (8/29/22)—also against Rider.

UBOGU BACK AMONGST THE GOALS

- · Forward Kome Ubogu comes off a season in which he only registered one goal (vs Louisville, 9/29/23)
- · However, in 2022, Ubogu ranked second on the team with six total goals in a season that featured an impressive team total of 34
- · In the first game of the 2024 campaign, Ubogu registered an important goal with less than a minute remaining in the first half to give Virginia a two-goal lead (vs Rider, 8/22/24).

CAPTAINS DISHING OUT ASSISTS

Two of Virginia's captains, Paul Wiese and Albin Gashi, found themselves on the scoresheet in the 2024 opener

- · Wiese recorded his first of the season after leading the team with eight in 2023
- · Gashi registered the third assist of his career and his first since assisting vs High Point (10/24/23).

CREATING CHANCES

In Virginia's second game of the season, the Cavaliers outshot Colgate by a margin of 28-3.

- · UVA's 28 shots were the most in a single game since the team put up 37 in a 1-1 draw with Virginia Tech (10/18/13)
- The last time Virginia took 20+ shots in a game and did not score a goal was also in the 2013 season when the Cavaliers drew 0-0 at Duke (10/8/13).

STARTING 1-1

Virginia has split the opening two games of the campaign for the third consecutive season.

- In 2022, the Cavaliers lost their season opener to Xavier by a margin of 1-0 despite outshooting the Muskateers 19-3. Virginia rebounded with a 4-0 win over Rider.
- · In 2023, the Cavaliers defeated Iona 1-0 in the season opener, but fell to LMU by a score of 3-1 next time out.
- · In each of the last two seasons, the Cavaliers have rebounded from a 1-1 start and secured a pair of top-eight national seeds.

BACK TO COLLEGE PARK

Virginia made its first trip to College Park to face Maryland since the 2015 where a pair of penalties led to a 1-1 stalemate with their longtime rivals.

The last meeting between the two teams in College Park took place in the 2015 NCAA Men's Soccer Championship. Maryland advanced with a 1-0 win.

- · The match featured an opening goal scored by Nick Dang at the penalty spot—the first penalty attempt of his
- · Minutes before the halftime break, Virginia conceded a penalty of its own to level the score
- · Virginia scored on a penalty kick for the first time since the 2023 meeting with Maryland, a 2-1 victory
- · The Cavaliers conceded a goal due to a penalty for the first time since an ACC semifinal match against Syracuse (11/9/22)

THREE OUT OF FOUR...

Cavalier defender Nick Dang scored on a penalty in Virginia's 1-1 draw with Maryland at Ludwig Field.

- Dang's goal against Maryland marked his third in the first four games of the season
- The penalty was his first attempt of his collegiate career
- · With three goals, he matched his season total from 2023-—a career high.

A NEW ROLE FOR LAMBE

Brendan Lambe has quickly become a centerpiece for the Cavaliers following a promising freshman season. A natural central midfielder with strong skills on the ball, Lambe often lines up as a full back while drifting into the center of the

- In 2023, Lambe appeared in 18 games while making a pair of starts including an NCAA tournament match against Indiana
- This season, Lamb has started each of UVA's four games.

MILLER ON THE WING

Reese Miller became a standout player for Virginia upon his arrival in 2022 playing as a left wingback.

· Miller scored a pair of goals his freshman year—both game-winning goals against Pitt. Once in the regular season and again in a 1-0 win in the ACC quarterfinal.

This season. Virginia doesn't utilize a system with wingbacks. which has caused head coach George Gelnovatch to use the lightning quick junior as a traditional winger on the left side.

- In his first three games of the season, Miller has been a major factor in producing goals for the Cavaliers with two goals and an assist to his tally.
- · With a pair of goals against Saint John's Miller doubled his career goal tally (4).

PELÀ MAKING A DIFFERENCE

- Named a captain ahead of the season, Umberto Pelà comes off a breakout season in which he started all but one game in 2023
- A trusted player on the ball with exceptional field vision and decision making, Pelà is often the lynchpin of the Cavalier midfield.

HEADING WEST...

- Virginia's trip to Berkeley, Calif. will mark its first regularseason road trip west of Notre Dame since 2014 a 1-0 overtime loss to Tulsa (9/4/14) — the last season UVA won a national title.
- The Cavaliers have not played a regular-season match on the west coast since 2009 when the team collected a pair of wins over Washington (2-1, 9/6/09) and Portland (3-0, 9/4/09).

THE GASHI/PELÀ MIDFIELD PARTNERSHIP

- Central midfielders Albin Gashi (Vargarda, Sweden) and Umberto Pelà (Milan, Italy) first met each other at an ID Camp in 2022 each vying for a spot on the Virginia roster
- Gashi recalled meetings in the coaches office where he was asked about other players who looked good throughout the camp. He hesitated to name Pelà in his answer for fear Pelà being recruited ahead of him.
- Ultimately, both earned a place on the roster and arrived on Grounds as roomates and have been ever since.
- Both players made their debuts as freshmen in the 2022 season opener, a 1-0 loss to Xavier. Gashi carved out regular minutes in the Virginia XI while Pelà would have to wait for his breakout season in 2023.
- Now playing side-by-side as holding midfielders, Gashi and Pelà were each named captains of the team ahead of 2024 looking to build on the team's progress in 2022 and 2023.

EARLY AUTUMN STREAKS...

Both of the previous two seasons featured lengthy unbeaten runs that were kickstarted in late September and early October.

- In 2022, Virginia started the season with a 4-3-0 record through its first seven games.
- The Cavalier season would later feature an eight-game unbeaten run (3-0-5) that started on Oct. 7—Virginia played six top-25 teams over that stretch.
- Virginia went on to earn the No. 4 overall seed in the NCAA Men's Soccer Championship.
- In 2023, the Cavaliers started 4-3-1 in their first eight games.
- · Virginia tore off a 10-game unbeaten run (7-0-3) that started on Sept. 26.
- The Cavaliers would earn the No. 7 overall seed in the NCAA Men's Soccer Championship.

FIRST-TIME STARTERS

Virginia's 1-0 loss to No. 2 Stanford featured a pair of first career starts for the Cavaliers.

- Luke Burns was originally scheduled to make his first career start when the Cavalier lineup was submitted. He played 45 minutes in the loss
- Victor Akoum was not listed in UVA's initial starting eleven. However, after an injury to Umberto Pelà in warm ups, Akoum was given the nod.
- The loss of Pelà moved Brendan Lambe from left back into his natural position in center midfield while Akoum took over on the outside flank.

FAMILIAR FOE FOR MANGAROV

- Virginia's Danny Mangarov transfered from UNCG ahead of the 2022 season
- Mangarov tallied four goals and five assists in two seasons as a Spartan
- · Mangarov tallied an assist in a 2-1 loss to UNCG

WIESE MAKES HISTORY

- Virginia captain Paul Wiese joined the Virginia elite in a 4-2 win over American.
- Currently at 27 career assists, Wiese is now in sole possession of seventh all time in the category at UVA.
- He becomes the first UVA player to crack a top-10 list for a career total in an offensive stat category since Will Bates (2009-12) who ranks in Virginia's top 10 in points (102), Goals (46), Shots (230), and game-winning goals (15).
- With nine assists on the season, Wiese leads the team and surpasses his single-season high mark of eight set last season.
- Wiese's total is tied for the most among defenders in NCAA Division I.

MIDFIELDERS RETURN

- Virginia's midfield suffered a major blow when the team played Stanford (Sept. 27). By the end of the night,
 Virginia would be without two of its captains as Umberto Pelà suffered an injury in warm ups, while Albin Gashi picked up a red card and a one-game suspension.
- Without either of its central defensive midfielders, the Cavaliers suffered a 2-1 loss to UNCG.
- Gashi returned to face No. 19 Virginia Tech and proved crucial as he netted the game-winning goal in a 2-1 affair.
- Pelà returned to take on No. 8 James Madison after missing three games to injury. In the end, it was his low cross that created the game-winning own goal in the final minute of the match.

ACC CO-DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

- Joey Batrouni turned in one of the top performances of his collegiate career in a 2-1 win over Virginia Tech (Oct. 4).
- The UVA goaltender made 11 stops on the night coming just two short of his career high (vs SYR, 11/5/23)
- Batrouni was named ACC Co-Defensive Player of the Week alongside Logan Erb.

LATE GAME HEROICS

- The Cavaliers logged back-to-back 1-0 victories over No. 8 James Madison and at Boston College.
- Both goals in those 1-0 victories came in the 78th minute or later
- Virginia's game-winning goal in the 90th minute against JMU was the first time the Cavaliers netted a game winner in the final minute of regulation since a 1-0 win over No. 19 New Hampshire (Joe Bell, 8/24/2018)

A SIGNIFICANT WIN IN BOSTON

- Virginia's win at Boston College was a crucial fixture with lots riding on the result. In a notoriously diffuclt ACC fixture, the Cavaliers came through in the clutch with a 1-0 victory.
- The win marked just the second-ever road victory for UVA over BC, and its first since 2005.
- · Virginia secured its first road win of the 2024 season with an unbeaten away record of 1-0-3.
- The three points moved UVA into a tie for sixth with eight points in the ACC standings—just four points off the leaders (Pitt, Stanford, Clemson)

RIGHT ON TRACK

- \cdot The Cavaliers lost four players that accounted for 22 of their 28 goals in 2024.
- Despite the loss of those players, UVA has totaled more goals (20) through the season's first 13 games as they had last season (18).

AN IMPRESSIVE TURNAROUND

- Down a pair of goals just 13 minutes into the game, Virginia overgame the deficit to down American by a score of 4-2 on Tuesday (Oct. 15)
- It was Virginia's first comeback win of the season and first time rescuing a win from a trailing position since a 2-1 win over Pitt (10/13/23).
- The game marked the first time UVA erased a multi-goal deficit to win since a 3-2 overtime victory over Virginia Tech (10/19/2012).
- The Cavaliers had most recently come back from 2-0 to draw at North Carolina (10/28/22)

UBOGU THE SUPER SUB

- Kome Ubogu's career as a Cavalier has been highlighted as a threatening attacking presence off the bench scoring 14 of his 15 goals as a substitite.
- In a 4-2 comeback win over American, Ubogu accounted for five points on a pair of goals and one assist.
- Ubogu's five-point performance is the first by a Cavalier since Phil Horton accomplished the feat in a 3-1 win at No. 10 Pitt (9/30/22).
- Ubogu ranks second on the team with four goals having started just one game all season.

FINDING A WAY

- The Cavaliers put together their longest winning streak of the season with five consecutive victories (Oct. 4-19) including a pair of ranked opponents (No. 19 Virginia Tech/No. 8 JMU).
- Virginia took a pair of 1-0 victories from JMU and Boston College. The former required UVA's first game-winning goal in the 90th minute since a 1-0 result against New Hampshire in 2018. The latter was earned in a notoriously difficult away fixture that featured clutch performances from Nick Dang and Joey Batrouni to score the winning goal, and close out the game defensively.
- Back at Klöckner Stadium, the Cavaliers found themselves facing a 2-0 deficit against American just 13 minutes into the match. On the back of a five-point performance from substitute, Kome Ubogu, UVA came back to win from 2-0 down for the first time since the 2012 season with a 4-2 victory.
- The team then dispatched Syracuse by a score of 3-0 for its third consecutive win in the ACC.
- Virginia's winning streak was snapped by No. 5 Pitt with a 4-1 road loss (10/25)

A NOSE FOR GOAL

- Virginia's Nick Dang leads the Cavaliers for the 2024 season with six goals on the year.
- Dang's goal tally currently ranks first among defenders in NCAA Division I
- Prior to his arriveal at Virginia, Dang had scored just four goals in three seasons at Lipscomb

BRIZUELA HEATING UP

- Virginia's freshman forward is finding his groove late in the season. He registered his first career assist in a crucial 2-1 victory over No. 19 Virginia Tech
- Brizuela scored his first career goal in a 3-0 victory over Syracuse and scored in his second consecutive outing against No. 5 Pitt.
- · He has now scored four goals in three games.

ACC TOURNAMENT SEEDING

- The Cavaliers enter the tournament as the No. 9 seed while NC State earned the No. 8 seed
- Virginia (8-5-3, 3-3-2 ACC), NC State (8-3-5, 3-3-2 ACC) and Note Dame (7-4-5, 3-3-2) each finished on 11 points in a three-way tie for the eighth seed in the tournament. The Wolfpack claimed the eighth seed and the right to host the first-round matchup on goal differential in league play.

PENALTY KICK WOES

- Virginia has won three of its seven NCAA titles on penalty kicks. However, in recent history, penalties have burned the Cavaliers in the postsesaon.
- In each of its past two ACC tournaments, Virginia has been eliminated on penalties at the hands of Syracuse:

- Three of Virginia's last four postseason competitions between the ACC and NCAA tournaments have ended with shootout defeats.
- Virginia last advanced on penalty kicks following a 0-0 draw with Louisville in the quarterfinal of the 2017 ACC Championship.
- Their last win on penalties in the NCAA Tournament delivered the teams seventh and most recent NCAA title defeating UCLA 0-0 (4-2) in 2014.

SUBS SPARK A RALLY IN RALEIGH

- In the first round of the ACC tournament, substitutes Triton Beauvois and David Okorie scored a pair of goals to bring Virginia back from a goal down to beat NC State and advance to its third consecutive ACC quarterfinal appearance
- •The win marked the first time Virginia came from behind to win an ACC Tournament game since the a 3-1 win over Clemson in the 2019 ACC Championship game—Virginia's last conference title
- The match marked Virginia's second winning result from a losing position in 2024

LIGHTNING STRIKES

- In each of Virginia's two ACC Tournament wins, the Cavaliers scored a pair of goals in 30 seconds or less.
- After falling a goal behind to eighth-seeded NC State, Virgina scored back-to-back goals in exactly 20 seconds (71:58, 72:18) to pull off a come-from-behind win.
- In a 2-0 win over top-seeded Pitt, the Cavaliers netted a pair in just 25 seconds (68:00, 68:25) to knock out the top seed.

BREAKOUTS ON THE ATTACK

- Virginia has seen a trio of goalscorers assert themselves in big moments through the start of the postseason.
- Triton Beauvois and David Okorie each recorded their first goals of the season in a comeback win over NC State.
- In the second round it was AJ Smith registering his first goal as a Cavalier to seal a 2-0 victory over Pitt.
- Beauvois did not feature in the second round at Pitt, but has scored in each of his last two appearances against NC State and Wake Forest.

HEAD COACH GEORGE GELNOVATCH



George Gelnovatch enters his 29th season as the head coach of the Virginia men's soccer program. The longest tenured head coach in program history, Gelnovatch has led the Cavaliers to a pair of national championships in 2009 and 2014 as well as six NCAA College Cup appearances and 24-consecutive berths in the NCAA tournament (1996-2019).

Gelnovatch became the program's all-time leader in wins on August 25, 2017 with a 3-2 double-overtime victory over Villanova, surpassing his UVA mentor Bruce Arena for the program record in wins with 296. He reached the 300-win plateau on Sept. 15, 2017 with a 2-1 triumph at Virginia Tech, becoming just the fourth coach in Atlantic Coast Conference history to win 300 career matches.

A former Cavalier soccer All-American and assistant coach, Gelnovatch has guided Virginia to five ACC tournament titles, three

regular-season ACC championships and a record of 382-162-74 (.678) during his tenure as UVA head coach. Over the course of his tenure as an assistant and head coach at Virginia, he has been a part of all seven of the Cavaliers' national championships.

Gelnovatch is the first coach in NCAA Division I men's soccer history to lead 20-straight teams to the NCAA tournament. He is one of just eight coaches in the Division I men's soccer annals to take 20 teams to the tournament and one of only four active coaches to do so.

Among active coaches, Gelnovatch enters the 2023 campaign ranked seventh in career wins (361) and 13th in career win percentage (.680). Among Division I coaches all-time, he ranked 33rd in career wins and 43rd in career winning percentage. These figures are even more striking when considering Gelnovatch's teams play one of the nation's toughest schedules on a yearly basis.

Virginia has won at least 15 games in a season 10 times under Gelnovatch, including 2019 when it won 21 games the second most in the history of the program en route to an ACC Coastal Division Championship, an ACC Tournament crown and a Runner-Up finish in the NCAA College Cup.

Gelnovatch has developed a number of Major League Soccer players during his UVA tenure, with 31 players going in MLS drafts and 13 in the MLS Supplemental Draft, while nine signed Project-40/Generation Adidas contracts and Jordan Allen (2014), Derrick Etienne (2015), Scott Thomsen (2015) and Aboubacar Keita (2018) each signed MLS Homegrown contracts. Jason Moore (1999) and Alecko Eskandarian (2003) were selected No. 1 in the MLS Draft, as 13 Cavaliers have been picked in the first round of the various MLS drafts.

Gelnovatch was named the 10th coach of the Virginia program on Jan. 3, 1996, after Bruce Arena announced he would end his 18-year career at the helm of UVA soccer to become head coach and assistant general manager of Major League Soccer's D.C. United.


