#### **THE OPENING DRAW**

### **HOOS IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT**

- · Virginia is set to make its 28th consecutive appearance in the NCAA Women's Lacrosse Championship
- The Cavaliers earned the right to host the first and second rounds as the No. 5 seed in this year's tournament—it marks the first time Virginia has hosted an NCAA tournament game since 2019, and its highest seed since 2008 when Virginia was awarded the No. 4 seed
- UVA will make its 36th overall appearance in the NCAA tournament and owns a 39-32 overall record in the competition.
- The Cavaliers have been crowned NCAA Champions three times (1991, 1993, 2004). The last time UVA advanced to an NCAA quarterfinal was in 2019, when the team fell to North Carolina.

#### **RECENT RESULTS**

- The Cavaliers enter the NCAA Women's Lacrosse Championship following an eventful ACC tournament run.
- Virginia was awarded the No. 5 seed in the conference tournament as well and made its first appearance in the quarterfinal round with a historic win over North Carolina—its first over the Tar Heels in just short of a decade.
- UVA's momentum was halted in the ACC semifinal after a 19-4 defeat at the hands of Syracuse; a team Virginia had played to a one-goal game in March. Prior to its lopsided defeat to the Orange, The Cavaliers had lost a total of three games by a combined total of seven goals—five of which came in a road loss to Duke.

#### THE UNIVERSITY OF VIRGINIA

#### **UNIQUELY UVA**

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

#### **UNIVERSITY NICKNAMES**

Virginia's athletics teams have been accompanied by a somewhat confusing array of nicknames. The most prominent and widely accepted of these monikers are "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos."

Although the terms "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are used almost interchangeably to refer to University teams and players, "Cavaliers" is more often used by the media, while "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are frequently used by Virginia students and fans.

Legend has it that Washington & Lee baseball fans dubbed the Virginia players "Wahoos" during the fiercely contested rivalry that existed between the two in-state schools in the 1890s. By 1940, "Wahoos" was in general use around Grounds to denote University students or events relating to them. The abbreviated "Hoos" sprang up later in student newspapers and has gained growing popularity in recent years.

#### THE CAVALIER MASCOT

The costumed Cavalier with a large character head debuted during Virginia's 1984 football season and has remained the official mascot of the University.

#### **UNIVERSITY COLORS**

Orange and blue were adopted as the University of Virginia's official athletic colors at a mass student meeting in 1888. UVA athletic teams had previously worn silver gray and cardinal red, but those colors did not stand out on muddy football fields, prompting a student movement to change them.

One of the students attending the mass meeting was Allen Potts, a star athlete who played on Virginia's first football team in 1888. Potts showed up at the meeting wearing a navy blue-and-orange scarf that he had acquired during a summer boating expedition at Oxford University. Orange and blue were chosen as the official athletic colors after one of Potts' fellow students pulled the scarf off Potts' neck and, waving it to the crowd, yelled, "How will this do?" UVA later served as the inspiration for schools like Auburn and Florida when they selected school colors.

## WAH-HOO-WAH

The origin of "Wah-hoo-wah" is uncertain. The cheer was used to root on Virginia teams as early as 1890 and may have been borrowed from Dartmouth College, whose athletics teams were once known as the Indians.

Legend attributes the yell to Natalie Floyd Otey, who sang the ballad "Where'er You Are, There Shall My Love Be" at Charlottesville's Levy Opera House in 1893. The predominantly student audience noticed that Otey warbled the first three words of the song between each of the stanzas and decided to join in the refrain. By evening's end, goes the legend, the crowd had corrupted "Where'er You Are" into "Wahhoo-wah."

The Levy Opera House stands at the corner of High Street and Park Street and has since been renovated into an office building.

#### **MORGAN SCHWAB: AN ELITE OUARTERBACK**

- · Virginia's senior attacker, Morgan Schwab, put together an impressive junior season in which she recorded 49 assists as well as 20 goals.
- The quarterback of the UVA offense, Schwab averaged the second-most assists in NCAA Division I for 2023 with an average of 2.72 per game. Her total tally for the season ranked seventh nationally and fourth in the ACC.
- Schwab has her fingerprints all over the Cavalier record books in the assist category. In 2022, she tied the Virginia single-game assist record with seven against USC. She appears on the all-time list two more times at No. 4 (6 assists at Richmond/Albany, '23) and No. 6 (5 assists at Princeton/Syracuse, '23)
- · Last season she recorded the second-most assists (49) in a single season throughout the history of the program. Schwab entered the 2024 season with 102 career assists and is climbing her way up the career assists list at UVA.
- · Schwab set a single-game record with eight assists in a 20-5 win over Richmond (March 6). She then set the UVA career record with her 130th assist at Notre Dame.
- · On Thursday (March 7) Morgan Schwab was announced as an addition to the 2024 Tewaaraton Award Watch List. This marks Schwab's first-ever honor by the foundation as she joins co-captain Mackenzie Hoeg on the list. Hoeg was included in the initial list announced in February.
- · Schwab's total of 51 assists this season currently ranks fifth in NCAA Division I.

#### POSTSEASON LACROSSE IN CHARLOTTESVILLE

- Klöckner Stadium set the scene for four games in three days as a host site for both the 2024 NCAA Men's and Women's Lacrosse Championships. The UVA women will be the No. 5 seed while the No. 6 seed men host St. Joseph's on Saturday (May 11).
- Both UVA programs are known nationwide for their rich tradition of top-tier lacrosse—the women host for the first time since 2019, while the men host in back-to-back seasons. UVA's women have qualified for each of the last 28 NCAA tournaments.
- The Cavalier men been at the top of the men's lacrosse world in recent seasons playing on Championship Weekend in three of the last four seasons.
- The last time Virginia's women were seeded higher than the men in a year when both qualified for the NCAA tournament, was in 2014. The women were seeded 6th while the men were seeded 8th.

#### **COACHING COMPARISONS: TOURNAMENT EXPERIENCE**

- The first half of a Women's Lacrosse doubleheader features a matchup of two coaches with a wealth of experience in collegiate lacrosse, but look to bolster their resumes with their first deep run in the NCAA Division I Women's Lacrosse Championship.
- Sonia LaMonica has made nine NCAA Championship appearances and looks to move past the second round for the first time in her career.
- Former collegiate teammate of LaMonica, Meghan McNamara (LIU) is a two-time NCAA Division II champion as a head coach, but takes her first crack at the DI championship in 2024.
- The other side of the Charlottesville preliminary site features one of the most accomplished collegiate coaches in women's lacrosse, Jenny Levy (UNC). A UVA graduate, and national champion with the Cavaliers in 1991, Levy ranks second all-time with 42 NCAA tournament wins. Levy has thee NCAA Championships to her name.
- · Amanda O'Leary (Florida) is a seasoned veteran in the NCAA championship as well raking eighth all-time with 14 appearances in the tournament.

- After an open competition between Virginia's five rostered goalkeepers, sophomore Mel Josephson was named the starting goalkeeper ahead of the season after not seeing any game time in 2023.
- · Josephson was awarded with ACC Defensive Player of the Week (Feb. 13) after back-to-back 12-save performances to end the week with a percentage of .615 in two games.
- The Cavalier netminder was a crucial piece to the puzzle for the Cavaliers in a thrilling 13-12 win over No. 3 Boston College. Her six first-half saves helped UVA build a five-goal cushion which would help withstand a 6-0 scoring run from BC.
- · She finished the game with 10 saves in total, marking her eighth game reaching double figures.
- · Josephson was awarded Defensive Player of the Week honors by IWLCA and the ACC following her performance against BC.
- · Josephson currently ranks No. 26 in NCAA Divison I and second in the ACC with 148 total saves.

#### LAMONICA NAMED ACC CO-COACH OF THE YEAR

• It has been an exceptional first campaign for Head Coach Sonia LaMonica as she was named ACC Co-Coach of the Year alongside former Maryland teammate and current BC head coach Acacia Walker-Weinstein.

"The coach of the year award is just a testament to the coaching staff and the amazing job these guys have done. I just couldn't imagine being anywhere else right now. So, thank you for this amazing recognition, but really it's about this entire group." - Sonia LaMonica

• In their first season under LaMonica, the Cavaliers recorded their first 14-win season since 2010 while matching a program-high of six ACC wins. Virginia's 9-1 start to the season was the best since 2007.

#### A STAR TRANSFER

- Lehigh transfer Katia Carnevale has slotted directly into the Cavalier offense at midfield and has proved to be a catalyst for a new-look Cavalier offense.
- In four seasons with the Mountain Hawks, Carnevale amassed a total of 156 goals and 34 assists for a total of 190 points. Carnevale logged 15 multi-goal games with 11 hat-tricks in 2023.
- · A prolific scorer, Carnevale has recorded a career-high of eight goals on two occasions while playing for Lehigh (4/20/22, 3/13/21).
- In her Cavalier debut, Carnevale was front and center scoring the first goal of the 2024 campaign in route to a four-goal performance to notch the 28th hat trick of her career.
- Carnevale is averaging 2.61 goals per game and leads the Cavaliers in goals with 47 on the season.
- Carnevale tallied a season high of six goals against Pittsburgh (March 16) marking her best offensive performance with seven total points on the day. Her five goals in the second half against Virginia Tech helped guide UVA to a 14-12 win in the regular season finale.
- The Virginia transfer has registered nine hat tricks this season, pushing her career total to 36.

## **GALICA DOING IT ALL**

- ACC Freshman of the Year, Kate Galica has made an immediate impact on her squad in 2024 making her presence felt in each third of the field.
- Galica has been an important piece for the Cavaliers taking a significant portion of the team's draws. With 86 draw controls, she currently leads the team in the category with the highest single-season total for a freshman in UVA history, but her contributions do not end there
- Galica smashed a career-high with 11 draw controls in a win over VCU matching the sixthhighest total for a Virginia player in a single game. She matched that total in a win over Virginia Tech.
- Offensively, Galica has proven to be a dangerous threat in front of goal chipping in 20 goals including a five-game scoring streak (Feb. 17-March 6) as well as goals coming in crucial moments.
- Galica accounted for two of Virginia's final three goals in a comeback win over No. 3 Boston College, including the game-tying goal with :02 seconds remaining in regulation. She recorded the third hat trick of her career with three total goals on the day.
- Against No. 18 Clemson and No. 23 Richmond, Galica accounted for six goals, nine draw controls, three ground balls and three caused turnovers.
- Galica is also a stand-out factor in other phases of the game as well. A relentless approach on the defensive and and in the ride game, Galica has accounted for 14 caused turnovers and 26 ground balls this season.

#### **RELENTLESS LACROSSE**

- The Cavaliers relentless style is epitomized by the aggressive ride employed by the team in each game. Virginia gives up nothing easy on the clear and often forces their opponents into turnovers on the clear. In most situations, the ball will finally touch Virginia's defensive zone after eating into a significant chunk of the shot clock.
- When performance at the draw so often has a significant effect on the outcome of games, Virginia has been at a disadvantage in the majority of its games this season trailing its opposition by a margin of 217-275.

#### THIRD QUARTER DOMINANCE

- Virginia has been impressive at the start of the second half this season outscoring its opponents by a margin of 65-40 in the third quarter.
- The Cavaliers have notched five or more goals in the third quarter in five games.
- Virginia's most impressive defensive run came when the Cavaliers held No. 23 Richmond to a 46:47 minute scoring drought which spanned all four quarters of the game.
- UVA has outscored its opponents in the third quarter in 11 games this season
- The Virginia defense has put together a total of four shutout quarters this season. (Liberty Q3, Richmond Q2, Richmond Q3, VCU Q2)

#### **ACC TEAMS IN THE NATIONAL POLLS**

- One of the toughest conferences in the nation, the ACC has five total teams ranked in the latest IWLCA Poll and six in the 29-team NCAA tournament field.
- ACC teams included in the poll include: Boston College, North Carolina, Syracuse, Notre Dame, Virginia. Duke is not ranked in the latest poll but will compete in the NCAA Championship.
- The past 11 consecutive NCAA title games have featured at least one current ACC-member school. That streak extends to 15 consecutive NCAA title games featuring ACC teams prior to Maryland's departure in 2013 (2009-23).
- Over that stretch, Boston College has made six appearances in the title game, North Carolina appeared in five while Syracuse made three. Those three teams accounted for four titles in that run.

#### **JULIE MYERS SELECTED FOR 2024 IWLCA HALL OF FAME CLASS**

- The Intercollegiate Women's Lacrosse Coaches Association announced Thursday (Feb. 15) that three coaches have been selected for induction into the association's Hall of Fame class for 2024 including Virginia alumna and legendary head coach Julie Myers.
- During her 28-year tenure as head coach at UVA, Myers amassed a remarkable record of 349-181 (.658), solidifying her as one of the most successful coaches in NCAA Division I collegiate lacrosse history. Her win total ranks fifth overall in NCAA Division I and 11th across all NCAA Divisions. Over her 28 years at the helm, Myers consistently led her teams to the postseason with the exception of 2020 when the NCAA spring championships were canceled due to the pandemic.
- Under her guidence, the Cavaliers clinched the NCAA Division I championship in 2004 and finished as national runners-up six times. Additionally the Cavaliers secured five ACC championships under Myers.

#### **NOTABLE DEPARTURES**

- •Though Virginia has made valuable additions to the squad while retaining some top talent, the team will still be tasked with replacing some top performers from the 2023 season.
- Rachel Clark departed in the summer for Boston College via the transfer portal. Clark led the Cavaliers in 2023 with 63 goals while adding 13 assists for a total of 76 points.
- The Cavaliers will also be missing Ashlyn McGovern on the attacking end of the field. A senior who finished her Virginia career with the third-most goals (204) in program history, McGovern accounted for 61 goals and seven assists.
- Another question mark for the Cavaliers will take place in the center circle after the departure of the program's all-time leader in draw controls (332), Aubrey Williams.
- · Clark and McGovern accounded for 46 percent of Virginia's goals in 2023. Either Clark or McGovern have led the team in goals in each of the last three seasons.

#### **CAVALIER COACHES ON THE WORLD STAGE**

- Virginia's coaching staff has a wealth of experience not only at the collegiate level, but on the professional and world stage.
- Head coach Sonia LaMonica, an Australian native and Maryland graduate, led the Australian national team to a World Cup title beating out the US national team for the gold medal on American soil. LaMonica was named to the 2005 IFWLA All-World Team and can also boast silver medals at the 2009 World Cup Championship and the 1999 World Championship as well as the bronze medal at the 2013 World Cup Championship in Canada.
- Assistant coach Caylee Waters is a current member of the US National Team and competes professionally with Athletes Unlimited. Waters split time in goal with the US National Team at the 2022 World Cup Championship as the US went on a run to the gold medal, winning gold on American soil for the first time in the team's history.
- Assistant coach Kerrigan Miller, also competes professionally with Athletes Unlimited, and has been a member of the USA Women's Senior National Training Team for the past two years.

#### **HEAD COACH SONIA LAMONICA**



LaMonica takes over UVA's storied program for the 2023-24 season after serving as the head women's lacrosse coach at Towson for the last 14 seasons. At Towson, she amassed a 139-91 record and owns a 147-101 all-time coaching record after starting her head coaching career at Mount St. Mary's for one season.

During her tenure at Towson, LaMonica led the Tigers to seven NCAA Tournament appearances and four Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) Tournament Championships. She has been named the CAA Coach of the Year five times.

Towson finished first or second in the CAA in 10 of her 14 seasons at the helm and made nine CAA tournament championship game appearances, including six-straight. LaMonica has coached six players to All-America honors and has had numerous All-CAA and All-Region honorees.

LaMonica consistently challenged her teams with tough schedules against top-ranked opponents. Towson finished .500 or better in 12 of the 14 seasons she oversaw the program, with one of the two being cut short due to the pandemic.

A native of Darlington, South Australia, LaMonica (pronounced La - MAHN - ick - uh) was named the 10th head coach in the history of the Towson women's lacrosse program after the 2010 season. She returned to lead the Tigers after a one-year stint as the head coach at Mount St. Mary's.

As the Mountaineers' head coach, LaMonica led Mount St. Mary's to an 8-9 record in 2010 and a berth in the Northeast Conference (NEC) semifinals. She coached five players who earned All-NEC honors.

Prior to becoming the Mountaineers' head coach, LaMonica spent two seasons as a member of Missy Doherty's staff at Towson and helped the Tigers win a pair of Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) championships.

Before joining the Tigers' staff, LaMonica was an assistant coach at the University of Denver, helping the Pioneers to a 15-5 record during the 2006 season. She coached the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation (MPSF) Player and Rookie of the Year along with three all-conference selections and the program's first IWLCA All-West/Midwest region honoree.

LaMonica is also the head coach of the Women's Professional Lacrosse League's (WPLL) Baltimore Brave. LaMonica led the Brave to the league championship in 2019 and guided the team to the title game in the inaugural season a year earlier.

In addition to her success as a coach, LaMonica is a member of the Australian National Team. She helped Australia win the gold medal at the 2005 World Cup Championship and a silver medal at the 2009 World Cup Championship. In the summer of 2013, LaMonica played a key role in helping Australia earn a bronze medal at the World Cup Championship in Canada.

Named to the 2005 IFWLA All-World Team, she was also a member of the U-19 Australian National Team that won the silver medal at the 1999 World Championships and was also the recipient of the U21 South Australian Sportswoman of the Year award.

A 2003 graduate of Maryland, LaMonica was a three-year starter for the Terrapins. She earned first team All-America honors and was a candidate for the Tewaaraton Trophy during her senior season after leading Maryland to the Atlantic Coast Conference (ACC) championship. A team captain during her senior season, she was a member of three ACC championship teams and helped the Terrapins win the 2000 and 2001 NCAA titles.

LaMonica scored 111 goals in her college career, including 49 goals as a senior, along with 55 assists.

Formerly Sonia Judd, LaMonica is married to former Maryland men's lacrosse standout Michael LaMonica. The couple resides in Parkton, Md., with their sons, Luca and Bodhi and daughter, Marley.

Michael LaMonica, a member of the Towson coaching staff, will join Sonia as an assistant coach for the Cavaliers.


