THE OPENING DRAW

FOR OPENERS

- Virginia is set to face off with Cornell for the second time in program history. The matchup will be the first meeting of the two teams since the 1988 season when Virginia took a 5-4 victory in Ithaca.
- The Cavaliers are ranked No. 15 in the latest IWLCa and USA Lacrosse Magazine polls.
- The Cavaliers play a difficult schedule in 2024 as the slate features nine teams ranked or receiving votes in the latest IWLCa poll. UVA will face off with all of the top-three teams in the latest edition of the poll (Boston College, Notre Dame, JMU).

A NEW ERA IN CHARLOTTESVILLE

- UVA head coach Sonia LaMonica was appointed in July 2023 and takes over UVA's storied program after serving as the head women's lacrosse coach at Towson for the last 14 seasons. At Towson, she amassed a 139-91 record.
- The LaMonica era began with a 3-0 start which has featured plenty of new Cavalier faces. Graduate transfer Katia Carnevale leads the Cavaliers in scoring with nine total goals including a four-goal performance on her UVA debut at Liberty.
- Freshmen Madison Alaimo (5g, 6a) and Jenna Dinardo (4g, 3a) have been difference makers on the attack while Kate Demark and sophomore Olivia Bruno have stepped into important roles on the defensive end.

THE UNIVERSITY OF VIRGINIA

UNIQUELY UVA

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

UNIVERSITY NICKNAMES

Virginia's athletics teams have been accompanied by a somewhat confusing array of nicknames. The most prominent and widely accepted of these monikers are "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos."

Although the terms "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are used almost interchangeably to refer to University teams and players, "Cavaliers" is more often used by the media, while "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are frequently used by Virginia students and fans.

Legend has it that Washington & Lee baseball fans dubbed the Virginia players "Wahoos" during the fiercely contested rivalry that existed between the two in-state schools in the 1890s. By 1940, "Wahoos" was in general use around Grounds to denote University students or events relating to them. The abbreviated "Hoos" sprang up later in student newspapers and has gained growing popularity in recent years.

THE CAVALIER MASCOT

The costumed Cavalier with a large character head debuted during Virginia's 1984 football season and has remained the official mascot of the University.

UNIVERSITY COLORS

Orange and blue were adopted as the University of Virginia's official athletic colors at a mass student meeting in 1888. UVA athletic teams had previously worn silver gray and cardinal red, but those colors did not stand out on muddy football fields, prompting a student movement to change them.

One of the students attending the mass meeting was Allen Potts, a star athlete who played on Virginia's first football team in 1888. Potts showed up at the meeting wearing a navy blue-and-orange scarf that he had acquired during a summer boating expedition at Oxford University. Orange and blue were chosen as the official athletic colors after one of Potts' fellow students pulled the scarf off Potts' neck and, waving it to the crowd, yelled, "How will this do?" UVA later served as the inspiration for schools like Auburn and Florida when they selected school colors.


WAH-HOO-WAH

The origin of "Wah-hoo-wah" is uncertain. The cheer was used to root on Virginia teams as early as 1890 and may have been borrowed from Dartmouth College, whose athletics teams were once known as the Indians.

Legend attributes the yell to Natalie Floyd Otey, who sang the ballad "Where'er You Are, There Shall My Love Be" at Charlottesville's Levy Opera House in 1893. The predominantly student audience noticed that Otey warbled the first three words of the song between each of the stanzas and decided to join in the refrain. By evening's end, goes the legend, the crowd had corrupted "Where'er You Are" into "Wah-hoo-wah."

The Levy Opera House stands at the corner of High Street and Park Street and has since been renovated into an office building.

NEW FACES

- Virginia welcomes 10 new faces to the squad in 2024 to make up nearly a third of the team. The 10 newcomers consist of eight freshmen and two transfers.
- With a squad of eight freshman, the Cavaliers will be reliant on incoming talent to perform on the field in 2024 and veteran guidance will be key to the development of the young players.
- On the offensive end of the field, graduate transfer Katia Carnevale has hit the ground running and is tied for the UVA lead in goals while Madison Alaimo and Jenna Dinardo have been outstanding contributors as freshmen.
- Kate Galica turned in a breakout performance against No. 8 North Carolina taking the majority of the draws for UVA. The freshman won two to herself and scored a pair of goals in a 10-9 overtime defeat to the Tar Heels.

MORGAN SCHWAB: AN ELITE QUARTERBACK

- Virginia's senior attacker, Morgan Schwab, put together an impressive junior season in which she recorded 49 assists as well as 20 goals.
- The quarterback of the UVA offense, Schwab averaged the second-most assists in NCAA Division I for 2023 with an average of 2.72 per game. Her total tally for the season ranked seventh nationally and fourth in the ACC.
- Schwab has her fingerprints all over the Cavalier record books in the assist category. In 2022, she tied the Virginia single-game assist record with seven against USC. She appears on the all-time list two more times at No. 4 (6 assists at Richmond/Albany, '23) and No. 6 (5 assists at Princeton/Syracuse, '23)
- Last season she recorded the second-most assists (49) in a single season throughout the history of the program. Schwab entered the 2024 season with 102 career assists and is climbing her way up the career assists list at UVA.

STANDOUT GOALKEEPING

- After an open competition between Virginia's five rostered goalkeepers, sophomore Mel Josephson was named the starting goalkeeper ahead of the season after not seeing any game time in 2023.
- The sophomore's impressive play between the pipes proved crucial as Josephson helped to negate a Cavalier disadvantage in draw controls and ground balls in UVA's first three games of the season.
- Josephson was awarded with ACC Defensive Player of the Week (Feb. 13) after back-to-back 12-save performances to end the week with a percentage of .615 in two games.
- As of Thursday (Feb. 22) Josephson ranked No. 4 in the NCAA with 36 total saves in her first three games of the season.
- Josephson was the only goalie ranked in the top five of NCAA Division I in total saves while also owning an undefeated record. Josephson is one of just two ranked in the top-five in saves while having a winning record going into the weekend.

A STAR TRANSFER

- Lehigh transfer Katia Carnevale has slotted directly into the Cavalier offense at midfield and has proved to be an early catalyst for a new-look Cavalier offense.
- In four seasons with the Mountain Hawks, Carnevale amassed a total of 156 goals and 34 assists for a total of 190 points. Carnevale logged 15 multi-goal games with 11 hat-tricks in 2023.
- A prolific scorer, Carnevale has recorded a career-high of eight goals on two occasions while playing for Lehigh (4/20/22, 3/13/21).
- In her Cavalier debut, Carnevale was front and center scoring the first goal of the 2024 campaign in route to a four-goal performance to notch the 28th hat trick of her career.
- Carnevale is averaging 2.25 goals per game and leads the Cavaliers in goals with nine on the season.

HOEG PICKS UP WHERE SHE LEFT OFF

- Mackenzie Hoeg's offensive output has increased with every season she has played as a Cavalier ending 2023 with a career-best 40 goals and four assists for 44 points.
- Hoeg was blazing hot at the tail end of 2023 scoring four consecutive hat tricks with 14 goals over that four-game period. The 2024 season started on a similar note as Hoeg notched three goals in UVA's opening game against Liberty (Feb. 9).
- Hoeg has carried her scoring streak into the 2024 season tied with Carnevale as UVA's leading scorer with seven to her tally so far. She is the only Cavalier to score multiple goals in every game this season.
- After the departure of Virginia's all-time leader in draw controls, Hoeg is tied for the UVA lead this season with nine. Hoeg broke into the Virginia's top-ten in career draw controls with a pair against Stanford (Feb. 11)
- Hoeg was named to the 2024 Tewaaraton Watch list on Feb. 15. It is the first honor she has received from the Tewaaraton Foundation in her career.

FANTASTIC FRESHMEN

- The Virginia first years made a statement in Virginia's opening portion of the season and showed signs that they can continue to produce on a young team.
- Madison Alaimo has been an immediate threat for the Cavaliers. Often operating alongside Morgan Schwab from the x-attack position, Alaimo has become a second quarterback for UVA with the third-highest point total (11) on the team. She is second among Cavaliers with six assists.
- Alaimo came through in big spots for the Cavaliers in her second outing as each of her goals and assists helped Virginia tie or take the lead against Stanford.
- Freshmen Jenna Dinardo (4g, 3a) and Addi Foster (1g, 1a) have also proved to be welcomed additions to a dangerous Virginia offense.

GRITTY LACROSSE

- When performance at the draw so often has a significant effect on the outcome of games, Virginia has been at a disadvantage in every game this season coming away with less draw controls than their opponents.
- The Cavalier team has shown toughness and grit as the team was able to grind out three victories despite the disadvantage. Their success, despite losing out in the draw control battle, can largely be attributed to the play of Mel Josephson in goal as well as the team's efficiency on the offensive end and in the clearing game.

THIRD QUARTER DOMINANCE

- Virginia has been impressive at the start of the second half this season outscoring its opponents by a margin of 16-5 in the third quarter.
- The Cavaliers have notched five goals in the third quarter against both Liberty and Stanford.
- Virginia's most impressive defensive period this season came in the third quarter against Liberty when UVA shut out the flames for the period in the midst of a 23-minute scoring drought for the Flames.

ACC TEAMS IN THE NATIONAL POLLS

- One of the toughest conferences in the nation, the ACC is tied with the Big Ten for the NCAA lead with six teams ranked in the IWLCA top-25.
- ACC teams included in the poll include: Boston College, North Carolina, Syracuse, Notre Dame, Virginia, and Clemson
- Boston College and Notre Dame are ranked first and second respectively.

JULIE MYERS SELECTED FOR 2024 IWLCA HALL OF FAME CLASS

- The Intercollegiate Women's Lacrosse Coaches Association announced Thursday (Feb. 15) that three coaches have been selected for induction into the association's Hall of Fame class for 2024 including Virginia alumna and legendary head coach Julie Myers.
- During her 28-year tenure as head coach at UVA, Myers amassed a remarkable record of 349-181 (.658), solidifying her as one of the most successful coaches in NCAA Division I collegiate lacrosse history. Her win total ranks fifth overall in NCAA Division I and 11th across all NCAA Divisions. Over her 28 years at the helm, Myers consistently led her teams to the postseason with the exception of 2020 when the NCAA spring championships were canceled due to the pandemic.
- Under her guidance, the Cavaliers clinched the NCAA Division I championship in 2004 and finished as national runners-up six times. Additionally the Cavaliers secured five ACC championships under Myers.

NOTABLE DEPARTURES

- Though Virginia has made valuable additions to the squad while retaining some top talent, the team will still be tasked with replacing some top performers from the 2023 season.
- Rachel Clark departed in the summer for Boston College via the transfer portal. Clark led the Cavaliers in 2023 with 63 goals while adding 13 assists for a total of 76 points.
- The Cavaliers will also be missing Ashlyn McGovern on the attacking end of the field. A senior who finished her Virginia career with the third-most goals (204) in program history, McGovern accounted for 61 goals and seven assists.
- Another question mark for the Cavaliers will take place in the center circle after the departure of the program's all-time leader in draw controls (332), Aubrey Williams.
- Clark and McGovern accounted for 46 percent of Virginia's goals in 2023. Either Clark or McGovern have led the team in goals in each of the last three seasons.

CAVALIER COACHES ON THE WORLD STAGE

- Virginia's coaching staff has a wealth of experience not only at the collegiate level, but on the professional and world stage.
- Head coach Sonia LaMonica, an Australian native and Maryland graduate, led the Australian national team to a World Cup title beating out the US national team for the gold medal on American soil. LaMonica was named to the 2005 IFWLA All-World Team and can also boast silver medals at the 2009 World Cup Championship and the 1999 World Championship as well as the bronze medal at the 2013 World Cup Championship in Canada.
- Assistant coach Caylee Waters is a current member of the US National Team and competes professionally with Athletes Unlimited. Waters split time in goal with the US National Team at the 2022 World Cup Championship as the US went on a run to the gold medal, winning gold on American soil for the first time in the team's history.
- Assistant coach Kerrigan Miller, also competes professionally with Athletes Unlimited, and has been a member of the USA Women's Senior National Training Team for the past two years.

HEAD COACH SONIA LAMONICA



LaMonica takes over UVA's storied program for the 2023-24 season after serving as the head women's lacrosse coach at Towson for the last 14 seasons. At Towson, she amassed a 139-91 record and owns a 147-101 all-time coaching record after starting her head coaching career at Mount St. Mary's for one season.

During her tenure at Towson, LaMonica led the Tigers to seven NCAA Tournament appearances and four Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) Tournament Championships. She has been named the CAA Coach of the Year five times.

Towson finished first or second in the CAA in 10 of her 14 seasons at the helm and made nine CAA tournament championship game appearances, including six-straight. LaMonica has coached six players to All-America honors and has had numerous All-CAA and All-Region honorees.

LaMonica consistently challenged her teams with tough schedules against top-ranked opponents. Towson finished .500 or better in 12 of the 14 seasons she oversaw the program, with one of the two being cut short due to the pandemic.

A native of Darlington, South Australia, LaMonica (pronounced La – MAHN – ick – uh) was named the 10th head coach in the history of the Towson women's lacrosse program after the 2010 season. She returned to lead the Tigers after a one-year stint as the head coach at Mount St. Mary's.

As the Mountaineers' head coach, LaMonica led Mount St. Mary's to an 8-9 record in 2010 and a berth in the Northeast Conference (NEC) semifinals. She coached five players who earned All-NEC honors.

Prior to becoming the Mountaineers' head coach, LaMonica spent two seasons as a member of Missy Doherty's staff at Towson and helped the Tigers win a pair of Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) championships.

Before joining the Tigers' staff, LaMonica was an assistant coach at the University of Denver, helping the Pioneers to a 15-5 record during the 2006 season. She coached the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation (MPSF) Player and Rookie of the Year along with three all-conference selections and the program's first IWFLCA All-West/Midwest region honoree.

LaMonica is also the head coach of the Women's Professional Lacrosse League's (WPLL) Baltimore Brave. LaMonica led the Brave to the league championship in 2019 and guided the team to the title game in the inaugural season a year earlier.

In addition to her success as a coach, LaMonica is a member of the Australian National Team. She helped Australia win the gold medal at the 2005 World Cup Championship and a silver medal at the 2009 World Cup Championship. In the summer of 2013, LaMonica played a key role in helping Australia earn a bronze medal at the World Cup Championship in Canada.

Named to the 2005 IFWLA All-World Team, she was also a member of the U-19 Australian National Team that won the silver medal at the 1999 World Championships and was also the recipient of the U21 South Australian Sportswoman of the Year award.

A 2003 graduate of Maryland, LaMonica was a three-year starter for the Terrapins. She earned first team All-America honors and was a candidate for the Tewaaratron Trophy during her senior season after leading Maryland to the Atlantic Coast Conference (ACC) championship. A team captain during her senior season, she was a member of three ACC championship teams and helped the Terrapins win the 2000 and 2001 NCAA titles.

LaMonica scored 111 goals in her college career, including 49 goals as a senior, along with 55 assists.

Formerly Sonia Judd, LaMonica is married to former Maryland men's lacrosse standout Michael LaMonica. The couple resides in Parkton, Md., with their sons, Luca and Bodhi and daughter, Marley.

Michael LaMonica, a member of the Towson coaching staff, will join Sonia as an assistant coach for the Cavaliers.
