THE KICKOFF

FOR OPENERS

- The Cavaliers are set for just their fifth matchup with California all-time. UVA leads the series with a 2-1-1 record. The last meeting between the teams took place in Berkeley, a 1-1 draw.
- UVA enters the game riding a 13-game unbeaten streak and are one of just seven teams in NCAA Division I with an active unbeaten streak of 10+ games.
- The Cavaliers went undefeated in ACC play with a record of 5-0-3. It marks the first time Virginia went unbeaten in ACC play was in 2001 when the team went 6-0-0.
- The 2001 season was also the last time Virginia won the ACC regular season title outright at earned the top seed in the ACC Men's Soccer Championship

HOOS IN THE ACC TOURNAMENT

- Virginia holds an all-time record of 49-21-14 in the ACC Men's Soccer Championship and has won the ACC tournament 11 times.
- Virginia has won the ACC title a total of 16 times, winning the league five times before the ACC tournament's inception
- Virginia is set to make its third appearance in the ACC Semifinal in the last four seasons
- UVA's last ACC Championship came in 2019 when the Cavaliers defeated Clemson by a score of 3-1 at WakeMed Soccer Park in Cary, N.C.

THE UNIVERSITY OF VIRGINIA

UNIQUELY UVA

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

UNIVERSITY NICKNAMES

Virginia's athletics teams have been accompanied by a somewhat confusing array of nicknames. The most prominent and widely accepted of these monikers are "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos."

Although the terms "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are used almost interchangeably to refer to University teams and players, "Cavaliers" is more often used by the media, while "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are frequently used by Virginia students and fans.

Legend has it that Washington & Lee baseball fans dubbed the Virginia players "Wahoos" during the fiercely contested rivalry that existed between the two in-state schools in the 1890s. By 1940, "Wahoos" was in general use around Grounds to denote University students or events relating to them. The abbreviated "Hoos" sprang up later in student newspapers and has gained growing popularity in recent years.

THE CAVALIER MASCOT

The costumed Cavalier with a large character head debuted during Virginia's 1984 football season and has remained the official mascot of the University.

UNIVERSITY COLORS

Orange and blue were adopted as the University of Virginia's official athletic colors at a mass student meeting in 1888. UVA athletic teams had previously worn silver gray and cardinal red, but those colors did not stand out on muddy football fields, prompting a student movement to change them.

One of the students attending the mass meeting was Allen Potts, a star athlete who played on Virginia's first football team in 1888. Potts showed up at the meeting wearing a navy blue-and-orange scarf that he had acquired during a summer boating expedition at Oxford University. Orange and blue were chosen as the official athletic colors after one of Potts' fellow students pulled the scarf off Potts' neck and, waving it to the crowd, yelled, "How will this do?" UVA later served as the inspiration for schools like Auburn and Florida when they selected school colors.

WAH-HOO-WAH

The origin of "Wah-hoo-wah" is uncertain. The cheer was used to root on Virginia teams as early as 1890 and may have been borrowed from Dartmouth College, whose athletics teams were once known as the Indians.

Legend attributes the yell to Natalie Floyd Otey, who sang the ballad "Where'er You Are, There Shall My Love Be" at Charlottesville's Levy Opera House in 1893. The predominantly student audience noticed that Otey warbled the first three words of the song between each of the stanzas and decided to join in the refrain. By evening's end, goes the legend, the crowd had corrupted "Where'er You Are" into "Wah-hoo-wah."

The Levy Opera House stands at the corner of High Street and Park Street and has since been renovated into an office building.

TELEVISION

Television rights for all home Virginia women's lacrosse games are owned by the Atlantic Coast Conference and ESPN. Permission must be obtained in advance to videotape the games for any purpose.

Members of the media present for 2024 Virginia home women's lacrosse games will be invited on to the field to speak with head coach Sonia LaMonica and select student-athlete(s) approximately 10-15 minutes after the conclusion of each game.

NOTES

RESULTS AGAINST TOP-10 OPPOSITION

- Virginia was tested early with a run of three consecutive matches against opponents ranked in the nation's top-10. The Cavaliers went 2-0-1 against No. 8 Virginia Tech (T, 2-2), No. 6 Louisville (W, 1-0) and No. 1 Wake Forest (W, 6-3).
- The stretch marked the first time UVA matched up with three-straight top-10 opponents since 2022 when Virginia went 2-1-1 against No. 3 Syracuse, No. 10 Pitt, No. 10 Denver and No. 2 Duke.
- The last time UVA opened ACC play with back-to-back road matches against top-10 foes was in 2000, when No. 11 Virginia posted a 2-0 win at No. 5 Wake Forest before defeating No. 10 North Carolina 3-1 in Chapel Hill.
- UVA then went on to topple No. 2 NC State (W, 1-0) on the road.
- The Cavaliers hold a record of 97-76-39 against top-10 opposition all-time
- Since the start of 2022, Virginia has recorded 14 positive results (wins or draws) against top-10 opponents with eight of those results coming on the road:

ACC COACH AND FRESHMAN OF THE YEAR

- Head Coach George Gelnovatch received his third ACC Coach of the Year Award after guiding the Cavaliers to an unbeaten record in conference play (5-0-3)
- Nick Simmonds was named ACC Freshman of the Year and a first team All-ACC Selection
- Other All-ACC honorees include: Nick Dang (second team), Casper Mols (second team), Umberto Pelà (second team), Sebastian Pop (third team) and Zach Ehrenpreis (all-freshman).

SIMMONDS FIRES CAVALIERS INTO ACC SEMIFINAL

- Top-seeded Virginia fell behind 1-0 in the ACC Quarterfinal against North Carolina in the 27th minute
- Virginia responded before halftime as Triton Beauvois found the back of the net on a Nick Simmonds assist
- Simmonds would later score the game winning goal in the 78th minute, his second of the season

SIMMONDS HISTORIC HAT TRICK

- Nick Simmonds was involved in each of Virginia's four goals (3g, 1a) in a shutout win over Clemson (10/25)
- Simmonds became the first Cavalier to record a hat trick since 2012 and the first freshman to do so since 2009.
- Will Bates ('12) was the last to achieve both of those feats – Bates also coached Simmonds at the U15 level

SHOOTOUT STRUGGLES

- The Cavaliers have suffered defeat in five consecutive penalty shootouts
- Virginia holds an all-time record of 12-9 in postseason shootouts in either the ACC or NCAA tournaments
- The last time Virginia advanced in penalty shootout was in 2017 when UVA defeated Louisville 4-3 on PKs in the ACC quarterfinal

NCAA SELECTION COMMITTEE RANKING

- The Cavaliers were ranked No. 3 in the NCAA Division I Men's Soccer Selection Committee's top-16 rankings announced Friday evening (Oct. 17)
- Based on results through games of October 14, Princeton, Stanford, Virginia and Portland received the top four seeds. The top four seeds are crucial, as if the seeds hold those four teams would have the opportunity to host quarterfinal matches with a bid to the Men's College Cup on the line.
- The ranking is based on the criteria used to select and seed the 48 teams for the Division I Men's Soccer Championship and in no particular order includes strength of schedule, Rating Percentage Index, head-to-head competition, results versus common opponents, strength and results against non-conference opponents, late season performance in the last eight games and strength and results against conference opponents.

NOTES

OCTOBER HOOS

- UVA has been impressive in the later stages of the regular season in recent years as each of the last three seasons has featured lengthy hot streaks.
- Since the start of 2022, UVA has gone 16-3-6 in the month of October.
- The 2022 season featured an eight-game unbeaten run (3-0-5) that started on Oct. 7—Virginia played six top-25 teams over that stretch before going on to earn the No. 4 overall seed in the NCAA tournament.
- Virginia tore off a 10-game unbeaten run (7-0-3) in 2023 en route to the No. 7 seed in the NCAA tournament.
- The team won five consecutive games in 2024 and six of its last seven on its way to the No. 11 seed.

SUPER SUB CLINCHES ACC REGULAR SEASON TITLE

- Freshman Bacary Tadjigora scored the game winning goal in a 1-0 win at SMU to clinch the ACC regular season title.
- Tadjigora was subbed on in the 83rd minute as a striker and netted the game-winning goal 80 seconds later.

"I think that was my first time playing striker, but coach wanted me to make an impact coming off the bench...which is the beauty of this team, the depth...it can come from anywhere." - Tadjigora
- The 84th minute goal was the latest game-winning goal scored by the Cavaliers all season
- Virginia clinched the ACC regular season title outright and earned the top seed in the ACC Championship for the first time since 2001.

CLICKING UP FRONT

- Virginia's pairing of Nick Simmonds and Marco Dos Santos has been productive combining for 15 goal involvements between them.
- Dos Santos leads the ACC with eight assists on the season – that total ranks third in NCAA Division I.
- His eight assists this season are more than his previous two seasons in college soccer combined (6)
- Simmonds leads the ACC with four goals in league games this season.

TWO TOP-TWO WINS

- A thumping header from Nick Simmonds in the 20th minute proved to be the difference as Virginia logged its fourth positive result and third win over a top-10 opponent this season, defeating No. 2 NC State 1-0 in Raleigh.
- The Wolfpack went down to 10 men in the eighth minute, and the Cavaliers capitalized shortly after through Simmonds' strike before holding firm for the shutout victory.
- With the result, Virginia recorded two wins over teams ranked in the top two for the first time since 2019 (2-0 vs. No. 1 Maryland; 3-1 vs. No. 1 Clemson).
- The Cavaliers also secured their first road win over a top-two opponent since 2020 (2-0 at No. 2 Wake Forest).

MOLS MAKES HIS RETURN

- After missing two games with an injury, was named ACC Defensive Player of the Week (Oct. 7) in his return to the lineup. Facing an NC State team that had averaged 2.9 goals per game coming into the match, the Virginia goalkeeper tallied two saves and commanded the penalty area as he dealt with a relentless series of long throw-ins from the Wolfpack.
- Mols secured his fifth shutout of the season to mark the team's sixth overall. UVA's six shutouts match the team's totals from both the 2023 and 2024 seasons
- In his absence, Caleb Tunks guided the Cavaliers to a scoreless draw against North Carolina (1 save, 1 SOG) and a 3-2 win over Milwaukee (4 saves, 6 SOG, 1 PK).

NOTES

COMEBACK WIN AT KLÖCKNER

- After conceding on a penalty kick just three minutes into the game, the Cavaliers rallied for their first comeback win of the season to defeat Milwaukee 3-2.
- In the 24th minute, Virginia subbed on **Alex Parvu**, **Luke Burns**, **Triton Beauvois**, and **AJ Smith**. Four minutes later, Burns and Smith were instrumental in scoring the equalizing goal. Smith and Parvu were each involved in the go-ahead goal just six minutes later.
- Milwaukee would level the score at 2-2 in the 51st minute, but **Sami Oulouheu's** first game-winning goal secured a 3-2 win for the Cavaliers.

TAKING DOWN NO. 1

- Virginia notched a signature win when the Cavaliers defeated then-No. 1 Wake Forest by a margin of 6-3 at Klöckner Stadium.
- With the win, Virginia improves to 9-8-5 all-time against No. 1-ranked opponents
- Virginia's 6-3 victory marked the largest margin of victory and its most goals scored against a top-ranked opponent

BURNS, MOLS COLLECT ACC WEEKLY HONORS

- **Luke Burns** (So./M) and **Casper Mols** (Gr./GK) were named ACC Co-Offensive and Co-Defensive Players of the Week after the team's road win over No. 6 Louisville.
- Burns earns the first ACC weekly honor of his career after netting a 73rd-minute winner to stun No. 6 Louisville on the road 1-0. The sophomore made an instant impact on the Cavalier attack, scoring the second game-winning goal of his career just 10 minutes after entering as a substitute.
- Mols, a former first-team All-American at Kentucky, secures his first ACC honor. The veteran goalkeeper recorded his fourth clean sheet of the season in the win over Louisville. Virginia needed all five of his saves to preserve a 1-0 victory, three of which came in the final 25 minutes of the game.

MILLER AND DANG RETURN

- The Cavaliers have been without two of their most important pieces in left winger/wingback **Reese Miller**, and centerback **Nick Dang** for the majority of the season.
- Going into the sixth game of the season in 2024 (Sept. 13 @ WF) Reese Miller was second on the team with five points (2g, 1a) averaging 1.17 points per game.
- Dang ended the season as the team's leading scorer with six goals as a center back. He was named an All-ACC second team selection in his first season as a Cavalier.
- Dang played the full 90 minutes in his first appearance of the season at No. 6 Louisville and helped close out a 1-0 shutout.
- Reese Miller also made his first appearance of the season at Louisville recording 24 minutes.

FIRST STARTS AGAINST AMERICAN

- Three Cavaliers made their first career starts in a 1-0 win over American including **Alex Parvu**, **Sami Oulouheu** and **Jed Akwaboah**.
- Parvu notched an assist on the game-winning goal in his first career start

TURNING POINTS AGAINST VIRGINIA TECH

In 2022 and 2024, Virginia kickstarted its seasons after wins in the Commonwealth Clash:

- **2022:** Entered 2-2 (0-0 ACC) after a 6-1 loss to No. 9 Maryland. Trained 1-0 in the 22nd minute but scored four straight from the 70th on to win 4-2. Finished 10-4-5, earning the No. 4 NCAA seed.
- **2024:** Entered 2-4-3 (0-2-2 ACC), winless in last six. Upset No. 19 VT at home to start a five-game win streak. Finished 11-7-3, earning the No. 11 NCAA seed.

This season, Virginia traveled to No. 8 Virginia Tech and rallied in the 79th minute for a 2-2 draw.

CAVALIER DEBUTS IN THE SEASON OPENER

- Nine players made their UVA debuts Thursday's season opener, three of which found their way onto the scoresheet including **Jesus De Vicente** (1g), **Nick Simmonds** (1a) and **Marco Dos Santos** (1a).
- De Vicente's goal marked the second consecutive season opener in which a Cavalier has marked their debut appearance with a goal (Nick Dang vs Rider, 8/22/24)
- The Cavalier starting lineup featured seven players making their first appearance in a Virginia shirt.

- Throughout George Gelnovatch's 29-year tenure, UVA has produced 36 MLS SuperDraft picks since its inception in 2000. With Virginia's pair of selections in the 2025 draft, 18 Cavaliers have been taken in the draft since 2018.
- UVA has had at least one player selected in six of the last eight drafts.

THE VIRGINIA STANDARD

- As an 11-seed in 2024, the Cavaliers earned a first round bye in the NCAA tournament for the third consecutive season.
- UVA is one of just five programs to earn first-round byes in each of the last three seasons and is the only program that earned multiple top-eight seeds in that span.
- The Cavaliers are coming off their second ACC Semifinal appearance in three seasons.

THE 2025 SCHEDULE

- Virginia has played the toughest schedule in NCAA

Division I in two of the last three seasons (2024, 2022). The 2023 Schedule ranked as the sixth toughest in NCAA Division I.

- Over that span, UVA has posted a record of 32-15-12.

SLOW STARTS

- The Cavaliers started with a 2-4-3 record in their opening nine games of 2024 before winning nine of their final 12 games to finish the season with an 11-7-3 record.
- Virginia has split the opening two games of the campaign in each of the last three seasons – each time they went on to earn a first-round bye in the NCAA Tournament.

GELNOVATCH BY THE NUMBERS

Virginia head coach George Gelnovatch enters his 30th season at the helm. Here is a look at his accomplishments over the previous 29 seasons:

- **41** – Though his tenure as head coach began in 1996, Gelnovatch first arrived on Grounds as a first-year forward in 1983. In 1989 he became a part-time assistant coach and has been with the program ever since. The 2025 season will mark his 41st season as a part of the UVA men's soccer team.
 - **7** – In his 41 seasons with the program, Gelnovatch has been a part of all seven NCAA titles in the program's history.
 - **2** – Gelnovatch has led the Cavaliers to a pair of NCAA Championships as head coach. He guided the team to its sixth title in 2009, as well as its seventh in 2014.
 - **5** – Coach Gelnovatch has led the program to five ACC tournament titles ('97, '03, '04, '09, '19). The program has also won regular-season titles in 1996, 2001 and 2019 under Gelnovatch.
 - **383** – Gelnovatch enters his 30th with 383 total wins. He reached the 300-win plateau on Sept. 15, 2017 with a 2-1 triumph at Virginia Tech to become just the fourth coach in ACC history to reach the threshold. Gelnovatch is the program's all-time wins leader after surpassing his predecessor Bruce Arena with his 296th win on August 25, 2017.
 - **24** – From his first season at the helm through the 2019 campaign, Gelnovatch guided the Cavaliers to 24 consecutive appearances in the NCAA Men's Soccer Championship field. This marked a first in NCAA Men's Soccer history. Overall, Virginia owns the longest postseason streak in NCAA men's soccer history at 36 seasons (1980-2019).
- TOP RETURNERS**
- **Albin Gashi** (M) – 54 appearances for UVA (most of any current player), named team captain in 2024
 - **Umberto Pelà** – Made 18 starts/appearances in both 2023 and 2024, named team captain in 2024
 - **Nick Dang** (D) - Leading goal scorer (6) in 2024...Second-Team All-ACC...his 57 appearances in collegiate soccer is the most of any player on the 2025 UVA roster
 - **Reese Miller** (D) – Prior to his injury, Miller accounted for a career-high seven points (3g, 1a) averaging 1.17 points per game as a left winger in 2024...Tallied five goals and four assists for his career
 - **Brendan Lambe** (M) – Played a utility role for Virginia as a defender with freedom to advance high up the field. Made 38 appearances and 22 starts in his first two seasons as a Cavalier.
 - **Parker Sloan** (D) – Sloan has made 31 appearances across the 2023 and 2024 seasons. He has gradually become a trusted defender playing important minutes in high-pressure situations.

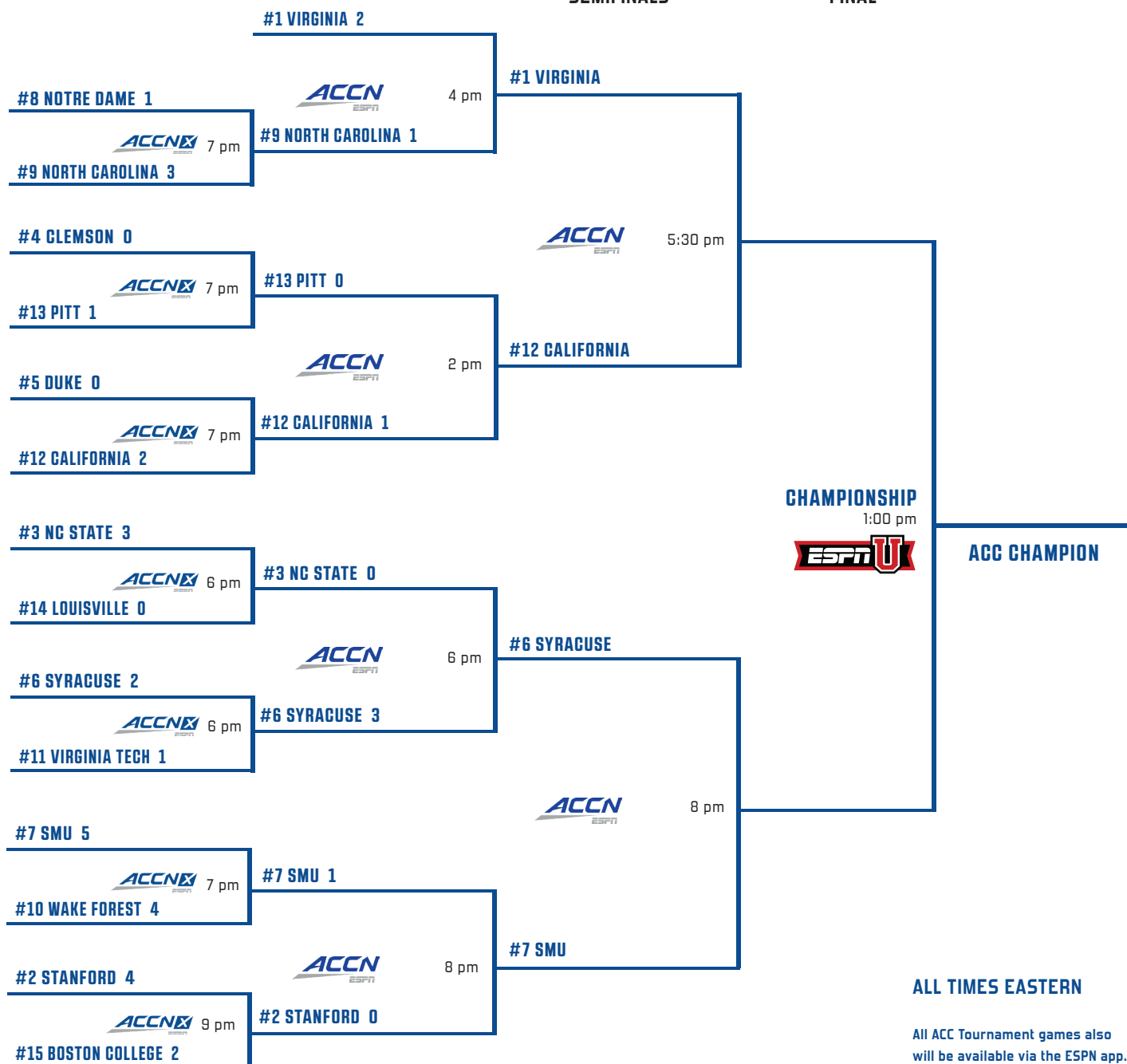

HEAD COACH GEORGE GELNOVATCH



George Gelnovatch enters his 30th season as the head coach of the Virginia men's soccer program in 2025. The longest tenured head coach in program history, Gelnovatch has led the Cavaliers to a pair of national championships in 2009 and 2014 as well as six NCAA College Cup appearances and 26 berths in the NCAA tournament.

Gelnovatch became the program's all-time leader in wins on August 25, 2017 with a 3-2 double-overtime victory over Villanova, surpassing his UVA mentor Bruce Arena for the program record in wins with 296. He reached the 300-win plateau on Sept. 15, 2017 with a 2-1 triumph at Virginia Tech, becoming just the fourth coach in Atlantic Coast Conference history to win 300 career matches. He became the first head coach to reach 100 ACC wins at a single school with a 3-1 win over NC State on Sept. 16, 2023.

A former Cavalier soccer All-American and assistant coach, Gelnovatch has guided Virginia to five ACC tournament titles, three regular-season ACC championships and a record of 361-152-67 (.680) during his tenure as UVA head coach. Over the course of his 32 years as an assistant and head coach at Virginia, he has been a part of all seven of the Cavaliers' national championships.

Gelnovatch is the first coach in NCAA Division I men's soccer history to lead 20-straight teams to the NCAA tournament. He is one of just five coaches in the Division I men's soccer annals to take 24 teams to the tournament and one of only two active coaches to do so.

Gelnovatch ranks as the 13th-winningest active head coach in Division I college soccer, with a .680 career winning percentage. He stands ninth in career wins among current head coaches. Among Division I coaches all-time, he ranks 40th in wins and 43rd in career winning percentage . These figures are even more striking when considering Gelnovatch's teams play one of the nation's toughest schedules on a yearly basis.

Virginia has won at least 15 games in a season 10 times under Gelnovatch, including 2019 when it won 21 games the second most in the history of the program en route to an ACC Coastal Division Championship, an ACC Tournament crown and a Runner-Up finish in the NCAA College Cup.

Gelnovatch has developed a number of Major League Soccer players during his UVA tenure, with 35 players going in MLS drafts and 12 in the MLS Supplemental Draft, while nine signed Project-40/Generation Adidas contracts and Jordan Allen (2014), Derrick Etienne (2015), Scott Thomsen (2015) and Aboubacar Keita (2018) each signed MLS Homegrown contracts. Jason Moore (1999) and Alecko Eskandarian (2003) were selected No. 1 in the MLS Draft, as 14 Cavaliers have been picked in the first round of the various MLS drafts.

Gelnovatch was named the 10th coach of the Virginia program on Jan. 3, 1996, after Bruce Arena announced he would end his 18-year career at the helm of UVA soccer to become head coach and assistant general manager of Major League Soccer's D.C. United.

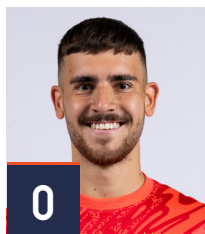
