#### MATCH NOTES

#### FOR STARTERS

- A win or draw against North Carolina will clinch the ACC Coastal Division Championship for Virginia. A Pittsburgh loss or draw at Notre Dame will also give UVA the division crown.
- Virginia will honor seven student-athletes – Robin Afamefuna, Marcel DaSilva, Max Diamond, Aaron James, Henry Kessler, Jerren Nixon Jr. and Colin Shutler – approximately 20 minutes prior to the match as part of its Senior Day recognition.
- The Cavaliers own a 9-1 record at home this season with the only loss coming against Pittsburgh on Oct. 18.
- Virginia comes into the match with the nation's lowest goals against average (0.26), the highest save percentage (.905) and the most shutouts (12).
- The Cavaliers are one of 10 programs nationally with one or no losses this season and Virginia's .900 winning percentage is tied for the fifth highest in the NCAA.
- North Carolina comes into the match winless in its last five matches (0-4-1), including a 1-0 loss at home to Appalachian State on Tuesday (Oct. 28).
- The Tar Heels are 6-1-3 against Virginia in the last 10 meetings, including 4-0-1 in the last five games at Klöckner Stadium.
- North Carolina head coach Carlos Somoano (.743 – 9 seasons) and Virginia head coach George Gelnovatch (.693 – 24 seasons) own the two highest winning percentages among active head coaches in the ACC.

#### POSTSEASON IMPLICATIONS

- Virginia has clinched a top-4 seed in the upcoming ACC Tournament thanks to a Syracuse win over NC State last Saturday.
- The Coastal Division and the Atlantic Division Champions are locked into the top two seeds in the ACC Tournament and seeds 3-12 are determined by points regardless of division.
- Since the current two-division format started in 2014, Virginia has not finished higher than second (2016) in the Coastal Division standings. The Cavaliers have earned a first-round bye once (2015) in the last six seasons..
- Virginia's last regular season ACC championship came in 2001. George Gelnovatch has won two regular season titles (1996, 2001) and four ACC Tournament Championships (1997, 2003, 2004, 2009) in his 24-year tenure.

#### COMING FULL CIRCLE

- Virginia is seeking its sixth conference win of the season, the most since going 6-2 in 2005. The Cavaliers have won six ACC games, four times (1984, 1986, 2001, 2005).
- Gelnovatch was a player on the 1984 and 1986 teams that won six ACC games and later as head coach led the Cavaliers to six league victories in 2001 and 2005.

#### AGAINST NORTH CAROLINA

- Friday will be 86th meeting between North Carolina and Virginia.
- The two programs have played each other every year since 1946 with the exception of 2018 when weather forced the regular season finale to be cancelled.
- Friday marks the first time Virginia faces an unranked North Carolina team since 2007, coincidentally the last time UVA defeated UNC at Klöckner Stadium.
- The Tar Heels own a 40-35-10 ad-vantage in the series and the Cavaliers are 11-12-4 under Gelnovatch against UNC.

#### DIKE DAZZLES

- For the second time in his career, sophomore Daryl Dike was named the ACC Offensive player of the Week after totaling three goals in two games against Saint Louis (Oct. 22) and then-No. 25 Virginia Tech (Oct. 25).
- Dike currently leads the Cavaliers in points (18), goals (6) and assists. He's also the team's active leader in career goals with 11.
- The sophomore striker was also an honorable mention for the on the TopDrawerSoccer.com Team of the Week for the third time in 2019.

#### CLEAN SHEETS

- Virginia has produced a shutout in 12 of its 15 matches this season, the most in the country. Only Washington (11), Georgetown (10) and New Hampshire (10) have reached double-digit shutouts in 2019.
- Under George Gelnovatch, the Cavaliers have reached 10+ shutouts, eight times including the National Championship seasons of 2009 and 2014.
- The 12 clean sheets in the regular season are the most in Gelnovatch's tenure and tied for fourth most in UVA history.

# NOTES CONTINUED

## NATIONAL ACCOLADES

- Nathaniel Crofts was credited with the game-winning goal against then-No. 25 Virginia Tech last Friday and for his efforts was an honorable mention on TopDrawerSoccer.com's Team of the Week.
- Goalkeeper Colin Shutler pitched a pair of shutouts and to-taled seven saves in two matches including a season-high five against Virginia Tech. He was recognized on the College Soccer News Team of the Week.
- Three Cavaliers were included on TopDrawerSoccer.com's midseason Top 100 college players, headlined by Joe Bell at the top spot. Henry Kessler and Daryl Dike are listed at No. 16 and No. 27, respectively.
- First year Andreas Ueland is the seventh-ranked freshman on TopDrawerSoccer.com's Midseason Top-100 freshman list.

## NON-CONFERENCE DOMINANCE

- Virginia went a perfect 8-0 in non-conference action this season and in those eight games did not surrender a goal for the first time in school history. Virginia outscored its non-conference opponents, 14-0.
- Virginia is unbeaten in its last 15 regular season non-conference matches 14-0-1.

## HOW THEY SCORE IT

- A total of 11 different goal scorers are responsible for the 25 Virginia goals scored this season.
- Sophomore Daryl Dike leads the team in points (6g, 6a) with 16. Not included in his stats are the fouls he drew to setup the game-winning goals against George Washington and Notre Dame.
- Dike's six assists are tied for fifth and three game-winning goals are tied for third in the ACC.
- Joe Bell has eight points (2g, 4 A) in league play this season, tied for the eighth most of any ACC player. The Cavaliers are 11-2-1 in his three seasons when he registers a point.

## FRIDAY OF FIRSTS

- Virginia suffered its first loss of the season on Oct. 18 against Pittsburgh. The Panthers scored on two of their four shots on goal in a 2-0 victory.
- The two goals are the only scored by an opponent at Klöckner Stadium this season and the loss snapped a nine-game home win streak.
- The Cavaliers trailed for the first time going into the halftime break. Prior to Friday, Virginia had only trailed for 23 minutes through its first 12 games.

## CAPTAIN'S IMPACT

- Captains Robin Afamefuna and Joe Bell have been mainstays on the pitch for the Cavaliers in recent years. Bell has started every game of his career, a span of 53 matches while Afamefuna has started 38-consecutive matches.
- The duo has been on the field for all but 11 minutes of the last 38 games, a stretch that includes 25 wins and 24 shutouts.

## DISSECTING THE DEFENSE

- Virginia has surrendered four goals in 15 games, the fewest in the country. The Cavaliers are the only school in the country to concede less than five goals in 2019
- Against Boston College (Oct. 11) was the second time this season (Western Michigan – Sept. 23) an opponent has failed to register a shot on target.
- Virginia has held opponents to five or less total shots five times and single-digit shots nine times.
- The defensive trio comprised of Robin Afamefuna, Henry Kessler, Andreas Ueland have started all 15 games and have missed a total of 11 minutes of game action as a unit.
- Virginia allowed one goal through its first 10 games, the fewest in the 76-year history of the pro-gram. Last season the Cavaliers went seven games before conceding the season's second goal, which had happened only one other time (1985).

## RECORD CHASING

- Goalkeeper Colin Shutler was credited with his 19th career shutout on Tuesday against Saint Louis moving him into a tie for sixth place on the program's career shutout list.
- Shutler has 19 shutouts in 28 career starts for the Cavaliers.
- The redshirt junior is also the NCAA's active leader with a career goals against average (0.52) which is the fourth lowest in UVA history.

## COACHING WINS

- Virginia head coach George Gelnovatch (330 wins) is the most wins among active ACC head coaches.
- Gelnovatch's surpassed Sasho Cirovski (321 wins) back on Sept. 20, for sole possession of third place on the all-time ACC coaching wins list.
- Gelnovatch is in his 24th season at the helm and owns the 7th-highest winning percentage (.693) among active NCAA coaches and the highest among ACC Coaches (minimum 10 years coaching).
- Gelnovatch has won 10 or more games in all 24 seasons as head coach and the program has won 10 or more games in 39-straight seasons. Only Maryland's Sasho Cirovski has more consecutive 10+ win seasons (25) among active NCAA head coaches.

## FAST START

Virginia won its first 10 games of the season six times in its 76-year history. The 10-0 start for the Cavaliers was the first since 1993 and the best in George Gelnovatch's 24-year tenure.

## SCORELESS STREAK

- Virginia held opponents scoreless for 692 consecutive minutes, a span of eight games from Sept. 13 through Oct. 11.
- The Cavalier defense recorded six-consecutive shutouts, the most since 2009.

## DEFENSIVE HIGHLIGHTS

- Virginia dominated the match against Boston College in all facets, with a 21-3 shot advantage and took 14 of the 15 corner kick attempts on the night. The Eagles did not take a single shot on goal.
- The Cavaliers have twice held opponents to no shots on target this season (W. Michigan - Sept. 23 & BC - Oct. 11).
- Virginia did not allow a NC State shot attempt for the first 80 minutes on Sept. 20. The four Wolfpack shots in the contest all came in the final 10 minutes including its lone shot on goal.
- Virginia has held nine of its 15 opponents this season to single-digit shots, including five against No. 1 Maryland, the fewest shots by the Terps since Nov. 17, 2013, also against the Cavaliers.

## SCHEDULE GAUNTLET

- Including matches against ranked foes, Duke and Maryland, the Cavaliers played five 2018 NCAA Tournament teams through their first six games of the season.
- Virginia and Georgetown are the only two programs to face 2018 postseason qualifiers in the first six games.

## PRESEASON NOTES

- Virginia comes into the 2019 season ranked 12th in the country by the United Soccer Coaches, the highest preseason ranking since 2015 when it ranked 2nd after winning the program's seventh National Championship in the fall prior.
- For the third-straight season, Virginia was picked to finish second in the Coastal Division in a poll of the league's 12 head coaches.
- The Cavaliers were one of four teams (UNC, Duke & Wake Forest) to receive a first place vote for the league's overall champion.

## HOOS BACK

- The Cavaliers return 15 letterwinners including eight of 11 starters from last season.
- Headed by junior Nathaniel Crofts (4g, 6a), six of the top seven point scorers from 2018 are on this year's roster. Virginia returns 83 percent of its scoring (20 of 24 goals) along with goalkeepers Colin Shutler and Marcel DaSilva.

## DECORATED SECOND YEARS

- Virginia set an ACC record with four honorees on the ACC All-Freshman team in 2018.
- Second years Daryl Dike, Cabrel Happi Kamseu and Daniel Steedman are all back for their sophomore campaigns. Dike and Happi Kamseu led the Cavaliers with five goals each. Steedman added a pair of goals both in conference play.
- Defender Aboubacar Keita signed a homegrown contract with the Columbus Crew SC and has appeared in six MLS matches through last Sunday.

# HEAD COACH GEORGE GELNOVATCH



George Gelnovatch is in the midst of his 24th season as the head coach of the Virginia men's soccer program. The longest tenured head coach in program history, Gelnovatch has led the Cavaliers to a pair of national championships in 2009 and 2014 as well as five NCAA College Cup appearances and 23-consecutive berths in the NCAA tournament.

Gelnovatch became the program's all-time leader in wins on August 25, 2017 with a 3-2 double-overtime victory over Villanova, surpassing his UVA mentor Bruce Arena for the program record in wins with 296. He reached the 300-win plateau on Sept. 15, 2017 with a 2-1 triumph at Virginia Tech, becoming just the fourth coach in Atlantic Coast Conference history to win 300 career matches.

A former Cavalier soccer All-American and assistant coach, Gelnovatch has guided Virginia to four ACC tournament titles, two regular-season ACC championships and a record of 317-129-57 (.687) in his first 23 seasons as UVA head coach. Over the course of his 30 years as an assistant and head coach at Virginia, he has been a part of all seven of the Cavaliers' national championships.

Gelnovatch is the first coach in NCAA Division I men's soccer history to lead 20-straight teams to the NCAA tournament. He is one of just eight coaches in the Division I men's soccer annals to take 20 teams to the tournament and one of only four active coaches to do so.

Gelnovatch ranks as the seventh-winningest active head coach in Division I college soccer, with a .692 career winning percentage. Going into the 2019 season he stood 15th in career wins among current head coaches. Among Division I coaches all-time, he ranked 38th in career winning percentage and 41st in wins going into 2019. These figures are even more striking when considering Gelnovatch's teams play one of the nation's toughest schedules on a yearly basis.

Virginia has won at least 15 games in a season nine times under Gelnovatch, including 2009 when the team recorded 19 victories en route to the conference and national championships.

Gelnovatch has developed a number of Major League Soccer players during his UVA tenure, with 27 players going in MLS drafts and nine in the MLS Supplemental Draft, while six signed Project-40/Generation Adidas contracts and Jordan Allen (2014), Derrick Etienne (2015), Scott Thomsen (2015) and Aboubacar Keita (2018) each signed MLS Homegrown contracts. Jason Moore (1999) and Alecko Eskandarian (2003) were selected No. 1 in the MLS Draft, as 11 Cavaliers have been picked in the first round of the various MLS drafts.

Gelnovatch was named the 10th coach of the Virginia program on Jan. 3, 1996, after Bruce Arena announced he would end his 18-year career at the helm of UVA soccer to become head coach and assistant general manager of Major League Soccer's D.C. United.

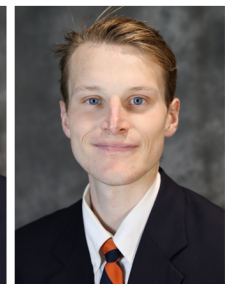
